Every pilot needs to be caught out in bad weather only once to appreciate the splendid training received in Link Trainers. In the link building the non-coms work long hours keeping their "babies" in shape for "flying" and patiently going over and over the principles of instrument flying. Under only one condition can army pilots go up without a parachute and that's when flying these tricky gadgets. The first time a cadet goes up he occasionally wished he had one on especially when he gets into a spin. The air speed is always changing, the altitude varies wildly, the link insists on turning, and the sergeant is quietly praying for combat. Dear Mom—

I finally made it, Mom. Yes, I am now an officer in the Army of the United States. Today as we walked up and got those wings pinned on our chests I wondered how many men were thinking of the past fifteen months and the work we have just completed. As the voice of the graduation speaker vibrated against my ears the scene faded and I saw the past months in review. I saw hundreds of boys, in civilian garb, reporting to Keesler, Miami, and Shepherd Field. They were excited, eager, and just a little scared of the adventure to come. They were all good boys; in fact, the best in the nation. Basic Training was rough, as we drilled millions of square steps and marched hour after hour. After five such weeks of hard work and regular meals, men began to emerge ready to cope with any cadet program. I'll never forget the diabolical gleam in the "medics' " eyes as they injected us for everything but fatigue. The next five months was a form of refined Basic Training taken at colleges all over the country. At Galesburg, Kansas City, Cleveland, Texas A and M., in fact, wherever a good college was to be found, boys in khaki studied Geography, Physics, Math, and Navigation in preparation for Pre-Flight. The ten hours of dual in "grasshoppers" in C. T. D. gave us a slight taste of military flying. (It reminded me of your chocolate cake on Sunday evening, remember?)

Classification and Preflight came next, three months of hard work. We said good-bye to the Bombardiers and Navigators at classification and to a lot of boys not as lucky as yours truly.

Not one of us will forget the Primary schools nor the PT-19 we flew there. It was a sweet airplane and the first one I soloed. Funny, about that. I scared my instructor so much that after eight hours he made me take it up alone and practice before he would ride with me again. Nor did I break my "blinkety blank" neck as he suggested.

I got 65 hours in the air before shipping to Basic, regular qualified H.P.'s, if you please. Basic trainers were equipped with "two way" radios along with a thousand other gadgets designed for safety. One cadet got so excited when his radio receiver went haywire that he radioed "DF-89—I'm coming in for a forced landing. If you can hear me, rock the tower." He made it, though, clear through to his gold bars. Just an average cadet!

The AT-6 came next and ten weeks of flying and praying. It was here that they first treated us like prospective officers and maybe you think we didn't go for that. It was by far, the nicest phase of our whole cadet life.

I'm really flying with a lot of good boys, Mom,—the kind you would like to have me bring home on weekends. I'll be fairly safe flying on their wing. I'm sorry all mothers couldn't be here today to pin on the wings, but first we have a war to win.

Keep the welcome mat out, for everybody will soon be home on leave. Boy, oh boy! The schedule we have planned for that two weeks.
