Lieutenant (jg) H. PETERSON obtained routine photo coverage of Marcus Island on 20 June 1945. Take-off was at 0640 King from Agana Field, Guam. Marcus was reached at 1213 King and vertical photographs were obtained from 19,000 feet. On the return route photographs were taken of the rescue by submarine of an Army Liberator crew that had ditched the previous day. He landed at Agana at 1740 King.
