SUBJECT: Result of Inspection

TO : Reparations Section, Kyoto Prefectural Government

1. During a recent inspection of the Fushimi Warehouse of Shimadzu Seisakusho K.K. the following discrepancies were discovered:

a. Security measures were not sufficient.

A housing project is being erected within 50 yards of the buildings in which the machines are stored yet no enclosures have been erected around the buildings and only two watchmen are duty during the night.

b. The largest of the buildings has only a few lights which do not provide enough light for proper maintenance of the machines.

2. Recommendations:

a. Erect fences around the warehouse buildings.

b. Install more adequate lighting fixtures either permanent or portable.

1. This office desires to point out that the erroneous release of machinery from Maizuru Naval Arsenal (plant 22-24) was first discovered by the Kyoto Military Government Team and a thorough investigation initiated prior to the arrival of Mr. Rudis.

2. The errors in release of machinery were caused by a misinterpretation as to what constituted dispersed machinery and the confused situation existing in Maizuru as to what actually constituted the Naval Arsenal.

3. These problems were taken up with Mr. Rudis by the Kyoto Military Government Team in order to get his advise and help in straightening out the dispersed machinery releases.

4. This office is still working on establishing the exact status of all machinery in question. As soon as this investigation is finished a complete report of all machines returned to reparations custody and control will be forwarded to your headquarters.
