INTRODUCTION.

THE Medals and Decorations in this Collection are in the finest possible condition, great care having been taken in their selection. With the exception of a few of the ordinary and commoner Medals, they have been verified either at the War Office, Admiralty or India Office, and their genuineness is guaranteed.

Amongst the most notable are the following—

Peninsula gold Cross with two clasps; gold Peninsula Medal; gold Medal for the 1st June, 1794; gold Medal for the Nile; complete set of gold Sultan's Medals for Egypt, 1801; unique Medal for the Defence of Gibraltar; Peninsula Medal with fourteen clasps, and Naval Medal with five; Medals representing no less than sixteen clasps of the old Army of India; the exceedingly rare Kelati-Ghilzie; an almost complete set of the East India Company's early Medals; Naval and Military Victoria Cross; several unique Regimental Medals.

All the Medals and Decorations have their proper ribands affixed, and are of silver unless otherwise described.
