a) Control of vermins in upland and paddy field rice plants:

Subsequent to previous month, the agents have demonstrated the prevention of vermins such as "Unka" and "Imochibyō" vermins so that there are very few areas which have been suffering from the damages caused by such vermins.

b) Control of vermins giving damage to Fall vegetable plants:

Plant-lice have been spreading in all areas this year, and so preventive steps were made known emphatically.

As a result of the revision of the tax law, the taxes are reduced by ¥30,000 millions as a whole. The local tax was increased to some extent compared with a big reduction of the national tax. It was because the taxes hitherto imposed in terms of national taxes were transferred to the local offices to a large extent. In consequence of the delay in enforcing the local tax law, we were obliged to ask you to pay the taxes for the 1st and 2nd half of the current fiscal year in one lot. We, therefore, request you to prepare yourself beforehand so that you can pay the taxes without delay when levied, in consideration of the importance of the local tax, which is used for establishment, improvement and so on of schools, police, fire brigades, drainage etc. The money deposit for this purpose is accepted at the banks and other financial organizations on favorable terms.

2. Japan-B Encephalitis! Kill Mosquitoes!

In the year before last, 595 Japan-B encephalitis cases were discovered in Japan and 151 died. The death rate was 1 out of 4. Now is the season for prevalence of Japan-B encephalitis and some cases were already discovered in the neighboring prefecture. As the Japan-B encephalitis is communicated by

mosquitoes, it is important to kill them. Fill up the stagnant water, ditches, etc. or clean them and pour insecticide upon them to prevent the mosquito larvae from breeding.

Consult the doctor immediately when you had a headache or a high fever.

3. Infantile-paralysis cases on the increase

The infantile-paralysis (poliomyelitis) is a sickness mostly attacking the children from one to 4 years old, and it will maim your dear children in an instant. Most of the patients die, or they will be maimed even if cured. This disease is very often mistaken for cold, indigestion, or sleeping sickness, and the patients sometimes lose time to have a radical treatment. The preventive method thereof is not known yet, but it is important to find the sickness as soon as possible and consult the doctor. Of course it is necessary to take care that you do not get too much tired, keep your hands always clean, and kill flies. The Tokyo 1st National Hospital and the Yokohama Medical College, plastic surgery dept., are engaged in the treatment of the polio-patients.

4. Examination of sweet potatoes

For the sake of facilitating the transactions between producers and dealers, sweet potatoes are examined by the pref. authorities and graded Sho, (1st grade) Chiku (2nd grade), Bai (3rd grade). The examination fee is ¥0.10 per kan.
