Guide to Carrying on Campaign for Iwate  
Prefecture Nation's Mutual Aid Community  
Chest and Japan Red Cross Society Funds  
Collection for the Fiscal Year 1948-49

1. Preparations for Subscription

1. Publicity:

- a. It is the policy of Iwate Prefecture Commission to make a news release and a radio cast in concert with Tokyo and to go to the various kinds of meeting to disseminate the spirit, and so the chapter and the sub-chapter also shall likewise disseminate the spirit.
- b. Along with the publicity of the spirit, the red cross spirit shall also be diffused.
- c. The required copies of posters and leaflets are expected to be depatched within the upper part of September.
- d. Care shall be taken for posters to be put up where many people groups and it is easy to see.

2. Organization of Subscription Team:

- a. It is proper to organize the team by the free methods of each chapter and sub-chapter by putting the commissioner of the chapter and sub-chapter at the center and with the co-operation of public welfare committee members, women's association members, red cross service corps, youths association members, students, pupils and school-children. But it is more convenient to organize systematically so as to put headquarters of each department in the chapter and sub-chapter, to put the company in each village division (or school area) and to put the section under the company, because the subscription consists of the previous subscription (promise of contribution of great amount) and the general subscription (home visitation, subscription on the street and subscription on the work-field).
- b. The number of persons of one section differs due to the width of the land, number of houses and kinds of subscription, but it seems adequate to subscribe by 2 or 3 persons by turns. For example, make one village division a section having 15 members, and 3 persons may serve six days by turns. It is also a good method to entrust all things to some especial person or to charge a small lot of land by dividing the village division into several lots. After all, the section may be organized according to the condition of the area.



- c. The subscription on the street shall be done by women, students, pupils and school-children, and it is proper that the section consists of 4 or 5 persons.
- d. The subscription team shall be the mixed team of public welfare committee members, women's association members, youths association members and red cross service corps members, or shall be the team having the organization as a unit due to the circumstances of the area.
- e. The subscription team members shall decorate themselves with the fixed badge (c.c. mark and red cross badge). The required number of badges is expected to be despatched within the upper part of September.
- f. The despatch of community chest for street use will be finished within the upper part of September as well.

The above preparations shall be completed up to September 20 at the latest.

## 2. Practical campaign for subscription

1. Previous subscription (promise of contribution of great amount):
  - a. The contributions of great amount shall be begged of the highest tax payer, the companies and juridical persons for mining industry, civil engineering and construction, forestry and fisheries, the factories and the banking institutions.
  - b. It is the free will of chapter or sub-chapter how much percent of the aimed amount shall be obtained by the contributions of great amount. Annual instances in the U.S.A., and examples of other prefectures last year show that it is generally 20 or 30 percent.
  - c. It shall be done by more than two collectors without fail. Because only one person often talks in vain.
2. Home visitation:
  - a. The average amount per household shall be obtained divided the balance obtained by the deduction of the contributions of great amount and estimated amount of subscription on the street (it must not be overestimated) from the aimed amount with number of households deduced the families in need of protection. But in the practical subscription, a grade shall be made by considering the burdens of rate on prefectural residents, etc., of each person.



- b. As soon as the contribution is received, the contribution certificate and the receipt shall be delivered, and the copy shall be made (Series of paper in three pieces shall be distributed beforehand). The contribution certificate shall be made plastered on the gate post.
  - c. The home visitation is the main point of this campaign but the utmost attention shall be paid not to give impression of compulsion.
  - d. Lest the responsibility of double contributions at office and home should be given, the mental preparation for contribution shall previously be attempted by publicly noticing the responsible burdens of each household against the aimed amount.
3. Subscription on the street:
- a. It shall be carried on in four cities, towns, and villages which have crowded quarters. As the estimated number of chests to the required and the reserves were ordered, they are expected to be distributed by the application.
  - b. The subscription shall be carried on by putting the chest at the frequent traffic places and applying the passers-by. At the time, the words too miserable or vulgar must not be used, and different words shall be used by men and children. An affected word of children shall be ineffective.
  - c. The badge of red feather shall be handed to the person who made contribution for the certificate (This is called the immunity badge.)
  - d. It is adequate that the subscription team consists of women, students, pupils and school children.
  - e. Stress shall be put on this campaign as well as the home visitation campaign. The actual record of this campaign can by no means said to be great in amount compared with others, but this campaign has the effect of direct culture and publicity in the face of the multitudes.
  - f. The chief of subscription team shall have the responsibility in aggregating the amounts subscribed and shall plan the exactitude of them.
4. Subscription at the office:
- By consulting with the office organization, it shall be developed as an autonomous community chest campaign of organization itself.



## 5. Subscription at school:

By linking with the social studies course of education, we wish them to educate students to serve in the subscription on the street and the home visitation as one of the duties and responsibilities. Students' autonomous contribution by the saving of pocket-money is received. But these handlings shall prudently be made by consulting with school.

## 6. Special subscription;

- a. As the performance tax has been transferred to the local tax and the exemption of tax has been decided never to be permitted in any case, the performance in the exemption of tax has become difficult. But it may be possible that during the period of subscription, by negotiating with the cinema house and the theatre any especial day will be made the Community Chest Day and some percent of the days' net profit will be contributed by them.
- b. They say it has obtained a considerable effect in the U.S.A. that a woman walks about with a box in hand saying "Subscribe a community chest!" between the acts in the cinema house or the theatre.
- c. It is one method to instal a chest at financial organs such as post office and bank, or famous stores, or railway stations or waiting room of motor bus, for aiming at the changes.
- d. The youths association, etc., will hold an arts festival, cultural movement, or vegetable exhibition and collect fees or contributions by legal means, and to make whose net profits contributed is also one method.

## 3. Distribution of Articles for Subscription

Posters and leaflets for publicity, badges for committee members and subscription team (c.c. mark and red cross badge), chests, immunity feathers, contribution certificates with receipts have been ordered so much as all chapters and sub-chapters recognize to be necessary including several reserves, and so their despatch will be completed in near future. You will apply for additional distribution if any shortage.
