The FR placed below is a Special Mention made by Shri Jagannath Patnaik, M.P.(Lok Sabha) regarding a house in Kabul where Netaji Subhash Chander Bose had stayed for 40 days after escaping from British internment. The house is now in a dilapidated condition. The Hon'ble M.P. has suggested that the Government of India should acquire the house and after suitable repairs, convert it into a museum.

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2. It may be mentioned that another M.P. Shri Chitta Basu had earlier taken up the matter with Prime Minister, vide his letter dated 12th March, 1986(Flag'B'). The matter had been considered in Prime Minister's Office and it had been decided that we need not take any action(F/'A'). The rationale of the decision was that if we were to acquire houses where our leaders of the past had stayed in different parts of the world, then there would be no end to it.

3. In the context of the foregoing, it is suggested that we adhere to the decision taken earlier in the matter. (At $F/x = J_{S}(AP)$'s notion of 17.6.88.)



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

I am writing with reference to the Special Mention made by you in the Lok Sabha on the 3rd September 1988 regarding the house in Kabul where Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose had spent some time in 1941.

2. While we fully appreciate the sentiments behind your suggestion, we do not think it will be worthwhile to acquire the house in honour of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose. It was not a house in which he stayed permanently; it was only a transit point; and it is doubtful whether many of our nationals will visit Afghanistan in order to see the house, even if we buy and maintain it as a national monument. Further, if we were to acquire houses where our leaders of the past had stayed in different parts of the world, there would be no end to it and, being outside India, they would not really inspire the younger generation. It is best that our national monuments are generally in India itself so that they serve as examples to our people.

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs has drawn the of EAM vide his letter No. 14(2)/89-LEG II dated attention 2nd June, 1989, impressing the necessity of sending expeditious replies to the Members of Parliament in respect of matters raised under Rule 377 in Lok Sabha and by way of Special Mentions in Rajya Sabha. 3. It may be possible that Divisions concerned have already sent their replies to the Member(s) concerned but have not endorsed copies to the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, Secretariat concerned and the Parliament Section. In case replies have been sent to the Members of Parliament, a copy of that communication should be sent to the Parliament Section urgently.

4. In case replies to Members of Parliament are pending, IT HAS BEEN DESIRED that draft replies should be put up to EAM/MOS urgently, and a confirmation to that effect should be sent to the undersigned in respect of each pending item latest by <u>21st June, 1989</u>, in order to enable the undersigned to prepare a draft reply for sending to the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs. It has been desired that the file should be submitted to EAM on <u>23rd June, 1989</u>.
