# CONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD OF DOMESTIC MISSIONS OF THE LOUISIANA ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

- ART. 1. This Board shall be denominated and known as the Board of Domestic Missions of the Louisiana Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South.
- Apr. 2. The object of this Board is to co-operate with the Parent Board of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, in support of Missions, especially within the territory occupied by this Conference.
- ART. 3. The officers of this Board shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, and five Managers, who shall be chosen quadrennially by the Louisiana Conference.
- ART. 4. The President, and in his absence the Vice President, shall preside at all meetings of the Board; in the absence of both, the Board shall select a President, three of whom shall constitute a quorum.
- ART. 5. The Treasurer shall take charge of all the funds and property of the Board, subject to the order of the Board, and shall make an accurate and full report annually of all the receipts and disbursements of the Board, to the Louisiana Annual Conference.
- ART. 6. The Secretary shall keep a full and complete record of the proceedings of the Board.
- ART. 7. That during the year, each preacher in charge shall, as far as practicable, ascertain how much each member will give for the support of the Domestic Mission, and collect the same in such manner as he shall think best.
- ART. 8. One-tenth of all the collections made for Domestic Missions shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of the Parent Board, and any surplus remaining after supplying our own work.
- ART. 9. This Constitution may be amended at the annual meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the Board.

#### : CENTENARY COLLEGE.
