Cumulative Report on Rescissions and Deferrals

April 1, 1981.

This report is submitted in fulfillment of the requirements of Section 1014(e) of the Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (Pub. L. 93-344). Section 1014(e) provides for a monthly report listing all budget authority for this fiscal year with respect to which, as of the first day of the month, a special message has been transmitted to the Congress.

This month's report gives the status as of April 1, 1981 of 155 rescissions and 104 deferrals contained in the first eight special messages for FY 1981. These messages were transmitted to the Congress on October 1 and December 2,

1980, January 15 and 29, February 13, March 10, 17, and 19, 1981.

Rescissions (Table A and Attachment A)

Rescission proposals totalling \$14,756.0 million are currently pending before the Congress. Table A summarizes the status of rescissions proposed by the President as of April 1, 1981, while Attachment A shows the history and status of each rescission proposed during FY 1981.

Deferrals (Table B and Attachment B)

As of April 1, 1981, \$4,999.2 million in 1981 budget authority was being deferred from obligation and another \$11.2 million in 1981 obligations was being deferred from expenditure. Attachment B shows the history and status of each deferral reported during FY 1981.
