





2. The following reported by Security Inspector, Los Alamos, New Mexico:

"Approximately 2400 hours (MST) on 8 August 1952, I observed an aerial object shaped like a 'bat' due northwest (approximately 290°) from station 330. The object was at an altitude of approximately 5,000 feet and approximately 12,000 feet from station 330 with a 30° angle of elevation from the horizon. The size and shape was comparable to a B-h7. The luminosity of the object was bright and gave off four colors: red, green, blue, and yellow. The object travelled at an exceedingly high speed flying downward at right angles. At first the object made a circular motion, then a swinging motion, and last a straight motion until it disappeared below the mountain. The object was in sight for 33 minutes before disappearing. I was attracted to the object because of its brightness which illuminated the clouds. Ir. and Ir. Security Inspectors on Patrol 185 also observed the object."
