

RULES.

The playing rules under which the game is to be played will be those in force in 1879. The following are those that vary from the present rules:

The pitcher's box to be six feet square, the front line forty-five feet from the centre of the home plate.

The batsman takes his base after nine unfair balls have been called.

After two strikes are called on the batsman the next good ball that is not struck at will be called a fair ball; then the next good one three strikes.

The batsman is out if a foul ball is caught on the bound.

Foul balls will not be called strikes unless the player fouls intentionally.

A batsman must be put out in the regular way and fly balls to the infield must be caught to put the batsman out, provided the other bases are occupied. In other words, the player can trap a ball for double plays or the catcher can miss three strikes for a double play if necessary.

The batsman may call for a high ball, low ball or a fair ball. A low ball is one that passes between the knee and waist; a high ball between the waist and shoulder, and a fair ball anywhere between the knee and shoulder.

BADGER, Yale, '82, will Captain the Amateur Nine for the first part of the game with players of '82 and before.

WINSLOW, Harvard, '85, will Captain the last part with later players.

SPALDING will Captain the Professional Nine the first part of the game.

MORRILL will Captain the last part.
