1. It is requested that the Nara Military Government Team be supplied with a direct telephone line from the Jackson Switchboard to its office.

2. It has become increasingly difficult and, at times impossible, to maintain satisfactory telephonic communication with the Kinki Military Government Region Headquarters at the Daiken Building. Many times during the course of an important conversation the line fades, or the connection is broken completely, and it is frequently impossible to again contact the person with whom the conversation was being carried on.

3. It is felt that the nature of the work being carried on by this organization and the necessity for direct contact with the Kinki Military Government Region Headquarters warrants consideration and approval of this request.

2. This headquarters over a period of 15 months frequently has been disturbed by the situation described in paragraph 2, above. Since it has been desirable on many occasions to reach Nara Military Government Team to relay instructions and information on important visitors or business, the unsatisfactory situation frequently worked great hardship on personnel and diminished the efficiency thereof.

3. Since no alteration of these conditions may be foreseen recommend that request in basic communication be approved



1. In accordance with instructions contained in letter Headquarters Kinki Military Government Region file number 676.3 dated 30 November 1946 it is the duty of this Military Government Team to inspect all radio stations in our area twice a year.

2. When a call was made recently at the meteorological station located at 104 Matsushima, Tsuruga-shi for the purpose of inspecting the radio apparatus a sign was observed which read as follows -  
"1. This area is off limits to Allied personnel, military and civilian, except by authority of the CO, 43rd Weather Wing, APO 925 (Meiji Building) Tokyo. 2. All requests for weather forecasts, climatological data, oceanographic studies, seismographic data, and other information will be directed to Adjutant, 43rd Weather Wing, Room 342 Meiji Building (Tel. Meiji 478) Tokyo. 3. Operational and technical jurisdiction of this facility delegated to CO, 43rd Weather Wing per letter GHQ, AFPAC: AG 000.93 (18th Jan 1946) GC and par 1-e, Occupation instruction No. 4 GHQ SCAP: 20th Sept 1946. Because of the sign the station was not entered.

3. Request is made for information whether or not it is desired that an inspection be made of this station and if so that permission to do so be obtained from the Commanding Officer of the 43rd Weather Wing Tokyo.
