ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF COMPTROLLER, MARIANAS-BONINS COMMAND

1. Purpose - This circular is published to outline the duties, functions, and organization of the Office of Comptroller, Marianas-Bonins Command.

2. General - In order to implement and expedite the use of modern techniques in the business administration of the Army, and to utilize more effective tools in the control of operations and costs, an Office of Comptroller will be established in this headquarters as a General Staff Section.

3. The Comptroller will have General Staff status and will be designated as Assistant Chief of Staff, Comptroller. He will report to the Commanding General, through the Chief of Staff.

4. The Comptroller will serve either personally or through designated representatives as the Budget Officer, Statistical Officer, and Chief Auditor of this command. In his capacity as AC of S, Comptroller, he will coordinate and supervise those matters pertaining to Budget, Fiscal, Statistical and Audit activities of this command as follows:

a. Preparation of military, and where appropriate, civil budget estimates for the command.

b. Preparation of plans and procedures for all budgetary matters of the command in accordance with basic policies established by General Headquarters, Far East Command.

c. Formulation and coordination of fiscal policy for the command in accordance with basic policy established by General Headquarters, Far East Command

d. Continuing survey of accounting and auditing procedures throughout the command in the interest of more effectively controlling operations and costs, and preparation of pertinent recommendations thereto.

e. Continuing survey and development of a cost analysis for the information and guidance of the various staff sections for establishing a better control system for the command, and preparation of pertinent recommendations thereto.

f. Furnishing all statistical information to the various staff sections pertaining to that which may make a better analysis of the utilization of manpower in its relationship to appropriations so that they may take advantage of all economies pertaining to their sections, yet maintaining maximum efficiency and equitable allocations.

g. Developing such other facts and figures based on the analysis of statistical information for the information of the various staff sections as will enable those sections to develop and inject methods and procedures in the interests of effectiveness, efficiency and economy.

h. Coordination of the collection, analysis, evaluation, and presentation of statistical data and reports.

i. Supervision of financial activities of all types, including such audit activities as are carried on under the jurisdiction of the command.

j. Preparation of a report based on the cost of operation of each of the major subordinate commands and coordination of such reports with the various staff sections for presentation to the Commanding General each month. These reports will reflect economy effected during the period of the report, and such other information pertaining to funds status as compared to the strength reports for the period under O1 funds (personnel).

5. Organization of the Office of Comptroller will be as shown in Annex Number 1 attached hereto. The establishment of the Office of Comptroller will not act to increase the total civilian or military personnel authorized this command.



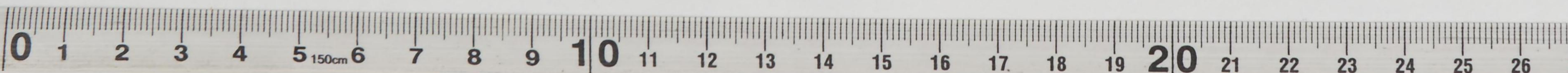

1. Reference is made to letter from CG MARBO to CINCPAC, file AG 320.2 (17 Mar 49) MBGCT-C, subject as above, 21 March 49. (Tab A)

2. By above reference, CG MARBO has submitted a plan to reduce forces on Saipan. Phasing is as follows:

a. Phase 1 (Upon approval). No change in present strength of 900. Recruitment of civilian personnel and shipment of property to Saipan sub-depots stopped.

b. Phase 2 (Effective 30 June 49). Reduction to 700 military personnel and 80 civilians. Begin phasing out of dependents and female civilian employees. Rotation policy new personnel instituted.

c. Phase 3 (Effective 31 Dec 49). Reduction to 161 military personnel. All dependents and female civilian employees phased out.

3. The above phasing is timed with completion of tasks requiring military personnel. Ability to meet the FEC Serv Project will not be adversely affected by this planned reduction of forces. Hazard to Navy ammunition from adjacent Army ammunition dump will be eliminated on or about 15 April 49 when scheduled Navy evacuation will be completed. Initial efforts of civilian contractor are based on disposal of unserviceable ammunition which was in the hazard area.

4. Present planning indicates no increase in mission for Saipan nor the necessity for continued use of present personnel strengths on Saipan.

5. Accordingly, it is recommended that the proposed 1st indorsement (Tab B) be approved and returned to G-4 for necessary action.

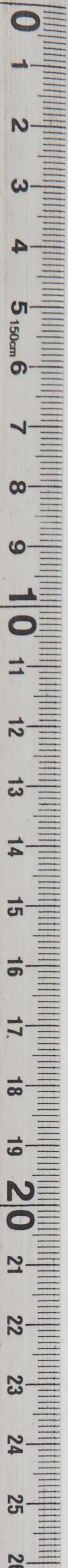

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Proposed Plan for Reduction of Saipan to a Caretaker Status

1. Ltr, Hq MARBO to CINCFE, file AG 320.2 (17 Mar 49)MBGCT-C, 21 Mar 49, subj as above, requested approval of a plan to reduce forces on Saipan. Phasing is timed to meet completion of present tasks.

2. Ord Sec, by report of staff visit, indicated that hazards to Navy Ammo from adjacent ammo dump will be eliminated on or about 15 Apr 49 when scheduled Navy evacuation will be completed. Only 10,000 short tons of the 25,000 were in hazard area and initial efforts of contractor will be in this area. Coast Guard is retaining 10 of Navy magazines. However, these are over 2,000 yds. away from Army ammo and do not constitute a hazard.

3. G-4 Supply (Lt. Col. Barksdale) stated that MARBO plan would not adversely affect the FEC Serv Project.

4. G-1 (Lt Col Cook) indicated no G-1 interest in proposed plan.

5. This action recommends to C/S that MARBO plan be approved and that proposed 1st Ind to this effect be approved for dispatch.

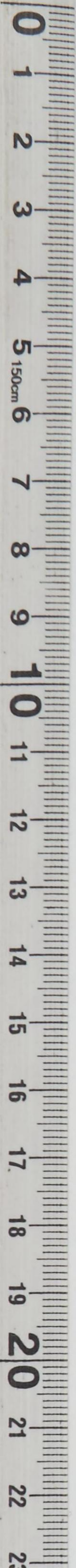

Subject: Report of Special Inspection of Marbo.

1. QM C/N (3) subject as above dated 24 March 49 advises that results of a survey of the Shoe Repair situation at MARBO made 7 and 8 Mar 49 during visit of D C/S were that shoe stocks were adequate and that backlog of shoes in repair shop was caused by inadequate stitching machines. Two stitching machines were airlifted to MARBO 23 Mar 49.
2. D C/S C/N (1) Subject: Staff Visit to RYCOM, PHILCOM & MARBO, FEC 3-9 Mar 49 carried under "MARBO Observations" the following: "(d) Shoe repair on Guam is poor - averaging 17 days. QM will ship a shoe-stitching machine to Guam by air if available." No action was directed however, G-4 C/N (2) to D C/S dated 17 Mar 49 furnished info that CG Eighth Army was directed by radio to airlift 2 shoe stitchers to MARBO and that QM would maintain follow-up.
3. No further action is considered necessary.
4. Action is within established G-4 policy.

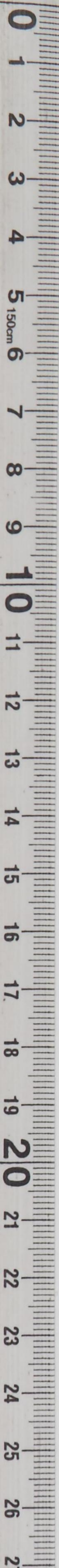

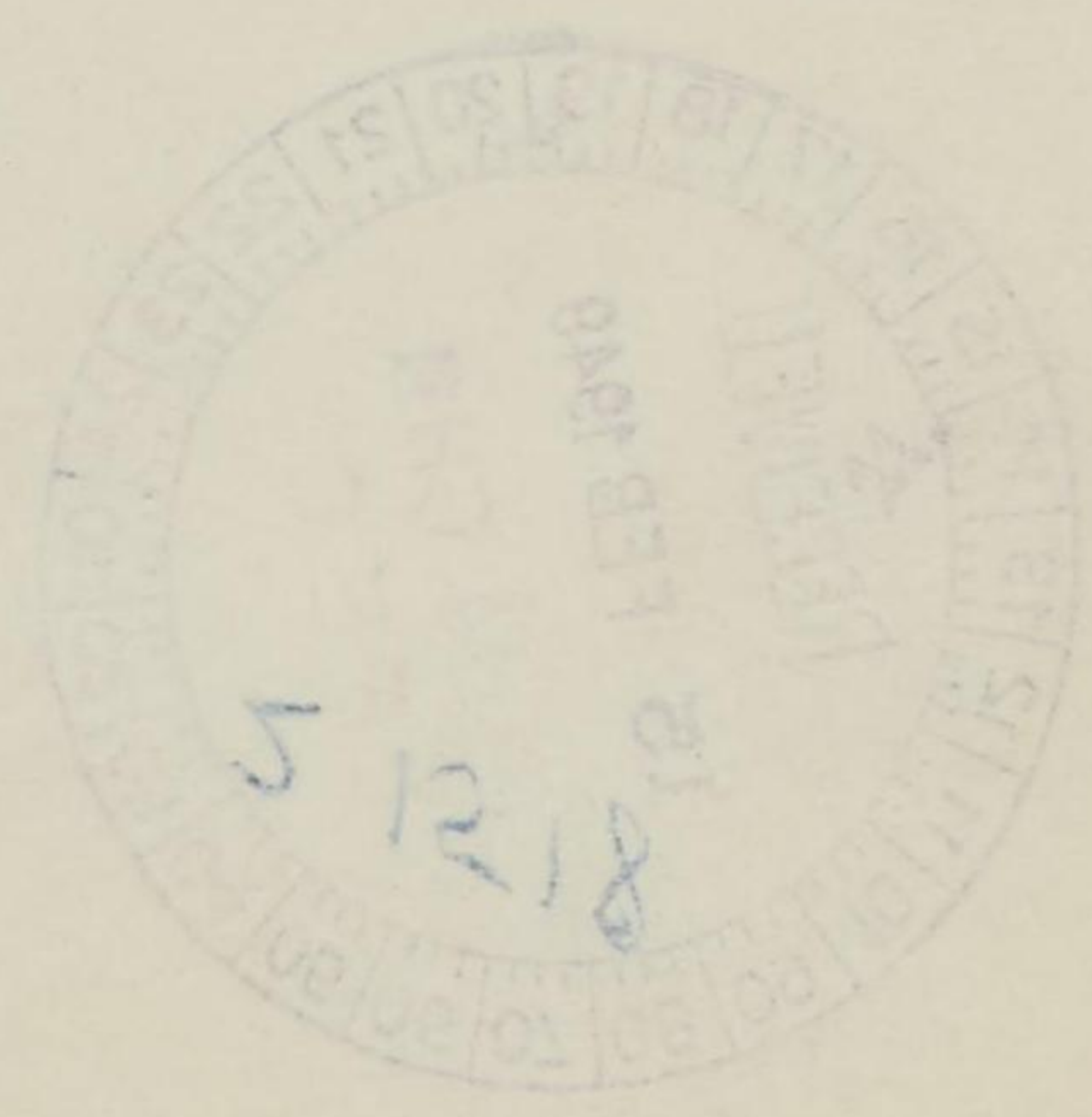
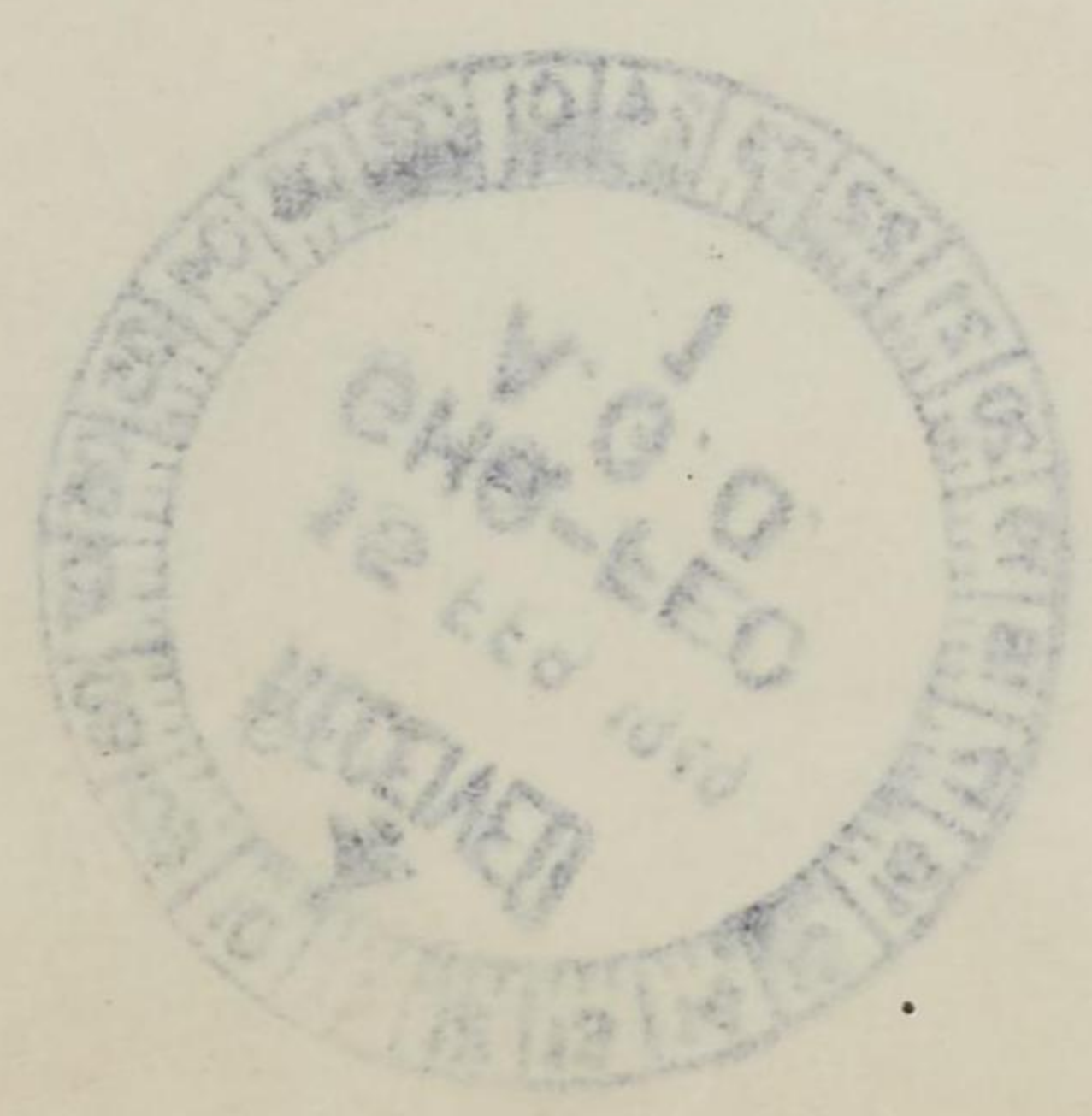
1. Attached herewith is a list of stock record balances of Shoes, service; Shoes, low-quarter; and Boots, combat, which were available for issue during the period of the special inspection mentioned in basic communication. At the present time the supply of shoes is adequate with exception of very few sizes which are now due in.
2. Upon report of shoe shortage organizations were notified through Station Supply to immediately submit requisitions to cover all existing shortages. Records indicate that all requisitions submitted were filled.
