ACAN will not be augmented nor extended solely to accommodate this traffic.

Message will not be transmitted over ACAN facilities which are paralleled by facilities of government to whom message is addressed but will be refiled at point where paralleling commences.

Routing line will show ACAN tributary serving addressee, address group meaning "Communication Liaison Officer for Government of (specified country) at blank" and address group for location of addressee. Examples: UFPG/SKID HURB is routing line for message to Greek Government Athens; UAPKA/SKID PEBO is routing line for Greek Communication Liaison Officer at Seoul.

Address group for Communication Liaison Officers for government of indicated country at blank location assigned as follows: Turkey PKZZ, Canada PLWL, Philippine Republic PLXU, UK POQF, France SJRB, Greece SKID, Australia SLIT.

Accounting symbols for each country, use limited to field force traffic, assigned as follows: Turkey TKX, Greece GCX, Canada CNX, Australia AUX, UK ENX, Philippine Republic PHX, France FRX. This symbol will appear in heading of each message.

Arrange with senior commander each nation listed for designation of Communication Liaison Officer and report names to GHQ, UNC.

Each ACAN Station accepting this traffic will keep log of messages filed by each nation and the file of original messages will be forwarded monthly to GHQ, UNC, not later than the 5th day of each month. This service may be extended to other nations whose forces have been accepted for military assistance by the US Government upon application to GHQ, UNC. Military attaches at seats of governments listed nations being advised by DEPTAR.

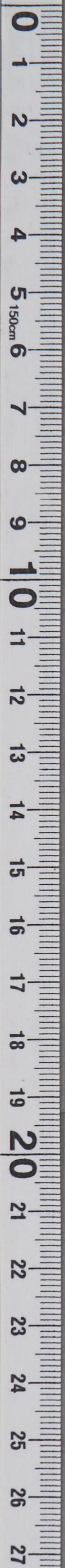

NOTE FOR RECORD:

1. Message 32095 from USAIRAT Ankara, Turkey to DEPTAR, Wash, D. C., information CINCFE stated Turks in Korea were refused use of US Army facilities and forced to use commercial communications from Korea at considerable expense. Further stated that in view of this policy Korea, Turkish General Staff has demand that US Joint Office stop use Turkish radio facilities presently available to them. Based on this development, DA was requested to reconsider present policy regarding handling of official messages from Korea to home governments by UN Forces in Korea.
2. DEPTAR message W 97444 to CINCFE directed that official messages between field forces of UN nations in Korea be accepted for transmission over ACAN facilities subject to various stipulations outlined.
3. Part I of context informs DEPTAR that Turks were offered the same privileges as were allowed the other contributing nations and that according to the present policy, Turkish messages could be sent free of charge between Korea and Japan and hence refiled commercially from Tokyo.
4. Part II of context informs DA that necessary action is being taken to implement the instructions set forth in referenced message.

Propose activate high freq program relay station 30 kilo-watts beamed from Tokyo on 290 degrees for Seoul and North Korea, frequencies and schedules effective 22 Nov as follows: 6175 kilocycles from 2200 to 2400 and from 0800 to 1430 GMT; 11800 kilocycles from 2400 to 0800 GMT.

From 2200 to 1200 GMT this station to be employed for AFRS program relay. Basis this use is poor reception in North Korea of stateside feeder stations and inability Korean AFRS originate own news programs as well as cover all troop areas.

From 1200 to 1430 GMT station to carry Korean language programs prepared by CINCPAC psychological warfare. This portion of schedule already in effect having been activated as operational support requirement employing frequency 6175 kilocycles already used daytime only by Japan Broadcasting Corporation. Programs from 1200 to 1330 GMT are rebroadcast by Pyongyang and Seoul medium and high frequency stations.

Frequency 11800 kilocycles was employed for MacArthur's special ultimatum broadcasts to North Koreans 1 Oct and 9 Oct. This freq was previously cleared urmsg W 83860 DTG 081704Z June for international broadcasting by Japan, activation of which now being held in abeyance.

Rqst comments para one above noting importance of both AFRS and Korean language uses. This program relay service temporary but not possible predict exact duration.

NFR:

1. Subject station was readied on short notice in order to carry the first of MacArthur's ultimatum broadcasts to the North Koreans 1 Oct. This daytime broadcast was aired on 11800 kc/s, which had been cleared with DA for Japanese international broadcasting. On the same date this station began regular nighttime relays of Korean language programs, employing for this purpose 6175 kc/s, a freq already used by BCJ daytime only.
2. Because of doubts as to propagation on 6175 kc/s, formal authorization of this freq was delayed pending completion of tests on 4910 kc/s. The higher freq has now been proved to be superior for purposes of rebroadcast in North Korea.
3. Originally, it was intended that 11800 kc/s would be authorized merely to cover any special requirements for a daytime frequency such as the ultimatum broadcasts. However, on 14 November TI&E urgently requested assistance in providing facilities for relaying AFRS programs to Seoul and N. Korea. It was thereupon decided to use subject station for AFRS relays throughout the day and during nighttime hours not already employed by G-2 for Korean language programming.
4. Authorization to the RRC now being processed provides for an "international high frequency program relay station", to be operated on 6175 and 11800 kc/s with schedule and direction of transmission as specified by SCAP.
5. Schedule as stated in above radio will be effected 22 Nov; this is deemed safe in view of past use of 6175 and past clearance of 11800 kc/s as well as in view of BCJ monitoring reports. The latter indicate that these frequencies are clear, with no strong signal being received in this area except for a short period in the afternoon when a BBC broadcast (believed to be a New Delhi origination beamed to New Zealand) is monitored R 2-3.
6. In view of the full schedule to be activated, it is nevertheless urgent that DA be informed of the contemplated uses for avoidance of future interference and to obtain up-to-date DA views.
7. Use of Japanese facilities involved in subject station is being covered by contracts with JLCOM.

It is requested that the following communication be transmitted to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Republic of Korea: Subject is Radio Frequencies for Reactivation of Former International and Internal Radio Communication Facilities of the Republic of Korea.

"It is recognized that as more and more of South Korea is liberated and returned by the United Nations Command to the Republic of Korea for Civil Administration, the Ministry of Communications may wish to re-establish essential domestic and international radio communications at the earliest possible date. In this respect, reactivation of the former Seoul-San Francisco radiotelephone and radiotelegraph service is already in process. Frequencies formerly used on this circuit have been protected by General Headquarters, United Nations Command to allow reactivation when the military situation permitted.

"Also in process is the establishment of Seoul-Tokyo radiotelephone and radiotelegraph service. Frequencies for this circuit have been provided by the Commanding General, United Nations Command on a temporary basis pending such time that a suitable complement of frequencies may be selected and cleared by the Republic of Korea.

"In view of the fact that the overall military effort in Korea continues to require a large number of frequencies to provide essential radio communications for the United Nations, ground, air and Naval Forces and considering the congestion that exists in the radio spectrum due to worldwide expansion of radio communications and in the interest of providing interference free communication to the greatest extent practicable, it would be mutually beneficial that the Republic of Korea coordinate with General Headquarters United Nations Command, any frequencies proposed for reactivation by the Ministry of Communications, Korea.

"As the military situation permits, reallocation of the United Nations Command radio frequency uses will be made to permit reactivation of essential former internal radio uses of the Republic of Korea. It would be appreciated, therefore, if the Ministry of Communications, Korea, would advise General Headquarters, United Nations Command, sufficiently in advance of proposed radio frequency reactivations to permit re-allocation of any uses affected or the selection of suitable alternate frequencies pending such time as reallocation may take place.

"The Frequency Allocation Panel, General Headquarters, United Nations Command, will, when required, perform any necessary coordination on frequency matters with the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Far East Command.

3. At present, there is no direct military means of signal communications between Formosa and Korea. CW circuit facilities were recently established between Formosa and GHQ, and relay can be effected to landline and radio tty circuits from Tokyo to Korea.

4. In accordance with instructions from Gen Back, Chinese Mission in Japan was contacted thru DS (Mr Lee) to find out their estimated traffic volume between Formosa and Korea. Mr Lee advises one (1) msg per day, averaging less than 100 word groups per day.

5. In Check Sheet to C/S, 11 Aug 50, we recommended approval of the request of the Chinese Gov't, provided their messages were handled by the AG in the usual manner. We also attached a draft of instant for approval by the Chief of Staff.

6. Instant message was approved for dispatch on 16 August 1950, by the Chief of Staff.

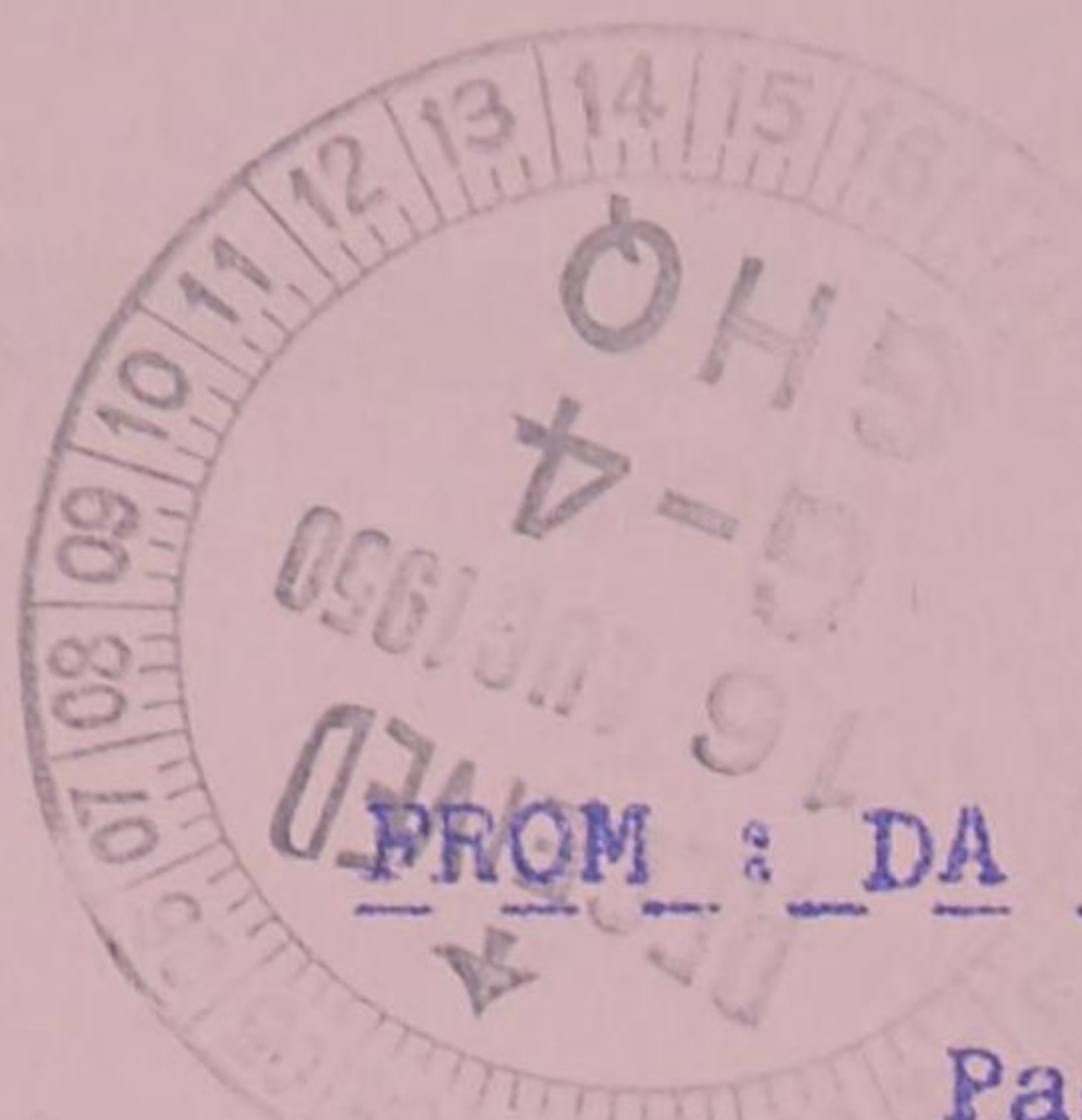

1. Following policy established hereby under Joint Communications-Electronics Committee for assignment of radio freqs within commands of CINCPAC, CINCFE, CINCAL, CINCARIB and CINCLANT effective 1 Sep 1950:

A. Inter-command communications or intra-command communications where interference, current or foreseeable, may result: CINCPAC, CINCFE, CINCAL, CINCARIB and CINCLANT will present requirements to Freq Allocation Panel, Joint Communications Electronics Committee with necessary date; indicate whether terminal will be Army, Navy or AF operated; when practicable, nominate from local knowledge suitable freqs giving due consideration to existing assignments, priorities and executive order freq listings to agencies. Freq Allocation Panel will effect necessary coordination and then designate freqs together with max emission, power and other limitations which may not be exceeded without further reference.

B. Intra-command communications where interference to other users is not likely: CINCPAC, CINCFE, CINCAL, CINCARIB and CINCLANT may assign appropriate freqs without reference to Freq Allocation Panel, Joint Communications-Electronics Committee. Such assignments by CINCPAC, CINCFE, CINCAL, CINCARIB and CINCLANT on a strict non-interference basis with non-priority rights must be adjusted when necessary to accommodate new reqmts for other military or non-military assignments. 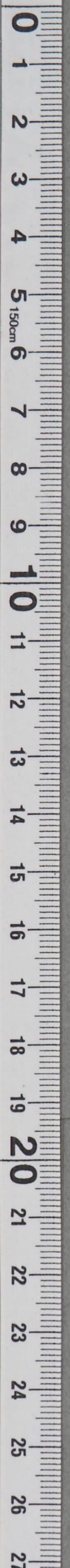

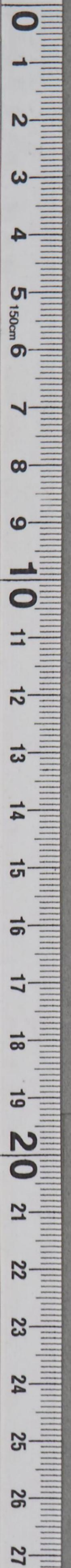

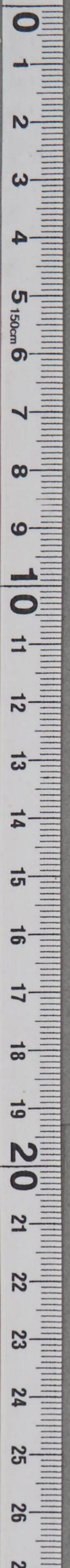

1. TCSFP 17542 - ANSIA of 26 Jul 50, states "View crypto backlog request info of adequacy night message precedence now assigned Radio Departure Reports for Far East cargo and passengers. If not adequate what precedence desired for each destination area?"

2. "Night message precedence" is an old designation corresponding to DEFERRED. Files of radio departure reports for the past month indicate considerable delays are being experienced in receipt of reports. According to OSPRO, these reports should be made within 24 hours after the ship sails. SFPE msg TCSFP 4626 GO, 29 Jul 50 indicates classified msgs both in and out are being delayed from 24 to 72 hours by 6th A Comm Center because of backlog crypto work. However this does not account for all of the time lag between ship departure time and receipt of report by CINCPAC.

3. WOJG Schutte (AG Radio & Cable) suggested that the reports should be given precedence not more than ROUTINE and agreed that our outgoing msg should mention the slow transmission time. It is believed that improvements in reporting can be made by more expeditious processing thru and by ANSIA.

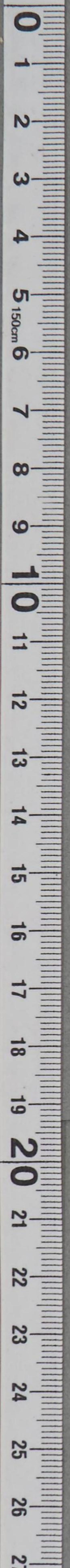

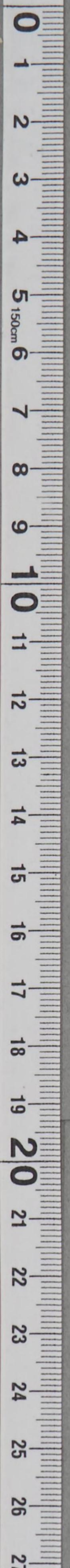
