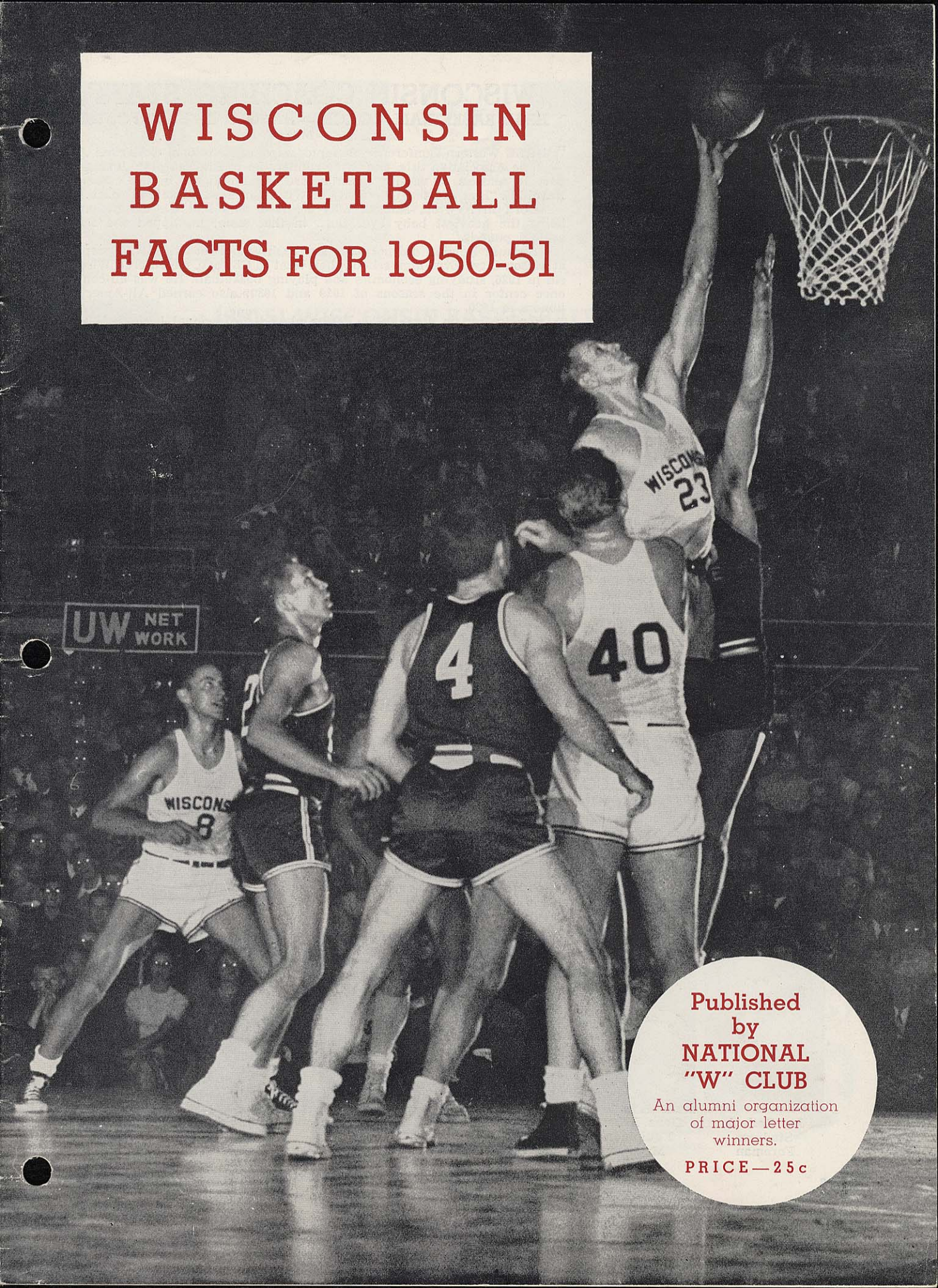

## WISCONSIN COACHING STAFF

### HEAD BASKETBALL COACH — HAROLD E. "BUD" FOSTER

Birthdate — May 30, 1906

THREE Western Conference championships, one National Collegiate Athletic Association title, and three runners-up in Big Ten play during the past 16 seasons of varsity coaching are the highlights in the career of Harold E. "Bud" Foster, University of Wisconsin head basketball coach.

Born in Newton, Kansas, May 30, 1906, Bud had the distinction of being the heaviest baby ever born in that state; he tipped the scales at 1334 pounds.

Because Newton did not offer any high school facilities, Bud prepped at Mason City, Iowa, high school, then went to Chicago. He entered Wisconsin in 1926, studying economics and playing basketball. He was all-conference center in the seasons of 1929 and 1930; also earned All-American honors in 1930.

Graduating in June, 1930, Foster played professional basketball with Chicago and Oshkosh (All Stars) teams, selling seeds for an Oshkosh firm during the off-seasons. In 1933, he was named freshman coach at Wisconsin and stepped into the varsity coaching spot when Dr. Walter E. Meanwell resigned in 1934.

Foster's initial team tied for the conference crown in 1935, then spent the next five years in the conference second division. But, in 1941, he welded together a fine group of players which, after a poor start, won their last 15 games to snare both Big Ten and NCAA championships. His last championship team was in 1946-47 and these cagers also finished third in the Eastern NCAA regional meet of 1947.

### ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH — FRED "FRITZ" WEGNER

Birthdate — November 24, 1912

LIKE Foster, Fred "Fritz" Wegner, assistant coach, is a graduate of Wisconsin and also played on the Oshkosh All-Star pro cage teams. Fred, who is regarded as one of the keenest scouts in collegiate basketball and an ideal assistant coach, played guard on the Wisconsin varsity teams of 1934-35-36; also was first baseman on the baseball teams of those same years. He starred in basketball, baseball, and track at Oshkosh high school.

Fred came to Wisconsin as an assistant coach in basketball one year after his graduation, later on adding the baseball duties in 1939 as an assistant to Art Mansfield.

During the past five summers, Fred has been in charge of the boys' baseball association in Madison, with approximately 1,000 youngsters competing in the various age groups.

### ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH — WALTER LAUTENBACH

Birthdate — November 17, 1922

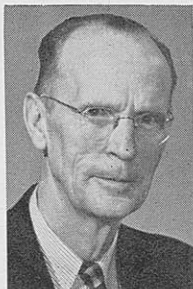
ASSISTING with the freshmen and junior varsity this season is Walter Lautenbach, whose brilliant guard play was one of the factors in bringing Wisconsin the 1947 Big Ten title. Lautenbach won three letters in basketball and three more in baseball as a pitcher. His college career was interrupted by military service but he returned in the fall of 1946 to complete his education at Wisconsin. Following his graduation, he played two seasons with the Oshkosh All-Stars pro team.



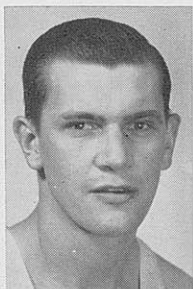

Birthdate was April 18, 1931.

## CHARLES DAHLKE (40)

Center . . . sophomore . . . 6-5 . . . 190 . . . 19 . . . Princeton—Won his frosh numerals last year . . . was scoring champ of the Big 7-C conference in his senior year at Green Lake high school . . . Green Lake was district cage champion in his last two years . . . won four letters in basketball and two in baseball during his prep career . . . Birthdate was July 1, 1931.

## KENNETH EMERSON (32)

Forward . . . junior . . . 5-11 . . . 180 . . . 22 . . . Waukesha—A nine letter winner at Waukesha high school . . . Awarded two for football, two for basketball, four for tennis, and one for swimming . . . Made All-Suburban first team in basketball, second team in football . . . Won a junior "W" with the Badger tennis team in 1949 . . . Won Jayvee award in basketball last winter . . . Birthdate was Mar. 13, 1929.

## ALLISON HEINS (36)

Center . . . sophomore . . . 6-5 . . . 208 . . . 19 . . . Eau Claire—Scored 30 points and made eight out of eight free throws in the Wisconsin Extension tournament last year . . . won two basketball letters at Eau Claire high school . . . was all-regional, all-sectional and all-state center in his senior year . . . working for a degree in journalism . . . nickname is "Ed" . . . Won numerals on the 1949 Wisconsin frosh cage team and a Jayvee award last year . . . Studying for B.S. degree . . . Birthdate was Nov. 17, 1928.

## SILAS JOHNSON (9)

Forward . . . junior . . . 5-10 . . . 150 . . . 20 . . . Madison—Was a forward and guard on the 1948 Madison West basketball team . . . Starred in tennis for three years and was a member of the 1947 state high school championship team . . . Entered in the School of Commerce . . . A junior varsity award winner in 1950 at Wisconsin . . . One of the most improved players on squad . . . Birthdate was Mar. 6, 1930.

## JAMES JUSTESEN (47)

Guard . . . junior . . . 6-3 . . . 190 . . . 21 . . . Mosinee—Had a great sport record at Mosinee high school . . . Gained all-state honors as a quarterback in 1946 . . . Won the conference scoring title as a center on the Mosinee cage teams of 1946 and 1947 . . . Also was all-conference . . . Mosinee was also co-champ in basketball in 1945 and football titleholder in 1944 . . . In 1946 was the school's light heavyweight boxing champ . . . Played with 1950 Badger Jayvee cagers winning junior "W" . . . Majoring in physical education . . . Birthdate was Mar. 1, 1929.

## DAVID MANDT (42)

Forward . . . sophomore . . . 5-10 . . . 185 . . . 23 . . . Oregon—Starred at nearby Oregon prep school in basketball and football for four years . . . also competed in boxing . . . Oregon was conference grid and cage champs in his senior year . . . graduated from Oregon in 1945 . . . earned Badger frosh cage numerals last year . . . majoring in agronomy . . . Birthdate was March 5, 1927.

## MARSHALL MARKHAM (4)

Forward . . . senior . . . 5-10 . . . 175 . . . 20 . . . Brodhead—Probably the greatest athlete ever turned out of Brodhead . . . He won 13 letters in his prep career in four sports—basketball, football, track and baseball . . . Makes up for lack of height by trigger-quick reaction . . . Won numerals in baseball in 1948 and junior varsity emblems the past two springs . . . The only varsity cager who has won two varsity basketball letters . . . Ambition is to be a lawyer . . . Birthdate was Nov. 22, 1929.

## ALBERT NICHOLAS (8)

Guard . . . junior . . . 6-3 . . . 175 . . . 19 . . . Rockford, Ill.—Nicknamed "Ab" . . . One of the greatest guards in Wisconsin history . . . Finished the 1950 conference season scoring 144 points to rank 13th in the Big Ten and the best of the full time playing guards . . . Played almost the full 40 minutes of every game . . . charged with only 15 fouls during the

entire 12-game Big Ten season . . . At West Rockford (Ill.) high school he gained all-conference honors in the Illinois Big Eight and second team on the Illinois All-State . . . Was co-captain in 1948 . . . entered in the School of Commerce . . . Birthdate was Jan. 24, 1931.

## ROBERT REMSTAD (43)

Center . . . junior . . . 6-4 . . . 195 . . . 22 . . . Kenosha—Gained athletic fame in football, basketball, and track at Kenosha high school . . . He graduated from there in 1945 . . . That fall he played end on the Badger football team . . . After the grid season he entered service and was discharged in 1947 . . . He was awarded a junior "W" the past two seasons playing with the Badger Jayvee cagers . . . Birthdate was Mar. 24, 1928.

## CHARLES SIEFERT (34)

Guard . . . sophomore . . . 6-1 . . . 165 . . . 18 . . .
