According to Bureau Informant 200, Olga Pyatnitskaya,

Martin Greendlinger's stepdaughter, who is approximately 10 or 11 years old, has been transferred to an English school about a mile from their home in Ivanova, USSR. From the 5th to the 10th grades, all subjects except math, physics, Russian language and Russian literature are taught in English. Bappiox 1254-14

In 1958, Martin Greendlinger, U. S. citizen, married a Soviet woman he had met at the World Youth Festival the previous year. He was a member of the Labor Youth League, active in other front activities and associated with Communist Party members. His wife, a member of the Komsomol, was granted an exit permit by the Soviets but the U. S. has refused to grant her a visa. Greendlinger has resided continuously in the USSR since 1960. A son and daughter, Lenny and Natascha, were born in the USSR. GREENDLINGER

Additional information from Bureau Informant 200 has revealed that there is a special school in Sverdlovsk, USSR, where Raisa Aleksandrovna Karaeva teaches history in English. She was also in Sverdlovsk in 1963 training individuals to translate technical literature from English into Russian and has worked with young and older students. Karaeva maintains a pen-pal relationship with numerous individuals in the U. S. and often requests books and information regarding educational methods and aspects of American life. Her English and knowledge of American expressions are excellent and her writing could pass for that of an American.

The above is called to your attention since it is believed that individuals who have received extensive training in such schools from an early age could be utilized by the USSR as illegal agents.
