

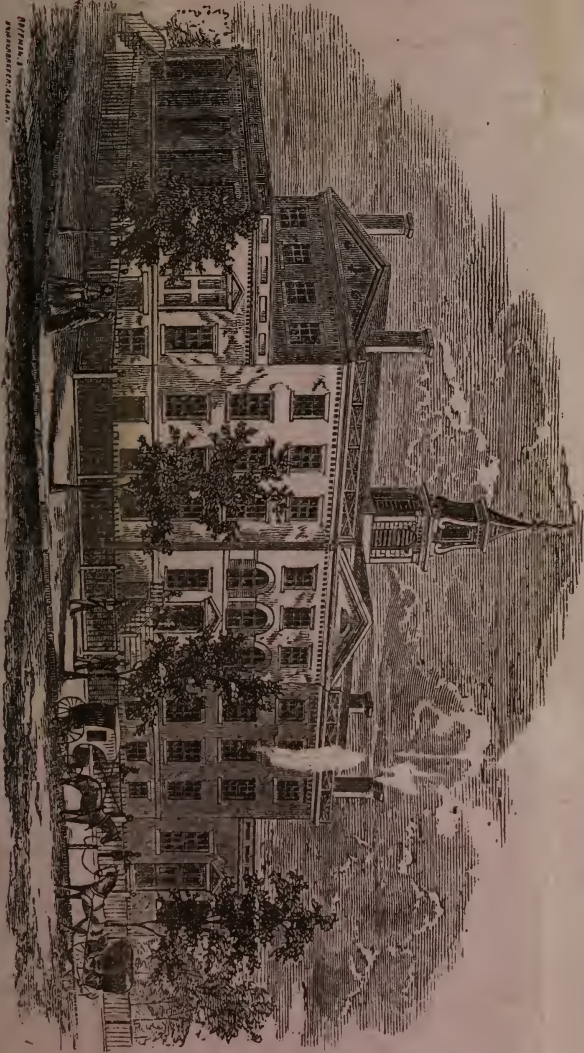

CIRCULAR FOR 1870.

The next term commences on the FIRST TUESDAY IN SEPTEMBER, and continues sixteen weeks. Degrees are conferred at the close of the term.

The COLLEGE edifice is spacious, commodious, and pleasantly situated near the Hospital and other public buildings. The Lecture Rooms, working Laboratory, Anatomical Theatre, and Dissecting Rooms, the halls for Museum and Library, combine all the requisites for medical and surgical instructions.

Museum.

The Museum, in the variety of its specimens, both natural and morbid, in the number of its rare and valuable preparations, and in the abundant means which it furnishes for practical illustration, is not surpassed by any in this country.

It contains the valuable morbid specimens accumulated during the long course of surgical practice of the late Prof. March, sufficiently numerous to form a very large Museum of Pathological Anatomy.

It contains Prof. McNaughton's valuable Collections accumulated during twenty years' connection with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Western New York. Also the extensive and valuable Anatomical Collections of Prof. Armsby, embracing a great variety of vascular, nervous and other preparations, which have been accumulating for 35 years.

The casts, plates, models and morbid specimens, in the museum are very numerous, comprising most of the valuable pathological models of Thibert, and of others skilled in this branch of art.

No College in the country affords more extensive means for illustrating anatomical structures and the various form of disease. The Museum is at all times open to students, and the specimens and preparations are so arranged as to afford opportunities for study and illustration.

THE CHEMICAL APPARATUS is extensive and complete, enabling the professor to exhibit all the experiments illustrative of the powers that influence chemical action. The application of chemistry to medicine is made a special object throughout the course.

The LECTURES on Materia Medica are illustrated by specimens of all the known remedies.

The LIBRARY numbers nearly 5,000 volumes, a portion of which is appropriated to the use of students during the lecture term. No fee is charged for the use of books to those who have matriculated. *Students are advised to furnish themselves with one good text book in each department.*

Text Books.

Obstetrics — Churchill, Byford, Ramsbotham, Cazeaux, Bedford, Meigs, Hodge, Thomas, Grailly, Hewitt.

Physiology — Carpenter, Dalton, Flint, Todd, Bowman, and Marshall.

Medical Jurisprudence — Beck, Taylor, Dean, Ordroneaux.

Practical Chemistry.

The WORKING LABORATORY, under the charge of the Professor of Chemistry, is open for students throughout the year.

Each student in this department has a table and chemicals for his use, and is furnished with all the necessary apparatus.

Laboratory tickets, \$10. Students are charged for breakage and chemicals used by themselves.

The chemical class is so arranged as not to interfere with the time of lectures and other College exercises during the lecture course.

Practical Anatomy.

The DISSECTING ROOMS are open during the term, under the charge of the Professors of Anatomy, and ample opportunities are furnished for dissection.

The dissecting ticket is \$5. Abundant supply of material for dissection is furnished on the most reasonable terms.

Clinical Instruction.

Saturday of every week is devoted to surgical operations, a great variety of surgical cases are presented to the class.

Clinical lectures are delivered regularly in the Hospital, in surgery, medicine and obstetrics.

The Professor of Surgery will give advice and perform surgical operations gratuitously on Saturday at the College or Hospital between the hours of 10 A. M. and 2 P. M.

The great advantages derived from these clinics consist in the intimate knowledge of diseases, and their history; the opportunity of witnessing a great variety of surgical operations, and the treatment proper for each case. From these clinical lectures and operations the students derive a great amount of varied practical knowledge. During the last term more than 400 cases were exhibited to the class, and a large number of the most important operations performed. The average number of cases and operations during

the week was 25, embracing a great variety of the most important surgical diseases and operations.

Hospital.

The HOSPITAL connected with the College has been greatly enlarged and improved, and the lecture room for clinical instruction is not surpassed in this country. Students are admitted to this institution free of charge.

Post mortem examinations are held in presence of the class; surgical and medical cases are also presented in great number and variety.

Regulations.

The Matriculation fee is \$5. The fee for full course, \$100. Perpetual ticket \$150. The fees of each of the branches are as follows:

Students are requested to register their names in the *album* of the College, and take out the tickets with as little delay as possible after their arrival in the city.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at other medical institutions will be required to pay \$25, and the matriculation fee.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at this College will be required to pay only the matriculation fee.

Graduates of this Institution have perpetual free admission. Graduates of other medical schools will be admitted by paying the matriculation fee.

Requirements for Graduation.

The candidate must be twenty-one years of age and exhibit certificates from a physician or surgeon duly authorized by law to practice his profession, that he has studied medicine and surgery under his instruction during a term of three years.

He must have attended two full courses of lectures, one of which was at this Institution.

He must deliver to the Registrar, six weeks before the end of the term, a thesis, written by himself, on some medical subject, and be prepared to defend it at his examination.

He must pass a satisfactory examination in the several branches of medicine and surgery.

The Graduation fee is \$25, which must be paid to the Registrar, before the candidate can be admitted to an examination.

Price of board \$4 to \$6 per week.

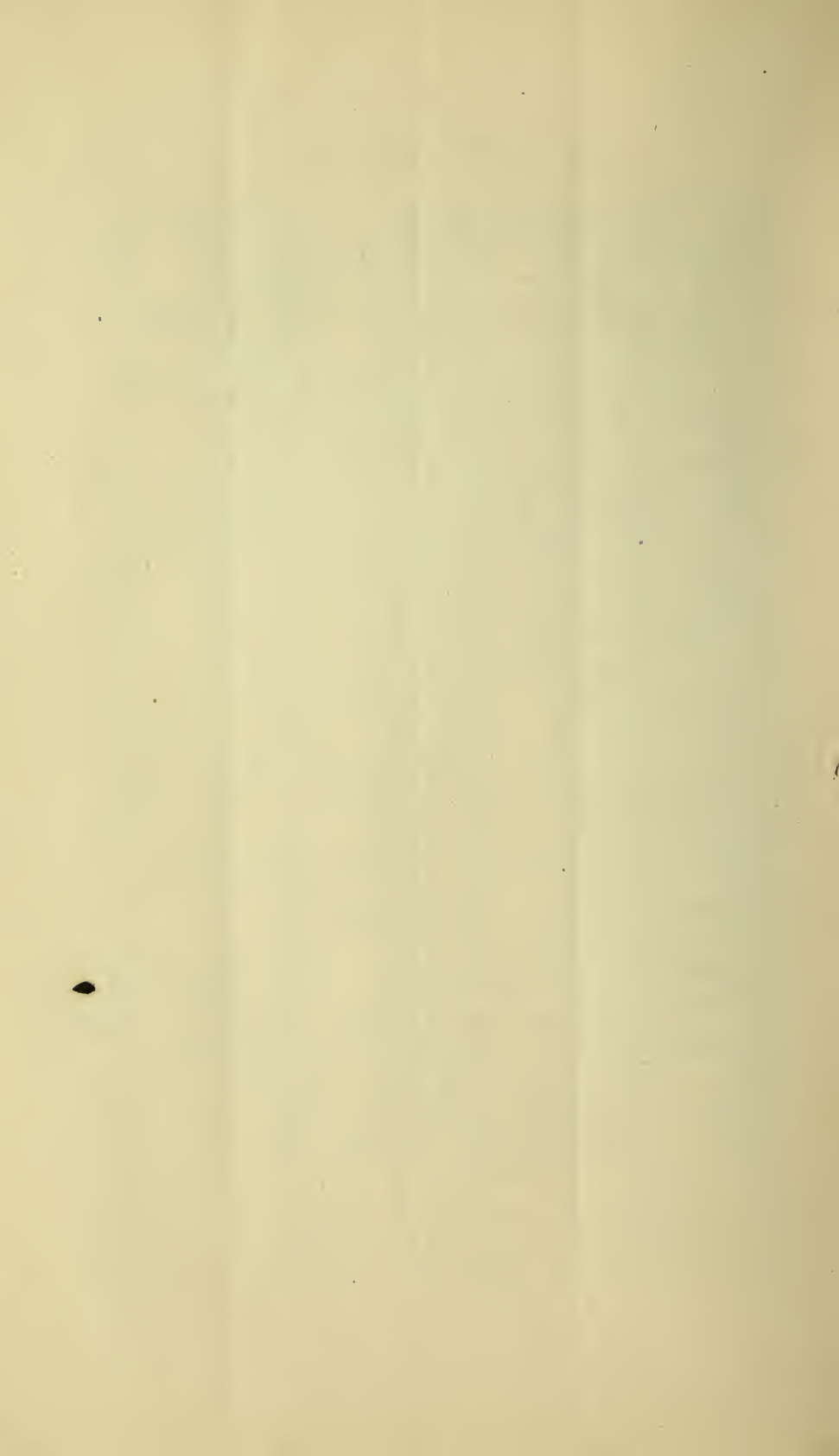

DEPARTMENT OF LAW.

The Winter term of 1869 commences on the last Tuesday of November, and the Spring Term of 1870 on the first Tuesday of March, and each continues twelve weeks. The next Fall Term will commence on the first Tuesday of September, 1870, and will be followed by two successive terms of twelve weeks each.

Any three successive terms will complete the entire course, each term being independent and complete, as to the instruction embraced in it. The method of teaching is by lecture, examination, and practice in moot courts. Two lectures are given daily, except Saturdays, and two moot courts held each week, at which causes are first argued by previously appointed disputants then discussed and decided by the class, followed by the views of the presiding Professor. Thus the law is taught both as a science and an art.

The immense *Law Library of the State* is open to the students, and all the terms of the *Supreme Court* of the Third Judicial District, and of the *Court of Appeals*, the highest in the state, are held in the city of Albany.

The fee for a single term is \$50; for two terms \$90; and for three \$130; in each case payable in advance.

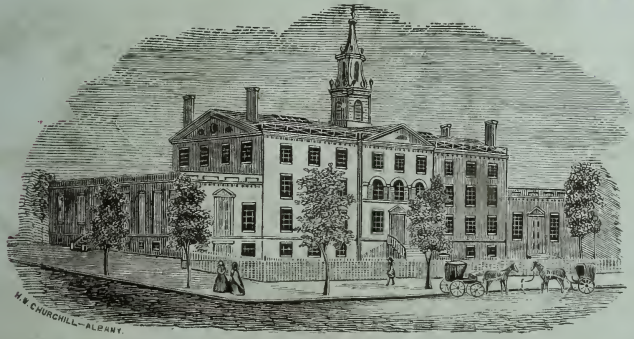

CIRCULAR FOR 1871.

The Trustees and the Faculty of the ALBANY MEDICAL COLLEGE, in presenting their thirty-fourth catalogue and announcement of the annual course of lectures, renew their acknowledgments to its graduates, and the profession generally, for the confidence and patronage heretofore so generously given to this Institution. They believe that the changes made during the past year in the several courses of instruction have contributed to its greater usefulness and efficiency, and will still further promote the object for which it was founded — the advancement of sound medical education.

The gentlemen composing the present faculty have fully demonstrated their fitness for the positions which they occupy. The College term commences on the first Tuesday of September, annually, and continues sixteen weeks.

The Trustees take pleasure in acknowledging a generous gift of \$15,000, to establish the MARCH PROFESSORSHIP, by THOMAS C. DURANT, M.D., an early Student and Graduate of the College.

LOCATION.

The city of Albany, from its being the seat of the State government, of the State Library, the State Museum of Natural History, and of other public and scientific institutions, and also from its being the central point of so many terminating and connecting lines of travel and traffic is rendered attractive and accessible to the student. Its large and rapidly increasing population, and its numerous manufacturing establishments, furnishes abundant illustrations for clinical medicine and surgery.

COLLEGE AND MUSEUM.

The COLLEGE edifice is spacious, commodious, and pleasantly situated near the Hospital and other public buildings. The Lecture Rooms, working Laboratory, Anatomical Theatre and Dissecting Rooms, the halls for Museum and Library, combine all the requisites for medical and surgical instruction.

The MUSEUM, in the variety of its specimens, both natural and morbid, in the number of its rare and valuable preparations, and in its abundant means for practical illustration, is not surpassed by any in this country.

It contains the valuable morbid specimens accumulated during the

long course of surgical practice of the late Prof. March, sufficiently numerous to form a very large Museum of Pathological Anatomy,

It contains Prof. McNaughton's valuable collections accumulated during twenty years' connection with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Western New York. Also the extensive and valuable Collections of Prof. Armsby, embracing a great variety of vascular, nervous and morbid preparations, which have been constantly accumulating since the establishment of the Institution.

No College in the country affords more extensive means for illustrating anatomical structures and the various forms of disease. The Museum is at all times open to students, and the specimens and preparations are so arranged as to afford opportunities for study and illustration.

The LIBRARY numbers nearly 5,000 volumes, a portion of which is appropriated to the use of students during the lecture term. No fee is charged for the use of books. *Students are advised to furnish themselves with one good text-book in each department.*

The following works are recommended by the Faculty :

Surgery—Druitt, Gross, Erichsen, Miller, Smith, Holmes. *Anatomy*—Wilson, Leidy, Gray. *Theory and Practice*—Flint, Hartshorne, Wood, Watson, Tanner, Niemyer. *Chemistry*—Brand and Taylor, Roscoe, Miller, Cooley, Wormley, Bowman, Bird, Fresenius. *Materia Medica*—U. S. Dispensatory, Wood, Stille, Pereira, Waring. *Obstetrics*—Churchill, Byford, Ramsbotham, Caseaux, Bedford, Meigs, Hodge, Thomas, Hewitt, Tilt. *Physiology*—Carpenter, Dalton, Flint, and Marshall. *Medical Jurisprudence*—Beck, Taylor, Dean.

THE HOSPITAL,

in close proximity to the college, is a large first-class institution, and has connected with it a DISPENSARY for outdoor patients, a LYING-IN DEPARTMENT and ALBANY EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY.

The Lecture Room, for clinical instruction, in the hospital, is not surpassed in this country for its arrangements and accommodations.

THE PLAN OF INSTRUCTION

in the College proposes to combine to the fullest extent possible clinical with didactic teaching. There will be three or more clinical lectures each week in the Hospital in addition to the usual surgical clinic in the College on Saturdays.

Indigent persons will receive medical or surgical treatment gratuitously. Such patients from abroad, who require continued treatment will be received into the Hospital on the payment of five dollars a week for board.

The most important surgical operations will be performed in the presence of the class, in the Amphitheatre of the Hospital, and a

great variety of medical cases, of diseases of the eye and ear, of the brain and nervous system, and of the deformities requiring surgical treatment, will be exhibited during the term.

PRACTICAL CHEMISTRY.

During the present term more than 500 surgical, and a great variety of medical cases have been presented for illustration, besides a large number of cases of disease of the eye, ear, spine, and other deformities.

Connected with the College is the Working Laboratory under the charge of the Professor of Chemistry.

Especial opportunities will be furnished students in this department desirous of extending their knowledge of chemistry, and its relations to medicine.

The name of Prof. Perkins, formerly connected with the Chemical Department of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of New York, and now Professor of Chemistry at Union College, is a sufficient guaranty of the value of the instruction to be gained in this department.

Each student has a table and chemicals for his use and is furnished with all necessary apparatus.

Laboratory ticket is \$10. Students are charged for breakage and chemicals used by themselves.

PRACTICAL ANATOMY.

The DISSECTING ROOMS are open during the term and winter, and ample opportunities are furnished for the pursuit of *Practical Anatomy*.

The Dissecting ticket is \$5. Abundant supply of material for dissection is furnished on the most reasonable terms.

OBSTETRICS.

Prof. Seymour, who now occupies the chair of obstetrics, is known as a thorough and successful teacher.

DISEASES OF WOMEN.

The course of lectures upon this subject will be eminently practical in its character, and, from the reputation of Dr. Peaslee in this department, it is believed will be of especial value to the student.

This course will be delivered during the month of September.

PSYCHOLOGY.

The name of Prof. Clymer, in connection with the Department of Diseases of the Nervous System and the Mind, gives full assur-

ance that the pathology and treatment of this class of diseases now exciting so much attention, will be ably presented, and fully meet the requirements of the profession, as recommended by the American Medical Association.

Drs. Peaslee and Clymer will hold clinics regularly, illustrating their lectures in their separate departments.

MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE.

The lectures on this subject will be given by the Hon. Ira Harris, L.L.D., one of the Professors of the Law Department. His great learning and long judicial experience render these lectures of peculiar value to the medical student.

REGULATIONS.

The Matriculation fee is \$5. The fee for full course \$100. Perpetual ticket \$150.

Students are requested to register their names in the *album* of the College, and take out the tickets with as little delay as possible after their arrival in the city.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at other medical institutions will be required to pay \$25, and the matriculation fee.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at this college will be required to pay only the matriculation fee.

Graduates of this institution have perpetual free admission. Graduates of other medical schools will be admitted by paying the matriculation fee.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION.

The candidate must be twenty-one years of age and exhibit certificates from a physician or surgeon, duly authorized by law to practice his profession, that he has studied medicine and surgery under his instruction during a term of three years.

He must have attended two full courses of lectures, one of which must have been at this institution.

He must deliver to the Registrar, six weeks before the end of the term, a Thesis, written by himself, on some medical subject, and be prepared to defend it at his examination.

He must pass a satisfactory examination in the several branches of medicine and surgery.

The graduation fee is \$25, which must be paid to the Registrar, before the candidate can be admitted to an examination.

Board can be obtained from \$4.00 to \$6.00 per week.

The Museum, one of the most extensive in the country, is at all times open to Students—The Library contains 5000 volumes.

Indigent persons from abroad are treated gratuitously. Those requiring continual attendance are received into the Hospital by paying \$5.00 a week for Board.

DEPARTMENT OF LAW.

The Winter Term of 1870 commences on the last Tuesday of November, and the Spring term of 1871 on the first Tuesday of March, and each continues twelve weeks. The next Fall Term will commence on the first Tuesday of September, 1870, and will be followed by two successive terms of twelve weeks each.

Any three successive terms will complete the entire course, each term being independent and complete, as to the instruction embraced in it. The method of teaching is by lecture, examination, and practice in moot courts. Two lectures are given daily, except Saturdays, and two moot courts held each week, at which causes are first argued by previously appointed disputants, then discussed and decided by the class, followed by the views of the presiding Professor. Thus the law is taught both as a science and an art.

The immense *Law Library of the State* is open to the students, and all the terms of the *Supreme Court* of the Third Judicial District, and of the *Court of Appeals*, the highest in the State, are held in the city of Albany.

The fee for a single term is \$50; for two terms, \$90; and for three, \$130; in each case payable in advance.

ALBANY MEDICAL COLLEGE.

CIRCULAR, 1871-72.

The Trustees and the Faculty of the ALBANY MEDICAL COLLEGE, in presenting their annual catalogue, renew their acknowledgments to its graduates, and the profession generally, for the confidence and patronage heretofore so generously given to this Institution. They believe that the changes made in the several courses of instruction have contributed to its greater usefulness and efficiency, and will still further promote the object for which it was founded — the advancement of sound medical education.

The gentlemen composing the present faculty have fully demonstrated their fitness for the positions which they occupy. The College term commences on the first Tuesday of September, and continues sixteen weeks.

The city of Albany, as the seat of the State government, the State Library, the State Museum of Natural History, and other public and scientific institutions, and the central point of so many terminating and connecting lines of travel and traffic, is rendered attractive and accessible to students. Its large and rapidly increasing population, and numerous manufacturing establishments, furnish abundant means for the illustration of clinical surgery and medicine.

COLLEGE AND MUSEUM.

The COLLEGE edifice is spacious, commodious, and pleasantly situated near the Hospital and other public buildings. The Lecture Rooms, working Laboratory, Anatomical Theatre, Dissecting Rooms, and halls for Museum and Library, combine all the requisites for medical and surgical instruction.

The MUSEUM, in the variety of its specimens, both natural and morbid, in the number of its rare and valuable preparations, and in its ample means for practical illustration, is not surpassed by any, in this country.

It contains the valuable morbid specimens accumulated during the long course of surgical practice of the late Prof. March. Also Prof. McNaughton's valuable collections made during twenty years' connection with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Western New York. And also the extensive and valuable Collections of Prof. Armsby, embracing a great variety of vascular, nervous and morbid preparations, which have been constantly accumulating since the establishment of the Institution,

A collection of Dr. Woodward's microscopic slides, from the Army Medical Museum and other sources, have been recently added to the Museum. They will be exhibited by the oxy-hydrogen light, and constitute an important feature in the illustration and study of minute anatomy. The Museum has been greatly improved during the past year, and is receiving constant additions by the contributions of the professors and graduates of the Institution.

No College in the country affords more extensive means for illustrating both healthy and morbid anatomical structures, and the various forms of disease. The Museum is at all times open to students, and the specimens and preparations are so arranged as to afford opportunities for study and illustration.

The LIBRARY numbers nearly 5,000 volumes, a portion of which is appropriated to the use of students during the lecture term. No fee is charged for the use of books. *Students are advised to furnish themselves with one good text-book in each department.*

The following works are recommended by the Faculty :

Dispensatory, Wood, Stille, Pereira, Waring, Headland. *Obstetrics*—Churchill, Byford, Ramsbotham, Caseaux, Bedford, Meigs, Hodge, Thomas, Hewitt, Tilt. *Physiology*—Carpenter, Dalton, Flint, and Marshall. *Medical Jurisprudence*—Beck, Taylor, Dean.

THE HOSPITAL,

in close proximity to the college, is a large first-class institution, and has connected with it a DISPENSARY for outdoor patients, a LYING-IN DEPARTMENT and an EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY.

The Lecture Room, for clinical instruction, in the hospital, is not surpassed in this country for its arrangements, light, and accommodations.

THE PLAN OF INSTRUCTION

in the College combines to the fullest extent possible, clinical with didactic teaching. There will be three or more clinical lectures each week in the Hospital in addition to the usual surgical clinics in the College. Saturdays are devoted to the surgical clinics in College and Hospital.

Indigent persons receive medical or surgical treatment gratuitously. Such patients from abroad, who require continued treatment will be received into the Hospital on the payment of five dollars a week for board.

All of the minor and most important surgical operations are performed in the presence of the class, in the Amphitheatre of the Hospital. A great variety of medical and surgical cases, diseases of the eye and ear, of the brain and nervous system, and of the deformities requiring surgical treatment, will be exhibited during the lecture term.

During the last term more than 500 surgical, and a great variety of medical cases were presented for illustration, besides a large number of cases of disease of the eye, ear, spine, and other deformities, and the diseases peculiar to women.

PRACTICAL CHEMISTRY.

The Working Laboratory, in connection with the College, will be open during the year, under the charge of the Professor of Chemistry and his assistant.

Special opportunities are furnished in this department to those who are desirous of extending their knowledge of chemistry in its various branches.

Each student has a table and chemicals for his use and is furnished with all necessary apparatus.

PRACTICAL ANATOMY.

The DISSECTING ROOMS are open during the term, and ample opportunities are furnished for the pursuit of *Practical Anatomy*.

The Dissecting ticket is \$5. Abundant supplies of material for dissection are furnished on the most reasonable terms.

REGULATIONS.

The Matriculation fee is \$5. The fee for a full course \$100. Perpetual ticket \$150.

Students are requested to register their names in the *album* of the College, and take out the tickets, with as little delay as possible after their arrival in the city.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at other medical institutions will be required to pay \$25, and the matriculation fee.

Students who have attended two full courses of lectures at this college will be required to pay only the matriculation fee.

Graduates of this institution have perpetual free admission. Graduates of other medical schools will be admitted by paying the matriculation fee.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION.

The candidate must be twenty-one years of age, and exhibit certificates from a physician or surgeon, duly authorized by law to practice his profession, that he has studied medicine and surgery under his instruction during a term of three years.

He must have attended two full courses of lectures, one of which must have been at this institution.

He must deliver to the Registrar, six weeks before the end of the term, a Thesis, written by himself, on some medical subject, and be prepared to defend it at his examination.

He must pass a satisfactory examination in the several branches of medicine and surgery.

The graduation fee is \$25, which must be paid to the Registrar, before the candidate can be admitted to an examination.

DEPARTMENT OF LAW.

The Winter Term of 1872 commences on the last Tuesday of November, and the Spring term of 1872 on the first Tuesday of March, and each continues twelve weeks. The next Fall Term will commence on the first Tuesday of September, 1872, and will be followed by two successive terms of twelve weeks each.

Any three successive terms will complete the entire course, each term being independent and complete, as to the instruction embraced in it. The method of teaching is by lecture, examination, and practice in moot courts. Two lectures are given daily, except Saturdays, and two moot courts held each week, at which causes are first argued by previously appointed disputants, then discussed and decided by the class, followed by the views of the presiding Professor. Thus the law is taught both as a science and an art.

The immense *Law Library of the State* is open to the students, and all the terms of the *Supreme Court* of the Third Judicial District, and of the *Court of Appeals*, the highest in the State, are held in the city of Albany.

The fee for a single term is \$50; for two terms, \$90; and for three, \$130; in each case payable in advance.
