reports that notwithstanding SR 600-100-2, dated 21 April 1949, the Veterans Administration is continuing to receive improperly executed applications for National Service Life Insurance and related papers. Errors and omissions in these applications cause considerable delay in processing, thus jeopardizing the interest of applicants and their beneficiaries.

"2. The most common errors and/or omissions by insurance officers, medical officers and applicants in the preparation of VA Forms 9-350a are as follows:

"Part II of VA Form 9-350a.

- a. Failure to date and sign application.
- b. Failure to answer questions individually as required, and not in groups.
- c. Omission of dates covering treatment and periods of hospitalization.

"Part III of VA Form 9-350a.

- a. Omission of the urinalysis report.
- b. Failure of the examining physician to utilize the space furnished under the various items for 'Remarks' to describe any departure from normal.
- c. Failure of the examining physician to furnish the present condition of the applicant where there is a record of some past illness or where he has been recently discharged from a hospital.
- d. Failure of the examining physician to furnish adequate remarks on abnormalities stated in Part II of the application.
- e. Failure of the examining physician to date and sign the application.
- f. Failure to make complete answers to questions 1 through 15, particularly 8 and 9, and, to a lesser degree, questions 10, 11, and 12.

"3. Commanders will take appropriate action to insure that applications for National Service Life Insurance (VA Form 9-350a) and related papers are properly executed." (AGRC 019)

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Material which does not require handling as expeditiously as intended for Messageforms or signal communications, will be compiled and issued by this headquarters in Weekly Directives. Weekly Directives have the status of official orders and directives, and are distributed to all units including companies. These directives are issued in numerical sequence, and subsequent references to them will make filing and annotating in the headquarters of all recipients essential.

Weekly Directive 62, Hq Eighth Army, 12 November 1949, Cont'd.

Section I - Marking System and Permanent Record Cards for Dependent Schools.

1. Reference.

Section XVII, Weekly Directive 48, this headquarters, 6 August 1949, subject as above.

2. Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 000.3 (29 Jul 49) GA, 1 November 1949, subject: "Marking System and Permanent Record Cards for Use in the Dependent Schools of the Far East Command," is quoted in part for information and compliance.

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"2. In amplification of instructions contained in reference letter, [quoted in the reference] it is desired that the following procedures be established:

"a. Form 216A will be retained at the local school until such time as a transcript of credits is requested by the school to which the pupil has transferred. Upon such request, it will be forwarded by mail in conformity with the requirements of the United States accrediting agencies.

"b. In case of transfer to another school in the Far East Command, both forms 216 and 216A will be mailed. In this instance, the school mailing the forms will retain a record of the information contained on these cards until a receipt is received for them.

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"d. Grade cards, forms 213, 214 and 215, issued by local schools, will admit transferring pupils to other schools in the Far East Command until the record is confirmed by form 216A. Likewise, normal practice in all United States schools is to accept grade cards for placement purposes until confirmed by permanent records (form 216A)."

3. Commanders will ensure, at the close of the current and each succeeding school year, that the Permanent Record Cards form 216 of pupils who have withdrawn from the local school are assembled and forwarded to this headquarters, attention: Dependent School Officer. (AGV 000.3)

Section II - Leaves to Philippine Islands.

1. Reference.

Circular 26, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1 August 1948, subject: "Authorized Absences."

2. Radiogram, Philippines Air Command, U13699A-1, 25 October 1949, is quoted in part for information and compliance:

"Request that enlisted men * * * not be permitted to depart your command for leave in the Philippines unless they have in their possession at least \$5.00 per day of leave authorized, in American United States currency. Enlisted men * * * arriving with occupation script, which is not cashable, or with insufficient funds, will be returned via first available air or water transportation."

3. Future requests for permission to visit the Philippine Islands will include a statement that person concerned will upon departure have sufficient United States currency in his possession. (AGR 210.711)

Section III - Lost, Abandoned and Unclaimed Baggage.

1. Reference.

Section XIV, Weekly Directive 46, this headquarters, 23 July 1949, subject: "Processing of Incoming Lost, Abandoned and Unclaimed Baggage," as amended.

2. Attached as inclosure 1 is list of unclaimed baggage on hand at or obtainable through the Baggage Section, 2d Transportation Medium Port. (AGJ 524)

Section IV - Legal Holidays - Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's.

1. References.

a. Paragraph 2, AR 600-115.

b. Paragraph 9e, Section I, Circular 33, this headquarters, 18 April 1948, subject: "Authorized Absences."

2. Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's being legal holidays all duty except necessary guard, fatigue and other functions essential for health, safety and welfare of the command will be suspended during the periods indicated below:

a. Thanksgiving - 24 November 1949.

b. Christmas - from 1200, 24, 25 and 26 December 1949.

c. New Year's - from 1200, 31 December through 2400, 2 January 1950.

3. Department of the Army civilian employees will be required to

work 32 hours during the week of 20-26 November 1949; 40 hours during the week of 18-24 December 1949; 32 hours during the week of 25-31 December 1949; and 32 hours during the week of 1-7 January 1950. Absence in excess of that prescribed above, for recreational purposes, will be charged to the civilian employee as annual leave.

4. Pass and leave policies should be liberalized during the period 22 December 1949 through 4 January 1950, both dates inclusive. The maximum number of personnel, consistent with present leave policies, whose families or home units are located in Japan, may be granted leave adequate to enable them to spend the holidays at their home station.

5. Passes issued to enlisted men for 24 December 1949 and 31 December 1949 may authorize absence from the unit until 0200, 25 December 1949 and 1 January 1950, respectively.

6. Commanders will plan complete recreational programs and holiday celebrations within unit areas, to provide appropriate recreational opportunities for those individuals not desiring passes on Christmas and New Year's Eve. (AGF 006)

Section V - Standing Operating Procedure for American Dependent Schools.

Pending revision, subparagraph 12a, Section I, Circular 10, this headquarters, 9 February 1949, subject as above, is changed to read: "Dependent School Monthly Report, Reports Control Symbol TIE 03 (R1), inclosure 1, will be prepared as of the last day of each month and forwarded direct to reach this headquarters by the 5th of the following month." (AGV 000.8)

Section VI - Return of Enlisted Personnel to RYCOM.

1. Radiogram, Commanding General, RYCOM, R 67079, 5 November 1949, is quoted for compliance:

"Reference Department of the Army message WCL 20134, request all enlisted men concerned, presently on leave, TDY and attending schools, who desire immediate relief from active duty, be returned this command soon as possible. It is anticipated that these enlisted men will depart for Zone of Interior aboard USAT Morton, estimated time of departure [from RYCOM] 28 November 1949."

2. Personnel on leave will be informed and others concerned will be released immediately for return to RYCOM.

3. Department of the Army Message WCL 20134 was disseminated in radiogram DX 73495 DP, 28 October 1949. (AGR 220.8)

Section VII - Passenger Transportation by Rail.

1. Reference.

Weekly Directive 62, Hq Eighth Army, 12 November 1949, Cont'd.

Messageform DX 84007 JM, this headquarters, 10 October 1949, subject: "Passenger Transportation by Rail - Changes in Procedure," as amended.

2. Commanders will ensure that acting Transportation Officers enter in the space provided on 3A Form 61, railway station of destination to preclude confusion and delay in the issuance of railway tickets. (AGJ 531)

Section VIII - Communications for the Philippines Command (Air Force).

1. The Philippines Air Command, established by General Orders 48, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 12 October 1949 was redesignated the Philippines Command (Air Force), short title, PHILCOM (AF), effective 7 November 1949 by General Orders 54, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 4 November 1949.

2. Communications for PHILCOM (AF) will be addressed to the Commanding General, Philippines Command (Air Force) APO 74. (AGRC 322)

Section IX - Anti-Freeze.

Commanders will ensure that all liquid cooled vehicles and equipment are protected against freezing prior to 20 November 1949 in compliance with the provisions of Section III, Circular 61, this headquarters, 6 August 1949, subject: "Ethylene Glycol Anti-Freeze." (AGO 412.6)

Section X - Issue Hours at Japan Oil Storage Company Petroleum Terminals.

Working hours at all Japan Oil Storage Company petroleum terminals are from 0800 to 1630, Monday through Saturday. Effective this date, except upon specific approval by the terminal superintendent, deliveries or issues of petroleum products will not be made during other than normal working hours. (AGP 463.7)

Section XI - Pay, Allowances and Numerical Grade Designation.

Radiogram, Department of the Army WCL 22496, 9 November 1949, is quoted in part for information and guidance:

"* * * In view of restriction contained in Mustering Out Pay Act regarding base pay of third pay period and since pay periods not specified in new pay act, doubt exists as to propriety of payment of mustering out pay to officers and warrant officers. Accordingly no further payments of mustering out pay should be made to any officer or warrant officer pending further instructions from this office.

"* * * AWOL of 24 hours or more after 1 October 1949 will terminate saved pay and family allowance.

"* * * New pay grade numerical designations as listed in Department of Army Circular 106 current series will not be used on military pay record and addressograph plates pending issuance of new instructions. Pay grade

and grade code numbers in effect prior to 1 October 1949 will continue to be used." (AGRC 240)

Section XII - Recruiting - Reenlistment Leave Travel Allowances.

Radiogram, Commander-in-Chief, Far East, ZX 27992, 3 November 1949, is quoted for information and compliance:

"Following information received from Department of the Army: 'Date 1 January 1950 for cessation reenlistment leave travel allowances payments correct. Section 531 (C) (8) Career Compensation Act 1949 repeals portion Act 6 October 1945 providing payments enlisted personnel reenlistment leave travel allowances. Section 533 (C) provision repeal shall become effective 1 January 1950 exceptions cannot be authorized.' Request dissemination all personnel." (AGRE 340)

Section XIII - Recruiting - Recruiting Check Sheet.

Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 341 (28 October 1949) AG-PR, 28 October 1949, subject as above, is quoted for information and compliance:

"1. In order to assist recruiting personnel in the execution of staff visits to subordinate units the attached Recruiting Check Sheet [Inclosure 2] has been prepared as a method of recording information obtained during such visits. The use of this check sheet will standardize to a great extent the organization and operation of recruiting units as well as aid in the elimination of deficiencies noted therein.

"2. It is recommended that this check sheet be reproduced and utilized by all recruiting personnel. The check sheet should be prepared in duplicate, original to be retained in the files of the unit visited, and the copy to be retained in the files of the Recruiting Office executing the staff visit." (AGRE 340)

"The following message Headquarters USAF is quoted for the information and guidance of all recruiting personnel:

'From AFFTP. Effective immediately and pending publication of change to AFR 39-25, 1 June 1949, the procurement of personnel and grade recommendation by board action as outlined in paragraph 5, AFR 39-25, will be limited to those individuals exceptionally well qualified in one of the Airmen Military Occupational Specialties listed as critical in AFR 35-34, 16 March 1949 or the regulation replacing it, or meet the general prerequisite qualifications for a technical training course leading to an MOS listed as critical.'" (AGRE 340)

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Material which does not require handling as expeditiously as intended for Messageforms or signal communications, will be compiled and issued by this headquarters in Weekly Directives. Weekly Directives have the status of official orders and directives, and are distributed to all units including companies. These directives are issued in numerical sequence and subsequent references to them will make filing and annotating in the headquarters of all recipients essential.

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

Section I - Breakage Allowance for Indigenous Chinaware and Glassware.

Breakage allowances for indigenously procured chinaware, cups and saucers, and glassware, tumblers, 10 ounce, authorized for issue to bachelor officer, Department of the Army Civilian, and troop messes, will be as follows:

a. Company style bachelor officers' quarters, Department of the Army Civilians, and troop messes - 10% per quarter.

b. Cafeteria style bachelor officers' quarters, Department of the Army Civilians, and troop messes - 20% per quarter. (AGP 414.3)

Section II - Cost of Subsistence Supplied to Department of the Air Force.

1. Reference.

Circular 55, this headquarters, 15 July 1949, subject: "Distribution of and Accounting for Field Rations."

2. On or before the 10th of each month the sales officer in charge of each field commissary, established and operating in accordance with the reference, will submit a report to this headquarters, attention: Quartermaster, containing the following information relative to issues made during the preceding month. Reports Control Symbol QMG-82 applies:

a. Number of rations issued to Army units.

b. Dollar value of subsistence issued to Army units.

c. Number of rations issued to Air Force units.

d. Dollar value of subsistence issued to Air Force units.

The value of subsistence supplied for resale use will not be reported.

3. The Tokyo Quartermaster Depot will submit a one-line report covering the total dollar value of subsistence supplied to the Air Force for resale purposes. Reporting date, addressee, and reports control symbol will be as prescribed in paragraph 2 above. (AGP 430)

Section III - Suspension of Authorizations for Clubs.

1. Pending completion of a facilities survey, approval for establishing additional enlisted, civilian, or officers' clubs will be withheld.

2. Requests now in this headquarters are being returned without action, for resubmission under the provisions of a circular to be published by this headquarters in the near future. (AGH 331.2)

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

Section IV - Troop Information Hours.

Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 353.01 (8 Oct 49) TIE, 19 October 1949, subject: "Subjects for Discussion in Troop Information Hours," is quoted for information and compliance:

"1. Reference is made to letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 353.01 (8 Oct 49) TIE, subject: 'Troop Information Hours,' 8 October 1949. [Section VI, Weekly Directive 58, this headquarters, 15 October 1949, subject: 'Troop Information Hours.']

"2. In accordance with the provisions of the referenced letter, the following subjects will be discussed during the month of November 1949 in all mandatory Army Information Hours:

"Week Beginning

6 November

'The Theory of Communism,' first of a series of articles on Communism based on Armed Forces Talk No. 294.

13 November

'Your Community and Your Vote,' fifth in a series of articles on Citizenship based on Armed Forces Talk No. 295.

20 November

'Communism in the USSR,' second in a series of articles on Communism based on Armed Forces Talk No. 296.

"3. For the week beginning 27 November TIPS Magazines, 'TVA - Pattern for Progress,' will be distributed to all units and may be used at the discretion of commanding officers." (AGV 353)

Section V - Library Overdue and Reserved Book Notices.

1. Library Form 3, "Overdue Notice," and Library Form 15, "Reserve Book Notice," with penalty indicia, are obsolete and will not be used.

2. Overdue notice cards and reserved book notices without penalty indicia will be forwarded through message centers. If use of postal channels is required, notices will be enclosed in penalty envelopes. (AGH 331.1)

Section VI - Volunteering, Selection and Processing for Airborne Training Officer Personnel.

1. Letter, Department of the Army, AGAO-S 210.31 (3 Oct 49) CSGPA-O-M, 7 October 1949, subject: "Volunteering, Selection and Processing for Airborne Training Officer Personnel," is quoted for information and compliance:

"1. References.

a. DA Cir 193, 1 July 1948.

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

b. DA Cir 380, 9 July 1948.

c. SR 135-215-5, 27 May 1949.

"2. Pending publication Special Regulation to supersede Department of the Army Circular 193, 1948, following policy governing officer personnel is effective immediately:

a. Officers of the National Guard or Officers' Reserve Corps on extended active duty may volunteer for airborne training without regard to months left to serve in current category.

b. Applications submitted in accordance with Circular 193, 1948 by officers of the National Guard or Officers' Reserve Corps on extended active duty will include the following statement:

(1) I intend to complete the course of instruction at the prescribed school, and upon completion thereof to remain on active duty with the Armed Forces for a period of one year. I hereby waive any right to resign, or otherwise be relieved from active duty before a date one year subsequent to successful completion of such schooling unless I am sooner relieved for the convenience of the Government.

c. Each commander, through whom an application is forwarded, will include in the forwarding indorsement a statement whether or not the applicant is qualified for retention on active duty in accordance with the provisions of SR 135-215-5, 27 May 1949."

2. Applications will be forwarded through channels to this headquarters. (AGR 210.31)

Section VII - Computation of Foreign Service Tour, Far East Command.

Radiogram, General Headquarters, Far East Command, ZX 26881, 24 October 1949, is quoted for information and compliance:

"Reference is SR 600-175-1, dated 21 June 1949. Expiration dates of normal foreign service tours for personnel who serve uninterrupted periods of sixty days or more on temporary duty with a major command within Far East Command having a different length of normal tour will be recomputed in accordance with paragraph six, referenced Special Regulation. For example, if an individual whose permanent station is Japan where the normal tour is thirty months serves three months temporary duty without interruption in Okinawa where normal tour is fifteen months, he will be credited with having served six months based on the thirty months tour. The expiration of his normal tour would consequently be reduced by three months. Extensions previously granted and commitments to remain twelve months after arrival of dependents in Far East Command will not be effected by foregoing instructions. Appropriate records of eligible personnel will be amended accordingly and will cite Department of the Army radiogram WCL 49186, dated 19 October 1949, as authority." (AGR 210.481)

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

Section VIII - Organized Reserve Corps - Mobilization Designations.

1. Reference.

SR 140-145-5.

2. Circular implementing instructions contained in reference is in process of preparation at this headquarters.

3. Letters prescribed in paragraph 6 of the reference are being sent to reservists selected for mobilization designations.

4. Commanders will authorize training for individuals in mobilization designations following receipt of circular referred to in paragraph 2. (AGR 326.2)

Section IX - Assignment of Enlisted Leaders' Course Graduates.

Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 220.3 (24 Oct 49) AG-PP, subject: "Assignment of Enlisted Leaders' Course Graduates," is quoted in part for information and compliance.

"1. References.

- a. Training Circular 6, Department of the Army, 19 July 48.
- b. SR 615-205-2.

"2. It is desired that enlisted replacements received from the zone of interior, who are graduates of the leaders' courses at training divisions, be assigned to combat career field positions.

"3. Until such time as the instruments upon which initial assignments are based clearly identify graduates of leaders' courses, it is desired that enlisted personnel possessing an MOS 0521, 0566, or 0590, in addition to personnel already classified in combat career fields, be assigned so far as is practicable to commands having combat career field positions. If it is necessary to assign enlisted men with an MOS of 0521, 0566, or 0590 to commands not having combat career field positions, leaders' course graduates so assigned need not be reassigned solely because they are graduates of the course; however, leaders' course graduates who are not assigned to a combat career position, and who desire such assignment, will be reported to the appropriate commander having reassignment jurisdiction." (AGR 220.3)

Section X - Lost, Abandoned and Unclaimed Baggage.

1. Reference.

Section XIV, Weekly Directive 46, this headquarters, 23 July 1949, subject: "Processing of Incoming Lost, Abandoned and Unclaimed Baggage," as amended.

2. Attached as inclosure 1 is list of unclaimed baggage on hand at or obtainable through the Baggage Section, 2d Transportation Medium Port. (AGJ 332.3)

Section XI - Sale of Waste Oil to Japanese Government.

1. The term "waste petroleum products," as used herein, includes all petroleum products procured by the United States Government, which have been used or have become contaminated and are no longer acceptable for the purpose originally intended or as substitutes for other refined petroleum products.

2. Waste petroleum products, excess to the needs of the occupation forces, will be released to the Japanese Government as follows:

a. Waste petroleum products will be accumulated for collection by authorized Japanese companies at places designated by Commander of Fleet Activities, Far East, regional post commanders and Commanding Officers of Air Force Bases.

b. Signed receipts (inclosure 2) will be obtained by the releasing agency (Army, Air Forces, Navy, British Commonwealth Occupation Force) from authorized waste oil collectors, listed in inclosure 3, and forwarded to this headquarters by 15th of the following month, attention: Sub-Area Petroleum Office of Japan.

3. Waste petroleum products generating from Eighth Army Exchange Services are not considered as having originated from United States Army sources. (AGP 463.7)

Section XII - Application for Housing and Transportation of Dependents.

1. Reference.

Inclosure 1 to Circular 60, this headquarters, 5 August 1949, subject as above.

2. Pending revision and effective with applications submitted for February 1950 priority list and subsequent lists, so much of paragraph 7 of the reference as reads "Cumulative overseas credits as of 1 December 1949" is amended to read "Cumulative overseas credits as of 1 June 1950." (AGR 510)

Section XIII - Recruiting - Individuals Ineligible for Enlistment in the Regular Army or Air Force.

Letter, Department of the Army, AGSE 342, 10 October 1949, subject as above, is quoted for information and necessary action:

"1. Pending publication of a printed change, SR 615-105-1, AFR 39-9 is changed by adding paragraph 10w as follows:

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

"10w. Former Airmen whose discharge certificates show the notation that they were discharged under the provisions of paragraph 1, AR 615-365 and Department of the Air Force letter AFPMP-4, 1 April 1949, subject: "Disposition of Enlisted Men in the U.S. Air Force."

"2. Individuals who have been discharged under provisions of the above cited letter are not eligible for enlistment in the Regular Army or Air Force." (AGRE 340)

p. Section XIII, Weekly Directive 48, this headquarters, 6 August 1949, subject: "Classification Testing Procedures for Enlisted Personnel."

2. Introduction of Career Fields.

Individuals who hold primary or potential primary MOS's listed in regulations introducing a career field, will be classified in the appropriate career field, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 60, reference 1m.

3. Reassignment of Enlisted Personnel Classified into Career Fields.

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

a. Upon completion of conversions directed in regulations announcing a career field, Soldiers Qualification Cards, WD or DA AGO Forms 20, will be screened and enlisted men who then have a primary MOS listed in a career field will be reassigned to positions in accordance with their primary MOS under the provisions of paragraph 60, reference 1m. Only exceptions authorized are individuals specified in paragraph 61, reference 1m.

b. Individuals who cannot be reassigned to positions within their respective units in accordance with primary MOS will be reported for reassignment on "Enlisted Personnel Status Report" (Reports Control Symbol R-08) as prescribed in reference 1o, including the following additional information:

- (1) Date and term of enlistment.
- (2) Race.
- (3) Date departed Zone of Interior on current overseas tour.
- (4) Number and sex of dependents and whether or not present in this theater.

c. The MOS's 596, 604, 605 and 610 listed in reference 1i, j and k as restricted, are rescinded.

4. Reclassification of Enlisted Personnel for Inefficiency.

a. Commanders will refer any individual who receives an unsatisfactory efficiency report score below 61, to the appropriate classification board for action under provisions of paragraph 73, reference 1m.

b. The classification boards may recommend that an appropriate job proficiency examination be administered by the examining and computing agency, on which a qualifying score of 90 must be attained.

5. The provisions of reference 1d pertaining to reduction for misconduct will apply to personnel classified into career fields.

6. Enlisted Efficiency Reports.

a. The provisions of reference 1a govern the proper rendition of the enlisted efficiency report.

b. Annual and regular efficiency reports will be rendered under provisions of reference 1a at times specified therein. Annual reports will not be rendered for grade 5 and 6 personnel.

c. Special efficiency reports will be rendered when enlisted personnel make application for promotion if more than 90 days has elapsed since the last report.

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

d. Pending revision of reference 1a, enlisted efficiency reports will not be rendered for periods of less than 60 days.

e. The custodian of personnel records may contact former units of enlisted personnel to obtain last efficiency report scores not recorded on WD or DA AGO Forms 20.

7. Provisions of and processing application for advancement and application for lateral transfer.

a. Enlisted personnel holding primary MOS's in a career field, and performing duty in that MOS as prescribed in paragraph 60, reference 1m, may apply for advancement in that career field. Exception is made for individuals performing recruiting duties, who hold primary or potential primary MOS's falling within an introduced career field with prefix digit "5," as prescribed in paragraph 31, reference 1c. This personnel will be considered as classified in a career field and will be eligible to submit application for career field promotion.

b. Enlisted personnel classified into a career field holding primary or potential primary MOS's in that field may apply for lateral transfer between career fields, under provisions of paragraph 66, reference 1m.

c. Lateral transfer (Section IX, reference 1m) may be accomplished by unit commanders, at the individual's request, by reclassification proceedings, or at the direction of the Department of the Army.

d. Individuals eligible for lateral transfer may submit request for such transfer on "Application for Advancement" (DA AGO Form 359). Applications will be processed as prescribed for applications for promotion. Lateral transfer qualifying score will be a composite score of 900.

e. An Enlisted person reporting to a testing center for proficiency examinations will have approved copy of application for advancement (DA AGO Form 359) or statement from his commanding officer that application for advancement was submitted and approved, but not received on date of examination. Individuals reporting for examinations, not complying with the above, will be ineligible for participation in proficiency examinations. Enlisted personnel reporting more than 2 hours late for examination will be considered ineligible.

f. Dates for submission of application for advancement for announced career field examinations.

(1) Food Service Career Field:

Effective immediately, personnel classified into the food service career field and performing duty in primary MOS or related MOS of equal or higher skill, may submit applications for advancement. Closing date for individuals to submit applications will be 21 October 1949.

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Applicants for first semi-annual round scheduled 11 and 12 August 1949 for grade 3, MOS 060, will be advised to withhold filing application on this second annual round until announcement of the promotion score for MOS 060, grade 3, has been made. Those who are not promoted may then submit applications for advancement. Pending revision by Department of the Army, the provisions of reference 11, are applicable to individuals in the Food Service Career Field, except that school training in the specific MOS is no longer mandatory for the award of the MOS. Applications for promotion normally will not be submitted subsequent to 21 October 1949.

(2) Combat Career Field:

Personnel properly classified into combat career fields may submit applications for promotion between the following dates: Infantry: 6 September - 20 October 1949. Armored Cavalry: 12 September - 26 October 1949. Artillery: 5 October - 21 November 1949.

g. Commanders will ensure that any individual eligible for rotation who has an accepted "Application for Advancement" to take scheduled career field proficiency examinations, is afforded the opportunity of being deferred from movement until after completion of the examination. Appropriate examining and computing agency will be notified immediately of any change of approved applicants.

h. Time in grade and time in service for promotion in combat career fields will be computed as of 1 February 1950. Requirements specified in paragraph 89, reference 1m, are applicable for recipients of one time grade adjustment promotions under the provisions of references 1i, j, and k, who wish to participate in forthcoming proficiency examinations.

i. Time in grade and time in service requirements for second annual round of food service promotion examinations will be computed as of the examination date. All individuals who were promoted as a result of the first annual round proficiency examination held in November 1948, regardless of date of promotion, will be credited with the necessary 12 months time in grade for application on the second annual round, when only 12 months time in grade is required. If delay in promotion was due to other ineligibility of the individual, credit for 12 months service will not be authorized.

j. Proficiency examinations for career fields will be held semi-annually for grade IV personnel, and annually for grades III, II and I.

k. Individuals eligible for proficiency examinations may submit applications for participation in three proficiency examinations in MOS's of the next higher grade.

l. Pending amendment to reference 1i, enlisted personnel holding

Weekly Directive 60, Hq Eighth Army, 29 October 1949, Cont'd.

- (3) MOS 0814 - Operations NCO (When such primary or potential primary MOS was obtained as a result of duty performance as Operations NCO in amphibious tractor units, or in connection with operation of amphibious tractors or training of amphibious tractor operators)

Section I - Monthly Statement of Operations and Net Working Capital
(Reports Control Symbol QSS-14)

1. Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, APO 500, File AG 123 (30 April 48) SS, 5 October 1949, subject: "Monthly Statement of Operations and Net Working Capital, Reports Control Symbol QSS-14 (R-1)," is quoted in part for the information and guidance of commanders exercising jurisdiction over organizations having clubs, messes, and similar associations operating under the provisions of Circular 1, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1 January 1949:

"1. References:

a. Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 123 (30 April 48) SS, subject: "Monthly Statement of Operations and Net Working Capital, Reports Control Symbol QSS-14, 30 April 1948."

* * * * *

d. Paragraph 20g, Circular 1, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1 January 1949.

"2. All previous instructions outlining the preparation of the Monthly Statement of Operations and Net Working Capital, Reports Control Symbol QSS-14, are rescinded and instructions included in this letter will be followed. Sample form to be followed by custodians of sundry funds in the preparation of this report is attached as an inclosure. [Inclosure 1]

"3. Monthly Statement of Operations and Net Working Capital, Reports Control Symbol QSS-14 (R-1), is divided into 5 sections, as follows:

Section A - Statement of Operations

Section B - Adjustment of Net Worth

Section C - Financial Statement

Section D - Operating Statistics

Section E - Comments and Questions

"4. Detailed instructions for the preparation of the report are listed below. Letters of sub-paragraphs correspond with the sections referred to in preceding paragraph, and numbers correspond to line numbers in the statements. The fund reference number to be entered at the top of the report will be assigned upon receipt of notification of establishment required by paragraph 13a, Circular 1, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1 January 1949. The name of the fund entered at the head of the report must agree with the name of the club of which establishment was approved. With the exception of funds dissolved during a month, a report will cover a full calendar month and the date entered in the space "Month Ending" will be the last day of the month covered by the report.

Weekly Directive 59, Hq Eighth Army, 22 October 1949, Cont'd.

a. Section A - Statement of Operations:

1. Gross Sales During Month will include the total gross sales of saleable merchandise, whether sold for cash or for chits. (Sales of chits must not be included in this total.)
2. Inventory at the beginning of the month must at all times agree with the amount of inventory at end of the previous month, shown on line 4 of the report for the preceding month.
3. Purchases during the month will include all saleable merchandise received during the month. In the event saleable merchandise is received and is not paid for by the end of the accounting period, the unpaid obligation will be reflected in Accounts Payable, item 9 of Section C - Financial Statement. The value of saleable merchandise received unaccompanied by an invoice will be determined on a cost basis and the estimated value thereof will also be included in Accounts Payable.
4. Inventory at end of month. The cost value of saleable merchandise on hand at the end of the month, excluding items related to "Other Revenue" will be entered on line 4.
5. Cost of Sales is determined by subtracting the inventory at the end of the month from the total of inventory at the beginning of the month and purchases during the month.
6. Gross Earnings on Sales is determined by subtracting line 5, Cost of Sales from line 1, Gross Sales During the Month.
- 7, 8, 9, & 10. Expenses. Enter items of expense by definite classification, such as salaries, maintenance supplies, stationery and printing, etc. Any expense incurred but not paid must be entered. Unpaid items will be included in item 9, Accounts Payable, in Section C, Financial Statement. The gross salaries must be included under Expenses. Federal Income Tax Withhold, will be reported under Other Liabilities of the Financial Statement. If sufficient space is not available for reporting by definite classification, a schedule will be attached to the report, and the total entered on the Statement of Operations.
11. The total expense for the period will be reported on line 11.

12. Net Earnings on Sales is the excess of line 6 over line 11. In the event line 11 is greater than line 6, a loss has been sustained. The amount of loss will be circled.
 - 13, 14, 15, & 16. Other Revenue must be itemized by definite classification. If sufficient space is not available in the statement, a schedule must be attached to furnish the required information and the total reported under Other Revenue. Enter the net amount for each type of revenue after deducting costs. As an example, if the club conducts bingo, the net result, after deducting cost of prizes will be reported. In the event a loss is sustained, the net result will be circled and deducted from the total of all other revenue.
 17. The total of items 13, 14, 15, and 16 are entered on line 17, Total Other Revenue.
 18. Enter the net result of lines 12 and 17. In the event a loss is sustained the amount of loss will be circled.
- b. Section B - Adjustment of Net Worth:
1. Balance Beginning of Period must agree with the net worth reported at the end of the preceding period.
 2. Profit (Loss) for Period. Enter result of operations for the period as reflected on line 18, Section A, Statement of Operations.
 3. Other Additions must be fully explained under Section E.
 4. Other Deductions must be fully explained under Section E.
 5. The net result of items 1 to 4, inclusive, are entered on line 15, Net Worth, Section C, Financial Statement.
- c. Section C - Financial Statement:
1. Cash on Hand is defined as the total cash on hand including indigenous currency, petty cash funds, change funds and monies not yet deposited.
 2. Cash in Bank. Enter the name of depository. Report the balance reflected by cash in bank account in the general ledger, which must be in agreement with balance shown in the check book. Do not enter the amount reported by banks, as bank statements frequently

require reconciliation due to outstanding checks or uncredited deposits in transit.

3. Inventories at Cost. Enter the inventories of saleable merchandise on hand which have been reported on line 4, Section A, Statement of Operations.
- 4, 5, and 6. Other Assets itemized by category. In the event sufficient space is not available, attach an itemized schedule to the report. Bingo prizes purchased for future use, Deposits for Locker Funds, Unexpired Insurance Premiums, and Cooperage are a few of the assets to be reported as Other Assets.
7. The total of lines 4, 5, and 6 is entered on line 7. Total Other Assets.
8. Total Assets is the total of: (1) Cash on Hand (2) Cash in Bank (3) Inventories at Cost (7) Total Other Assets.
9. Accounts Payable is the total of all unpaid current obligations, other than Federal Income Tax Withheld.
- 10, 11, and 12. Report all other liabilities by definite classification. Federal Income Tax Withheld will be reported as a separate item on one of these lines. Other liabilities, such as Refundable Memberships and Unredeemed Chits will also be reported separately. In the event sufficient space is not available, list the outstanding liabilities on an attached schedule and report the total thereof under Other Liabilities.
13. Enter total of lines 10, 11, and 12.
14. Total Liabilities is the total of item 9, Accounts Payable and item 13, Total Other Liabilities.
15. Net Worth must be in agreement with the Net Worth End of Period, reported on line 5, Section B, Adjustment of Net Worth.
16. Total Liabilities and Net Worth is the total of lines 14 and 15 and must be in an agreement with line 8.

d. Section D - Operating Statistics:

1. Membership. Enter under appropriate captions, the total of the various categories of personnel constituting the membership of the club. Dependents and civilians, unless they actually pay membership fees

and dues, are not to be included in these statistics.

2. Chits. - The unredeemed balance at beginning of the month must agree with the amount reported under Other Liabilities in the report for the preceding month. Sold During the Month will include all chits sold. Redeemed During the Month will include the total of all chits redeemed, either in exchange for cash or saleable merchandise. Unredeemed Balance is determined by adding the unredeemed balance at the beginning of the month to the total sold during the month, and deducting the total redeemed during the month. Unredeemed Balance will be shown as a separate item under Other Liabilities of Section C, Financial Statement.
3. Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment. Furniture, fixtures and equipment will be recorded in a memorandum account similar to that in the Council Book QMC Form 15, Net Value Beginning of the Month must agree with the balance reported at the end of the preceding month. The total cost of property acquired during the month will be reported under the caption, Acquired During the Month. Payment for the property will be reported under part 6, Section E, Comments and Questions, and be included on line 4, Other Deductions, Section B, Adjustment of Net Worth. The total cost of property disposed of during the month, including that on an expenditure voucher for fair wear and tear, will be reported under the caption, Disposed of During the Month. The total amount of monies received from the sale of property will be reported on line 3, Other Additions, Section B, Adjustment of Net Worth, and will be fully explained under part 5, Section E, comments and questions. The Balance at End of the Month is determined by adding Net Value Beginning of Month to Acquired During the Month, and deducting Disposed of During the Month.
4. Description of Minor Revenue Producing Activities. Describe, and state the location of minor revenue-producing activities of the fund. Normal functions of the club, such as bingo parties need not be reported under this caption.

e. Section E - Comments and Questions:

1. Date of last audit, and period covered.
2. Membership limitation. State the limitation as to grade, military, civilian, etc.

3. Date established and authority, if a new fund.
4. Notification of dissolution, if appropriate - advise date of notification.
5. A complete description of all additions to net worth, other than that reported on line 13, Section A, Statement of Operations.
6. Other deductions must be fully itemized and the total must agree with line 4, Other Deductions in Section B, Adjustment of Net Worth.

"5. The report must be signed by the custodian of the fund involved. In the event the custodian is other than a commissioned officer, the club officer must also sign the report to indicate that it has been reviewed by him and is correct.

"6. It is desired that all reports be reviewed by the appropriate headquarters, to insure accuracy and completeness, before being forwarded. Reports should be forwarded so as to reach the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, not later than the 25th of the month following the month for which the report is rendered."

2. Previously prescribed accounting procedure for clubs within the jurisdiction of this headquarters will remain in effect, except as to form of report.

3. The revised report, inclosure 1, will be reproduced locally on both sides of legal size (8x13) paper and will be utilized by all clubs, commencing with the report for the month of October 1949.

4. Reports will be forwarded in duplicate to reach this headquarters not later than the 15th day following the month covered by the report. (AGU 121.7)

Section II - Athletic Shoes and Supporters.

1. References.

- a. SR 32-20-1.
- b. Paragraph 1, Circular 97, Department of the Army, 1 September 1949, subject: "Athletic Clothing."

2. Athletic shoes and supporters are being deleted from paragraph 20 reference 1a and will no longer be issued to enlisted personnel at Government expense (reference 1b). When desired by individuals continued supply is authorized, chargeable against clothing monetary allowance. Mandatory issue will not be made.

3. Items in the individuals' possession will be retained until

unserviceable. Stocks on hand in organization, distribution points and depots will be retained pending disposition instructions from the Department of the Army. (AGP 420)

Section III - Medical Meeting at the 35th Station Hospital.

1. A medical meeting will be held at 0900, 9 November 1949, at the 35th Station Hospital, Kyoto, under the auspices of I Corps (35th and 118th Station Hospitals). Professional subjects of interest to chiefs of services in hospitals and to dispensary surgeons will be discussed.

2. All medical corps officers are invited to attend.

3. The meeting will last one day and terminate in time to permit departure from Kyoto the same evening. Officers desiring overnight accommodations, which are limited, should notify the Commanding Officer, 35th Station Hospital, APO 301 at the earliest practicable date. (AGN 337)

Section IV - Approved Sources for Indigenous Seafoods.

Paragraph 2c, Section XIII, Weekly Directive 57, this headquarters, 8 October 1949, subject as above, is amended to read:

"c. For fresh and frozen seafoods:

Yokohama Reito Kigyo K.K. Central Market, Yokohama, Honshu.

International Marine Products Co., Central Market, Yokohama, Honshu." (AGFS 430)

Section V - Unsuitable Medical Drug.

Pending further instructions from this headquarters, use of item 1-607-422 Procaine Penicillin G Crystalline in oil with Aluminum Monostearate manufactured by Heyden Chemical Corporation, with green closures, is suspended from further use and issue. (AGN 441)

Section VI - Mail Matter Sent to United States.

Section II, Postal Memorandum Number 25, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 13 October 1949, is quoted for information:

"II. MAILING OF BAMBOO, RATTAN, AND RICE STRAW INTO THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES. Reference: Section 52, page 36, U. S. Official Postal Guide, Part II.

The following information concerning the entry into the United States of manufactured articles of bamboo, rattan, and rice straw has been received from the Import and Export Section, Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine, Department of Agriculture:

a. Manufactured articles of bamboo or rattan, such as boxes, furniture, curios, etc., are enterable without restriction. The quarantine

which governs the importation of bamboo and rattan applies only to material capable of propagation.

b. So far as rice straw is concerned, entry without permit or restriction is authorized of rice straw and ornaments intended for household use; of floor mats and rugs and similar articles made of rice straw; and small whisk brooms (not large brooms). Rice straw sandals and slippers are also accorded unrestricted entry." (AGR 311.1)

Section VII - Operating Schedule, Yokohama Engineer Depot.

Effective immediately the Yokohama Engineer Depot normally will not be open on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays for the receipt or issue of supplies. Prior arrangements for emergency issues during other than normal operating hours will be made with the Commanding Officer of the Depot through the duty officer (tel. 4-1424). (AGL 370.2)

Section VIII - Application Forms for Retirement.

1. Radiogram, General Headquarters, Far East Command, ZX 26315, 17 October 1949, is quoted for information and compliance:

"It is desired that in the future, applications for retirement be submitted on NME Form 210, dated 1 June 1949. This form supersedes WD AGO Form 49 dated 1 February 1947, which is obsolete."

2. Initial distribution of NME Forms 210 has been made by the Eighth Army Adjutant General Publications Depot. (AGR 210.85)

Section IX - Observance of Armistice Day.

Armistice Day, 11 November 1949, will be observed as a legal holiday. All duty except necessary guard, fatigue and functions essential to the health, safety and welfare of the command will be suspended. (AGR 006)

Section X - Petroleum Price Lists - Bulk and Packaged.

Inclosure 2, Weekly Directive 48, this headquarters, 6 August 1949, subject: "Packaged Petroleum Price," and inclosure 2, Weekly Directive 55, this headquarters, 24 September 1949, subject: "Bulk Price - Petroleum Products," are rescinded and inclosures 2 and 3 substituted therefor. (AGP 400.1912)

Section XI - Eighth Army Central Dependent Schools Fund.

1. Pending revision, paragraph 4, Section I, Circular 65, this headquarters 12 September 1949, subject: "Eighth Army Central Dependent Schools fund" is changed to read:

"4. Tuition rate will be \$280.00 per pupil per year, payable in ten equal monthly installments."

2. The above tuition is retroactive to 12 September 1949. Necessary

adjustments will be made for tuition collected in excess of this amount, method of adjustment to be at the discretion of local commanders. (AGV 00.8)

Section XII - Computation of Expiration Dates of Sentences of Prisoners.

1. References.

- a. AR 600-375.
- b. SR 600-335-11.
- c. TM 12-510.

2. Letter, Department of the Army, AGAO-S 253 (16 Sep 49)-M, AGPK-S, 20 September 1949, subject: "Computation of Expiration Dates of Sentences of General and Garrison Prisoners," is quoted in part for information and compliance:

* * * * *

"2. Pending its revision, Appendix III of TM 12-510, will be disregarded. * * * for purposes of computation, good time allowances will be reduced to months and days. For this purpose, all months will be considered as having 30 days, and the months and days good time will be subtracted from the sentence to determine the length of time the prisoner will be required to serve in confinement. The expiration dates of sentences of general and garrison prisoners will be computed in accordance with paragraph 211, AR 600-375, which provides for a prisoner's release from confinement on the day preceding the date arrived at by adding the actual time to be served in confinement to the date the sentence was adjudged. The time to be served in confinement is added on a month and day basis. * * * * *"

3. Commanders will, within 60 days:

- a. Review the sentences of prisoners in confinement and recompute the expiration date thereof in accordance with inclosure 4.
- b. Correct records to show the recomputed expiration date.
- c. In cases involving general prisoners submit, when necessary, corrected DA AGO Form 174 in accordance with reference 1b. (AGK 253)

Section XIII - Officer Personnel Act 1947.

Radiogram, Commander-in-Chief, Far East, ZX 26544, 19 October 1949, is quoted in part for necessary action:

" * * * * *

'Effective immediately, final relief orders relieving officers from active duty, excluding Army Specialized Training Program and Medical

Administrative Corps officers, will state that Army of the United States appointments made under provisions of Officer Personnel Act of 1947 and Army of the United States (Air Corps) appointments terminate on date officer reverts to an inactive status. Army Specialized Training Program Medical Corps officers, Army of the United States commissions will continue in force during the present emergency plus six months unless sooner terminated." (AGR 210.456)

Section XIV - Halazone Tablets.

1. Halazone tablets coded G 403 T 427, G 407 T 263, and G 503 T 166 do not pass laboratory tests. Any stocks bearing these numbers in the hands of troops or in depots will be destroyed immediately.

2. Tablets coded G 505 T 021, dated June 1945, will continue to be used on a basis of four (4) tablets per quart of water instead of two (2). (AGP 441)

Section XV - Reporting of Fires.

1. Reference.

Circular 54, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 24 December 1948, subject: "Fire Prevention, Fire Protection, Fire Fighting and Reports of Fire Damage," as amended.

2. In addition to Fire Report, DA AGO Form 5-2, required by the reference, when estimated damage exceeds \$10,000 or loss of life is involved, available facts will be reported immediately to this headquarters, Attention: Engineer by telephone (Yokohama 3-2523 during normal duty hours, 3-2375 after duty hours) or other electrical means. (AGL 600.913)

Section XVI - Recruiting - Enlistments in the United States Air Force.

Radiogram, Commander-in-Chief, Far East, ZK 25995, 13 October 1949 is quoted for information and compliance:

"Effective immediately oversea commanders are not authorized to enlist individuals chargeable against monthly USAF enlistment quota. Section II - Eighth Army Barbershop Harmony Quartet Contest.

1. A Barbershop Harmony Quartet Contest will be conducted in accordance with inclosure 1 for military personnel of Eighth Army and Naval personnel stationed in Japan.

EIGHTH ARMY BARBERSHOP HARMONY QUARTET CONTEST

1. Purpose.

To stimulate interest in off-duty entertainment-music activities, to acknowledge talent, and to select an entry for the Far East Command Barbershop Harmony Quartet Contest.

2. Rules.

a. Each quartet will sing three numbers. Additional numbers will be permitted to break a tie or aid the judges in reaching a decision.

(5) Accuracy in pitch, attack and release.

(6) Effectiveness of expression.

(7) Balance of parts.

(8) Ease of execution.

(9) Spirit and sincerity.

(10) Showmanship and stage presence.

3. Commanders indicated in paragraphs 2 and 3, Section II, Weekly Directive 58, this headquarters, 15 October 1949, subject: "Eighth Army Barbershop Harmony Quartet Contest," are authorized to issue orders directing minimum necessary travel in connection with preliminary elimination contests. Quartets selected to represent these commands will be placed on temporary duty with this headquarters from 1 December 1949 to the end of the contest. The winning quartet will remain on temporary duty with this headquarters through 12 December 1949 to compete in the Far East Command contest.

4. This headquarters, attention: Special Services, will be informed of the estimated time of arrival of the contestants not later than 24

November 1949. Negative reports will be submitted.

5. Participating commands will forward information for publicity to include names and home addresses of contestants.

6. Awards.

Commands conducting preliminary contests are authorized to make awards from nonappropriated funds for winning entries as provided by paragraph 17b, Circular 1, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1 January 1949, subject: "Non-appropriated Funds." This headquarters will make awards to the first three place quartets in the Eighth Army contest.

Weekly Directives have the status of official orders and directives, and are distributed to all units including companies. These directives are issued in numerical sequence and subsequent references to them will make filing and annotating in the headquarters of all recipients recipients essential.

Weekly Directive 57, Hq Eighth Army, 8 October 1949, Cont'd.

Section I - Promotion of Army Nurse Corps and Women's Medical Specialist Corps Officers (Regular Army).

Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 43609, 22 September 1949, is quoted in part for information and necessary action:

* * * * *

"1. Under provisions of Section 107, Public Law 36, 80th Congress, selection board will convene in Washington, D. C. to recommend officers of Army Nurse Corps for promotions to permanent grade of Lt Colonel and officers of Army Nurse Corps and Women's Medical Specialist Corps for promotion to permanent grade of Major. Board will convene commencing on or about 10 October 1949.

"2. 'Best qualified' method of selection will be used throughout. Names of officers in zones of consideration will be submitted by The Adjutant General to selection board and all officers in zones will be considered for promotion. No lists or recommendation are required to be submitted by addressee.

"3. Consideration for promotion will extend through following officers:

a. Army Nurse Corps:

- (1) For Lt Colonel - all permanent Majors who have completed 1 year service in permanent grade of Major prior to 1 January 1950.
- (2) For Major - all permanent Captains who have completed 14 years service for promotion purposes prior to 1 January 1950.

b. Women's Medical Specialist Corps:

- (1) For Major - all permanent Captains of Dietitian Section who have completed 14 years service for promotion purposes prior to 1 January 1950.

"4. Any officer scheduled for consideration for selection under paragraph 3 above and who desires to submit written communication to board concerning themselves will forward such communication to The Adjutant General, attention: Department of the Army Selection Board, not later than 10 days after convening of board.

"5. Desire that this message be brought immediately to attention of all Regular Army officers of Army Nurse Corps and Women's Medical Specialist Corps." (AGR 210.2)

Weekly Directive 57, Hq Eighth Army, 8 October 1949, Cont'd.

Section II - Army or Air Force Retiring Boards.

Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 44994, 29 September 1949, is quoted in part, for information and guidance:

"* * * * 1. Effective 2400 hours, 30 September 1949, authority to convene Army or Air Force retiring boards and authority to discharge onlisted personnel by reason of certificate of disability is rescinded.

"2. No Army or Air Force officer, warrant officer or onlisted person will be discharged, relieved from active duty, retired or otherwise separated by reason of physical disability subsequent to 30 September 1949 (notwithstanding previous directives authorizing such separation) pending announcement of new procedures being developed to implement provisions of new disability separation procedures contained in proposed Career Compensation Act of 1949.

"3. Proceedings of Army or Air Force Retiring Boards and Certificate of Disability Discharge Boards now in session will be discontinued. Completed proceedings of such boards ready for transmittal to Department of the Army or the Air Force or discharge authority will be retained at location of board. Retirement board cases on hand or enroute to Department of the Army or the Air Force which cannot be finalized by 30 September 1949, will be returned for processing under new procedures.

"4. Separation of personnel under the provisions of Army Regulations 615-368 and 615-369 are not affected by provisions of this message unless separation is predicated upon physical disability."
(AGR 210.85)

Section III - Career Guidance Plan for Warrant Officer and Enlisted Personnel.

Section IX, Weekly Directive 52, this headquarters, 3 September 1949, subject: "Career Guidance Plan for Warrant Officers and Enlisted Personnel," is amended as follows:

a. Paragraph 7a to read:

"a. Enlisted personnel holding primary MOS's in a career field, and performing duty in that MOS as prescribed in paragraph 60, reference 1a, may apply for advancement in that career field. Exception is made for individuals performing recruiting duties, who hold primary or potential primary MOS's falling within an introduced career field with prefix digit "5," as prescribed in paragraph 31, reference 1c. This personnel will be considered as classified in a career field and will be eligible to submit application for career field promotion."

b. Paragraph 7h to read:

"h. Time in grade and time in service for promotion in combat career fields will be computed as of 1 February 1950. Requirements

specified in paragraph 89, reference lm, are applicable for recipients of one time grade adjustment promotions under the provisions of references li, j, and k, who wish to participate in forthcoming proficiency examinations." (AGR 330.11)

Section IV - Promotion of Women's Army Corps Officers (Regular Army).

Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 43610, 22 September 1949, is quoted in part for information:

* * * * *

"1. Under provisions of Section 518, Public Law 381, 80th Congress, as amended by Public Law 625, 80th Congress, and AR 605-12, selection board will convene Washington, D. C. to recommend Department of the Army personnel from Women's Army Corps promotion lists for promotion to permanent and temporary grades of Lt Colonel, Major and Captain. Board will convene commencing on or about 16 November 1949.

"2. 'Best qualified' method will be used. Names of officers of Women's Army Corps in zone of consideration will be submitted by The Adjutant General to selection board.

"3. Zones of consideration for permanent promotion are as follows:

a. To Lt Colonel-all permanent Majors who complete 16 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.

b. To Major-all permanent Captains who complete 10 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.

c. To Captain-all permanent 1st Lieutenants who complete 5 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.

"4. Zones of consideration for temporary promotion as follows:

a. To Lt Colonel-:

(1) All permanent Majors Regular Army who complete 16 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.

(2) All non-regular officers serving in grade of Major who have temporary dates of rank of 28 February 1947 or earlier.

b. To Major-:

(1) All permanent Captains Regular Army who complete 13 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.

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- (2) All non-regular officers serving in grade of Captain who have temporary dates of rank of 30 April 1946 or earlier.

c. To Captain-:

- (1) All permanent 1st Lieutenants Regular Army who complete 6 1/2 or more years service for promotion purposes prior to 13 September 1949.
- (2) All non-regular officers serving in grade of 1st Lieutenant who have a temporary date of rank of 30 June 1945 or earlier.

"5. Provisions of paragraph 7a, AR 605-12, that officer being considered for temporary promotion shall have completed a minimum of 12 months in grade while on active duty and not less than 6 months on current tour of active duty will be waived for these promotions.

"6. Recommendations for or against temporary promotions of each officer within the zone established in paragraph 4 will be submitted to The Adjutant General, Department of the Army, attention: AGPO-P, to arrive no later than 24 October 1949. Any officer scheduled for consideration for selection under provisions of paragraph 3 above who desires to submit written communication under provisions of Section 507(c), Public Law 381 80th Congress, will forward such communication to The Adjutant General, attention: Department of the Army Selection Board, so to reach Selection Board not later than 10 days after convening of board.

"7. This message will be brought to attention of all Women's Army Corps officers." (AGR 210.2)

Section V - Distribution of Warrant Officer Pay Grades.

Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 45403, 30 September 1949, is quoted in part for information:

* * * * *

"1. The recently enacted Career Compensation Act of 1949 provides that warrant officers shall be distributed in Pay Grades W-1, W-2, W-3 and W-4, for purpose of initial implementation. Effective 1 October 1949, Chief Warrant Officers will be assigned Pay Grade W-2 (except as indicated below); Warrant Officers Junior Grade will be assigned Pay Grade W-1 (except as indicated below).

Exceptions:

- a. Chief Warrant Officers now authorized 4th pay period are designated Chief Warrant Officer W-4.
- b. Masters and chief engineers (Army Mine Planter Service)

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are designated Chief Warrant Officer W-3.

- c. First mates and first assistant engineers (Army Mine Planter Service) are designated Warrant Officer Junior Grade W-2.

"2. Amplifying Department of the Army circular will issue explaining future actions.

"3. Department of the Army Special Orders, 1 October 1949, announces initial designations set forth in paragraph 1.

"4. Authority to make temporary appointment as Chief Warrant Officer under the provisions of AR 610-15 is hereby suspended." (AGR 241)

Section VI - Career Guidance Proficiency Examinations.

1. Reference.

Section IX, Weekly Directive 52, this headquarters, 3 September 1949, subject: "Career Guidance Plan for Warrant Officers and Enlisted Personnel."

2. The number of applications for advancement, DA AGO Form 359, submitted by individuals for participation in forthcoming proficiency examinations in the Career Guidance Plan is smaller than anticipated. Personnel are apparently not cognizant of eligibility requirements for filing of applications and dates of forthcoming examinations.

3. Commanders will ensure that the records of individuals classified into career fields are reviewed and personnel eligible to participate in the forthcoming proficiency examinations are interviewed and information contained in the reference is fully explained to them. (AGR 220.01)

Section VII - Medical Corps Officers.

Radiogram, Commander-in-Chief, Far East, ZX 24679, 29 September 1949, is quoted for information:

"This message pertains to Medical Corps officers, who are recent arrivals in Far East Command, processed under provisions of paragraph 8, Circular 148, Department of the Army, 1948. Surgeon General has advised that no commitment for return to Zone of Interior prior to completion of normal overseas tour can be made to those officers of this category upon acceptance of Regular Army appointment, however upon completion of overseas tour, all will be top list for entry into residency training, 1 July 1952, if record of service warrants selection." (AGR 210.481)

Section VIII - Individual Clothing and Equipment Forms.

1. Reference.

SR 32-20-1.

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2. Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 42138, 16 September 1949, is quoted for compliance:

"Subject is disposition of WDAGO Forms 32 and 732. All previous instructions pertaining to disposition of WDAGO Forms 32 and 732 are rescinded and following substituted therefor: Old WDAGO Forms 32 and 732 will be destroyed after appropriate entries required by paragraph 47b(2), SR 32-20-1 have been transcribed therefrom and posted to new NME Forms 139 or 190. Department of the Air Force concurs in this action." (AGR 315)

Section IX - Promotion of Personnel to Grade 6.

Letter, General Headquarters, Far East Command, AG 220.2 (28 Sep 49) AG, 29 September 1949, subject: "Promotion of Personnel to Grade 6", is quoted for information and compliance:

"1. Records, General Headquarters, Far East Command, show an excessive number of enlisted personnel assigned to the Far East Command presently serving in pay grade 7, recruit.

"2. In this connection attention is invited to paragraph 21, Department of Army Circular 202, 1948, as amended by Department of Army Circular 78, 1949, which provides that pay grade 6, private, will be the lowest pay grade held by an individual who has completed basic military training or who has a minimum of 4 months time in service, with the exception of those individuals reduced to pay grade 7, and who are not, as a result of the action of a court martial, in a promotable status.

"3. It is desired that action be taken in accordance with Department of Army Circular 202, 1948, as amended, AR 615-5 and SR 615-5-1, to promote or separate from the service, those individuals who are in a promotable status and are presently serving in pay grade 7." (AGR 220.2)

Section X - Promotion of Enlisted Personnel.

1. Reference.

Message, this headquarters, DX 78258 RDE, 20 September 1949.

2. Message, Department of the Army, WCL 45216, 29 September 1949, is quoted in part for information and compliance:

* * * * *

"1. The intent of this directive is to clarify enlisted promotions during the period of the temporary 1st 3 grade promotion suspension announced by WCL 42425, 16 September 1949 [Reference 1a]

"2. Effective until further notice, all non-career field and cadre promotions under sections II and III, SR 615-5-1 into and within the 1st 3 grades are suspended.

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"3. This suspension will not affect the following special non-career field promotions:

- a. Posthumous appointments under paragraph 13, AR 615-5.
- b. Medal of Honor promotions under paragraph 14, AR 615-5.
- c. One grade promotions upon completion of 29 years of service under paragraph 15, AR 615-5.
- d. Promotions of officer candidates under Circular 136, Department of the Army, 1948, as amended by Circular 263, Department of the Army, 1948.
- e. Grade adjustments accomplished in special and meritorious cases by The Adjutant General.

"4. Career field promotions in the 1st 3 grades will continue to be made as provided in Department of the Army Circular 202, 1948, following all scheduled career field promotion examinations, based upon promotion composite scores when announced by the Department of the Army following such examinations.

"5. Career field promotions to grade 4 will continue to be made as provided in Department of the Army Circular 202, 1948, as amended, following all scheduled promotion examinations.

"6. Non-career field promotions to grades 6, 5 and 4 will continue to be made in accordance with Department of the Army Circular 202, 1948, Department of the Army Circular 78, 1949, and SR 615-5-1, except that:

a. Promotions to grades 5 and 4 without regard to position vacancies under paragraphs 10b(2) and c(2), SR 615-5-1, will be made without regard to major commands or local command promotion ceilings, notwithstanding paragraphs 4 and 5, SR 615-5-1.

b. Promotions to grade 4 under paragraph 10c, SR 615-5-1, will be made provided the individual holds a primary MOS appropriate to his present grade, notwithstanding the contrary provisions concerning primary MOS in paragraph 10e, SR 615-5-1.

c. Promotions to grades 5 and 4 to fill position vacancies under paragraphs 10b(1) and 10b(2), SR 615-5-1, will be made without regard for any grade 4 overages outside the individual's unit of assignment, that is, separate company, separate battalion or regiment, or similar units, unless grade 4 vacancies have been pooled by some higher echelon, notwithstanding paragraphs 4 and 5, SR 615-5-1. All echelons are authorized to pool grade 5 and 4 vacancies for non-career field promotions where appropriate to provide equitable promotion opportunity.

"7. All presently announced career field promotion examinations for Infantry, Armored Cavalry, Artillery, and Food Service Career Fields

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will be held as scheduled. As new career fields are introduced, career field promotion examinations will be scheduled as may be appropriate.

"3. WCL 42425 is superceded."

3. The minimum time in grade requirements established in paragraph 89, Circular 202, Department of the Army, 1948, for career field promotions remains in effect for all career field and non-career field promotions within this command as prescribed in paragraph 6d, Circular 5, this headquarters, 15 January 1949. (AGR 220.2)

Section XI - Clothing Monetary Allowance System.

Radiogram, Department of the Army, WCL 43360, 22 September 1949, is quoted in part for information and compliance:

"* * * Pending publication of changes to pertinent regulation the following procedure will govern affecting clothing and clothing records of enlisted persons transferred and assigned to detachment of patients in ZI and upon return from overseas commands for further hospitalization.

"All items of individual clothing in the quantities indicated on NME Form 139 will accompany the individual. Turn-in of items charged on NME Form 139 for purpose of receiving credit is not authorized except for turn-in under the provisions of paragraph 29b and 29b(1), SR 32-20-1.

"When circumstances are such that clothing cannot accompany the individual, the unit or similar commander is charged with the responsibility of shipping the clothing within 48 hours to the enlisted person concerned under the provisions of paragraph 4, Executive Order 10053 appearing in paragraph 3, AR 55-160, AFR 95-30 dated 29 April 1949.

"When evacuating by air from overseas commands, the above procedure will be followed except when weight allowance is not sufficient to permit all property belonging to the individual to accompany him, clothing and toilet articles will have first priority. The remainder of the individual's property will be shipped by the first available water transportation. Such organizational clothing and/or equipment as is required for comfort enroute will accompany the individual and records maintained in accordance with paragraph 56, SR 32-20-1, Clothing Monetary Allowance System. NME Form 191 will be credited to indicate these organizational items turned in and will reflect those in the possession of the individual.

"In all cases the NME Form 139 and 191 will accompany the individual's records. Both forms must be correct in every respect."
(AGP 246.5)

Section XII - Separation Special Orders.

Letter, Department of the Army, AGAO-S 210.8 (15 Sep 49) AGPO-X, 20 September 1949, subject: "Separation Special Orders" is quoted for information and compliance:

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"1. Information has been received that the Central Office of the Veterans Administration is still receiving copies of the WD AGO Form 53 series with copies of special orders relating to the separation of military personnel attached thereto.

"2. It is desired that all installations effecting the separation of enlisted and/or commissioned personnel be advised that copies of such special orders need no longer be attached to the Form 53 series, or forwarded to the Central Office of the Veterans Administration." (AGR 300.4)

2. The film depicts dramatized case histories of the purpose, methods, and effects of pastoral counseling. Opening with a wounded soldier on Corregidor seeking the advice of the chaplain, the film continues with a returning soldier who has marital difficulties; the case of a sergeant who wants to enter the church; a prisoner in the guard-house; two psycho-neurotic cases; and the case of a negro soldier who needs spiritual guidance from the chaplain. A summation of the entire

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theme follows and all soldiers are urged to call on the chaplain whenever the need for counseling arises. (AGC 413.53)

Section XV - Resignation and Return of Civilian Employees to the Zone of Interior as a Result of Executive Order 10,000.

1. Authority for resignation and return to the Zone of Interior at government expense of civilian employees who suffered loss in net pay as a result of Executive Order 10,000 (change in rate of overseas and/or post differential) is withdrawn effective 30 October 1949.

2. Employees who desire to take such action will submit their resignations in writing, accompanied by civilian personnel form letter "Request for Return to (U. S.) (Hawaii) for (Leave) (Termination)" to this headquarters, attention: Civilian Personnel Section, not later than 30 October 1949. Return to the Zone of Interior will be effected prior to 31 December 1949, subject to the availability of transportation. (AGCP 230)

Section XVI - Supply of Gases.

Effective 15 October 1949, the entire operation for the receipt, storage and issue of all gases (oxygen, acetylene, refrigerate gases, etc) in this command, which are the responsibility of the Yokohama Engineer Depot, will be transferred from the North Dock Area to Sagami Arsenal. The Arsenal is located approximately 18 miles from Yokohama, on Route 4. The rail address is:
