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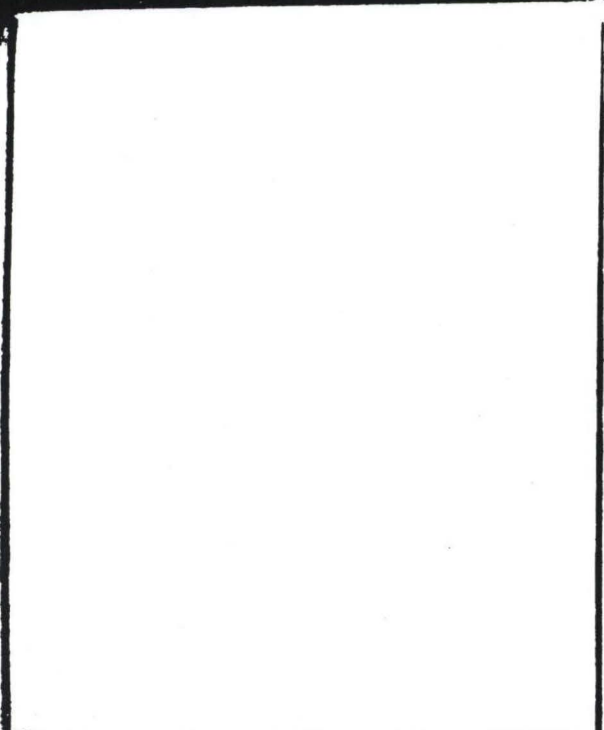

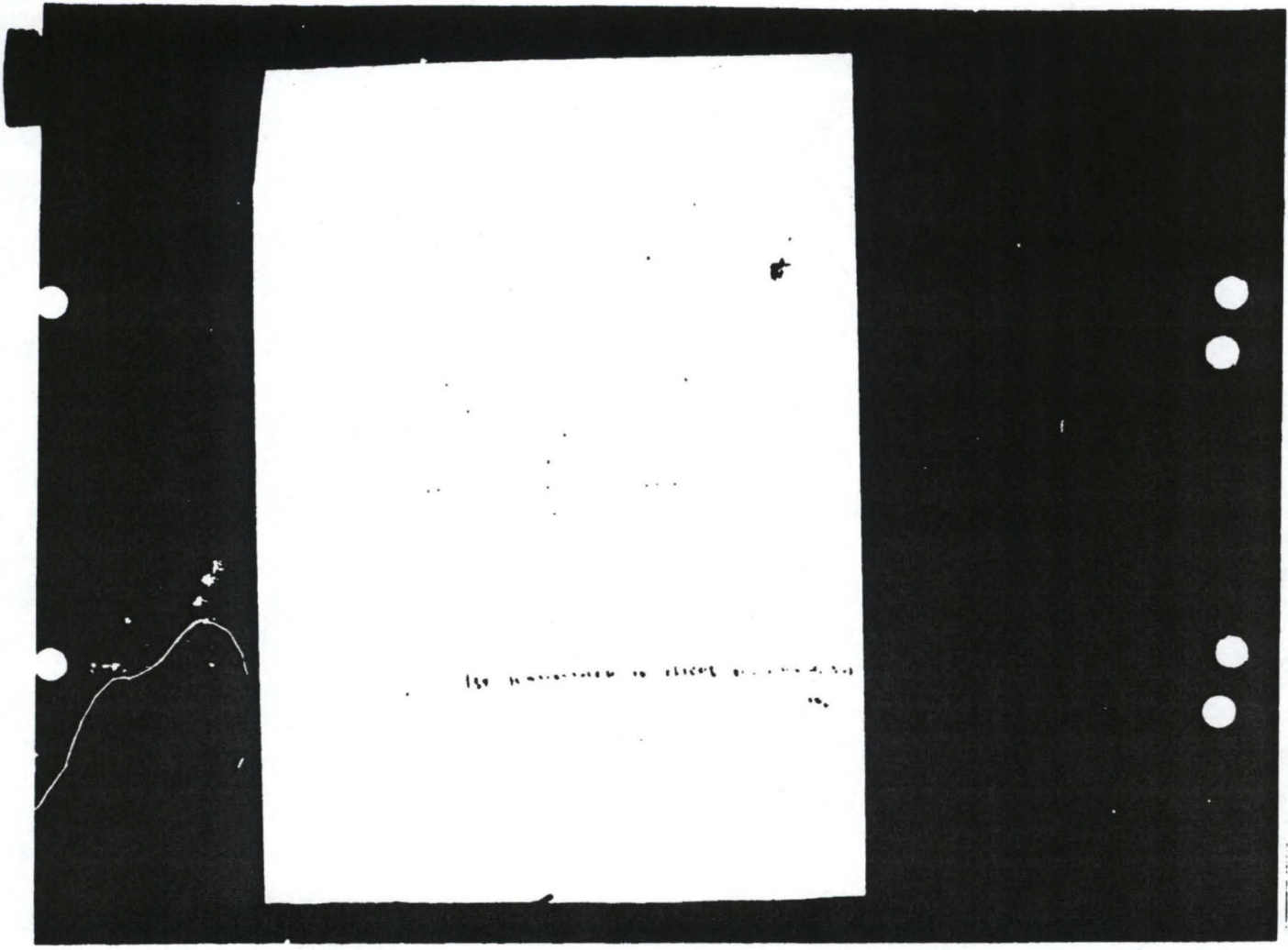

Dear Alec:

You may recall that way back in October 1954 you sent me information regarding subject indicating she had been dating one SYRUP who had been a very active SS man and that he may presently be working for a German organization. You also mentioned that GEHRICH might be giving information to the local police and/or to SYRUP.

For your information I have just received reliable information that during the latter part of World War II she worked in Innsbruck with the Gestapo SD where she remained until February 1945 at which time she was sent to Verona to work for a positive intelligence group of the German SD as a typist.

This seems to tie in with the information you submitted and in all probability is again being utilized. In view of this you may want to review the entire situation and decide whether or not you wish to retain her. I feel you are the one in the best position to judge the seriousness of the problem and decide whether or not she should be retained. Please advise me of your decision.

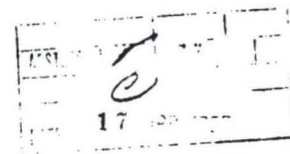

1. Per your recent request, the following is a summary of information contained in Headquarter's files on Dr. Guenther SYRUP:

a. SYRUP, born 21 August 1910 in Hildesheim, whose war-time address was Meierfeldstrasse 26, Kl.-Machnow, was an SS Hauptsturmbahnfuhrer in Amt VI/Gruppe A (Allgemeines u. Inland - General Administration) of the RSHA. He was liaison officer to the Reichswirtschaftsministerium from 1940-43, then joined the Waffen SS. His father was State Secretary in the Arbeitsministerium.

b. In 1954, the ZIPPER Weekly Report number 4 on the Otto JOHN case, cites Rechtsanwalt Guenther SYRUP, residing Hamburg/Fuhlbuettel, Am Hassenberg 37/1 as the source of several items on the JOHN case. Specifically, he reports that a fellow Hamburg lawyer, Dr. Curt Otto BLEY, was a long time friend of Otto JOHN. It is not possible to determine the significance of the ZIPPER SYRUP connection. From the context, since he is openly cited as having provided the information, his relationship to ZIPPER was evidently not regarded as particularly sensitive. You will recall that ZIPPER is the former cryptonym for the Gehlen Organization.

c. SYRUP is not listed in current overt materials - the Hamburg telephone directory, rosters of German lawyers, etc.

2. We will undertake further action, including field traces, if you desire.

<p>In addition to our initial contact with Identities 1 and 2 (Reference F), [ ] had two follow-up meetings with them on 5 and 25 April 1972. Our current assessment of their capabilities indicates that Identity 1 possesses several local contacts who are Bloc refugees with access to the Port of Hamburg and visiting Bloc nationals. Identity 2 appears sincere when describing his voluntary "intelligence network" of former friends and associates, but we are somewhat dubious that his "network" produces intelligence of direct interest to BKTRUST. We plan to request POA on Identity 1 for the purpose of exploring leads which she has among local Bloc nationals of interest.</p>

Identity 3 by Otto SKORZENY whom Identity 3 had interviewed earlier and with whom Identity 3 appeared to have a most friendly relationship. (According to Identity 2, SKORZENY is the godfather of one of Identity 3's children and also attempted to establish contact with BKTRUST through Identity 3.) During their meetings with Identity 3, the latter stated that he was a friend of Fletcher K. KNIGHT and suggested that BKTRUST would probably be interested in contacting Identity 1 and Identity 2. Identity 3 later informed Identities 1 and 2 in a letter that he had broached the topic with KNIGHT and that a representative of BKTRUST would contact them. Identity 3 apparently sent a similar message to SKORZENY who informed Identity 2 that he was also expecting BKTRUST to contact him. (Identity 2 considers SKORZENY indiscreet and insecure. He allegedly furnished Identity 3 with incorrect information about the Waffen-SS and thus drew the ire of other SS officers who were interviewed by Identity 3 in Germany. As a result many HIAG members are distancing themselves from SKORZENY.)

### 2. Background of Identity 1.

In addition to information contained in para 2, reference A, Identity 1 volunteered the following: She is currently making her living as a free-lance journalist, specializing in Soviet and Bloc affairs, and has also maintained contact with Radio Free Europe as a part-time analyst and interviewer. In addition to her native German, she speaks English, French, Italian and Russian. She studies "Pravda" daily, translating and analyzing its articles for various local newspapers, and provides Identity 2 with a weekly "Soviet Newsletter" which Identity 2 makes available to HIAG and to various prominent members of the CDU/CSU, including Franz Josef S T R A U S S. As far as her activities on behalf of RFE are concerned, Identity 1 makes use of local Bloc refugees who conduct so-called "opinion polls" among visiting Bloc nationals in order to determine the degree of effectiveness of RFE programs. One of her best interviewers is Dr. Lubomir T R I F O N O V, a Bulgarian national born on 22 January 1930 in Sofia, who is employed in the insurance department of HAPAG-LLOYD, and whose residence is 2 Hamburg 62, Gehlengraben 6A. According to Identity 1, TRIFONOV has steady access to visiting Bulgarian and other Bloc vessels, and is on friendly terms with some ten Bulgarian truck drivers who deliver agricultural products to Hamburg. Another interesting contact, whom Identity 1 has known since 1952, is Piotr O L E N D E R ( ) who has sold information on Poland to her (for use by RFE) on a continuing basis. (Field Comment: Base records indicate that OLENDER - a known smuggler and black marketeer - has been investigated over the years by a variety of FRG and Allied services for suspected activities on behalf of the PIS. The Poles, in turn, blacklisted him as a Western spy in a newsletter issued to the members of the Polish Merchant Marine.) Identity 1 claimed to possess other "stringers" - Romanians, Hungarians, etc. - who conduct interviews for her. She promised to furnish us with a complete list of her contacts. When queried about her export-import activities (as listed in the Hamburg telephone directory), Identity 1 explained that she had been engaged in the import of Hong Kong-manufactured textiles but had given up her business venture long ago in the face of strong competition by West German firms.

### 3. Background and activities of Identity 2.

According to Identity 2, his father - a conservative - occupied the post of Minister of Labor in the pre-HITLER German cabinet, and was imprisoned for a while after the take-over by the Nazis. Identity 2, who describes himself as "a national and a Nazi for reasons of ideology", joined the Waffen-SS at an early age. After a short tour of duty with the "Sicherheitspolizei" in Prussia, Identity 2 was transferred to the "Reichssicherheitshauptamt" (RSHA) in Berlin where he worked in the section "Economic Espionage", and where he became a protege of HEIDRICH. During World War II, he saw



action in the Balkans and in Soviet Union, his last rank being that of a "Sturmbannfuehrer" (Major). A lawyer by profession, Identity 2 was no longer permitted to practice law after his denazification in 1948, and retired to his family's farm near Hamburg. A fanatical anti-Communist, he became one of the first organizers of the HIAG (Hilfsgemeinschaft auf Gegenseitigkeit), the association of former Waffen-SS members with a current strength of ca 120,000 which publishes a monthly magazine called the "Freiwilliger" (The Volunteer). Identity 2 then proceeded to organize an intelligence branch of the HIAG - the "Sicherheits-Referat" - but resigned from HIAG when it became evident that the authorities were watching this organization closely, and built his own informal intelligence network, the so-called "Kameradschafts-ND". This network is composed of former members of the Waffen-SS (HIAG), RSHA, and SD, and allegedly possesses contacts in all walks of life, including political parties, police, Bundeswehr, industry, trade organizations, etc. According to Identity 2, the goal of his network is to continue fighting against Communism and left-wing Socialism in the FRG by means of providing the opposition parties CDU/CSU with precise information about individuals who cooperate with the East. Identity 2, who showed  several of his reports to STRAUSS, BARZEL, and other outstanding members of the opposition, and the thank-you letters he has received in return, stated that he is willing to furnish BKTRUST with similar or better information.

4. BKTRUST and CENTREG traces are requested on the following individuals who belong to the circle of Identity 2's informants:

- a. Paul HAUSER, former SS-General who resides in Darmstadt and is the "Father of HIAG".
- b. Former SS-Lt. Colonel Richard SCHULZE-KOSSENS, Duesseldorf, Karl-Moeller Str. 18A, who was HITLER's SS-Adjutant.
- c. Graf SCHWERIN von KROSIGK, 43 Essen, Wilhelm-Otto-Weg 23, who in the closing days of the war succeeded Joachim von RIBBENTROP as Foreign Minister.
- d. Horst ISSEL, Hamburg-Reinbek, Schmiedesberg 2b, a former SS-Officer who is Identity 2's deputy in the "Kameradschafts-ND".
- e. Hubert MEYER, Leverkusen 5, Richard Wagner Str. 18, the current head of the HIAG.

(Field Comment: We realize that our information on the above-listed individuals is less than the optimum for tracing purposes, but we have decided against pressing Identity 2 for all details on them at this stage of our contact. He has promised to furnish us with complete data on his active informants (ca 15-20) at a later date.)

### III. FUTURE PLANS:

We plan to continue contact with Identities 1 and 2 until we have obtained full PRQ data and all details regarding the identities and nature of their contacts. It is planned to have  continue their assessment after his return from Home Leave in July 1972.

<b>I. SUMMARY.</b>			
<p>There was no contact with Identities during May-June 1972 when <input type="checkbox"/> was on Home Leave and had an opportunity to discuss the case with Headquarters officers, including Fletcher M. KNIGHT. After his return to Hamburg, <input type="checkbox"/> met Identities on 10 July, had one meeting with Identity 1 alone on 21 July, and met both of them again on 3 August 1972. We have now reached the stage where Identity 1 has expressed desire to accept recruitment by BKTRUST, reveal all her sources, and furnish us with information on MHHARSH and other nationals of interest to us. Identity 2, contrary to his earlier enthusiasm, now seems to have the viewpoint that the "open support" of the current FRG government by LNLUTE makes it questionable whether it would be worthwhile (for him) to cooperate with BKTRUST on a steady basis. Despite his apparent skepticism, and his relatively heavy critique of LNLUTE policies in Europe and elsewhere, Identity 2 has proposed to remain in loose contact with us through Idem 1.</p>			
<b>II. OPERATIONAL.</b>			
<b>1. Identity 1</b>			
<p>a. During our three above-mentioned meetings with Identity 1 - two of them in the presence of Identity 2 - <input type="checkbox"/> gained the impression that her desire to become an asset of BKTRUST is genuine, and that this desire is based on a combination of idealistic and material motivations. enemies with the methods used in the "Third Reich" - Identity 1 is a much more subtle and sophisticated individual with international interests and with democratic ideas. She feels that her contribution to BKTRUST - no matter how small - would help to maintain freedom in the West, and she took the initiative by volunteering to provide us with whatever information we may need. She agreed to furnish us with a list of all her contacts among the Bloc refugees (who have contact with relatives and friends in their respective homelands) and the news media (she is a free-lance journalist), and to provide us on a continuing basis with her daily analysis of the MHHARSH press. Demonstrating her independence, she commented in Identity 2's presence that she often disagrees with latter's "narrow-minded political ideas", but added that this does not disturb their friendship. Identity 2, who was asked whether he had any objections to Identity 1's firm contact with BKTRUST, gave a negative answer and added jokingly that this left the door open for him in the future.

b. If firmly recruited Identity 1 could be a worthwhile addition to our current assets - note her fluency in MHHARSH language - and we are planning to submit her PRQ I & II after our next meeting with her. What requires further study from the security viewpoint is her current personal relationship (which used to be intimate in the past) with Identity 2. We definitely do not want him and HIAG to be aware of our operational assignments given to Identity 1.

## 2. Identity 2

a. An unexpected change in Identity 2's attitude vis-a-vis BKTRUST was noticeable already during our first meeting (10 July) with him after [redacted]'s return to Hamburg. When informed that approval had been granted for his cooperation with BKTRUST, and that we should now discuss the necessary administrative and operational details - including the table of organization of his so-called "Kameradschafts-ND" - Identity 2 became evasive and commented that "certain events had forced him to review his previous desire to cooperate with BKTRUST". Responding to [redacted]'s polite prodding, Identity 2 referred first to the ratification of the "Ostvertraege" by the FRG - calling it a definite victory for Communists - and added that it had been "a tremendous blow" to him personally that LNLUTE had apparently approved the ratification. Following through, Identity 2 stated that many ranking members of HIAG had also been badly shaken by LNLUTE's open support of BRANDT's policy, and that such support had created strong anti-WOCORK sentiments among them. Consequently, Identity 2 added, he could no longer figure with their support in his efforts to collect intelligence for BKTRUST, and such activity would therefore be meaningless. When reminded that [redacted] had repeatedly warned him not to mention his contact with BKTRUST to his HIAG friends, Identity 2 commented that "the damage had been done in the past" - during Identity 3's visit to Germany - when it had become "general knowledge" among HIAG leadership that he was in close touch with a personal friend (Identity 3) of Fletcher M. KNIGHT. Making it a condition of his possible future cooperation with us, Identity 2 then proposed that [redacted] personally meet his deputy in the "Kameradschafts-ND" (Para 4.d., Reference), plus "a few other ranking HIAG members", in an attempt to convince them that BKTRUST offers them a fair play, and that it would be in their interest to cooperate with us. It was politely explained to Identity 2 that such a proposal did not match with our operational concept, and that if he was still interested in cooperating with us he should do it alone, and on our terms, i.e. he should be willing to take direction and identify his sources of information. Identity 2 then asked for time to think it over, and it was decided to meet again on 21 July 1972.

b. Identity 2, who failed to keep the 21 July meeting, passed his apologies through Identity 1, stating that he had to attend an important political rally in his home district. [redacted] used the opportunity to firm his contact with Identity 1 (Para II., 1. above) and asked the latter to inform Identity 2 that there was no time pressure,

on our part, and that he left the initiative to Identity 2 to arrange the next meeting.

c. The 3 August 1972 meeting took place on Identity 2's initiative, and was an eye-opener regarding his true personal sentiments vis-a-vis BKTRUST, LNLUTE, and WOCORK in general. Opening the meeting with the statement that he was wondering whether [redacted] could stand some "brutally open critique of LNLUTE policies", Identity 2 then started a long anti-WOCORK tirade covering everything from the "Vietnam fiasco" to our support for Israel. Coming to a conclusion, Identity 2 summarized LNLUTE's worldwide actions as "naive", "outright stupid", and in many areas "entirely contrary to German interests". Consequently, Identity 2 stated, his active and meaningful support of BKTRUST - which appears to be unable to exercise positive influence on LNLUTE - remains "beyond his imagination". Responding to [redacted]'s remark that we always welcome constructive and unbiased critique from any party, Identity 2 stated that he would gladly provide us with periodic written reports about LNLUTE's "political mistakes" in Europe - provided that he could retain a copy and "go on record", if he deems it necessary, that such reports have been submitted to BKTRUST. When asked to clarify "going on record", Identity 2 explained that he may want to show these copies to his HIAG colleagues sometime in the future if it proves that BKTRUST is not in a position to change the current pro-MHHARSH and anti-GERMAN course of LNLUTE's policy (!). [redacted] was again forced to remind Identity 2 politely that we could not accept any conditions from him, and that we were better off without such reporting.

d. When asked whether he and the HIAG people were also perhaps unhappy with the CDU/CSU (whom they have provided with political reports so far), Identity 2 flared up about "BARZEL's soft attitude during the ratification debates in the Bundestag", and stated that HIAG and other organizations representing "the real Germans" are forced to take the fate of Germany into their own hands from now on. Identity 2 commented in this connection that the ratification of the "Ostvert- raege" has brought all patriotically-minded groups closer together, and that a roof-organization, ARST (Aktiven, Reservisten, Soldaten- und Traditionsverbaende), consisting of members of the Bundeswehr, Bundeswehr reserve organizations, World War II soldiers' organizations, and refugee organizations was recently founded in Bavaria. According to Identity 2, the aim of this organization is (1) to act as a counter- force to the "government-sponsored" Socialist and Communist organiza- tions in the FRG, (2) lead the population back to patriotism and the feeling of national honor, and (3) to abolish any foreign influence (cultural, political, and financial) in Germany and in entire Europe. The official statutes of the organizations state simply that its goal is to establish a unified Europe. Identity 2 predicted that the organizations now under the central leadership of ARST are ready "to fight the leftists in the streets", and that major riots could be expected in case the current FRG government should remain in power after the next elections.

e. Before departing, Identity 2 commented that his critical attitude should not be interpreted as an act of hostility, and that he did not want to close the door to BKTRUST entirely, i.e. he would prefer to remain in loose contact with us through Identity 1, and provide us with information which he considers of interest to BKTRUST. He repeated, however, that he would not divulge his sources under any circumstances because he does not want to jeopardize their security.

f. Identity 2 was told politely that we were sorry not to be able to accept his conditions, but that we will leave the door open for further exchange of ideas if he should change his mind and decide to reveal all his sources and operate under our directions. In such case, he could always contact us through Identity 1.

III. COMMENTS.

1. We are glad that we managed to learn Identity 2's true feelings in this early stage of our contact with him. He is apparently a fanatic and a dreamer who has refused to learn from the past, and who could do serious damage if permitted to operate under BKTRUST flag in his own and in HIAG's interest. Although he has indicated that he does not want to break contact with us entirely, and that he may have some information for us in the future, we would like to recommend that we drop him in a graceful fashion.

2. As stated in Para II.1.b. above, we are planning to proceed with the recruitment of Identity 1 - provided that she is willing to maintain secrecy vis-a-vis Identity 2 - whom we could well use in our efforts directed against PCS MHHARSH and visiting AEGLOBE targets.

A thorough check of BKTRUST indices, the normal repositories of information on the Nazi era, and the usual overt reference works was made in June when KNIGHT's office advised that Identity-3 of Reference had called to announce that SCHULZE-KOSSENS planned to visit Identity-3 and asked if BKTRUST would be interested in talking to him. A WOMUSE officer who has met several times with Identity-3 in KNIGHT's behalf declined, feeling that he would have little to offer in the way of interesting or useful information.</p> <p>2. Summary information on other members of the "Kameradschafts ND" follows:</p> <p>a. Paul HAUSER (HAUSIER), born 7 October 1880 in Brandenburg, began his military career in 1899. He was a Lt. except for military service during World War I, was continuously in the civil service of the Second Reich, the Weimar Republic and the Third Reich. He was connected with the Ministry of Finance from 1920, and was Finance Minister from 1932 till 1945, when he succeeded von RIBBENTROP as Foreign Minister for about a week during the Doenitz interregnum. Sentenced to ten years imprisonment in 1945, he was scheduled for release from Landsberg in 1952. (CENTREG traces are still pending. Any recent or significant information will be forwarded.)

c. Horst ISSEL   born 10 September 1912 in Berlin. SS Hauptsturmfuehrer stationed at Amt VI, SD Copenhagen, as a member of the Sonder Kommando working against resistance and sabotage groups, using cover name Horst WALDENBURG. He managed to escape arrest in 1945. In 1949 he was arrested by British Forces in Berlin and turned over to Danish Police for extradition to Denmark where he was tried for war crimes and sentenced to death. Neither BKTRUST or CENTREG files contain information after 1949 to explain the circumstances of his survival. At the time of his arrest, he was employed by the Gehlen Organization in Berlin, using the name Hans Horst ISERMANN. He was terminated at the time of his arrest.

d. Hubert MEYER, born 5 December 1913 in Altglienicke. Former SS Colonel. Was in the automatic arrest category at the end of World War II and confined in the War Crimes Cage in Dachau in 1945. There is a gap in information until 1950 when he appears as Land Baden-Wuerttemberg representative to HIAG. CANHISPER coverage of veterans' organizations documents his attendance at HIAG meetings and his steady rise to his current position, but adds little substantive information.

3. While we share your feelings regarding the value of Identity-2's information concerning his "intelligence network", we would appreciate being kept informed owing to his contact with Identity-3.

4. Should Identity-1   become of operational interest, we shall process a POA at your request.

<p>1. In connection with a teachers' exchange agreement between MEMBRUSH and CKPOLAR, Subject was selected to teach CKPOLAR language in Identity 1 for the duration of one year. Accompanied by his wife and daughter, Subject arrived in Hamburg on 20 September 1972, and was billeted in Identity 2 apartment which is his current residence. Dissatisfied with the conditions in Identity 1, Subject soon made arrangements through CATROJANI ORSH - [ ] to visit at least once a week - to teach evening courses in Identity 3, and continued looking for other opportunities which may help to extend his stay in Hamburg. With the help of [ ] [ ], Subject managed to obtain a temporary teaching job in Identity 4 in February 1973, and his current efforts are to cancel his contract with Identity 1 and get a permanent job with Identity 4 for an additional year.</p> <p>2. establishing contact with a local publisher, small presents, etc.) have now helped to establish a relationship of "mutual trust and confidence" between them. [REDACTED] has already provided us with a considerable amount of assessment data and other information of operational interest, and is currently engaged in a step-by-step attempt to learn the degree of Subject's susceptibility which we could use for an eventual direct approach to him by a BKHERALD officer.

3. In order to obtain a parallel assessment on Subject, we assigned CASUSTAIN-15 the task of attending Subject's language lessons in Identity 3. Starting on 2 May 1973, she has attended three lessons (for advanced students) so far, and has furnished us with a four-page summary of her impressions on Subject's behaviour and attitude. Although she has no close relationship with Subject at the moment, we hope that this will materialize in the near future because both she and Subject possess common interest in modern art and literature.

4. Although Subject is a target of opportunity, the fact remains that he is the only CKPOLAR national in our area who is in touch with two of our access agents, and who could be contacted and assessed by a BKHERALD officer much easier than the other target-individuals. As he does not require much of our time or money at the present time, we would like to follow through and request that he be assigned a 201-number and cryptonym.

## II. OPERATIONAL

### 1. Background.

In addition to information contained in Reference A, we have learned that Subject's home address is Identity 5 and that he has a son, 13 years of age, who remained at home and is being cared for by Subject's grandmother. So far, Subject has revealed details only about his educational career, and nothing is known about his parents, his possible military service, or other activities of interest. According to what Subject has volunteered to [REDACTED], he studied German in what he called the "Pol. School Institute" in GPOLEN capital and worked as a [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. Subject's wife, [REDACTED], his wife, whom he married in 1960, has a teacher's diploma in English, and would like to take a part-time job in Hamburg.

### 2. Activities in Hamburg.

Although Identity 1 personnel treated Subject and his family with utmost courtesy - he was given a furnished apartment, and several teachers turned their classes over to him - he soon voiced loud dissatisfaction, claiming that the school was "below his niveau", and that he had expected to teach at university level. In order not to "irritate" Subject and the local CATROJANHORSE - where he became a steady visitor shortly after his arrival - Identity 6, who had been fundamental in bringing Subject to Hamburg, granted permission for Subject to take a part-time job in Identity 3, and later in Identity 4. As already stated in paragraph I.1. above, Subject is aiming now even higher, and is pulling strings in CATROJANHORSE and CATOPHAT in order to achieve a transfer to Identity 4 as a full-time teacher. His steady CATROJANHORSE contact and supporter in this respect is Identity 7, and his backer in CATOPHAT is Identity 8. Whatever little time Subject has left over from his teaching activities is spent either in CATROJANHORSE, where he apparently has to report on all his contacts and

activities, or in Identity 4 library with research work. Subject, whose wife and daughter returned home for the period 18 January - 26 May 1973 for "family reasons", made no apparent effort to enjoy this freedom as far as personal pleasures are concerned, and even did not permit female Identity 1 colleagues to enter his apartment.

### 3. Character and Behaviour.

According to [REDACTED], who knows Subject best, Subject belongs to the "new generation" of CKPOLARS who are relatively well educated, who dress in Western fashion, and who have learned Western manners (including table manners), i.e. it seems that he has received considerable training. The specific features of his character and behaviour which have come to our attention so far as the following:

a. He has never made an attempt to discuss politics, and quickly changed the topic when political themes were brought up by others.

b. He is a name-dropper - trying to make himself important and interesting - and a person who enjoys talking, and who demands attention from his audience.

c. He gets quickly mad when faced with arguments which oppose his viewpoints, but his oral reaction is seldom rude. When angered, he turns pale in his face and lapses into a silence.

d. He is fond of vodka and wine, and can carry his liquor well.

e. He is interested in modern art, literature, and theater.

f. He has indicated that he values money, constantly repeating that his current salary is too low in order to live comfortably and purchase presents for his relatives and friends, and that he would be willing to work harder (by giving private lessons) in order to raise his income.

g. He is extremely correct and polite when dealing with opposite sex, and has left the impression of a faithful husband and loving father.

h. He has shown visible interest in prohibited literature (when visiting [REDACTED]'s private office), claiming that "we do not have anything like this at home...".

### 4. Special Interests.

One of Subject's main interests is to have his manuscript (a comparative study of German and CKPOLAR languages) published in Hamburg, and thus gain some weight and prestige locally and at home. It was [REDACTED] who helped him to find an interested publisher (Identity 9) and who was thus able to strengthen her "friendship" with him. (Note: Identity 9 has the rights for all publications originating in Identity 4, meaning that we could not introduce a publisher controlled by BKHERALD.) Subject's other interests, already mentioned, are to get a permanent job with Identity 4, to earn more money and prestige, and to try to remain in Hamburg for an additional year. It is apparently also CATROJANHORSE interest to keep him

here for as long as possible.

#### 5. Subject's Contacts.

Based on information obtained from [redacted] [redacted], CASUSTAIN-15, and CALLIKAK, we have been able to identify a total of 23 individuals - six of them CKPOLAR nationals - who maintain contact with Subject. The majority of them are connected with Identities 1, 3, and 4, and are going to remain in steady contact with Subject throughout his stay in Hamburg. We are currently in the process of checking them out locally, and will trace them with Headquarters at a later date. Both [redacted] [redacted] and CASUSTAIN-15 have been assigned the task of identifying Subject's additional new contacts.

#### 6. Possible Intelligence Affiliation.

Subject's steady contact with Identity 7 - whom CAWHISPER has classified as "Known PDQUICK" - leaves us with the speculation that Subject may have been co-opted prior to his arrival in Hamburg. At the moment, there is no evidence of his direct involvement in intelligence activities, but he has definitely shown pointed interest in at least one individual (a "Juso" who serves as [redacted] [redacted]'s assistant in Identity 4, and who is scheduled to attend a language seminar in CKPOLAR capital this summer), and he has been equally interested in overt scientific information published by the "Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft" which is available in Identity 4, and which has been "fed" to him by [redacted] [redacted] with the idea of testing his intelligence interests. What could be considered as a possible attempt by Subject to frame the "Juso" for a PDQUICK approach, was his offer to furnish the "Juso" with CKPOLAR currency prior to his scheduled departure from Hamburg, and his statement that the latter should not be afraid to smuggle currency into CKPOLAR "because nobody is being searched at the border". The "Juso" (Identity 10), on whom we are going to report separately at a later date, was clever enough to turn down Subject's offer.

#### 7. Operational Developments.

As far as contact with Subject, CASUSTAIN-4 is [redacted] [redacted] (contact with Subject's wife) as [redacted] [redacted] already has an invitation for a "family party" in Subject's apartment. This relationship should provide us with the still missing biographic data, help us to gain more assessment information, and furnish us with ideas as to what approach we should use to Subject. The current teacher-student relationship between Subject and CASUSTAIN-15 is still new, but we hope that it will develop into a personal contact in the near future.

### III. Comments

1. We hope to be able to complete a good portion of phase two of our preliminary plan prior to 10 July 1973 when Subject is returning home for the summer, and follow through upon his return to Hamburg in late August 1973. As already stated, Subject will continue pulling strings toward his transfer to Identity 4, and [redacted] [redacted] will do the same through her channels. Should Subject's transfer materialize, his contact with [redacted] [redacted] would become even closer than it is now and it would work for our advantage.

2. We will continue reporting on this case, and would like to place Subject in direct contact with a BKHERALD officer - preferably with one who is not attached to Hamburg Base, and who could use "hit and run tactics" - after we have completed our assessment of Subject and discovered the best avenue of approach to him. Our current estimate is - based on Subject's apparent desire for money and material values - that the approach and the Case Officers' cover should be tailored along commercial lines.

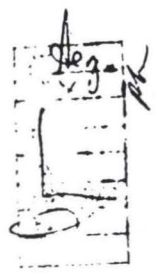

<p>1. During [ ] 13 July 1973 meeting with CASUSTAIN/15, the latter revealed that she had recently learned the following from her boyfriend, Identity 1 [ ]</p> <p>a. Immediately after CAB assumed his present position, he purchased an estate somewhere near Identity 2 which cost him at that time two (2) million DM. (Field Comment: The implication here is that CAB was paid off by some unidentified party interested in elevating him into his current position.)</p> <p>b. One of CAB's sons (unidentified) is a narcotics addict, and presently under treatment in a sanatorium.</p> <p>2. When pressed for the source of the above, CASUSTAIN/15 named Identity 3, a close friend of Identity 1. CASUSTAIN/15 was instructed to discuss the rumors again with Identity 1, and to obtain additional details.</p>

The purpose of this dispatch is to bring Headquarters up to date on the activities of AENOG (Subject) since Reference A was written, and to describe our continuing two-pronged assessment and cultivation efforts through <input type="checkbox"/> and CASUSTAIN/15. Whereas Reference A contained information obtained mainly from <input type="checkbox"/> we are now emphasizing the observations and impressions of CASUSTAIN/15 who has been attending Subject's weekly language lessons since 2 May 1973, and who resumed contact with him - after Subject's Home Leave in CKPOLAR - on 9 September 1973.</p> <p>2. As reported in Reference A, Subject's original plan, backed by CATROJANBORSE officials, was to request a transfer for a full-time job with Identity 1 during the 1973/74 school year. For reasons unknown, this was not approved by the CKPOLAR Ministry of Education, but Subject was granted another year in Hamburg and given an additional responsibility in the form of another part-time job in Identity 2 for DM 600.00 per month. This means that Subject will now have three part-time jobs (Identity 1, Identity 2 and Identity 3) in addition to his full-time teaching job in Identity 4, and that his income will increase considerably.</p> <p>3. Subject and his family departed Hamburg for CKPOLAR on or about 10 July 1973, and returned here on 18 August 1973. A) is still valid, but Subject is allegedly looking for a new apartment closer to the city. As already stated, they are scheduled to remain here for another year.

4. As far as our efforts are concerned, [ ] who will resume her contact with Subject after her return from Annual Leave in early October 1973 - has definitely reached the cultivation stage, where both Subject and his wife have accepted a variety of favors and presents from her, and we see no difficulty in strengthening this relationship. We are also satisfied with the achievements of CASUSTAIN/15 who has become Subject's favored student, and whose assessment of Subject and of the participants of the Identity/3 sponsored language course we are describing in this dispatch.

## II. OPERATIONAL

### 1. Identity 3 Language Course:

A. Thanks to Identity 5, Chairman of Identity 3, the rooms for the language course were made available in the house of Identity 6 where Subject teaches once a week (currently Wednesdays) for a total of four hours. The hours for the advanced group attended by CASUSTAIN/15 are from 1800-1900 hours, and for the beginner's group 1900-2000 hours. (Field Comment: As Subject is teaching another four hours earlier in Identity 1 the same day, he is usually 20-25 minutes late to the Identity 3 course. This reduces CASUSTAIN/15's "contact time" with him, but offers her a good chance to elicit information from the other members of her group, described below, who are somewhat naive CKPOLAR sympathizers.) The course is free of charge for members of Identity 3, whereas non-members pay a fee of DM 2.00 per lesson.

B. Prior to permitting CASUSTAIN/15 to join Subject's course for advanced students, we carefully rehearsed her cover story (literary reasons) and warned her not to reveal her thorough knowledge of the language and her deep-rooted anti-CKPOLAR sentiments. She displayed her talents as an "actress" to our satisfaction, and has apparently continued to play her role so well that she has become Subject's favorite student - he has loaned her his personal textbooks, they are discussing psychology (Sigmund FREUD), art, literature, and other topics which are a bit much too intellectual for the taste of the other students, and which have lately led to a noticeable jealousy on their part. Despite that, CASUSTAIN/15 is still a long way from a steady personal contact with Subject, the problem being that she, as a woman, cannot take the initiative and propose a meeting after classes. We are now weighing the possibility of having her take private lessons from Subject or latter's wife - provided that Subject will agree - but this move requires more planning as we do not want to be too obvious and risk the possibility of destroying CASUSTAIN/15's current good rapport with Subject.

C. There are currently only six other students in the advanced class attended by CASUSTAIN/15, all of them female, and this number alone shows that the Identity 3 sponsored course is anything but popular among Hamburg population. Out of the six, CASUSTAIN/15 has helped us to fully identify three - Identities 7, 8 and 9 - and has provided us with the names of two others whom we are tracing locally. One old lady of ca 70 years of age is still unidentified, and probably of no operational interest. Of immediate interest to us was Identity 7, whose husband was a contact of Identity 10 in 1960, and who has made it a habit to visit CKPOLAR vessels and to

entertain CKPOLAR tourists. (Field Comment: Identity 7 and her husband were traced by CAVHISPER after the Identity 10 affair, and the possibility that they were recruited by CAVHISPER/Hamburg should not be overlooked. We will check this possibility through a sensitive Hamburg Base asset who is scheduled to return from his Annual Leave in early October.) As far as Identity 8 is concerned, it looks as if she and her husband - a medical doctor - are on the CKPOLAR recruitment list: after an initial contact with an unidentified member of CATROJANBOESE, who helped them to translate some CKPOLAR literature, and who learned that the couple were going to attend a medical conference in Identity 11 in September/October, they received a letter from a CKPOLAR citizen seeking to become their "pen pal". This perfect stranger later proposed to have a personal meeting with the couple in Identity 11, and Identity 8 naively accepted the proposal. The couple is still in Identity 11, and we have instructed CASUSTAIN/15 to elicit details of the meeting from Identity 8 after her return to Hamburg. Identity 9, a member of Identity 3, is in charge of collecting fees from the students attending the language course. A talkative woman who likes to gossip, she is CASUSTAIN/15's "best source" about Identity 3 activities and its leadership and we have encouraged CASUSTAIN/15 to enter into social contact with her.

D. At the time CASUSTAIN/15 joined Subject's class in May 1973, the curriculum was relatively void of political propaganda topics. Effective 9 September - after Subject's return from Home Leave - it became evident that he had been given specific instructions to use a portion of his time for propaganda. His current theme is the world-wide CKPOLAR campaign dealing with friendship with other nations, and he has been also "programmed" with facts and figures about CKPOLAR political, scientific, and cultural achievements. An apparent effort to obtain biographical data on his students was made by Subject on 12 September when he issued as classroom theme the CKPOLAR visa requirements for foreigners, and then he asked for an oral presentation of the curriculum vitae of each student.

## 2, CASUSTAIN/15's Assessment of Subject:

A. According to CASUSTAIN/15, Subject takes good care of his physical appearance "from hair to fingernails", and is a conservative neat dresser. Being often late (Para II 1 A above), he is apologetic vis-a-vis his students upon his arrival, but a keen observer would notice that he apologizes for the sake of politeness only, and that each single apology is accompanied with the statement that he had had "other important business", i.e. a trace of Geltungsbeueverfnis. Although polite, it is often visible that he is bored with his audience (which is not too bright) on which occasions he displays signs of absentmindedness or slight impatience. What is strongly in evidence is his apparent discomfort or dislike when he goes into a monologue on CKPOLAR propaganda topics: his smile fades, he keeps his eyes directed to the floor, and his statements are accompanied by nervous jerking of his face muscles. According to CASUSTAIN/15, "it looks like the man is turning a switch in his mind", and the above-mentioned discomfort/dislike disappears immediately after he has finished his propaganda lecture.

B. As far as women are concerned, Subject is a charmer and likes to flatter the old ladies with compliments. A lively person, he may be somewhat bored with his own wife's quiet and well-balanced nature. A possible indication in this direction surfaced when he introduced his students the theme of a lively husband and a quiet wife, and when he asked CASUSTAIN/15 to

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analyse the positive and negative features of the married life of such couple along the lines of Freudian psychology. Although he likes to charm the ladies in his class, Subject has not shown any desire for a serious flirt with them, and CASUSTAIN/15 tends to believe that he is faithful husband and a loving father who is especially fond of his son in CKPOLAR. (Field Comment: According to [ ], Subject was rather heartbroken when his request to bring the son to Hamburg for a short visit was turned down by CKPOLAR officials.)

C. As a result of her general observation of Subject's behavior, CASUSTAIN/15 believes that Subject may possess "all normal human weaknesses" regarding money and material values (search for additional income, possession of Western clothing, recent purchase of an expensive TV set), and that he is not a firm believer in the propaganda that he has been asked to spread in the classroom. Despite that, Subject seems to possess a strong respect for the discipline exercised by his "watchers" in CATROJANHORSE, and has been careful not to voice any dissatisfaction. Summing it up, CASUSTAIN/15 does not see any "opening" at the present time which would permit her to establish a closer relationship with Subject.

D. Judged by Subject's recent efforts to obtain biographical data on his students (Para II 1 d above), plus the possibility that he may have arranged Identity 8's contact with CATROJANHORSE, CASUSTAIN/15 is inclined to believe that Subject has been co-opted by PDQUICK.

### III. COMMENTS

1. It is evident that CASUSTAIN/15's assessment of Subject is limited - mainly because of the nature of their current teacher/student relationship - but she has made considerable progress under the circumstances involved and we are planning to keep her on the target and let her continue looking for the "opening" we all seek. We are going to take a closer look at Subject's activities, family, and local contacts through [ ] when she returns from her vacation in early October 1973. Our ultimate aim remains to find a proper avenue of approach for direct Case Officer contact with Subject.

2. Regarding Paragraph 3 of Reference B, [ ] came to the conclusion that Subject was either bragging about his CKPOLAR currency "smuggling", or that he had been instructed to set up Identity 10 of Reference A for a body search at CKPOLAR border, and thus pave the way for a recruitment pitch by the PDQUICK. We agree with Headquarters that Subject would make no profit by exchanging CKPOLAR currency into DM. As far as the prohibited literature is concerned which seemed to interest Subject, we will obtain the exact titles from [ ] and will keep you informed as to whether and how we could exploit this interest operationally.

<p>1. As stated in Paragraph III.1. of reference, we were looking for an "opening" which would help CASUSTAIN-15 to establish closer contact with AENOG. Considering that there was no such opportunity in the classroom, and having learned from <input type="checkbox"/> that AENOG covers the distances from Identity 1 to Identity 2 on foot, we instructed CASUSTAIN-15 to take the same route and intercept him. Her efforts paid off on 10 October 1973, a rainy night, when AENOG caught up with her and in a gentleman like fashion offered to protect her with his umbrella, and linked arms with her. During their ten-minute walk to Identity 2, AENOG asked several casual but pointed questions about CASUSTAIN/15's profession, and became visibly interested when she stated that she is a free-lance journalist and translator, and that her main income is derived from translation of English-language TV scripts. AENOG commented thoughtfully that "it must be wonderful to be free and select and do the kind of work one's heart desires". He then stated that his wife is an English teacher, and apparently wanted to add something, but they had already reached the classroom where the other students were waiting for him and the sentence remained unfinished. Since their little date, AENOG has practiced "intimate" eye contact with CASUSTAIN-15 in the class - displaying an amusing "flame" when other students are making mistakes-and has paid more attention</p>

to her than the other female students seem to appreciate. Some of them have already remarked to her that her near-perfect knowledge of the CKPOLAR language is giving them complexes, but she has managed to remedy the ruffled feelings by remaining friendly and offering her help before or after classes.

2. We have instructed CASUSTAIN/18 to continue gaining ground with AENOG, and have suggested that she make him a polite offer to be of help to his wife either as a conversation partner (English and German) or as a "city guide". Should the reaction be negative, we will instruct CASUSTAIN/18 to ask AENOG whether he or his wife would be willing to give her private CKPOLAR language lessons against a reasonable payment.

3. CASUSTAIN/15 provided two written reports concerning her classes with AENOG on 12 Feb 74 and 20 Feb 74, which contain the following highlights:

a. AENOG admitted that he had no photographs of his vacation in Irkutsk to show the class, in spite of the fact that they had presented him with the camera just before Christmas. (Note: As CAS/15 hinted, this is another indicator that the Irkutsk home is a cover story. CAS/15 ~~xx~~ also said that she finds it very unlikely that someone who grew up in Irkutsk, as AENOG supposedly did, would have his accent.)

b. The DGB functionary, previously mentioned, is Klaus Nilius (not Mylius). His office phone is at "Neue Heimat." CAS/15 ~~xxxx~~ got the numbers: Office: 35 24 60, Home: 552 16 67.

c. The young American named David, works for a British airline at the airport. (Probably BEA, since there are no others. It seems very strange that the Brits would employ an American on one of their national airlines. This probably gives us enough to put a Forscher on him for identification.)

d. AENOG failed to show up for the class of 20 Feb 74. CAS/15 waited the whole hour, then walked out to see if he was coming, believing that a Soviet always keeps an appointment. AENOG was approaching very slowly, but ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ began hurrying when he saw CAS/15. He clearly had intended to miss the class, but CAS/15 believes that he wanted to get there just at the last moment ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ when he could still

get paid for the class. She had no explanation for why he might have wanted to miss the class. He claimed that he had missed three buses in a row.

e. Frau Womers is taking another Russian course and used her Bildungsurlaub to take a course in politics, possibly as a helper in the election, according to CAS/15's conjecture.

ii. CAS/15 gave me a brochure put out by the CVJM concerning the trips they arrange to the Sov Union.

1. The following information, keyed to the FPAG, was obtained from CASUSTAIN/15 on 29 Jan 74, at a meeting held solely for this purpose.

2. FPAG

A. FAMILY

1. Regarding place of birth, we noted for first time that, although Irkutsk is a pioneer town, AENOG always had given CAS/15 the impression that he had gone there as a volunteer around age 18. CAS/15 has previously reported impression that AENOG's family originated somewhere in Western Russia. He doesn't have a Siberian accent. AENOG's patronymic is very unusual, possibly indicates French connections of some kind for his father.

2. AENOG has at least one brother, apparently much older, since he served in the Sov space program in Baikonur and is already receiving his pension

B. PRESCHOOL, SCHOOL, AND ADOLESCENCE

3. No information

C. MARRIED LIFE AND SEXUAL BEHAVIOR

4. Wife is composed and silent in his presence, but lively and talkative when alone with one other female, a foreigner. He does the talking for the family and is definitely dominant.

5. He has two children, a 12 or 13 year old boy and a three year old girl. The boy has remained in the Soviet Union with his grandmother. AENOG was very disturbed over his inability to have the boy visit in the summer of 1973. He brought the boy a cowboy outfit as a present at Christmas 1973, which apparently was very successful.

6. In the classroom, AENOG passes over sexual double entendres in lesson material. He is obviously embarrassed, and not only in the classes attended primarily by elderly ladies.

D. GENERAL HEALTH

7. AENOG appears generally healthy. His drinking pattern, at least among foreigners, appears to be very cautious. At one reception, he took one drink and at first refused any more. The student who sits nearest him in class has told CAS/15 that she can smell vodka on AENOG's breath. He prefers vodka to champagne, because he has an allergy to champagne.

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## E. EMOTIONAL REACTIONS

8. CAS/15 described his usual mood as friendly and impersonally polite. He is never uncontrolled, but does not give the impression of being overly controlled. When the subject of Solzhenitsyn was raised by students, he contradicted them, supporting the official Soviet line, but without obvious emotional engagement or appearance of being under stress. There is no midlife crisis apparent. One of CAS/15's fellow students thinks that AENOG feels himself superior, however CAS/15 finds him typical for Soviets in this respect.

## F. THOUGHT PROCESSES

9. CAS/15 considers AENOG to be of medium intelligence, but believes that there are definite gaps in the education that would have been received by a teacher of German, particularly in German history and the German literary classics. He is ready to discuss new ideas and occasionally asks CAS/15 to interpret a passage in a Freudian sense, which he admits that he cannot do.

## G. RELATIONSHIPS

10. AENOG overlooks conflicts and even rationalizes the decisions of superiors, including the refusal to allow his son to travel to the West. He does not play off people against each other.

## H. BEHAVIORAL PATTERNS

11. CAS/15 assesses AENOG as not aggressive, but imaginative. He likes imaginative people. He is self-confident and not easily shaken. For advice, he goes to the Soviet Consulate. He is not a brooder. CAS/15 believes that, because he is a Soviet man, he is therefore manipulative. He definitely likes physical comfort. His clothes can be considered elegant, even by Western standards. There are no known special fears or anxieties.

## RELIGION

12. He has never mentioned religious subjects. CAS/15 believes that, if he were religious, he would not speak about it. There is no evidence of superstition, except for his awe of Freud.

## J. POLITICAL

13. There is a rote quality to his political discussion. He does not personalize and has never mentioned Brezhnev.

## K. GENERAL

14. CAS/15 believes that he is fairly typical. She has nothing against him and finds him not unsympathetic. She is neither comfortable nor uncomfortable in his presence. He is somewhat reserved. His most attractive feature is his good behavior and his imagination. The most unattractive is the general Soviet attitude which he shares of being "superior." He is not prone to misunderstandings and is thick-skinned. He seems preoccupied with requests for personal opinions on family life, Freud, and freedom in personal life.

15. CAS/15 describes him as a modern Communist brought up under the Soviet system. He may once have wanted to stay in the West, but he ~~may~~ probably has a better position at home than he could obtain in the West. He is not at all a fanatic and does not show his doubts. He is not a refined person. CAS/15 added as her final thought, that the son's visit, which was not allowed, was definitely a very important topic for him.

2. CASUSTAIN/15 passed me translations of two articles from Pravda concerning Soviet Policy in South Asia.

OPERATIONAL

3. CAS/15 provided one typewritten report on the class held by AENOG on 27 February, which contained the following items of interest:

a. AENOG showed surprise at the recent criticism of Brandt by Guenter Grass, saying that Grass's group (Gruppe 47) had ~~xx~~ always been favorable to the Sov Union.

b. The lesson was interrupted by preparations for a visit of the CVJM building by Foreign Minister Scheel, who was campaigning in Hamburg. (Note: Significance of this is that Weber, the CVJM leader, whom CAZAMIA is interested in, is persona grata with Scheel.)

c. AENOG is taking a holiday in the Soviet Union and will return with family. (Note: This means that our two new access agents will not be able to start ~~class~~ class until 9 April. ) He had given no previous notice of this to the class. CAS/15 asked him to bring back some pictures this time. AENOG said that he couldn't stand Moscow, loved Siberia, the countryside, etc. Then CAS/15 asked him directly whether he was born there. AENOG paused and looked at her then said, "Yes." (Note: It is interesting that AENOG is so sensitive on this point, however CAS/15 should have worked it somewhat more smoothly, by asking if he came as a Komsomol pioneer.)

4. CAS/15 has been invited to a lecture by a US professor, who has been a lecturer at the National War College, Jerzy Hauptmann, on "Probleme der amerikanischen

8. Subject stated that she and KOROTKOVA have adjoining offices in the Uni, and wondered whether K. may use a "mike" to listen to her confidential talks with her students. The undersigned recommended that she keep her voice down (VUK!).

9. Subject was paid her Feb 74 salary (DM 500.-).

1. Headquarters has initiated traces on Alexander RAMSAY   with the following results. The information, most of which originated from Hamburg, Munich or Frankfurt, has been extracted from RAMSAY's 201 file and is either noted below or attached herewith. 1952 OPC information indicated that RAMSAY was born on 9 January 1914, Coldingham, Berwick, Scotland. Additional biographic data on Subject in that report is attached. Another report of 19 August 1952 (WSSA-4230) indicated that an RFE source of   Station reported that Alexander RAMSAY would arrive in Stockholm on 20 August as a temporary replacement for that source. RAMSAY was to remain in Stockholm for about two months until a permanent replacement was named, and he was also to continue to function as the Chief of the Hamburg Bureau of the RFE during that period. RAMSAY was further reported to have been in the British military intelligence during the war and had served in Germany as a security officer immediately after the war. He was then assigned to the Foreign Office (possibly with the Information Research Department (IRD) section) and subsequently was employed by RFE. (It is interesting to note that if, indeed, he were employed by the IRD, he had at least a peripheral connection with intelligence activity. However, there was no record in London   at that time of his ever having been associated with  (SMOKE)).

2. In April 1955, CASCOPE reported that an alleged BIS Naval Intelligence man, a Mr. RAMSAY, was in touch with a Mr. MADGE (fnu), of the Hamburg Branch of the London firm, United Baltic Corporation which firm CASCOPE believed to be a BIS cover firm.

3. In 1957 proprietary approval was requested to use subject as a correspondent for RFE in Hamburg. This was disapproved based on the strong possible association of RAMSAY with British intelligence. In 1958 subject was transferred to Brussels with RFE and in 1964 proprietary approval for his use as Bureau Chief there was again requested. This was then granted as of 24 September 1964, but there is no further information in subject's file, an indication that he was probably never utilized.

4. The documents in reference, namely, EGMA-14836 dtd 25 March 1955, EGQA-64554 dtd 22 June 1955 and EGGA-402 dtd 29 November 1955 were searched at Hqs as they were not in subject's 201 file. Copies of the latter two are attached for  Base; however, there was no abstract or record of EGMA-14836. It, therefore, is not recoverable.

5. The reply to the question in paragraph 1 of reference as to whether a British citizen could be a security chief of an American organization, namely, the RFE, is affirmative.

depth as [redacted] (EGGA-5961) Other students in the class have supplied CASUSTAIN/15 with various bits of information which has shed some light on the relationships between AENOG, CAEVIL/Hamburg, and Eduard Sharapov, the CAEVIL referent in CATROJANHORSE.

A major indication that AENOG is coopted was his work with Dr. Helga Topel, a student who also took private lessons from AENOG's wife. Topel is employed as a translator for the European Air Bus with the job translating engineering drawings from French to German. CASUSTAIN/15 assessed Topel's Russian as being already sufficient for translation and inferred that Topel was passing drawings of the Air Bus to AENOG. If so, AENOG and his wife have been the handlers for a industrial espionage case similar to the "Concordeski," and the Russian version of the Air Bus should display surprising similarities to the Messerschmidt-Bozkow-Blohm version.

CASUSTAIN/15 has maintained her contacts within the emigre community and press circles in Hamburg. Little attempt has been made to work on these contacts since they do not have any access better than her own contact to AENOG. In May 1974, CASUSTAIN/15 told [redacted] that Iden 1 was ready to resume his interesting conversations with [redacted]. The first meeting is scheduled for June 6. Her press contacts and the Iden 1 meetings offer the best other possibilities for redirection of CASUSTAIN/15 after the PCS departure of AENOG.

CASUSTAIN/15's major activity is translation of significant articles on Russian-German relations from Pravda. She stated on one occasion that she supplies these translations to Iden 2 and Iden 3 among others. Copies of her translations have been of some use in keeping Base officers aware of the Soviet view of developments in Bonn. From her close reading of Pravda, CASUSTAIN/15 has noticed the following items of interest in recent months. Pravda, which normally reports results of European elections within a day or so, had no comment on the Hamburg election of 3 May 1974, until well into April, in spite of the widely recognized significance of the SPD defeat there. She also states that Yuri Zhukov, the star commentator, has been primarily concerned with Far East problems lately.

### III. FINANCIAL

CASUSTAIN/15 is paid DM 500. per month plus her expenses incurred in attending AENOG's class.

### IV. SECURITY

The most important security consideration in the operation is CASUSTAIN/15's relationship to Iden 1. He knows that CASUSTAIN/15 remains in contact with BKHERALD, but she has been told not to discuss our meetings with him.

A VSYOKE national, Iden 4 has opened a fashionable ladies shop next door to CASUSTAIN/15's residence. Iden 4 is the divorced wife of Iden 5 who was of operational and security interest to Hamburg Base in 1965. Traces from CALASER provided extensive information on Iden 5's criminal record and Bloc connections, but indicated that he has had no contact with his wife since the divorce in 1967. CASUSTAIN/15 has been briefed on his general background.

CASUSTAIN/15's remark that Alexander Ramsay was working for TPFEELING prompted Base to trace him on the chance that

he might be recruiting for SMOKE among her acquaintances. See EGGA-6016.

A man of East European appearance who passes by CASUSTAIN/15's residence frequently at precisely 1200 hours has been photographed, but cannot be identified. Although this man might be interested in [ ]'s office, which is around the corner from CASUSTAIN/15's residence, we believe that he is simply an office worker or pensioner of very precise habits. We do not believe that he has any interest in CASUSTAIN/15's residence.

V. MORALE/ATTITUDE/PERFORMANCE

CASUSTAIN/15's performance in making contact with and assessing AENOG has been good, within the limitations imposed by her background, including the widely-known fact that she is a former TPFEELING employee. Although she probably would not carry out her assignments for BKHERALD gratis, her primary motivation is ideological rather than financial.

COMMENTS

Base officers are conscious of the high flap potential in this operation. All meetings are prearranged. Telephone silence is being observed, and CASUSTAIN/15 has not been issued an ops number.

The next step in the operation will be to determine the value of Iden-1's offer of cooperation, beginning with the meeting on June 6.

CASUSTAIN/15 had typewritten reports on AENOG's class of 18 June (Meeting A) and the farewell party of 25 June (Meeting B). (Note: Meetings had been held more frequently than usual in June in order to monitor AENOG's last days more closely.)

AENOG's wife told her that after the farewell parties, they would take a vacation in Mittenwald, Bavaria (Note: Last party is on 27th. On night of 28 June, [ ] as magazine salesman, determined that the AENOG's were not home.)

AENOG had photographs of his family, but as we expected, there was nothing in the photos to identify the place where they were taken, whether Irkutsk or Moscow. (Note: We should keep this in mind for the future. In all likelihood, AENOG's wife, if she comes out, will come alone, because children in these ages, cannot keep track of a cover story. If she is forced to come alone for this reason, there will be an immediate clash of family solidarity with professional duty, which might be exploitable.)

NEW BIO DATA

AENOG. In course of discussing beauties of Siberia, AENOG revealed that he is a mushroom and berry collector. He was able to discuss the types found in Siberia with some assurance. According to AENOG, the honey in Siberia is particularly good, since it is from an environment unspoiled by chemicals, etc.

AENOG's wife. AENOG's wife makes an unobtrusive first impression. She is about 5'3", hair graying. She has three gold front teeth. Her manner is friendly, modest and very calm. CASUSTAIN/15 had the impression that she had been warned or given special instructions about CASUSTAIN/15 from the way that her glance rested on CASUSTAIN/15. AENOG's wife speaks English with a Russian accent, but with extensive vocabulary. She was never at a loss for correct word. She learned none of her English overseas, all at home. She will resume her place as an English teacher when she returns. She got very little chance to go out while they were in Germany, and her German was terrible. Their son is Alexey (Alyosha). The daughter Darya (Dasha) had no German friends and also got out very seldom. Dasha had been looking forward to the party days. Upon CASUSTAIN/15's remark that it was not a prison, AENOG's wife said that she had gotten a good rest for the work to come. She had gone shopping. She found the self-service shops very simple. The daughter made an excellent impression on CASUSTAIN/15, a happy, friendly child without any fears, apparently on good terms with Herr Nilius.

Nilius, who was at the party, told AENOG that he could keep the book he was reading "Sprache der Politik" which Nilius had lent him. (First indication that Nilius was this close to him.)

1. In May 1974, CASUSTAIN/15's friend, Identity 1, Subject of  , requested through her a resumption of his discussions with BKHERALD which had been broken off in 1972. At a meeting in CASUSTAIN/15's residence on 5 June 1974, Identity 1 met again with   and was introduced to    who is handling CASUSTAIN/15. It was agreed that   would make the next contact with him.

2. On 5 September 1974,   called Identity 1 at home from a nearby coin telephone and suggested a meeting to which Identity 1 readily agreed. In sum Identity 1 asserted that his organization's major contacts were in Rumania and within CASCOPE. He also mentioned that after the change of government in 1969, contacts had been established at many levels with the HBFAIRY government. We told him that in order to establish his credentials as a reporter, we would like to begin with his knowledge of Communist organizations, particularly the Rote Kapelle, on which he claimed to have good files. This field was chosen primarily to reduce the flap potential of this contact, at least in the opening stages.

3. Before any further contact,   traced Identity 1 routinely with Base and CASCOPE because of a telephone call to   from

Identity 1 had approached Delfs at a CDU rally on 2 October 1974 and informed her that he knew derogatory information concerning her personal life. He hinted that he had connections with CASCOPE. [redacted] provided Base with a copy of CASCOPE's trace reply, which stated that Identity 1 was known to them but was not an employee. CASCOPE stated that Identity 1 had been noted in 1954 in connection with the Otto John case and in 1961 in connection with the case of Siegfried Lietzmann, an LHGRAB agent.

4. [redacted] 's files showed that Identity 1 was living with

Identity 1 is not properly registered at the Residents' Registration Office (BMA), Hamburg. Identity 1 had offered his services to CAZAMIA in 1963, which were eventually turned down, according to [redacted] 's file. In 1971, Identity 1 telephoned CAMHISPER to complain about the damage to German interests caused by a TV program about the work of CAMHISPER.

5. Delfs appeared, prior to 11 November, for an interview with [redacted] [redacted]. She reported that Identity 1 knew that she had been fired from the Max Planck Institut in 1963 as a security risk and that she had then worked from 1964 to 1970 at the Swiss Consulate in Hamburg as a secretary. Identity 1 had told Delfs that her close friend, Identity 2, was a Soviet Bloc intelligence agent. Delfs had accompanied Identity 2 on his business trips for ten years, from 1960 to 1970, before breaking up with him when she learned that he is married. Identity 1 claimed that Identity 2 is now in Portugal.

6. In view of these developments, we have not resumed contact with Identity 1 for further assessment of his claims. The danger of serious embarrassment to BKHERALD always present in this case, has been heightened since [redacted] [redacted] 's attention has again been directed to Identity 1, through his own actions. This incident, taken together with his indiscreet remarks in 1972 concerning his BKHERALD contact and his telephone call to CAMHISPER in 1971, demonstrate a desire for personal recognition to a degree which is incompatible with a secure operation. Although we have not dismissed the idea that Identity 1 may indeed have Bloc connections of some worth, we feel that his apparent instability and lack of discretion present risks which are not worth the potential return.

7. Request Headquarters and Station Headquarters traces on Delfs, Daniel and Identity 2. There are no Base traces.

that classes had resumed. On 5 November 1974, CASUSTAIN/15 attended her first language class of the new academic year and met the new teacher, Identity 1. In addition to the basic biographic data contained in Reference B, Identity 1 has mentioned that he has a wife, also a teacher, and an 11-year-old daughter. CASUSTAIN/15's first impressions are that Identity 1 is a good teacher, but is personally rigid and inflexible in comparison with AENOG. He is not willing to enter into the occasional discussions of psychology that intrigued AENOG but, on the other hand, he is interested in CKPOLAR poetry of the Romantic era. His mimeographed handouts show that he writes very clearly and has some talent for sketching. Copies of five of these handouts are forwarded herewith for a handwriting analysis.

4. Like AENOG, Identity 1 must report regularly to CATROJANHORSE. Base files show that Identity 3 is responsible for all CKPOLAR teachers, including Identity 1; however, his name has not been mentioned to CASUSTAIN/15 yet. In November Identity 1 and the other teachers were summoned to Bonn for a meeting but Identity 1 was unwilling to provide the class with any details. Identity 1's primary mission is teaching in a local school. He is singing in a choir, organized by Identity 4, one of CASUSTAIN/15's fellow-students and, as  recently learned from a new contact, Identity 1 is giving private language lessons. He has not shown AENOG's willingness to accept gifts. When he mentioned his family at the class Christmas party, some of the students asked Identity 1 why he didn't bring them to the West and whether he was forbidden to have them with him. Identity 1 became obviously embarrassed but repeated the official CKPOLAR line that schooling was difficult, etc. He will return from Christmas vacation in the CKPOLAR capital on 5 January 1975.

5. Request assignment of crypt and 201 number for Identity 1.

#### Identity 1's Students

6. Most of AENOG's students who have continued lessons with his successor were identified in Reference D. This group now includes Identities 4, 5 and 6. Identity 2, who takes lessons in the beginners' section, became friends with AENOG and is well-placed for continuing access to CKPOLAR teachers in this exchange program. Identity 2 has never explained to CASUSTAIN/15 what caused the long delay between Identity 1's arrival and the beginning of classes. (We believe that the delay was due to political quarrels in the local government over the extent of CKPOLAR influence upon Identity 7, who is the chief promoter of the program.)

7. Identity 8 joined CASUSTAIN/15's advanced course section shortly before AENOG's departure. During the summer of 1974, Identity 8 took a study trip to the CKPOLAR homeland and later described her classes there to CASUSTAIN/15. Although Identity 8 is in close contact with Identity 9, one of the leaders of CAEVIL/Hamburg, she does not appear to have substantially better access to Identity 1 than CASUSTAIN/15.

8. Identity 10, a former member of the beginner's course, took the same study trip as Identity 8. He did not apply himself seriously but still made a considerable hit with the young CKPOLAR students. He startled his teachers by claiming that his frequent absences were due to long conferences with PDQUICK officers. After his return to Hamburg



in August 1974, he attracted attention among his acquaintances by claiming that he was a BKHERALD agent. Identity 10 was among those considered for recruitment as an access agent to AENOG in Spring 1974, but fortunately, no contact was ever made with him. According to Identity 8, he is in touch with an Aeroflot pilot at Hamburg airport. If this is true, the "pilot" is probably Identity 11.

9. CASUSTAIN/15 has not yet been able to obtain the full name of Identity 12, a new student with excellent command of the CKPOLAR language. According to Identity 12, she worked in a CKPOLAR office in Identity 13 for many years before moving to LHDEN and then to West Germany. Her husband is a teacher of CKPOLAR language.

#### Other Contacts

10. CASUSTAIN/15 has heard from her TPFEELING contact only once, when he told her that the usual annual survey would not be taken in 1974 and that he would recontact her in 1975. In response to our requirement, she identified the editor at Deutsche Presse Agentur, Hamburg, responsible for East European affairs as Alfred Bragand. We have discouraged her for the moment from carrying this contact any further because of the primacy of the CKPOLAR target but she believes that this could be done, if called for, through Identity 14, a friend from her TPFEELING years.

11. CASUSTAIN/15 continues her regular translation activities and provides us with copies of her work. She recently looked over a copy of the WOLOIN Soviet edition and pronounced the translations excellent.

#### III. COSTS

12. CASUSTAIN/15 is paid DM 500. per month. Her expenses, incurred in connection with the class, were not more than DM 50. for 1974.

#### IV. PLANS

13. For the immediate future, we intend to continue targeting CASUSTAIN/15 on Identity 1 and on operationally interesting students in these classes. Although CASUSTAIN/15 has not joined CAEVIL/Hamburg, we are able to monitor some developments through her contacts with the other students, who are members. We will continue to encourage CASUSTAIN/15 to make friends among this group of CKPOLAR sympathizers, many of whom are themselves potential access agents.

**A. FAMILY**

1. (16 January 1936, Moscow; not known to Source). Russian. Religion - unknown. Social and economic background - unknown.
2. Nothing known to Source about relatives.
3. Subject is proud of continuing tradition of family names, giving his father's name to his son.

8. To judge by speech, his family is Great Russian.

**B. PRESCHOOL, SCHOOL AND ADOLESCENCE**

1. Subject has never talked about his childhood in Source's presence.
2. Unknown

5. No information on this period of his life.

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**C. MARRIED LIFE AND SEXUAL BEHAVIOR**

1. Subject is married.
2. Subject has only mentioned his wife once, saying that she was waiting at the door of their house when he returned home for leave.
3. One child, age 11, a son, legitimate. Subject is very fond of his son.
4. Unknown
5. Unknown
6. No aggressive tendencies or need to prove himself have been noted. He is very respectful to older women and has not flirted once with younger women in Subject's group.

**D. GENERAL HEALTH**

1. He is in good physical health and has never complained about any ailment.
2. Subject is not hypochondriacal.
3. Amount of sleep needed is unknown. Subject showed a very restrained, modest approach to food available at a Christmas party.
4. At the same party (as 3 above), he took one cup of tea and rum, sipped it very slowly, did not finish the drink, and refused when he was pressed to have another drink. No known use of drugs.
5. Unknown

**E. EMOTIONAL REACTIONS**

1. His usual mood is quiet relaxation. This seldom varies.
2. In an emotional situation, his reaction is a timid grin and an attitude of expectance. He waits for calm and maintains his polite attitude. He does not use gestures.

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3. His reactions are appropriate and never uncontrolled. Source does not find him overcontrolled.
4. Source has never seen him very angry or anxious. He is sad about the separation from his son. Source has never seen him elated.
5. His emotional reaction to stress is passivity, marked by his uncertain smile. Source has not seen him in danger, except for one provocative statement before her group. In making this statement, he remained cool and understated. Under good-natured non-political provocation, he originally reacted with the retreat into himself, but he is now able to reply with humor. Reaction to betrayal is unknown, but Source speculated that he would react to adultery by beating up the adulterer. The government has not been discussed in Source's presence.
6. Unknown. There is no suggestion of "mid-life" crisis.
7. Unknown
8. He does not seem to consider himself "special." There is no suggestion of "Messiah complex" or thought about his role in the system.

F. THOUGHT PROCESSES

1. He has ordinary intelligence and common sense. He is not very intuitive and does not appear to be cunning or shrewd.
2. His acquisition of knowledge is possibly though attentiveness to spoken word. He shows little flexibility in use of written texts and is not creative. His antenna are always up when someone else in the room is speaking, whether to him or not. He has been able to learn some of the native language in addition to his ability at time of arrival.
3. Nothing is known of his fund of knowledge except that he is interested in Russian literature and folklore and seems well informed in these fields.

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2. He is not easily shaken, but he has not been observed under pressure.
3. Unknown.
4. Subject is suggestible, in that he can be sidetracked into a discussion of a new topic, but he usually returns to the previous topic.
5. He does not seem to have very strong scruples. Source remarked that the only time she saw Subject laugh was after another member of the group asked whether Soviet waiters are insulted when offered a tip.
6. Subject could be a brooder.
7. Source believes that he is somewhat opportunistic, but not very manipulative.
8. Physical comforts do not seem very important to him. Clothes are definitely of little interest.
9. Nothing is known of patterns hobbling his performance.
10. He is able to relax. In his free time, he sketches. He has mentioned going for long walks as recreation.

I. RELIGION

1. Religion plays no known part in his life.
2. Unknown
3. He is not superstitious. He is interested in folk songs.

J. POLITICAL

1. He has not shown strong political feelings. He did react very sharply once to the mention of strikes, saying that they were forbidden in the Soviet Union.
2. He has said that his deepest wish is to have his son grow up to be a good citizen of the Motherland. He has a good voice and has vigorously promoted Russian folklore and

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poetry among his German friends. He chooses poems from the Russian Romantics, especially Pushkin. Among the newer poets, his favorite is one who died as a young man in the Second World War. He has never mentioned any of the Soviet leaders by name. He has shown no sign of interest in the dissident writers. In a recent incident, he told Subject in the presence of several other members of her group, some known to be pro-Soviet, that his mail to the Soviet Union went through the Consulate and that all mail in the Soviet Union is censored.

3. He does not discuss the government.

**K. GENERAL**

1. Source finds him typically Russian.
2. Source likes him, is comfortable in his presence, and feels that the original wall of reserve has diminished considerably. He is a good teacher, is polite, balanced, relaxed. He is friendly and has an atmosphere of rest about him. Source is offended by his terrible Soviet clothes. He does not take offense, is not prone to misunderstandings, and will ask for an explanation when he does not understand. His favorite topics would be lyric poetry, folklore, singing, fine arts, and his son.
3. In his appearance, with deep blue eyes, light hair, and round face, Subject could be a North European. From his lack of elegance and his impression of being genuine, he suggests to Source a hardworking mechanic, who has perhaps a shop with five or six people working for him. He seems to be a good father who is in service for his country. In this job, he has met new people, whom he had only read about before. He finds his new acquaintances human and kind and he is not against them personally, but must be because of his job.

STATUS REPORT - CASUSTAIN/15

1. SUMMARY: CASUSTAIN/15's current CKPOLAR target is PDFOG, a CKPOLAR businessman stationed with his wife in Hamburg. CASUSTAIN/15's other assignments are in reporting on local emigre and harbor community.

OPERATIONAL

2. Through two leftist acquaintances, CASUSTAIN/15 has obtained agreement to be introduced to Mrs. PDFOG for exchange of language lessons and conversation, however C/15's friends have not yet followed through. In April 1976, C/15 was told that arrangements were final, but shortly thereafter PDFOG went on vacation and C/15's friends have not arranged a new date in spite of her reminders. We believe this is due to personal problems in her friends' lives, including serious injuries in an auto accident.

3. After completion of her assessment of PDDITCH, a teacher in whom Headquarters expressed very limited interest, we decided that CASUSTAIN/15 should not join CAEVIL/Hamburg. This had been made a condition for continuance of her lessons with PDDITCH, so that she withdrew from the course. She has been able to stay in occasional touch with this circle of CKPOLAR sympathizers.

4. In Autumn 1975, C/15 was contacted by TPFEELING, who asked her to carry out another of her many campaigns of research among Bloc visitors to assess the impact of TPFEELING. This activity brings C/15 into contact with various shopowners and tavernkeepers in the harbor area, who may be of interest in MPMAR operations or in case of a revival of interest in PDGLOBE operations.

5. In addition to these harbor contacts, her long-time TPFEELING stringers keep her in touch with the various emigre communities. In the course of a given campaign, they may interview several hundred Bloc visitors, whose names and positions are made available to her Case Officer. Although these interviews occasionally turn up interesting items of background information, which she reports to TPFEELING, we have not identified any viable operational leads. Local checks were also run on her QTPPOST interviewers, who were mostly newly recruited for TPFEELING in this campaign, but none of them appear to have useful access. In sum, C/15's activity gives the Base a relatively inexpensive and timesaving means of monitoring the local emigre community and Bloc visitors.

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6. Social. In the hope that some of her acquaintances at the social level might have access to economic information, we have instructed C/15 to report on them. She has identified a banker in East Asian trade and a family who took a tourist trip to the PRC in September 1975. Traces and further assessment are in progress to determine the worth of these contacts.

7. Political. A/15 continues her work as a translator of CKPOLAR newspapers on behalf of the CDU/CSU.

8. a. Our first priority is establishment of the contact to the PDFOG family.

b. C/15 has been instructed to continue full reporting of her harbor and emigre contacts, for possible use in MPMAR or Bloc emigre operations.
