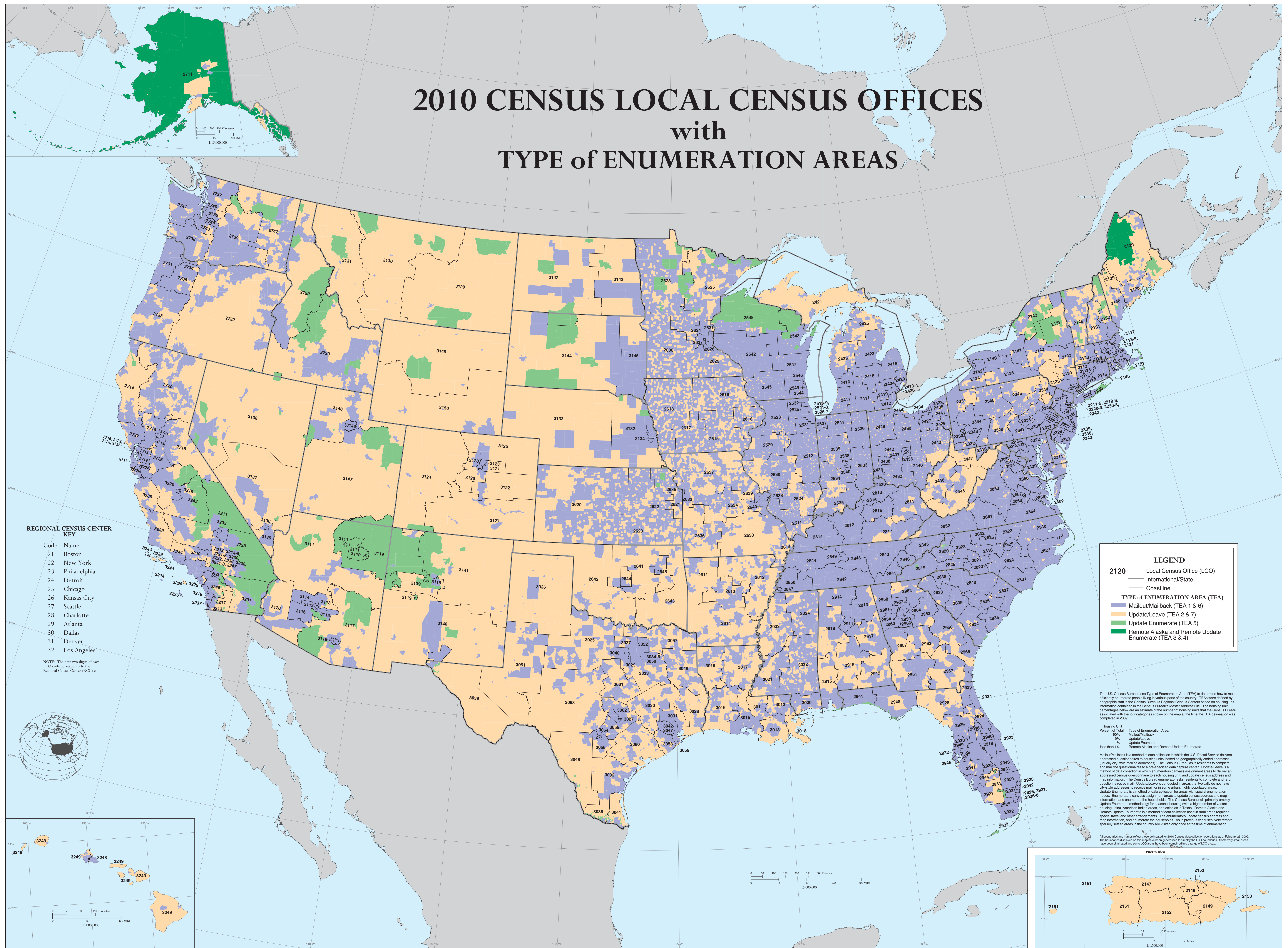

The U.S. Census Bureau uses Type of Enumeration Area (TEA) to determine how to most efficiently enumerate people living in various parts of the country. TEAs were defined by geographic staff at the Census Bureau's Regional Census Center based on housing unit information contained in the Census Bureau's Master Address File. The housing unit percentages below are an estimate of the number of housing units that the Census Bureau associated with the four categories shown on the map at the time the TEA delineation was completed in 2008.

Mailout/Mailback is a method of data collection in which the U.S. Postal Service delivers addressed questionnaires to housing units. Based on geographically coded addresses (usually city-style mailing addresses), the Census Bureau asks residents to complete and mail the questionnaires to a pre-specified data capture center. Update/Leave is a method of data collection in which enumerators canvass assignment areas to deliver an addressed census questionnaire to each housing unit, and update census address and map information. The Census Bureau enumerates sparse residents to complete and return questionnaires by mail. Update/Leave is conducted in areas that typically do not have city-style addresses to receive mail, or in some urban, highly populated areas.

Update Enumerate is a method of data collection for areas with special enumeration needs. Enumerators canvass assignment areas to update census address and map information, and enumerate the households. The Census Bureau will primarily employ Update Enumerate methodology for seasonal housing (with a high number of vacant housing units), American Indian areas, and colonies in Texas. Remote Alaska and Remote Update Enumerate is a method of data collection used in rural areas requiring special travel and other arrangements. The enumerators update census address and map information, and enumerate the households. As in previous censuses, very remote, sparsely settled areas in the country are visited only once at the time of enumeration.

All boundaries and codes reflect data delivered for 2010 Census data collection operations as of February 23, 2009. The boundaries displayed on this map have been generalized to simplify the LCO boundaries. Some very small areas have been eliminated and some LCOs that have been combined into a single LCO area.
