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INTRODUCTION

During the period of demobilization, 1919, it was thought that all ranks who had served with the 21st Canadian Infantry Battalion would wish to have something in their possession which would remind them of the history of the Service Unit with which they were identified in the Great War, and of those with whom they were associated. The suggestion of a booklet was favoured; hence the

idea of this "Historical Calendar."

Merely to sketch the movements of the Battalion in Belgium, France, and Germany would be incomplete without reference to the mobilization of the unit and the periods of valuable training in Kingston, Ontario, Canada (the "Home of the 21st"), and at West Sandling Camp, Kent, England. The standard of efficiency which was attained as the result of the application and work of those arduous days contributed very materially towards the imperishable record which this Battalion of the Eastern Ontario Regiment has won on the battlefields of Europe.

On the 19th of October, 1914, authority was granted to Lieutenant-Colonel (later Brigadier-General) William St. Pierre Hughes, a member of the distinguished Canadian military family, to organize an Infantry Battalion, to be absorbed into the second Canadian contingent for overseas service. The personnel was to be from Fastern Ontario, including Ottawa, Kingston, Belleville, Picton, Cobourg, Brockville, Lanark, Perth, Smith's Falls, Carleton Place, Almont, Arnprior, Renfrew, Pembroke, Lindsay, Port Hope, Bowmanville, Trenton, Prescott, Peterboro, and Cornwall. From these districts the number of volunteers exceeded the establishment by hundreds; and on the 3rd of November the drafts arrived at Kingston, which city had been selected for the headquarters of the Battalion. The unit was first organized on the eight single-company basis, lettering from "A" to "H." Headquarters was established at the Armouries, with the right half Battalion accommodated in the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery new stables, which had been renovated, in the adjacent Artillery Park. The large

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building of the cereal mill on the water front at the foot of Gore Street was converted into a barracks for the left half Battalion. A few weeks later the formation was reorganized on the four double-company basis.

From the date of formation to the 4th of May, 1915, which included several cold months, a systematic schedule of training was carried out, with sports and amusements as diversions. Special courses of instruction were conducted for Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers.

When the warning order to proceed overseas was finally received, a fully mobilized and well-disciplined Battalion, composed of men from every profession and occupation, was in readiness, and keen at the prospect of soon taking their place on the Western battle-front alongside their comrades of the glorious First Canadian Division.

While at Kingston the Battalion was presented with handsome "Colours" by the Army and Navy Veterans'

Association of that city.

On the evening of the 5th of May the "21st" was accorded a rousing send-off by the people of Kingston, who most heartily showed their appreciation of the spirit and loyalty of the Commanding Officer, Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men. Demonstrations of this nature were repeated at Brockville and Cornwall, where the citizens assembled at the stations and wished all "God speed" and "a safe return."

The trains pulled in at the Montreal docks at six o'clock on the following morning, and the Battalion quickly embarked on the s.s. *Metagama*. Hospital units from Queen's, McGill, and Laval Universities were on board. At 11 a.m. on the 6th of May the *Metagama* cleared from the docks and steamed down the St. Lawrence River. After a pleasant ten days' voyage the "21st" disembarked at Devonport, England; and on the 16th of May was complete at West Sandling Camp, as a unit of the 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade, 2nd Canadian Division.

Then commenced a period of intensive training, to complete the Battalion's efficiency as a fighting force, in preparation for the move to France. Throughout this period the spirit and discipline of the men was marked by cheerfulness and a desire to attain quickly the required

standard for service on the battle-front.

Numerous events during the period in England are recalled, among them the 4th Brigade Sports at West Sandling, on the 1st of July; the inspection of the Division at Beechborough Park, Kent, by the Right Hon. Sir Robert Borden, Premier of Canada, on the 16th of July; the inspection by Mr. Bonar Law, Colonial Secretary for Great Britain, accompanied by Major-General Sir Sam Hughes, on the 4th of August; Divisional manœuvres from the 23rd to the 26th of August; and, lastly, the review of the Division by His Majesty King George V., accompanied by Lord Kitchener, at Beechborough Park, on the 2nd of September. While in England the Battalion "Colours" were placed in the custody of Sir George Perley, the High Commissioner for Canada, pending the return of the Battalion to England.

On the 14th of September the 21st Battalion received the order to embark at Folkestone on the following morning. The crossing over to French soil was carried out without mishap, and the 21st Battalion became

identified with the British Expeditionary Force.

COMMANDING OFFICERS

BRIGADIER-GENERAL WILLIAM ST. PIERRE HUGHES, D.S.O.

The first Commanding Officer was in pre-war days associated with the 14th Regiment (Princess of Wales's Own Rifles), of Kingston, Ontario. At the outbreak of war he was commanding the unit. General (then Lieut,-Colonel) Hughes was appointed to mobilize and command the 21st Canadian Battalion in November, 1914, and continued in such capacity until he assumed command of the 10th Canadian Infantry Brigade, in France, on the 14th of July, 1916, and was promoted to the rank of Brigadier-General. He saw service in the North-West Rebellion, wearing the riband of that campaign. He has also completed the period for the Long Service Decoration in the Canadian Active Militia. Previous to the war he was Inspector of Penitentiaries.

The name of General W. St. Pierre Hughes, the moving spirit in the Battalion for so many months, who directed and "fathered" the unit from the days of its infancy, and whose character as a man and example as an officer became engrained into its life, will ever be associated with

its history.

(THE LATE) LIEUT.-COLONEL ELMER WATSON JONES, D.S.O. (WITH BAR).

Succeeded Brigadier-General W. St. P. Hughes in command of the 21st Canadian Battalion. The unit of the Canadian Active Militia in which he served was the 41st Regiment (Rifles), of Brockville, Ontario. In 1907 he transferred from his home Regiment to the Reserve of Officers, with the rank of Captain. When war broke out he was practising law at Vancouver, B.C., but came East, applied for an appointment with the 21st Canadian Battalion, and became the first Officer Commanding "A" Company. He was promoted to the rank of Major while commanding his company on the 9th of February, 1915, and was appointed Second-in-Command of the Battalion in France in January, 1916. His service with the "21st" had been continuous except for a period of convalescence in England, from wounds received in the attack of Vimy Ridge on the 9th of April, 1917. During his absence the Battalion was commanded by Major (Acting Lieut.-Colonel) T. F. Elmitt, D.S.O. The late Colonel Jones returned to France and resumed command on the 6th of July, 1917. On the 8th of August, 1918, he was mortally wounded when advancing with the Battalion in the attack on Marcelcave. East of Amiens, and expired a few minutes later. The remains were interred in the Military Cemetery at Longeau.

Extract from Captain R. J. Renison's (formerly Chaplain) Story of "Battle of Amiens," in "Canada."

"The late Lieut.-Colonel Elmer W. Jones, D.S.O., was one of the most brilliant and beloved officers in the Canadian Army, a man of wide culture, born in Brockville. At the beginning of the war he came over with the Battalion early in 1915. A veteran of St. Eloi, the Somme, and Vimy, he was a father to every man in the Battalion. His influence over his officers was quite extraordinary. He called them all by their Christian names, and his humorous badinage touched the spot with unerring in-His last conference with his company officers was a lesson in personality. He sat on a couch in the dug-out. with hand and leg bandaged, for he had not recovered from a painful accident of a week before. In his quiet tone he gave each his final instructions. His confidence in them and their affectionate respect for him were beautiful to behold."

MAJOR THOMAS F. ELMITT, D.S.O.

In pre-war days an officer of the 43rd Regiment, of Ottawa, and at the outbreak of war was engaged in the lumber business in that city.

Major Elmitt enlisted with the Battalion in November, 1914, as a Captain. He was appointed to command "D" Company, and promoted to the rank of Major December 31st, 1915.

When the late Colonel Elmer W. Jones assumed command of the Battalion, he was appointed Second-in-Command. He commanded the Battalion, with the acting rank of Lieut.-Colonel, during the period Colonel Jones was in England owing to wounds received in the attack on Vimy Ridge in April, 1917.

In October, 1917, Major Elmitt was appointed to a command in England.

This officer, whose enviable record with the "21st" is so well known to all who have served with it, will always stand as one of the prominent figures in the history of the Battalion.

For some years before the war Lieut.-Colonel Pense was associated with Brigadier-General W. St. P. Hughes in the 14th Regiment (Princess of Wales's Own Rifles), of Kingston, Ontario. On the mobilization of the 21st Canadian Battalion he was taken on the strength as a Lieutenant, and posted as a Platoon Commander in "A" Company. On the 5th of February, 1915, he was promoted to the rank of Captain, and assumed the duties of Secondin-Command of "C" Company, which post he held until appointed to command "A" Company in the fighting at the St. Eloi craters in April, 1916. He was appointed an Acting-Major on July 1st, 1916, and was wounded on September 15th, 1916, when the Battalion captured the Sugar Factory, near Courcelette, on the Somme. joining the Battalion in February, 1917, he was promoted to the temporary rank of Major, from the 18th of January, 1917, and appointed Adjutant on the 25th of February of the same year. He held this appointment until assuming the duties of Second-in-Command of the Battalion on the 29th of October, 1917. On the death in action of the late Lieut.-Colonel E. W. Jones, the present Commanding Officer was appointed to command the Battalion, and promoted to the temporary rank of Lieutenant-Colonel on the 9th of August, 1018.

Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' Fields.
- "Take up the quarrel with the foe!
 To you from falling hands we throw
 The torch. Be yours to hold it high.
 If ye break faith with us who die,
 We shall not sleep, though poppies glow
 In Flanders' Fields."

One thought is always with us who live—the thought that other men died for us. Youth, with all its treasures of life and promise, unspent, poured out like spikenard at the feet of the greatest cause—that of right and freedom. Romance and chivalry were once a memory, broken fragments living on, of heroic ages in the past. Upon memories and fragments we live no longer. We have experienced an heroic age, and, like Browning's hero, these "never turned their back, but marched breast forward." We honour our fallen, and the thought of them makes our heritage a richer one.
