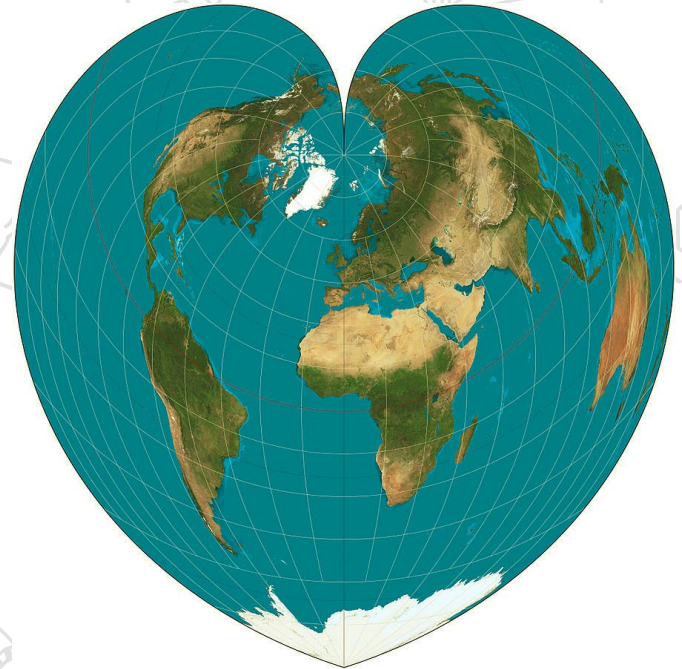

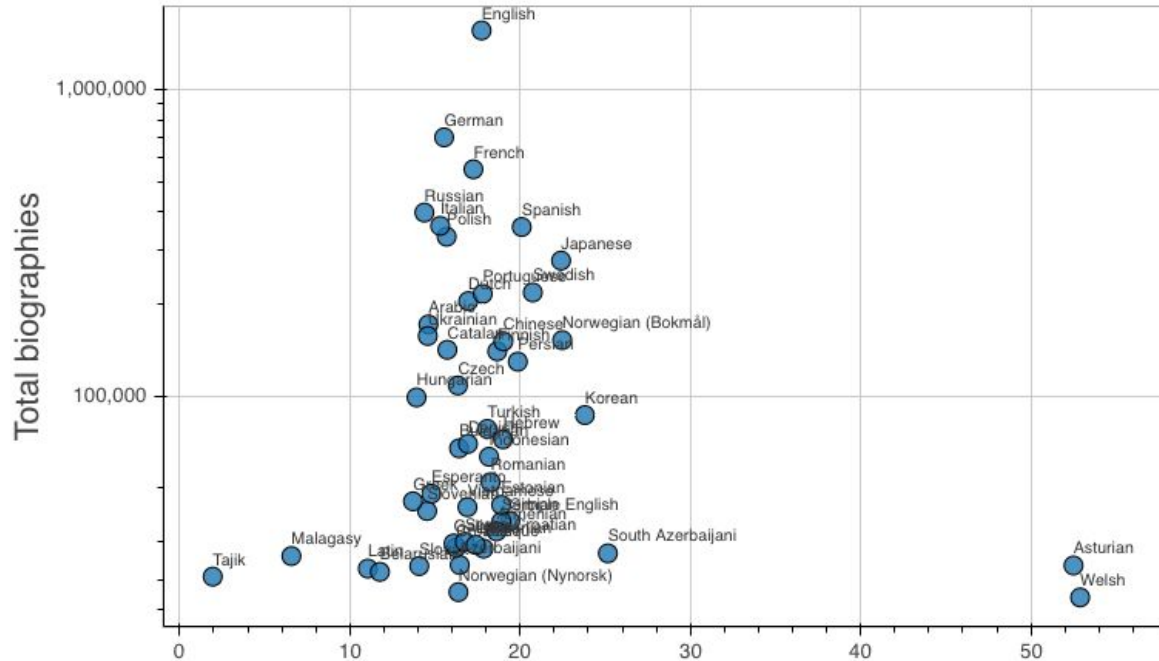

# Gender Diversity Visibility Community User Group



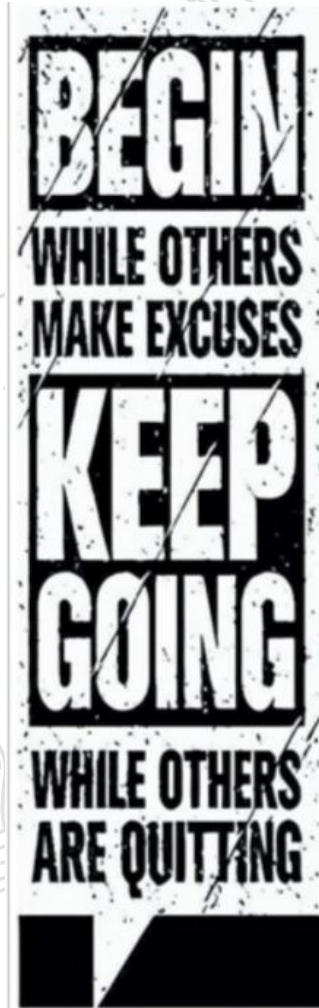
Depicts percentage of women's biographies, by language Wikipedia, as of 21 Nov 2018:

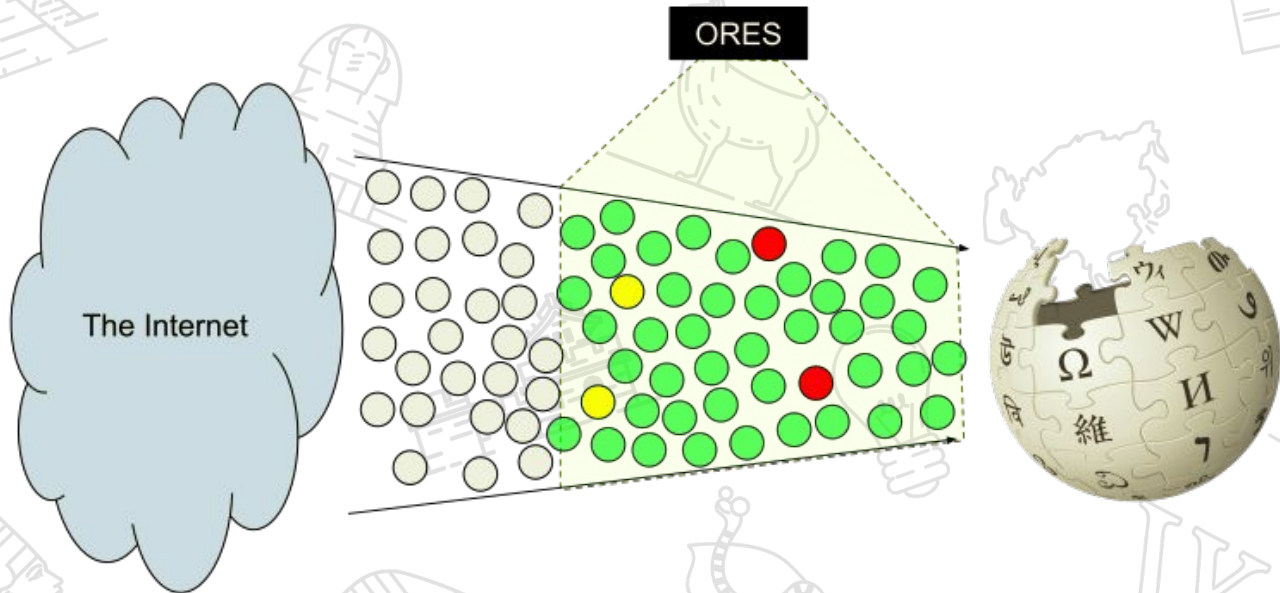
