Seeds, Plants and Bulbs can be mailed, the rate being one cent for each two ounces up to eight ounces. All packages over eight ounces take pound rates as per table above. In ordering a pound remit postage for two pounds, as packing will increase weight.

The weight limit to zones one and two is 70 pounds; to all others 50 pounds.

Bulk limit (measurement around package both ways) in all zones 72 inches.

Liquids, poisons and goods packed in glass must be sent by express.

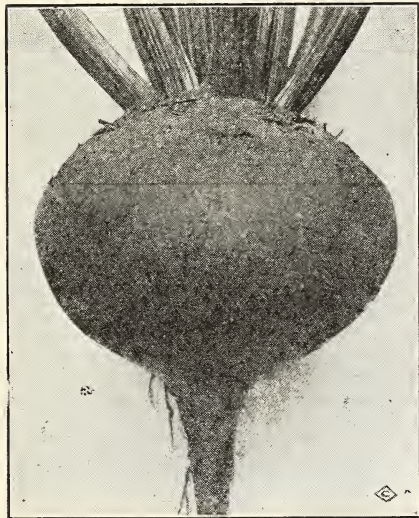

CULTURE—The land should be thoroughly manured the previous season. Sow the early sorts in March and April, in drills 1 inch deep and 14 inches apart; thin out to 4 inches. For main crop sow in May or beginning in June. Care should be taken at all times to see that the soil is firm over the seeds, either by means of feet, roller or garden drill. Slug-Shot dusted over the ground will prevent maggots.

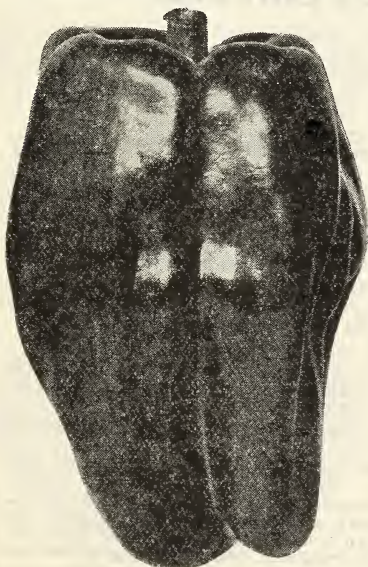

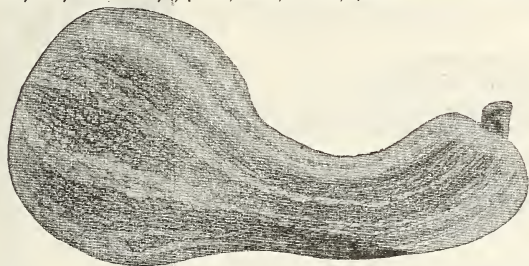

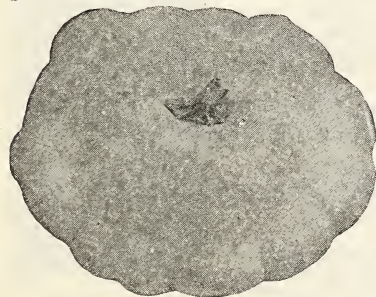
