

### Preface

The CATOLOG OF COPYRIGHT ENTRIES is published by authority of sections 210 and 211 of Title 17 of the *United States Code*. Section 210 provides in part: "The current catalog of copyright entries and the index volumes herein provided for shall be admitted in any court as prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein as regards any copyright registration."

The Catalog is subdivided to represent the classes of material listed in section 5 of said Title 17. The table at the end of this preface shows the organization of the Catalog, the symbols used with the registration numbers to distinguish the classes, and the prices of the semiannual issues. The annual subscription for each part is twice the price of a single issue and the complete catalog, including all parts, may be secured on a subscription basis for \$20 a year.

The record of each copyright registration listed in the Catalog includes a description of the work copyrighted and data relating to the copyright claim (the name of the copyright claimant, as given in the application for registration, the copyright date, the copyright registration number, etc.). Available information in the records of the Copyright Office, including information relating to subsequent changes of ownership, can be obtained upon request and upon payment to the Register of Copyrights of the fee specified in section 215 of said Title 17 (\$3 for each hour of time consumed) for the conduct of a search of the records.

In the case of each registration listed, except for renewals, the deposit of a copy (or copies) of the work has been made in accordance with the provisions contained in sections 12, 13, or 215 of said Title 17, or, in the case of published three-dimensional works of art, there has been compliance with section 13 of said Title 17, which provides for the deposit of identifying reproductions in lieu of the work itself. Foreign works, two copies of which

were deposited with a catalog card and application for registration under the waiver-of-fee provision in section 215 of Title 17 of the *United States Code*, are indicated by a zero immediately following the alphabetical symbol in the registration number.

Orders, payable in advance, for all parts of the Catalog of Copyright Entries should be sent directly to the Register of Copyrights, Library of Congress, Washington 25, D. C. Orders may be placed for individual issues, as subscriptions for one or more parts, or for the complete Catalog, and for periods of one or more years. All orders should state clearly the title and the inclusive dates of the part wanted. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the Register of Copyrights.

The Copyright Office welcomes inquiries, suggestions and comments on the content and organization of the Catalog. Such communications should be addressed to the Chief of the Cataloging Division, Copyright Office, Library of Congress, Washington 25, D. C.

#### Table of Organization

Each part listed in the table records all current registrations in the class or classes indicated by the alphabetical symbols given. In each case the first letter of the symbol is that of the class under which registration is made; the second, if any, is a designation added by the Copyright Office for the purposes of statistical analysis. A zero immediately following the symbol (e. g., AFO, EFO) distinguishes a foreign work deposited under the waiver-of-fee provision. The symbol R does not represent a class designated by the copyright law, but has been adopted by the Copyright Office to distinguish renewal copyright registrations. These are recorded in a separate section of those parts of the Catalog which cover the classes in which the works were originally

registered. Some parts also contain registrations made under other symbols if the subject matter or type of material is similar to that generally included in the part.	semannu issue

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#### INTRODUCTION

PARTS 3-4 list dramas, dramatico-musicals, lectures, sermons, monologs, and radio, television, and recording scripts registered in Classes C and D. Selected published dramas currently registered in Class A are also included for the convenience of the user.

Arrangement is by title. Each work is described in a main entry which includes information pertinent to the copyright claim. References lead from variant titles, from distinctive subtitles, and from other titles associated with the work. Works for which the subsisting copyright has been renewed are listed separately in the Renewal Registrations section.

The Name Index to the names of authors, editors, claimants, etc. given in the main entries covers both currently registered works and renewal registrations, the latter being distinguished by the symbol "R" following the title. Reference is made from each name to the titles under which the main entries are to be found. When the name is that of a claimant, the copyright symbol © follows the title.

For unpublished works currently registered, the main entry includes the following items if available and applicable:

- 1) Title.
- 2) Descriptive phrase indicating the character of the work; e. g., a play in three acts.
- 3) Names of persons contributing to the work as given in either the copy or the application; e. g., author, editor, translator.
- 4) Series statement.
- 5) Information given in the application which relates to the registration of an earlier version of the work.
- 6) Brief statement of the new matter on which copyright is claimed, preceded by the

abbreviation "NM," if this information is given in the application and is not indicated elsewhere in the entry.

- 7) Copyright symbol ©.
- 8) Name of the copyright claimant.
- 9) Date on which the last of all the items required to complete registration (i. e., copy, application, and fee) was received in the Copyright Office.
- 10) Registration number.

For published works currently registered, the main entry includes the following items if available and applicable:

- 1) Title.
- 2) Names of persons or agencies contributing to the work (authors, editors, compilers, etc.).
- 3) Edition statement.
- 4) Name of the publisher of works published in the United States when the publisher is not also the claimant; for works published outside the United States, place of publication and name of the publisher.
- 5) Number of acts, scenes, or volumes.
- 6) Series statement.
- 7) Names of authors given in the application which do not appear elsewhere in the entry.
- 8) Name of the employer in the case of a work made for hire, if so named in the application, together with the name of the employees when given.
- 9) Information contained in the application which relates to the registration of an earlier version of the work.
- 10) Brief statement of the new matter on which copyright is claimed, preceded by the

abbreviation "NM," if this information is given in the application and is not indicated elsewhere in the entry.

- 11) Copyright symbol ©.
- 12) Name of the copyright claimant.
- 13) Date of publication as given in the applica-
- 14) Registration number.

For radio and television scripts, both published and unpublished, the following items are given if available and applicable:

- 1) A descriptive phrase indicating the type of program.
- 2) Names of authors or agencies responsible for the program.
- 3) Subtitles, issue dates, and program numbers. For published works, whenever it is necessary to indicate a variation between the information given in the application and the copy of the work with respect to the claimant's name or the date of publication, the data from the application are given first, followed by the phrase "in notice" and the data given in the work; e. g., © Richard Roe; 12 Jan 57 (in notice: 1956); DP2450.

Works deposited in connection with copyright registration may be selected for inclusion in the collections of the Library of Congress. Library of Congress printed cards are available for many of the published works so selected. Orders for such cards or inquiries concerning them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, Washington 25, D. C.

For renewal registrations, the main entry includes the following items of information if available and applicable:

- 1) Title.
- 2) Names of authors of renewable matter.
- 3) Edition statement.
- 4) Number of acts, scenes, or volumes.
- 5) Series statement.
- 6) Brief statement of new matter on which the original copyright was based, preceded by the abbreviation "NM," if available in the renewal application.
- 7) Copyright symbol ©.
- 8) Date of original copyright.
- 9) Original registration number.
- 10) Name of the renewal claimant followed by a statement in parentheses, usually in

abbreviated form, giving the basis of the renewal claim as supplied by the claimant; e. g., "John Doe (NK)" indicates that renewal of copyright is claimed by John Doe as next of kin of the deceased author

- 11) Date of receipt of the renewal application or fee, whichever is later.
- 12) Renewal registration number.



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# Preface

The CATALOG OF COPYRIGHT ENTRIES is published by authority of sections 210 and 211 of Title 17 of the *United States Code*. Section 210 provides in part: "The current catalog of copyright entries and the index volumes herein provided for shall be admitted in any court as prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein as regards any copyright registration."

The Catalog is subdivided to represent the classes of material listed in section 5 of said Title 17. The table at the end of this preface shows the organization of the Catalog, the symbols used with the registration numbers to distinguish the classes, and the prices of the semiannual issues. The annual subscription for each part is twice the price of a single issue and the complete catalog, including all parts, may be secured on a subscription basis for \$20 a year.

The record of each copyright registration listed in the Catalog includes a description of the work copyrighted and data relating to the copyright claim (the name of the copyright claimant, as given in the application for registration, the copyright date, the copyright registration number, etc.). Available information in the records of the Copyright Office, including information relating to subsequent changes of ownership, can be obtained upon request and upon payment to the Register of Copyrights of the fee specified in section 215 of said Title 17 (\$3 for each hour of time consumed) for the conduct of a search of the records.

Orders, payable in advance, for all parts of the Catalog of Copyright Entries should be sent directly to the Register of Copyrights, Library of Congress, Washington 25, D. C. Orders may be placed for individual issues, as subscriptions for one or more parts, or for the complete Catalog, and for periods of one or more years. All orders should state clearly the title and the inclusive dates of the part wanted. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the Register of Copyrights.

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## INTRODUCTION

PARTS 3-4 list dramas, dramatico-musicals, lectures, sermons, monologs, and radio, television, and recording scripts registered in Classes C and D. Selected published dramas currently registered in Class A are also included for the convenience of the user.

Arrangement is by title. Each work is described in a main entry which includes information pertinent to the copyright claim. References lead from variant titles, from distinctive subtitles, and from other titles associated with the work. Works for which the subsisting copyright has been renewed are listed separately in the Renewal Registrations section.

The Name Index to the names of authors, editors, claimants, etc. given in the main entries covers both currently registered works and renewal registrations, the latter being distinguished by the symbol "R" following the title. Reference is made from each name to the titles under which the main entries are to be found. When the name is that of a claimant, the copyright symbol © follows the title.

For unpublished works currently registered, the main entry includes the following items if available and applicable:

- 1) Title.
- 2) Descriptive phrase indicating the character of the work; e. g., a play in three acts.
- 3) Names of persons contributing to the work as given in either the copy or the application; e. g., author, editor, translator.
- 4) Series statement.
- 5) Information given in the application which relates to the registration of an earlier version of the work.
- 6) Brief statement of the new matter on which copyright is claimed, preceded by the abbreviation "NM," if this information

is given in the application and is not indicated elsewhere in the entry.

- 7) Copyright symbol ©.
- 8) Name of the copyright claimant.
- 9) Date on which the last of all the items required to complete registration (i. e., copy, application, and fee) was received in the Copyright Office.
- 10) Registration number.

For published works currently registered, the main entry includes the following items if available and applicable:

- 1) Title.
- 2) Names of persons or agencies contributing to the work (authors, editors, compilers, etc.).
- 3) Edition statement.
- 4) Name of the publisher of works published in the United States when the publisher is not also the claimant; for works published outside the United States, place of publication and name of the publisher.
- 5) Number of acts, scenes, or volumes.
- 6) Series statement.
- 7) Names of authors given in the application which do not appear elsewhere in the entry.
- 8) Name of the employer in the case of a work made for hire, if so named in the application, together with the name of the employees when given.
- 9) Information contained in the application which relates to the registration of an earlier version of the work.
- 10) Brief statement of the new matter on which copyright is claimed, preceded by the abbreviation "NM," if this information

is given in the application and is not indicated elsewhere in the entry.

11) Copyright symbol ©.

12) Name of the copyright claimant.

- 13) Date of publication as given in the applica-
- 14) Registration number.

For radio and television scripts, both published and unpublished, the following items are given if available and applicable:

1) A descriptive phrase indicating the type of

program.

2) Names of authors or agencies responsible for the program.

3) Subtitles, issue dates, and program numbers. For published works, whenever it is necessary to indicate a variation between the information given in the application and the copy of the work with respect to the claimant's name or the date of publication, the data from the application are given first, followed by the phrase "in notice" and the data given in the work; e. g., © Richard Roe; 12 Jan 57 (in notice: 1956); DP2450.

Works deposited in connection with copyright registration may be selected for inclusion in the collections of the Library of Congress. Library of Congress printed cards are available for many of the published works so selected. Orders for such cards or inquiries concerning them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, Washington 25, D. C.

For renewal registrations, the main entry includes the following items of information if available and applicable:

1) Title.

- 2) Names of authors of renewable matter.
- 3) Edition statement.
- 4) Number of acts, scenes, or volumes.
- 5) Series statement.
- 6) Brief statement of new matter on which the original copyright was based, preceded by the abbreviation "NM," if available in the renewal application.
- 7) Copyright symbol ©.
- 8) Date of original copyright.
- 9) Original registration number.
- 10) Name of the renewal claimant followed by a statement in parentheses, usually in

abbreviated form, giving the basis of the renewal claim as supplied by the claimant; e. g., "John Doe (NK)" indicates that renewal of copyright is claimed by John Doe as next of kin of the deceased author.

- 11) Date of receipt of the renewal application or fee, whichever is later.
- 12) Renewal registration number.
