One of the planes scheduled for this foray was prevented from taking off at the last minute as a result of an hydraulic leak. The pilots were briefed to release the Napalm over growing gardens and to conduct a routine fighter sweep around the Northern Palau's.

About 200 ft. off shore at TA 912 Love two individuals in small boats were strafed and killed. The rowboats were riddled. The men appeared to be searching for clams. Other than this the "sweep" was uneventful.

All map references used in this report are the "Special Air and Gunnery Target Map" of the Palau's, scale 1: 20,000.
