Friend Richard

We sold your Flour

yesterday to J. W. Hittley at 44/6 the quantity is 71 Bbls all Superfine. We held it at 5/8 and tried most of the Flour dealers and here but one offer of the same price for 100 Bbls. As the Captain would retain it our loss no longer we were under the necessity of either selling or storing.

We have heard of no sales worth of fancy Flour since the price we sold at, and J. J. Smith informed me that he sold yesterday at 44/6.

We called on several grocers but find we could retail at present but a small quantity and that not over 5/8.

We are unable to do better than sell for able on the 2nd inst
