- (5) Since, for intendance purposes, Section 2 of Staff Headquarters cannot readily be separated, Staff Headquarters is treated as a whole. The period before 1942 could not be examined since payments were made by disbursing officers.

1. Tokumubu and other organizations of similar names.

Navy:

Tokumu-bu -- in charge of governing in the occupied area during the Sino-Japanese Incident. ✓

Tokumu-kikan -- in charge of wireless intelligence. It was located in Shanghai. Later its name was changed to Tokumu-han.

Tokumu-han -- in charge of wireless intelligence. It's location is in Gunreibu, Naval Headquarter, and in other several places.

(For reference) Army:

Tokumubu was a Military governing organization of the Hokushi-Haken-Gun (Army dispatched to North China). The business of this organization also includes administration and public peace intelligence.

Tokumu-kikan -- is to guide Chinese local administrative organizations, and it includes public peace intelligence.

2. Kaigun Tokumu-bu (Dept. of Special Service)

(1) Hoku-shi (North China) Tokumu-bu

Location -- Peiping and Tienching

Nanking Tokumu-bu

Kanko (Hankou) Tokumu-bu

Nan-shi (South China) Tokumu-bu

Location -- Kwangtung

These Tokumu-bus were later disorganized.

(2) Kainan Tokumu-bu (Location--Haikou) *Kainan*

This still existed during the East Asia War. Chief work of this organization is the general governing of Kainan-To (Kainan Island), and also includes public peace intelligence and works.

3. Kaigun Zaikin-Bukan (Naval Officer Holding Post) and Chuzaibukan (Naval Residing Officer) (For China)

(1) Chuzaibukan

Chuzaibukan was staying where Tokumu-bu was, and took the additional post as a member of Tokumu-bu.

The duty of Chuzaibukan was intelligence and he was command by Gunreibu (N.H.Q.).

At the same time, he took the additional post as a staff officer to the Commands of the Fleets dispatched for China.

Chuzaibukan was abolished later about the time when the Tokumu-bu was dis-organized.

(2) Zaikin-bukan.

During the Great Asia War, these officers were holding post at Shanghai, Nanking, Peipin, Hankou, Amoi and Kwangton. They were under the partial command of Fleets dispatched for China, and in charge of business work on land. So far as intelligence is concerned, they are under the direct command of Chief of Naval General Headquarters.

'Naval attache' to embassy to China holds an additional post as Zaikin Bukan at Nanking, and assistant of above mentioned Naval attache holds an additional post as an assistant of Zaikin-Bukan at Peipin.

(3) Shanghai Kaigun Bukan-fu (Shanghai Naval Office)

Shanghai Zaikin Bukan, i.e. "Naval officers holding post at Shanghai" were working there. Assistant Chief of Staff of the Chinese Area Fleet (C.S.F.) takes an additional post as a Shanghai Zaikin Kaigun Bukan.

Assistants of Shanghai Zaikin Kaigun Bukan take additional posts as a staff of intelligence, a staff of foreign affairs or a administrative staff of the China Area Fleet. The communication staff officers of the above fleet is also called intelligence staff officer.
