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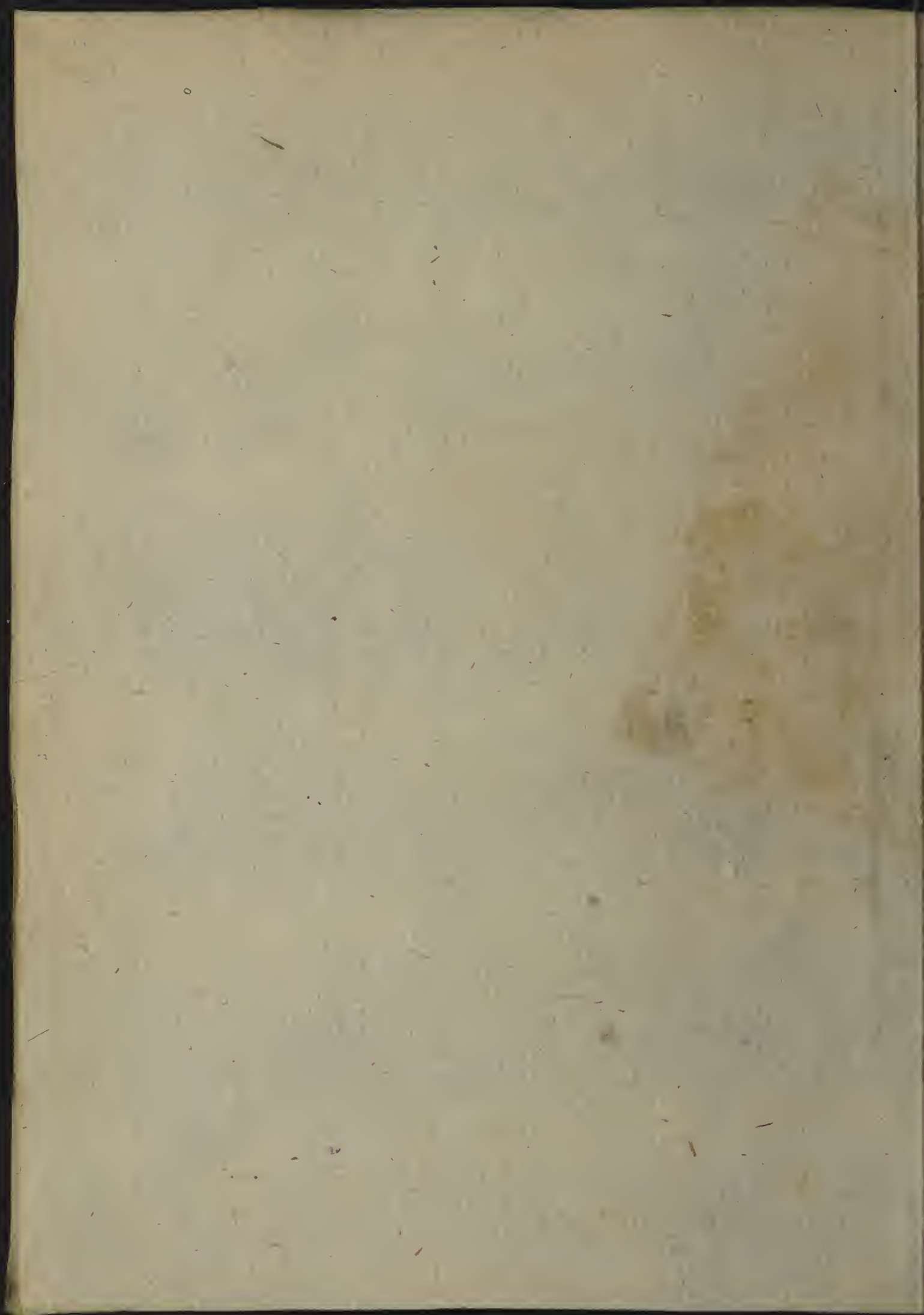

*I* may be objected unto me, that the collation of these things, is not all made up and digested into this fabrique of mine owne materials and structure, and I doe ingenuously confesse it: Seeing the *Four Treasuries* were collected by Mr. Agard, his private notes, a man very industrious and painfull in that kind; and one, who had continuall recourse vnto the most, & custody of many of the rest of the same: And the latter Callender of the Records of the Tower, came to my hands from an Author vnknowne, euen as the Printer was drawing the last sheet of the precedent worke from the Presse, I was content to giue it whar sake, and to let it be layd on shore with the rest, but very unwillingly; because, I had no conuenient roome left where to dispose it, without blaming of my Methode, in that it was not layd in his proper place, with the rest that is vnder the Title of the Tower, in the first Station: whereof I hope an equall censure, ever resting

All things past vnder the Great Seale, which are in the Lord Treasurers gift, Confirmations of Graunts from the King, Acts of Parliament, and Creation of Nobilitie, with the judiciall proceedings of this Court.

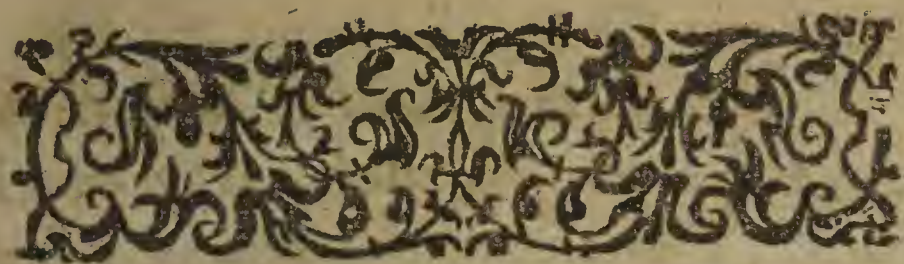

# THE TOWER.

**T**He Tower followes by due course, being the *Repositorye* of the Chappell of the Rolls of the Chancerie, to receiue their older Records, which are more ancient then *primo* of *Richard* the third. All which, the Master of the Rolles heretofore hath sent ouer to the Tower. And keeps in the Chappell, onely those that are of more Reccencic.

So it plainely appeareth; that the Tower hath the like Records, as the



## Chancerie Chappell.

Here is one Kalender called the Booke of *Names*, made by way of Alphabet, containing the Names of all men whose Offices, or Inquisitions, taken after their deaths, are there to be found. In which you may see what Lands any such dyed seised of, with the tenure of the same; and in many of them finde, the last Wills and Testaments of such persons, recyted in the same, here, as in the Chappell of the Rolles, which Wils sometimes are not to be found elsewhere.

*Item*, here are diuers Kalenders of Eschetors bundles (viz) one of the time of *Henry* the third.

Another of *Edward* the first.

Another of *Edward* the second.

Another of *Edward* the third.

Another of *Richard* the second.

Another of *Henry* the fourth, and *Henry* the fifth.

*Item*, here is one booke called the booke of *Heyres*, of *Henry* the thirds time, containing the names of such persons, as had Offices found at that time, declaring who were their *Heyres*, and their age; and sometimes mentioning their *Wiues*, with the *Countyes* wherein they had any *Lands*.

*Item*, the like severall bookes are severally and respectiuely here made vp, of the times of *Edward* the first, *Edward* the second, *Edward* the third, *Richard* the second, *Henry* the fourth, and *Henry* the fifth.

*Item*, heere is one little *Kalender* by way of *Alphabet*, containing such *Manners* and *Lands*, as are found in any the aforesaid *Offices* or *Inquisitions*, in the *County* of *Essex*, but not perfect.

*Item*, the like booke of the *County* of *Lincolne*. And the like of the *County*



ty of Bedford. The like of Berkes.  
 The like of Buckingham. And one great  
 booke, the like, for the Counties of Som-  
 merset, Dorset, Devon, and Cornewall.  
 But not by way of Alphabet.

Item, heere is a Kalender and Col-  
 lection out of the old Rolles, called  
*Charta antiquam*, without date.

Item, a like Kalender of the Rolles  
 of King *Iohn*: a like of *Henry* the third,  
 from the first till the eleventh of his  
 Raigne: a Kalender and Collection  
 of all Graunts of Inheritance, granted  
 by any of our Kings before *Richard* the  
 third, and so ancient as there are any  
 Records here; and this with the like,  
 was transmitted hither out of the *Chan-  
 cerie*.

Item, here be certaine Rolles of *Ed-  
 ward* the first, for his whole raigne.

Item, two bookes or Kalenders of  
 Free Warrens, Markets, Fayres, Lects,  
 and other Liberties; gathered out of  
 the

the Charter Roll, of the time of *Edward* the first, and during his whole Raigne.

*Item*, an old Kalender of Charters of Corporations, and other Liberties granted of Cities, Borroughes, Abbyes, Colledges, and Cathedrall Churches, during the whole Raigne of *Edward* the first.

*Item*, a Kalender or Collection of the Parliament Rolles of Attayndors, Restitutions, Resumptions: from the twenty ninth of *Henry* the third, till the end of his raigne.

*Item*, certaine paper Rolles for confirmations of Charters, and Liberties of Colledges, Corporations, and religious Houses. And for Licences of Lands to be giuen in Mortmaine, from the first of *Edward* the first, till the last of *Edward* the fourth, done by way of Alphabet.

*Item*, one booke of Confirmations of Charters, of Liberties of Colledges,

Corporations, and religious Houses; and for Licenses of Lands to bee giuen in Mortmaine (as aforesaid;) collected out of the Patent and close Rolles of all the time of *Edward* the second: except two or three of the last yeares.

*Item*, certaine small bundles of loose Papers of like nature, by way of Alphabet, of sundry Kings times, confusedly layd together

*Item*, a collection of the Patent Rolles, gathered of all Presentations, made by the King to any Church Prebendarie, or Chappell; as well, in the right of the Crowne, as in the right of any other, (the same beeing for that time in the hands of the King) from *primo* of *Edward* the first, till the midst of the raigne of *Edward* the third.

Here be two bookes, the one, of the *Taxation* of all the Spirituall Liuinges in *England*: The other of the Temporalities,

**T**He chiefe Records of the Exchequer, are in the custody of the Lord Treasurer ; and the two Chamberlaines there. And of the two Remembrancers, viz. The Kings Remembrancer, and the Lord Treasurers Remembrancer.

The Records in the Kings Treasuries at *Westminster*, being foure, of which the Lord Treasurer and the Chamberlaines



berlaines haue the custody, may be de-  
uided thus, (*viz.*)

1. *Forreigne*, as Leagues,  
or Treaties, betweene  
Prince and Prince, or  
States of sundry Nati-  
ons.
2. *Domesticall*, and they  
are of foure sorts.

*Viz.*

1. Such as concerne  
matters of Estate, and  
the Crowne onely.
2. Pleading betwixt the

Kings Prerogatiue.

All which Records and Monuments, are layd vp for their better preservation, in foure seuerall Treasuries: except some few, kept in priuate Officers hands, whereof mention shall bee hereafter made; vnder three seuerall Keyes, kept by three sundty Officers, distinct the one key from the other. And vpon each doore three lockes; all which foure Treasuries, and their places, with their Records in them contained, I shall hereafter set forth and declare.

And so much for their places.

For your better direction, I shall deliver, what Records are to bee found in euery of these Treasuries, respectiue-ly.

But by the way, and before I begin  
to

to shew what Records are in euery Treasury ; it is fit I should shew you, what particular Records, vse to remaine in the hands of priuate Officers, on the Receipt side.

The first, with the Remembrancer of the Receipt ; which is now the Office of Sir ROBERT PYE, who hath the keeping of all *Privy Seales*. And Inrollment of Patents, and Warrants, for the Issuing of Treasure. And the accompts thereof from the Tellers, whereof, hee hath a great number in Bags and Presses, in an Office close by the Court of Receipt. And in another Office which he hath below, neare his house.

The next, is the Clarke of the *Pelles* ; now, Sir EDVVARD WARDORS Office, who keepeth the two *Pelles*, called *Redditus*, and *Introitus*, of both sorts ; whereof hee hath a particular Office, in a roome neare to the Court  
of



of Receipt, which records are from EDVWARD the first, till this present.

*And now to the foure Treasuries.*

The first ; the Treasurie of the Court of Receipt. In which are,

Two of the ancientest Bookes of Records in this Kingdome : made in WILLIAM the Conquerours time, called *Doomes-day.*

The one Booke in Quarto, containing the Description or Suruey of Essex, Norfolke, and Suffolke.

The other in Folio, being the like, for all the Shires in England, from Cornwall, to the Riuer of Tyne.

Here is a Booke, called the blacke Booke, made in HENRY the seconds time, *De necessarijs Scarij obseruandis* : And in the same, are the Oathes and Admittances of Officers inrolled, and

other Notes of some consequence.

*Item*, heere is a Patent Roll of EDWARD the seconds time.

*Item*, a booke in Parchment of the *Perambulation* of all the Kings Forrests beyond *Trent*. And the Iustice-Scate held in them, by the Deputyes of the Lord *Cromwell*: Iustice there made in the time of HENRY the eight.

*Item*, a Bag of canvassc of speciall Records, abbreviated into a sheet of Paper being in the Bag:

*Item*, the ancient Keyes of the Treasurie of the Leagues, in the Cloyster of *Westminster Abbey* in a Chest.

*Item*, sundry Bags of Foyles of Sheriffes, and Bayliffes tallyes, which by default of Order in the Pype Office, were neuer joyned.

*Item*, sundry Books of Remembrances, and Abbreviations of Records.

*Item*, the Scale of the Court of Receipt in siluer, very ancient with the  
Kings



Kings face in it, and these words following about it, *Sigillum Officij Receipt. Success. Regis Anglia.*

There is a little Roome adjoyning to the same Courts, wherein are are three Chests, In which are Records placed, viz.

THE first Chest next to the Doore, containeth Pleadings of *Quo Warranto coram Iusticiarijs itinerantibus*, and *Placita Corona*, and *Placita de Iur.* & *Aff.* in and through the most part of the Shires of England, in King EDWARD the firsts time. Onely some two shires put into a Bag, and some one shire, for the more easie finding and Preservation thereof.

*The next Chest beyond that, hath three Divisions in it.*

**T**He first diuision being on the right hand, hath in it a very faire Booke in Parchment in Folio, containing an abbreviation of the two former spoken Bookes of Doomes-day verbatim, with that Booke in the Exchequer called Doomes-day, in the custody of the Kings Remembrancer there.

*Item,* another large booke in Parchment, contayning the Inrollment of Popes Bulles, Deeds of Lands, conueyed to the Prince by sundry Persons; Some Leagues with Princes, especially of *Wales, &c.* The Inrollment of the Statutes of *Winchester, and Gloucester, &c.*

Two great Bags of Suruey of sundry discovered Abbeyes by *Cardinall Woolsey*; and such like.

*Item,*



Item, a Bag of sundry Charters, granted to diuers for Lands and Liberties in England; the contents thereof may be found in a blacke booke in Parchment abbreuiated and intituled, *Chart. tangen. diuersas Libertat. de diuersis Monasterijs, & alijs.*

Item, a great bag of Rolles of Assizes, in Henry the third, Edward the first, Edward the third, and Henry the fourth times, all abbreuiated into Bookes, very ready to bee found by the number Roll.

Item, a booke of the Treasurer and Chamberlaines Deputies, deliuerances of Records, and Iewels, and Receipt of Leagues, and deliuey of them out, from Edward the thirds time, vntill Henry the eighths time; In which, are many good Notes worthy of obseruation.

Item, an old Catalogue of Leagues, betwixt Prince and Prince, and Popes,

intituled, *Kalendarium seu Repertorium.*

*Item,* a Basket wherein are contained 8. Bulles of Popes of Ratification, of the libertics of *England*, granted to the Kings, Clergie, and Nobility of *England.*

*Item,* a Roll of Lands giuen in *Mortmaine*, in *London*, ab *Anno* 5. *EDVVARD* 1. vsq<sup>3</sup> *annum* 30. of the same King: *Pro Camerar. & al. Elemosinam sustentand.*

*Item,* some Chamberlaines counterpells of the time of *Philip* and *Mary*, and of *Queene ELIZABETHS* raigne.

*Item,* a bag of bookes intituled, bookes of *Suruey* and other, *de quibus quere.* In which bag especially, is a large booke intituled, *Extent. Manery de Bradford.*

The middle diuision, hath onely *Placita Forreſt.* which are diuided into three bags, one bag containeth small bags, wherein are mentioned the particular



ticular Shires or Forrests : and on the outside are mentioned the shires.

The like is in another bag.

The third bag, containeth Records of Forrests in diuers shires.

There is also a fourth bag, whercin are contained, Inquisitions in sundry Forrests, but in them you shall find nothing in effect for Euidence ; because they mention specially, *De malefactoribus de venac. & de virid.*

In the bag of diuers Countyes, is a bag of such Parliament Rolles, as were found in the foure Treasuries, and gathered and collected together, which are abbreuiated into a booke, and they bee very worthy Records, and some of them touch matter of Forrests.

In a bag of Accompts of the Lands called Warwicke-Lands, and of the Earle and Countesse of Devonshires Lands, wherein is an Accompt of EDVVARD Duke of Buckingham's Lands, and a booke of Suruey of the sayd Dukes Lands, made in Anno 13. of Henry the eight.

In a bag conrayning Auditors Accompts, in Henry the seuenths, and Henry the eights times, *De terris perquisitis*.

**N**Ext the doore on the left hand, is a bag intituled, *Bagamanorum*. In which are Inquisitions made in diuers Shires through the hundreds, touching Liberties, &c. Withdrawne and withholden from the King, in EDVVARD the firsts time, &c. *Quere quid plus.*

*Item*, a bag of like Inquisitions, in *Com. Salop.* in Edward the firsts time.

*Item*, the like in *Com. Wiltes.* & *Com. Devon.*

*Item*, a bag of Tenures which are but few, *Quere quid plus.* And therein a Roll of *Com. Lincoln.* Anno 3, of Edward the third, of Scutage. Also a Copie of  
the



the booke called *Kirbyes Questions*, in Yorkeſhire, in EDVVARD the firſts time. And *Nomina villarum* in EDVVARD the the ſeconds time.

*Item*, ouer the third Cheſt, hang theſe bags following, *viz.* A bag of old Euidence and Court Rolles of *Wykes Abbey*, diſſolued by Cardinall *Woolſey*, and a Priory called *Montioy*.

*Item*, a bag of Indentures, made betweenc the Iudges, and the Officers of the Treasurie, for the receiuing of Records out of their Courts into the Treasurie, of ſundry natures.

*Item*, a bag of matters concerning the Mint, and aduancing or abating of the Coynes.

*Item*, a bag of Records which are abbreviated, remaying in a Cheſt of the ſame Court.

*In the second Treasurie, which is in the Pallace of Westminster locked with three lockes, and contayning one Roome or Chamber, there are these Records placed in Presses of Wainscot, viz.*

*In a Presse on the right hand, in the middle.*

**A** Blacke bag intituled, Concerning the Insurrection of Yorkeshire, being within a bag intituled Treasons.

Another blacke bag, wherciu is the Insurrection of Lincolneshire, within the said bag intituled, Treasons.

A bag of the Duke of Richmonds matters in the North.

Diuers bookes and workes of Byshop FISHERS, and others; which are specified in a booke made and collected in *Anno 1610*. This Presse is noted on the outside, with this marke, A.

On the left hand, two Presses of Counterpells of sundry Kings times.

In the second third and fifth Presses, on the right hand, are Deliberations Goales in sundry Countyes.

*Item*, the vpper part of one of the Presses, contayneth diuers Popes Bulls, &c.

In the third Presse on the left hand, are contained sundry Deeds of Sale, Gift, Purchase, and Exchange of Land, made to sundry Princes in former times, beginning at EDVWARD the firsts time, put into seuerall boxes.

In the foremost Presse on the right hand, are some accompts of the *French* Territoryes, and Accompts of the chiefe Butlers Office of *England*. Books

of Accompts of Fortification, and the Staple of *Callice*, and Suruayors of works, &c.

On the left hand, in the Corner of the same Presse, are stampes of Coynes of *Edward* the thirds time.

In the foremost Presse on the left hand, are bookes of Musters, made in *HENRY* the eighths time.

In the foremost Presse on the further side, is a presse full of Letters and Cyphers of Embassadours, written at the time of theyr Negotiation, *tempore* of *Henry* the eyght, &c.

*Item*, two small Cupboords or Coffers in the Wall, contayning some few Rentalls bookes, and matters touching mens Lands & Lordships; the Contents whereof, are abbrevuiated into a booke, &c.

A boxe intituled; Instruments touching King *Henry* the eights marriage, & *aliquid tangens divorcium.*

*Item*, a box of Indentures of the Lord Treasurers of England, and elsewhere, &c.

*Item*, the Couenants made with the Commoners, for the Tinne workes of Devon. and Cornewall, Anno 14. of Henry the eight.

*Items*, two presses in the middle, containing *Placita de Iure & Ass.* &c. in the most Shires of England, in the time of Edward the first.

*Item*, in two presses in the middle, are *Placita de jur. & Ass.* in the most Shires, of the Raigne of Edward the second, and Edward the third, and Richard the second.

*Item*, the measures of Elne and Yard, in brasse.

There lacke the waights of Troy; which in former times were accustomed to be kept in the Treasurie.

of their Offices respectiuely, appears by an especial order made for the purpose, by Sir *Richard Lyster* Knight, Lord Chiefe Baron of the Exchequer: Dated in Iuly, in the five and twentieth yeare of the raigne of King HENRY the eighth, which remaines with the Kings Remembrancer.

And most of the businesse of the Remembrancers, are taken out of an Originall or Extract, which the Chancerie transmitteth yearely into the Exchequer, to collect and recouer thereout, and thereby, any thing that is reserved or due to the Crowne, whether it be Rent Service, Accompt, or whatsoever else; whereby any profit may arise to the Crowne, either casually, or certainly. By which originall, growes that great correspondency, which is betweene the Exchequer, and the Chancerie.

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*It shall not be amisse, that mention be made of the manner how the Deputy Chamberlaines haue demeaned themselves in the exercises of their Offices, being in the Court, and what qualities were needfull for them, in their places.*

**F**irst, it is needfull for them to haue a reasonable good knowledge, in the Latine and French tongues, for Latine, to vnderstand, reade, and examine the Tailles, which they must doe publikely; Also, to vnderstand the Records, and to know the diuersitie of their natures: For the French, to tell the numbers in examining the Tailles, and especially, to vnderstand the Records, whereof sundry both of State

and otherwise are in French, and especially, in *Monstre le Droits*, and *Treatyes* betweene Prince and Prince.

After the *Tailles* be examined, the charge of the *Foyles* is onely in the *Chamberaynes*, to deliuer them safe ouer to the other two *Deputyes* on the *Chequer* side, to joyne the same.
