


In the Cemetery, Weston-super-Mare, a grave-stone will shortly be erected with the following inscription.

Here lie the remains of


MARIA NEWMAN, second daughter of the first Sir John Kennaway, Bart., Born Feb. 1801, Married Dec. 1835,

With no superiority of intellect, vet by the force of love, by sweet piety, by tender compassion, by coming down to the lowly, by unselfishness and simplicity of life, by a constant sense of God's presence, by devout exercises private and social, she achieved much of Christian saintliness, and much of human happiness. Warm and constant in friendship, she ever remembered the afflicted poor, though parted by time and distance. She has left a large void in her husband's heart, who enjoyed the blessing of her love more than 40 years.
