["Cob" money conformed to the lawful standard in weight and fineness, but was struck with the hammer without much regard to regularity of form or impression. The "8" which is so conspicuous on the dollars, signifies 8 reals, and, combined with the two columns which always appear rising out of the water on one side of the coins, becomes our dollar-markthus \$].
