## Coroners (Salaries) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1974

Made . . . . . 12th June 1974

Coming into operation . . . . . 15th July 1974

To be laid before Parliament

RULES, DATED 12TH JUNE 1974, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 36 OF THE CORONERS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1959 AND SECTION 18 OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1962.

In pursuance of section 36(1)(a) of the Coroners Act (Northern Ireland) 1959(a) read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), I hereby make, after consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service(c), the following Rules:—

*Citation and commencement*

1.—(1) These Rules may be cited as the Coroners (Salaries) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1974.

(2) These Rules shall come into operation on 15th July 1974 and shall have effect as from 30th June 1972.

*Salaries of Coroners*

2. The annual salary payable to a Coroner appointed for a district set out in column 1 of the Schedule shall be the amount specified in column 2 as from the 30th June 1972, and that specified in column 3 as from the 30th June 1973, and shall be inclusive of any travelling, subsistence, telephone and out-of-pocket expenses incurred by him in the course of his duty as Coroner.

*Salaries of Deputy Coroners*

3. The annual salary payable to a Deputy Coroner shall be one-twelfth the annual salary (determined in accordance with Rule 2) of the Coroner whose deputy he is, and shall be inclusive of any travelling, subsistence, telephone and out-of-pocket expenses incurred by him in the course of his duty as Deputy Coroner.

*Salary of Coroner's Officer for City of Belfast*

4. The annual salary of the Coroner's Officer for the City of Belfast shall be:—

£1,196, as from 30th June 1972;

£1,258, as from 1st September 1973;

£1,470, as from 7th November 1973;

£1,587, as from 1st January 1974.
