Regulations

OF THE

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

THE Medical Department is under the immediate government of the Medical Professors, who constitute the Faculty of Medicine, subject to the Rules and Statutes of the Board of Trustees. The Faculty consists of

A Professor of the THEORY AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE AND CLINICAL MEDICINE;

A Professor of ANATOMY;

A Professor of MATERIA MEDICA AND PHARMACY;

A Professor of CHEMISTRY;

A Professor of SURGERY;

A Professor of OBSTETRICS AND THE DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN; and

A Professor of the INSTITUTES OF MEDICINE.

The Medical Faculty hold meetings for the purpose of arranging and conducting the business of their department, and for the preservation of order and decorum among the medical students.

One of the members acts as Dean, whose duty it is to keep the Minutes of the Faculty, to arrange the examination of the candidates for graduation, to conduct the business of the Faculty at their meetings, and to attend to correspondence.

The Session for the Medical Lectures begins early in October, and ends in the middle of March ensuing.

The Commencement for conferring the Degree of Doctor of Medicine is held, by a special mandamus of the Board of Trustees, early in April.

The following are the Rules in force in relation to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine:—

I. The candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one years, have applied himself to the study of Medicine for three years, and been, during that time, the private pupil, for two years at least, of a respectable practitioner of Medicine.

II. The candidate must also have attended two complete courses of the following Lectures in this Institution :—

Theory and Practice of Medicine,

Anatomy,

Materia Medica and Pharmacy,

Chemistry,

Surgery,

Obstetrics and the Diseases of Women and Children,

Institutes of Medicine.

III. Medical students who have attended one complete course in a respectable Medical School, where the attendance on two complete courses is necessary to a degree, where the same branches are taught as in this, and which is placed upon the *ad eundem* of this School, are permitted to become candidates by an attendance here for one full course; the rules of graduation being in other respects observed. They are also exempted from the payment of fees upon attending a second term.

IV. The candidate must also have attended one course of Clinical Instruction in the Pennsylvania Hospital, or some other Institution approved of by the Faculty of Medicine.

V. When a candidate applies to the Dean for admission, he must exhibit his tickets to prove that the above rules have been complied with.

VI. The candidate, at the time of his application, must deliver to the Dean of the Medical Faculty a Thesis, composed by himself, on some medical subject. This Thesis is referred to one of the Professors, who shall examine the candidate upon it, and make his report thereon to the Medical Faculty.

VII. When a candidate is rejected, his essay will be retained by the Medical Faculty.

VIII. The essay must be in the candidate's own handwriting, and must be written uniformly on letter paper of the same size, the alternate pages being left blank.*

IX. Bad spelling in a Thesis, or evidences of want of literary culture, will preclude a candidate from examination for a Degree.

X. A Thesis may be published by the candidate if he desire it, the permission of the Professor by whom he was examined thereon

* The essay should be written upon Thesis paper. This is for the purpose of convenient binding together into volumes. It is recommended to the candidate to prepare his Thesis before the commencement of the second course of lectures.

being first obtained ; but no alteration shall be made in such Thesis without the consent of the said Professor.

XI. The voting on the case of each candidate is by ballot. Candidates who have not been successful upon a first examination, will be permitted to have a second, when all the classes have been disposed of by the Faculty. The second examination will be conducted in full meeting of the Professors.

XII. The candidate shall pay the fees of graduation at the time of his examination, or before receiving notice of his success; his name may then be entered on the register of passed candidates, for the purpose of being reported to the Board of Trustees and included in the mandamus for a Degree.

XIII. Candidates who have passed their examination, and in other respects complied with the regulations, are to be reported by the Dean to the Provost, who will communicate such report to the Board of Trustees, in order that, if approved of by them, their mandamus be issued for conferring the Degree.

XIV. The Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate who absents himself from the public commencement, except by special permission of the Medical Faculty.

XV. Graduates of Medical Schools, on the *ad eundem* list, by attending one complete course in this Institution, and complying with the above regulations, are put upon the same footing with students who have attended two complete courses here; that is, they may present themselves as candidates for graduation;—also, if they attend a second time, the tickets will be free. Such graduates, if of five years' standing, are permitted to attend the course of Lectures, upon a general ticket of admission, free of expense, except the cost of the matriculating ticket. But this general ticket does not qualify for graduation.

Rules and Regulations of the Academy.

THE building for the Academy is located back of Nos. 42 and 44 N. Fourth Street. The course of instruction in the Classics is preparatory to admission into the Freshman Class of the Department of Arts. In pursuing the course of English studies, the pupils are prepared for the counting-house and active business life.

Pupils are received from nine years of age. The academic year is divided into two terms—the first commencing on the first Monday of September, and terminating on the last day of January; the second commencing on the first day of February, and terminating on the last day of June. The usual holidays are allowed at Christmas and Easter. The hours of instruction are from 9 A. M. to 1½ P. M., with a recess of fifteen minutes at 12 o'clock. The Academy is closed on Saturdays.

Abstract of the Regulations

OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF ARTS.

THE college year is divided into three terms; the *first* beginning on the 8th of September, and ending on the 24th of December; the *second* beginning (for 1858) on the 3d of January, and ending on the 31st of March; and the *third* beginning on the 8th of April, and ending on the 2d of July (Commencement day). The vacations are eight days at the close of the first term, seven days at the close of the second term, and about nine weeks at the close of the third term.

The students pursue either the full course, for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, or that portion of the course for which the degree of Bachelor of Science is given, or any such portion of the course as the Faculty may sanction, for which a certificate of proficiency may be given at the close of each session.

The students of the full course are distributed into four classes, viz: the Senior, the Junior, the Sophomore, and the Freshman Classes.

To be admitted into the Freshman Class, a student must be at least fourteen years of age, and qualified for examination on the following subjects and authors:—

Cæsar (First three books of the Gallic War). Virgil (First six Books of the *Æneid*). Cicero (Four Orations against Catiline). Horace (First Book of the Odes). Xenophon (*Anabasis*). Homer (First three Books of the *Iliad*).

Quantity and scanning in each language.

Greek and Latin Exercises.

Ancient and Modern Geography.

English Grammar.

Arithmetic. Elementary Rules of Algebra, including Simple Equations. It is desirable that such students as design to pursue the scientific course, should also have studied the first four books of Legendre's Geometry.

No student is admitted to advanced standing without being as fully instructed as the class, to which admission is asked, in all the studies which the class has pursued.

Course of Instruction for the Degree of Bachelor of Science.

THE degree of BACHELOR OF SCIENCE is given to such students as have attended all the courses in the Department of Mathematics, and in that of Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, and one course in Natural Theology, and the Evidences of Christianity, with two courses in Modern Languages, or two courses in Moral and Natural Philosophy, or two courses in Physiology and Natural History.

The Professors in the Faculty of Arts, by arrangement among themselves, deliver to the students not less than three lectures, on separate days in each week, at such hours not devoted to the ordinary instruction and recitations of their several professorships, as they deem most fit, on subjects connected with their several professorships.

On each day of the week, except Saturday, there are three recitations of one hour each for every class. On Saturday, each class recites once.

The character of each recitation is recorded, and the results communicated to parents or guardians at the end of each term.

At the end of each term, public examinations (written and oral) of the classes are held by the Faculty, and the students who are distinguished are classed in order of merit.

The fees for instruction in the full course of the Department of Arts are \$30 per term, payable in advance. Scientific and other students, who recite with one or more classes, are charged for each branch one-third of the fee charged to regular undergraduates. In the Department of Modern Languages, the fee of each Professor is \$10.

Two Literary Societies, consisting of students and alumni of the Institution, are sanctioned by the Board of Trustees, and meet in the University, being under the general control and supervision of the Faculty.

Students not from the City of Philadelphia, will, if it be requested

by their parents, have one of the Faculty appointed as a guardian, who will take charge of the disbursements, and attend to the comfort and well-doing of the individual.

The degree of Master of Arts may be conferred on the alumni of the University, bachelors in the arts of three years' standing, who apply for it. Such students as have received the degree of Bachelor of Science (of three years' standing) are entitled to the degree of Master of Science, on presenting to the Faculty a Thesis, which shall give satisfactory evidence that the author has continued to devote himself with success to science.

A public Commencement for conferring degrees, is held on the 3d of July, unless that day fall on Saturday or Sunday, when the Commencement is held on the Friday before.

A stated annual appropriation is made by the Board of Trustees, to enable the Faculty to offer *Prizes* for superiority in the performance of voluntary exercises, over and above the ordinary Course. The subjects are proposed by the several Professors early in the year; the award is made by the Faculty, and reported to the Board, before the month of June; and the names of those who have received Prizes are published at the annual Commencement.

In addition to the above, there is also a prize, called the "*Henry Reed Prize*," founded by the Alumni of the University in memory of the late Prof. Henry Reed, to be annually awarded for the best English composition by a member of the Senior Class, entitling the successful candidate to one year's interest on a certificate of loan issued by the City of Philadelphia, in the sum of \$600, and also to an accompanying Diploma of Merit.

The Committee on the Department of Arts may admit, for gratuitous instruction in this Department, such pupils, not exceeding ten at any one time, as shall, after application to the Provost, have been examined and approved by the Faculty, and reported by the Provost as worthy of admission.

A Professor of OBSTETRICS AND THE DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN; and

A Professor of the INSTITUTES OF MEDICINE.

The Medical Faculty hold meetings for the purpose of arranging and conducting the business of their department, and for the preservation of order and decorum among the medical students.

One of the members acts as Dean, whose duty it is to keep the Minutes of the Faculty, to arrange the examination of the candidates for graduation, to conduct the business of the Faculty at their meetings, and to attend to correspondence.

The Session for the Medical Lectures begins early in October, and ends in the middle of March ensuing.

The Commencement for conferring the Degree of Doctor of Medicine is held, by a special mandamus of the Board of Trustees, in the latter part of March.

The following are the Rules in force in relation to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine:—

I. The candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one years, have applied himself to the study of Medicine for three years, and

been, during that time, the private pupil, for two years at least, of a respectable practitioner of Medicine.

II. The candidate must also have attended two complete courses of the following Lectures in this Institution:—

Theory and Practice of Medicine,
 Anatomy,
 Materia Medica and Pharmacy,
 Chemistry,
 Surgery,
 Obstetrics and the Diseases of Women and Children,
 Institutes of Medicine.

III. Medical students who have attended one complete course in a respectable Medical School, where the attendance on two complete courses is necessary to a degree, where the same branches are taught as in this, and which is placed upon the *ad eundem* of this School, are permitted to become candidates by an attendance here for one full course; the rules of graduation being in other respects observed. They are also exempted from the payment of fees upon attending a second term.

IV. The candidate must also have attended one course of Clinical Instruction in the Pennsylvania Hospital, or some other Institution approved of by the Faculty of Medicine.

V. When a candidate applies to the Dean for admission, he must exhibit his tickets to prove that the above rules have been complied with.

VI. The candidate, at the time of his application, must deliver to the Dean of the Medical Faculty a Thesis, composed by himself, on some medical subject. This Thesis is referred to one of the Professors, who shall examine the candidate upon it, and make his report thereon to the Medical Faculty.

VII. When a candidate is rejected, his essay will be retained by the Medical Faculty.

VIII. The essay must be in the candidate's own handwriting, and must be written uniformly on letter paper of the same size, the alternate pages being left blank.*

* The essay should be written upon Thesis paper. This is for the purpose of convenient binding together into volumes. It is recommended to the candidate to prepare his Thesis before the commencement of the second course of lectures.

IX. Bad spelling in a Thesis, or evidences of want of literary culture, will preclude a candidate from examination for a Degree.

X. A Thesis may be published by the candidate if he desire it, the permission of the Professor by whom he was examined thereon being first obtained; but no alteration shall be made in such Thesis without the consent of the said Professor.

XI. The voting on the case of each candidate is by ballot. Candidates who have not been successful upon a first examination, will be permitted to have a second, when all the classes have been disposed of by the Faculty. The second examination will be conducted in full meeting of the Professors.

XII. The candidate shall pay the fees of graduation at the time of his examination, or before receiving notice of his success; his name may then be entered on the register of passed candidates, for the purpose of being reported to the Board of Trustees and included in the mandamus for a Degree.

XIII. Candidates who have passed their examination, and in other respects complied with the regulations, are to be reported by the Dean to the Provost, who will communicate such report to the Board of Trustees, in order that, if approved of by them, their mandamus be issued for conferring the Degree.

XIV. The Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate who absents himself from the public commencement, except by special permission of the Medical Faculty.

XV. Graduates of Medical Schools, on the *ad eundem* list, by attending one complete course in this Institution, and complying with the above regulations, are put upon the same footing with students who have attended two complete courses here; that is, they may present themselves as candidates for graduation;—also, if they attend a second time, the tickets will be free. Such graduates, if of five years' standing, are permitted to attend the course of Lectures, upon a general ticket of admission, free of expense, except the cost of the matriculating ticket. But this general ticket does not qualify for graduation.

Regulations, etc.

OF THE

LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

IT is the design of this Department to aid in preparing gentlemen for admission to the Bar, and, also, to offer to those who have not the Bar in view an opportunity of acquiring knowledge in any one or all of the branches of legal learning. The Conveyancer and the Merchant may attend, with profit, the particular lectures appropriate to their respective pursuits.

By late Rules of the District Court and Court of Common Pleas of the County of Philadelphia, the time occupied in this Department is considered, with respect to admission to the Bar, as equivalent to a like term of regular clerkship in the office and under the direction of a practising Attorney. And persons admitted to practise in any Court of Common Pleas or District Court of the State, if they are graduates of this Department, are admitted, at once, to the Supreme Court. It is believed that admission to the Bar in Philadelphia will entitle to admission in any part of Pennsylvania, and in many other States of the Union.

Gentlemen can study in their own rooms, or in a room at the University provided for that purpose.

The Professors do not presume to embrace in their course the peculiar laws and rules of procedure of all parts of the Union. Their design is so to discipline and prepare the mind by instruction in the principles of jurisprudence and their application in Pennsylvania, that other local codes can be acquired with facility and advantage. The foundations of the laws of most of the States are the same.

Students may matriculate at any stage of their professional preparation.

Students are not examined for matriculation, nor is it possible to require, peremptorily, a college degree, or any previous line of

study. This must be left to circumstances, to the views of the student, and to the influences which control him.

Instruction is conveyed by lectures, and by books and portions of books upon the subjects of the lectures, which are recommended by the Professors. The students are frequently and carefully examined. Moot courts are held, at which questions are argued. And the Law Academy of Philadelphia, an institution of long standing, to which not only students, but many practising lawyers belong, gives opportunity for debate and argument which has been found of the greatest practical advantage. Exercises in writing legal essays and opinions form part of the course.

There are two terms each year. The first term begins on the first of October, the second on the first of February. Each term continues four months. From the first day of June to the first of October is vacation. The course is so arranged that a student entering at the commencement of any October term will complete his term of study in two academical years.

Students who have attended four consecutive terms with each Professor, may, upon the recommendation of the Faculty, proceed Bachelors of Law.

Students who have attended any one or two of the Professors only, may receive from each Professor certificates of proficiency.

The fee to each Professor is ten dollars for each term of four months. No matriculation fee is required.

In all cases where a student is a proper object for such indulgence, he will be allowed to attend the lectures without charge.

Those who have received the degree of Bachelor of Laws, may attend all future lectures free of charge.

Arrangement of the Course.

For the first term, beginning October 1, 1856, ending February 1, 1857, General Jurisprudence, International Law.

For the second term, beginning February 1, 1857, ending June 1, 1857, Sources of Municipal Law, Constitutional Law.

For the third term, beginning October 1, 1857, ending February 1, 1858, Law of Persons and Personal Property, Mercantile Law.

For the fourth term, beginning February 1, 1858, ending June 1, 1858, Mercantile Law, Law of Debtor and Creditor, Criminal Law, Conflict of Laws.

PROFESSOR MCCALL

For the first term, as above,	Practice and Pleading at Law.
For the second term,	Practice and Pleading at Law.
For the third term,	Evidence.
For the fourth term,	Practice and Pleading in Equity.

PROFESSOR MILLER

For the first term,	Real Estate.
For the second term,	Conveyancing.

The course for the four terms, beginning October 1, 1858, ending June 1, 1860, will be, unless some change is announced, a repetition of the above. It will be perceived, therefore, that a student entering on the 1st of October of any year, and continuing four terms, will have a complete course, though the studies will not be presented in the same order to him as to those who have entered in the previous October.

Library, Museum, and Cabinets.

THE apartment in the University occupied by the Board of Trustees, and the apartment adjoining it to the westward, are appropriated for the reception and arrangement of the Library, and as a Reading Room.

The Library is open for not less than two hours daily (Sundays excepted), for the use of the Students, Professors, Trustees, and Alumni of the University, and all persons connected with instruction in the several departments.

The Library is under the care and in charge of the Professor of Belles Lettres and the English Language and Literature, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Permission may be granted, from time to time, to take books for a limited period, from the Library, and to admit to its use other persons than those connected with the University, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Connected with the Medical Department is the Wistar and Horner Museum. Tickets of matriculation in that Department entitle those holding them to admission to the Museum. The Museum is open on Wednesdays and Saturdays of each week, throughout the session.

The private Cabinets of the several Professors in the Medical Department are likewise open to the students, at convenient hours.

R E P O R T .

IN compliance with their established custom, the Medical Faculty of the University of Pennsylvania have again the pleasure of communicating with the Alumni, and those who are interested in the prosperity of the School. Their Announcement may be regarded as an annual salutatory to those far removed from the scenes of their former labors, as well as a Report of its present condition and prosperity. For the patronage which continues to be extended to this the oldest institution of Medical Science in the country, those having the management of its affairs feel bound to express their obligations, convinced that so long as a high tone of professional standing is fostered, and efficiency of teaching is maintained, they can rely fully upon the sympathies of the numerous graduates who have periodically left the institution, as also of the profession at large. To her numerous children, especially, the University looks for support and approbation, hoping that the cord of affection originating in early associations continues firm and lasting, while, at the same time, the assurance is given that exertions will be unremitted to merit the confidence hitherto awarded. The only change to be noticed in the organization of the School, has been made by the death of Dr. Robert Hare, the Emeritus Professor of Chemistry, whose distinguished career in his favorite science has been a source of pride with the University. His decease occurred in May last.

The number of students in attendance upon the past course of Lectures was 435, and the number of graduates for the year was 145. The Faculty testify with the highest satisfaction that a more correct and earnest collection of young gentlemen have never been in attendance upon the instruction of the University.

The regular Lectures of the coming Session, 1858-59, will commence on Monday, October 11, and be continued without inter-

ruption until the middle of March ensuing. The examination of candidates for graduation will commence immediately upon the close of the term, so as to entail as little delay as possible upon the graduates. The Commencement for conferring degrees will be held at as early a period in March as will be compatible with the work of examination.

During the two weeks preceding the commencement of the regular lectures, preliminary lectures will be delivered by the members of the Faculty upon subjects connected with their several courses of instruction.

MUSEUM-CABINETS, AND OTHER MEANS OF INSTRUCTION.

The scheme of instruction now in full operation is entirely demonstrative, so as to bring the senses of the pupil to the aid of his memory and intelligence. This is true with respect to all the branches, even the course on the Practice of Medicine, formerly purely didactic, has been made a demonstrative one. The means of illustration at the command of the Faculty are the amplest in the country. Those who have not recently visited the University during the progress of the lectures, or inspected the present cabinets, can scarcely realize the extent to which, within a few years past, its means of demonstrative instruction have been expanded and improved, or form a correct estimate of what are the resources of the Faculty for effective teaching.

The collection hitherto known as the *Wistar Museum*, is now called the **WISTAR AND HORNER MUSEUM**, in recognition and honor of the munificent bequest made to the University, by its late distinguished Prof. of Anatomy, Dr. Wm. E. Horner, of his entire cabinet of wet and dry preparations, among them exquisitely minute injections, which he had prepared and accumulated during a long term of years, zealously devoted to the interests of the school. Within the last five years beautiful additions have been made to this department of the Museum by the present Prof. of Anatomy. They consist of admirably executed magnified drawings, illustrative of histology, dissections of important organs of the body upon an improved method, showing the intimate structure of them; and models, upon a natural and gigantic scale, of the most complicated

structures of the œconomy, including the sympathetic nerve, the veins, the lymphatics, and the delicate structure of the brain. It is due to the science and artistic skill of Dr. H. D. Schmidt, a recent graduate of the School, to mention that these superb models are the work of his hands.

Connected with the Museum—in fact a continuation of it—are the cabinets of the Profs. of Practice and of Surgery. The former is upon an extensive scale, containing everything that could be procured in Europe, or this country, without regard to cost. It consists of an extensive series of wax preparations, copied from the collection of Guy's Hospital, and University College, London, by the eminent artists Towne and Husson, of French models and preparations in wax, and other materials, of a great variety of pathological wet preparations. A full suite of cutaneous diseases is so arranged in upright cases, lighted on all sides, as to facilitate careful study. The cabinet devoted to Surgery is ample and instructive, embracing numerous specimens of tumors, of diseased bones, &c., partly prepared, and partly collected in Europe, by the present incumbent of the chair. It also contains wax models of surgical diseases, and a model the size of life, ingeniously constructed by Schmidt, to exhibit all the deformities which result from fractures and dislocations, with the action of the muscles concerned in producing them.

For the purpose of more easy reference by the student, an extensive collection of *Materia Medica* has been located in the Museum. It consists of all the drugs, and their varieties, employed in the course of instruction on the subject, and of rare and valuable specimens collected by the present and former incumbent of the chair; they are labelled, and so placed in the cases, as to facilitate reference. Connected with this department, is a rich herbarium, in frames for examination, containing exotic and indigenous medicinal plants. The course is also illustrated by a large series of living plants, and delineative paintings.

The united collection, illustrative of Human and Comparative Anatomy, Pathology, Physiology, Surgery, Obstetrics, and *Materia Medica*, now numbers many thousand specimens.

Pertaining to the chairs of Chemistry and Institutes, are all the instruments, models, apparatus, diagrams, &c., required for the extensive illustration of these branches.

The Museum is open on Wednesday and Saturday mornings for study by the students of the University. The object of this arrangement is, that an opportunity may be presented of familiarity with the illustrations previously exhibited by the Professor, or of studying in detail, with the facility thus afforded, any particular subject.

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION.

HOSPITAL INSTRUCTION.

The Professor of the Theory and Practice of Medicine, whilst conducting his course in the University, also lectures twice a week, on Clinical Medicine, in the *Pennsylvania Hospital*, during his term of service as Senior Physician to this Institution.

The Surgeons of this Hospital perform similar valuable clinical service in connection with the branch of Clinical Surgery.

Students, pursuing their studies in the city throughout the year, have full access to the wards of the Hospital, on the prescribing days of all the Physicians and Surgeons during this term, by exhibiting the Hospital Ticket.

Numerous appointments of Resident Physicians in the Pennsylvania, St. Joseph's, Episcopal, and Wills' Hospitals, as well as in the various Dispensaries of the city, are made, each spring and fall, from among the recent graduates; thus presenting facilities for sound hospital instruction, unsurpassed in the country.

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN THE UNIVERSITY.

As a means of illustrating and forcibly impressing the lessons of the Lecture-Room, CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN MEDICINE AND SURGERY is conducted by the Professors in the University Hall, four times a week throughout the session, and no effort will be wanting to render this course interesting and of practical value to the students of the school.

The number of patients brought before the class and treated, during the past season, was *four thousand five hundred*. These cases embraced an extensive variety of acute and chronic diseases, with

a large number of surgical operations of both the major and minor grade, as amputation, lithotomy, lithotripsy, &c.

For the accommodation of such patients as require it, the Faculty have provided two Surgical Wards, and proper attendance within the college building.

The Dispensary of the University, which is open throughout the year, affords an opportunity to the class of examining patients, and those who avail themselves of it, will find it a valuable addition to their means of clinical instruction.

In view of the foregoing statements respecting the classes, mode of conducting instruction, and the resources at command of the Faculty, it may be affirmed with truth, as it is with pride, that the University of Pennsylvania has never enjoyed a more solid prosperity, nor been better provided in all its departments for performing the work of efficient medical teaching than at the present time.

ANATOMICAL ROOMS.

The apartments, devoted to Dissection and Demonstration, are spacious and well ventilated. They are open early in September, and during the entire session, and are provided with an ample supply of material, as well as with all requisite conveniences for the student.

While engaged in his dissections, the student has the constant personal attention and aid of the Demonstrator and his assistants.

OPERATIVE SURGERY.

Adjoining the dissecting-room is one devoted to the study of *Practical Surgery*, which is conducted under the personal supervision of the Professor of Surgery, aided by the Surgical Demonstrator.

By means of appropriate apparatus, the student is taught how to apply the bandages and splints required in the treatment of fractures, &c., upon the *living person*; whilst upon the subject he is also instructed in the performance of all the operations of Surgery. The advantages thus gained in practical knowledge are, it is believed, presented in no other school.

REGULATIONS

OF THE

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

THE Medical Department is under the immediate government of the Medical Professors, who constitute the Faculty of Medicine, subject to the Rules and Statutes of the Board of Trustees. The Faculty consists of

A Professor of the THEORY AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE AND CLINICAL MEDICINE,

A Professor of ANATOMY,

A Professor of MATERIA MEDICA AND PHARMACY,

A Professor of CHEMISTRY,

A Professor of SURGERY,

A Professor of OBSTETRICS, AND THE DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN, and

A Professor of the INSTITUTES OF MEDICINE.

The Medical Faculty hold meetings for the purpose of arranging and conducting the business of their department, and for the preservation of order and decorum among the medical students.

One of the members acts as Dean, whose duty it is to keep the Minutes of the Faculty, to arrange the examination of the candidates for graduation, to conduct the business of the Faculty at their meetings, and to attend to correspondence.

The Session for the Medical Lectures begins early in October, and ends in the middle of March ensuing.

The Commencement for conferring the Degree of Doctor of Medicine, is held by a special mandamus of the Board of Trustees, early in April.

The following are the Rules in force in relation to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine.

I. The candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one years,

have applied himself to the study of Medicine for three years, and been, during that time, the private pupil, for two years, at least, of a respectable practitioner of Medicine.

II. The candidate must also have attended two complete courses of the following Lectures in this Institution:—

Theory and Practice of Medicine,
 Anatomy,
 Materia Medica and Pharmacy,
 Chemistry,
 Surgery,
 Obstetrics, and the Diseases of Women and Children,
 Institutes of Medicine.

III. Medical students who have attended one complete course in a respectable Medical School, where the attendance on two complete courses is necessary to a degree, where the same branches are taught as in this, and which is placed upon the *ad Eundem* of this school, are permitted to become candidates by an attendance here for one full course; the rules of graduation being in other respects observed. They are also exempted from the payment of fees upon attending a second term.

IV. The candidate must also have attended one course of Clinical Instruction in the Pennsylvania Hospital, or *some other* Institution approved of by the Faculty of Medicine.

V. When a candidate applies to the Dean for admission, he must exhibit his tickets to prove that the above rules have been complied with.

VI. The candidate, at the time of his application, must deliver to the Dean of the Medical Faculty a Thesis, composed by himself, on some medical subject. This Thesis is referred to one of the Professors, who shall examine the candidate upon it, and make his report thereon to the Medical Faculty.

VII. When a candidate is rejected, his essay will be retained by the Medical Faculty.

VIII. The essay must be in the candidate's own handwriting, and must be written uniformly on letter paper of the same size, the alternate pages being left blank.*

* The essay should be written upon Thesis paper. This is for the purpose of convenient binding together into volumes. It is recommended to the candidate to prepare his thesis before the commencement of the second course of lectures.

IX. Bad spelling in a Thesis, or evidences of want of literary culture, will preclude a candidate from examination for a degree.

X. A Thesis may be published by the candidate if he desire it, the permission of the Professor by whom he was examined thereon being first obtained; but no alteration shall be made in such thesis without the consent of the said Professor.

XI. The voting on the case of each candidate is by ballot. Candidates who have not been successful upon a first examination, will be permitted to have a second, when all the classes have been disposed of by the Faculty. The second examination will be conducted in full meeting of the Professors.

XII. The candidate shall pay the fees of graduation at the time of his examination, or before receiving notice of his success; his name may then be entered on the Register of passed candidates, for the purpose of being reported to the Board of Trustees and included in the mandamus for a Degree.

XIII. Candidates who have passed their examination, and in other respects complied with the regulations, are to be reported by the Dean to the Provost, who will communicate such report to the Board of Trustees, in order that, if approved of by them, their mandamus be issued for conferring the Degree.

XIV. The Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate who absents himself from the Public Commencement, except by special permission of the Medical Faculty.

XV. Graduates of Medical Schools, on the *ad Eundem* list, by attending one complete course in this Institution, and complying with the above regulations, are put upon the same footing with students who have attended two complete courses here; that is, they may present themselves as candidates for graduation:—also, if they attend a second time, the tickets will be free. Such graduates, if of five years' standing, are permitted to attend the course of Lectures, upon a general ticket of admission, free of expense, except the cost of the matriculating ticket. But this general ticket does not qualify for graduation.

GRADUATES.

At a Public Commencement, held March 27, 1858, in the Musical Fund Hall, the Degree of Doctor of Medicine was conferred by HENRY VETHAKE, LL.D., Provost, upon the following gentlemen; after which an Address was delivered by JOSEPH LEIDY, M. D., Professor of Anatomy.

Abstract of the Regulations

OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF ARTS.

THE college year is divided into three terms; the *first* beginning on the 8th of September, and ending on the 24th of December; the *second* beginning on the 2d of January, and ending on the 31st of March; and the *third* beginning on the 8th of April, and ending on the 3d of July (Commencement day). The vacations are eight days at the close of the first term, seven days at the close of the second term, and about nine weeks at the close of the third term.

The students pursue either the full course, for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, or that portion of the course for which the degree of Bachelor of Science is given, or any such portion of the course as the Faculty may sanction, for which a certificate of proficiency may be given at the close of each session.

The students of the full course are distributed into four classes, viz: the Senior, the Junior, the Sophomore, and the Freshman, Classes.

To be admitted into the Freshman Class, a student must be at least fourteen years of age, and qualified for examination on the following subjects and authors:—

Cæsar (First three Books of the Gallic War). Virgil (First six Books of the *Æneid*). Cicero (Four Orations against Catiline). Horace (First Book of the Odes). Xenophon (Four Books of the *Anabasis*). Homer (First three Books of the *Iliad*).

Quantity and scanning in each language.

Greek and Latin Exercises.

Ancient and Modern Geography.

English Grammar.

Arithmetic. Elementary Rules of Algebra, including Simple Equations. It is desirable that such students as design to pursue the scientific course, should also have studied the first four Books of Legendre's Geometry.

No student is admitted to advanced standing without being as fully instructed as the class, to which admission is asked, in all the studies which the class has pursued.

Course of Instruction for the Degree of Bachelor of Science.

THE degree of BACHELOR OF SCIENCE is given to such students as have attended all the courses in the Department of Mathematics, and in that of Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, and one course in Natural Theology and the Evidences of Christianity, with two courses in Modern Languages, or two courses in Moral and Natural Philosophy, or two courses in Physiology and Natural History.

The Professors in the Faculty of Arts, by arrangement among themselves, deliver to the students not less than three lectures, on separate days in each week, at such hours not devoted to the ordinary instruction and recitations of their several professorships, as they deem most fit, on subjects connected with their several professorships.

On each day of the week, except Saturday, there are three recitations of one hour each for every class. On Saturday, each class recites once.

The character of each recitation is recorded, and the results communicated to parents or guardians at the end of each term.

At the end of each term, public examinations (written and oral) of the classes are held by the Faculty, and the students who are distinguished are classed in order of merit.

The fees for instruction in the full course of the Department of Arts are \$30 per term, payable in advance. Scientific and other students, who recite with one or more classes, are charged for each branch one-third of the fee charged to regular undergraduates. In the Department of Modern Languages, the fee of each Professor is \$10.

Two Literary Societies, consisting of students and alumni of the Institution, are sanctioned by the Board of Trustees, and meet in the University, being under the general control and supervision of the Faculty.

Students not from the City of Philadelphia, will, if it be requested

by their parents, have one of the Faculty appointed as a guardian, who will take charge of the disbursements, and attend to the comfort and well-doing of the individual.

The degree of Master of Arts may be conferred on the alumni of the University, bachelors in the arts of three years' standing, who apply for it. Such students as have received the degree of Bachelor of Science (of three years' standing) are entitled to the degree of Master of Science, on presenting to the Faculty a Thesis, which shall give satisfactory evidence that the author has continued to devote himself with success to science.

A public Commencement for conferring degrees, is held on the 3d of July, unless that day fall on Saturday or Sunday, when the Commencement is held on the Friday before.

A stated annual appropriation is made by the Board of Trustees, to enable the Faculty to offer *Prizes* for superiority in the performance of voluntary exercises, over and above the ordinary Course. The subjects are proposed by the several Professors early in the year; the award is made by the Faculty, and reported to the Board, before the month of June; and the names of those who have received Prizes are published at the annual Commencement.

In addition to the above, there is also a prize, called the "*Henry Reed Prize*," founded by the Alumni of the University in memory of the late Prof. Henry Reed, to be annually awarded for the best English composition by a member of the Senior Class, entitling the successful candidate to one year's interest on a certificate of loan issued by the City of Philadelphia, in the sum of \$600, and also to an accompanying Diploma of Merit.

The Committee on the Department of Arts may admit, for gratuitous instruction in this Department, such pupils, not exceeding ten at any one time, as shall, after application to the Provost, have been examined and approved by the Faculty, and reported by the Provost as worthy of admission.

Regulations

OF THE

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

THE Medical Department is under the immediate government of the Medical Professors, who constitute the Faculty of Medicine, subject to the Rules and Statutes of the Board of Trustees. The Faculty consists of

A Professor of the THEORY AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE AND CLINICAL MEDICINE,

A Professor of ANATOMY,

A Professor of MATERIA MEDICA AND PHARMACY,

A Professor of CHEMISTRY,

A Professor of SURGERY,

A Professor of OBSTETRICS, AND THE DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN, and

A Professor of the INSTITUTES OF MEDICINE.

The Medical Faculty hold meetings for the purpose of arranging and conducting the business of the department, and for the preservation of order and decorum among the medical students.

One of the members acts as Dean, whose duty it is to keep the Minutes of the Faculty, to arrange the examination of the candidates for graduation, to conduct the business of the Faculty at their meetings, and to attend to correspondence.

The Session for the Medical Lectures begins early in October, and ends early in March ensuing.

The Commencement for conferring the Degree of Doctor of Medicine, is held by a special mandamus of the Board of Trustees, during the month of March.

The following are the Rules in force in relation to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine:—

I. The candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one years, have applied himself to the study of Medicine for three years, and

been, during that time, the private pupil for two years, at least, of a respectable practitioner of Medicine.

II. The candidate must also have attended two complete courses of the following Lectures in this Institution:—

Theory and Practice of Medicine,
 Anatomy,
 Materia Medica and Pharmacy,
 Chemistry,
 Surgery,
 Obstetrics, and the Diseases of Women and Children,
 Institutes of Medicine.

III. Medical students who have attended one complete course in a respectable Medical School, where the attendance on two complete courses is necessary to a degree, where the same branches are taught as in this, and which is placed upon the *ad eundem* of this school, are permitted to become candidates by an attendance here for one full course; the rules of graduation being in other respects observed. They are also exempted from the payment of fees upon attending a second term.

IV. When a candidate applies to the Dean for admission, he must exhibit his tickets to prove that the above rules have been complied with.

V. The candidate, at the time of his application, must deliver to the Dean of the Medical Faculty, a Thesis, composed by himself, on some medical subject. This Thesis is referred to one of the Professors, who shall examine the candidate upon it, and make his report thereon to the Medical Faculty.

VI. When a candidate is rejected, his essay will be retained by the Medical Faculty.

VII. The essay must be in the candidate's own handwriting, and must be written uniformly on letter-paper of the same size, the alternate pages being left blank.*

VIII. Bad spelling in a Thesis, or evidences of a want of literary culture, will preclude a candidate from examination for a degree.

IX. A Thesis may be published by the candidate if he desire it,

* The essay should be written upon Thesis paper. This is for the purpose of convenient binding together into volumes. It is recommended to the candidate to prepare his thesis before the commencement of the second course of lectures.

the permission of the Professor by whom he was examined thereon being first obtained; but no alteration shall be made in such thesis without the consent of the said Professor.

X. The voting on the case of each candidate is by ballot. Candidates who have not been successful upon a first examination, will be permitted to have a second, when all the classes have been disposed of by the Faculty. The second examination will be conducted in full meeting of the Professors.

XI. The candidate shall pay the fees of graduation at the time of his examination, or before receiving notice of his success; his name may then be entered on the Register of passed candidates, for the purpose of being reported to the Board of Trustees and included in the mandamus for a Degree.

XII. Candidates who have passed their examination, and in other respects complied with the regulations, are to be reported by the Dean to the Provost, who will communicate such report to the Board of Trustees, in order that, if approved of by them, their mandamus be issued for conferring the Degree.

XIII. The Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate who absents himself from the Public Commencement, except by special permission of the Medical Faculty.

XIV. Graduates of Medical Schools, on the *ad eundem* list, by attending one complete course in this Institution, and complying with the above regulations, are put upon the same footing with students who have attended two complete courses here; that is, they may present themselves as candidates for graduation: also, if they attend a second time, the tickets will be free. Such graduates, if of five years' standing, are permitted to attend the course of Lectures, upon a general ticket of admission, free of expense, except the cost of the matriculating ticket. But this general ticket does not qualify for graduation.

 CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN THE UNIVERSITY.

As a means of illustrating and forcibly impressing the lessons of the Lecture-Room, CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN MEDICINE AND SURGERY is conducted by the Professors in the University Hall, four times a week throughout the session, and no effort will be wanting to render this course interesting and of practical value to the students of the school.

For the accommodation of such patients as require it, the Faculty have provided two Surgical Wards, and proper attendance within the college building.

The Dispensary of the University, which is open throughout the year, affords an opportunity to the class of examining patients, and those who avail themselves of it, will find it a valuable addition to their means of clinical instruction.

The Lectures of the ensuing Session of 1860-61 will begin on the second Monday of October and close on the first of March.

Regulations, etc.

OF THE

LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

It is the design of this Department to aid in preparing gentlemen for admission to the Bar, and, also, to offer to those who have not the Bar in view an opportunity of acquiring knowledge in any one or all of the branches of legal learning. The Conveyancer and the Merchant may attend, with profit, the particular lectures appropriate to their respective pursuits.

By late Rules of the District Court and Court of Common Pleas of the County of Philadelphia, the time occupied in this Department is considered, with respect to admission to the Bar, as equivalent to a like term of regular clerkship in the office and under the direction of a practising Attorney. And persons admitted to practise in any Court of Common Pleas or District Court of the State, if they are graduates of this Department, are admitted, at once, to the Supreme Court. It is believed that admission to the Bar in Philadelphia will entitle to admission in any part of Pennsylvania, and in many other States of the Union.

Gentlemen can study in their own rooms, or in a room at the University provided for that purpose.

The Professors do not presume to embrace in their course the peculiar laws and rules of procedure of all parts of the Union. Their design is so to discipline and prepare the mind by instruction in the principles of jurisprudence and their application in Pennsylvania, that other local codes can be acquired with facility and advantage. The foundations of the laws of most of the States are the same.

Students may matriculate at any stage of their professional preparation.

Students are not examined for matriculation, nor is it possible to require, peremptorily, a college degree, or any previous line of

study. This must be left to circumstances, to the views of the student, and to the influences which control him.

Instruction is conveyed by lectures, and by books and portions of books upon the subjects of the lectures, which are recommended by the Professors. The students are frequently and carefully examined. Moot courts are held, at which questions are argued. And the Law Academy of Philadelphia, an institution of long standing, to which not only students, but many practising lawyers belong, gives opportunity for debate and argument which has been found of the greatest practical advantage. Exercises in writing legal essays and opinions form part of the course.

There are two terms each year. The first term begins on the first of October, the second on the first of February. Each term continues four months. From the first day of June to the first of October is vacation. The course is so arranged that a student entering at the commencement of any October term will complete his term of study in two academical years.

Students who have attended four consecutive terms with each Professor, may, upon the recommendation of the Faculty, proceed Bachelors of Law.

Students who have attended any one or two of the Professors only, may receive from each Professor certificates of proficiency.

The fee to each Professor is ten dollars for each term of four months. No matriculation fee is required.

In all cases where a student is a proper object for such indulgence, he will be allowed to attend the lectures without charge.

Those who have received the degree of Bachelor of Laws, may attend all future lectures free of charge.

Arrangement of the Course.

For the second term, beginning February 1, 1860, ending June 1, 1860, Sources of Municipal Law, Constitutional Law.

For the third term, beginning October 1, 1860, ending February 1, 1861, Law of Persons and Personal Property, Mercantile Law.

For the fourth term, beginning February 1, 1861, ending June 1, 1861, Mercantile Law, Law of Debtor and Creditor, Criminal Law, Conflict of Laws.

PROFESSOR McCALL.

The course for the four terms, beginning October 1, 1861, ending June 1, 1862, will be, unless some change is announced, a repetition of the above. It will be perceived, therefore, that a student entering on the 1st of October of any year, and continuing four terms, will have a complete course, though the studies will not be presented in the same order to him as to those who have entered in the previous October.

Regulations

OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF MINES, ARTS, AND MANUFACTURES.

• THE design of the course of instruction in this Department, is to assist the student in those branches of applied science which are embraced in the plan of the Department, and to afford to those already in practice, an opportunity of acquiring theoretical information in connection with their occupations.

The course is adapted to the wants of the student of Civil Engineering, to young engineers in offices, to those desiring to become geologists, mineralogists, or mining engineers, and to those interested in manufactures, mining, or construction generally.

The method of instruction is by means of lectures, amply illustrated by drawings, models, and experiments, and by informal examinations and conversations on the subjects discussed, when desired by the student; parallel courses of reading and study are also pointed out, and assistance given in their prosecution by the Professors.

A separate course of Mathematics may be followed by those who desire to do so, under the direction of the Professor of Mathematics.

The well selected cabinet of minerals belonging to the Department, is used to illustrate the lectures on Mineralogy.

No examination for admission is required; attendance upon the lectures is entirely voluntary, and they are not connected with the ordinary instruction.

The lectures commence in November, and are continued until the end of March.

Library, Museum, and Cabinets.

THE apartment in the University occupied by the Board of Trustees, and the apartment adjoining it to the westward, are appropriated for the reception and arrangement of the Library, and as a Reading Room.

The Library is open for not less than two hours daily (Sundays excepted), for the use of the Students, Professors, Trustees, and Alumni of the University, and all persons connected with instruction in the several departments.

The Library is under the care and in charge of the Professor of Belles Lettres and the English Language and Literature, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Permission may be granted, from time to time, to take books for a limited period, from the Library, and to admit to its use other persons than those connected with the University, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Connected with the Medical Department is the Wistar and Horner's Museum. Tickets of matriculation in that Department entitle those holding them to admission to the Museum. The Museum is open on Wednesdays and Saturdays of each week, throughout the session.

The private Cabinets of the several Professors in the Medical Department are likewise open to the students, at convenient hours.

Abstract of the Regulations

OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF ARTS.

THE college year is divided into three terms; the *first* beginning on the 8th of September, and ending on the 24th of December; the *second* beginning on the 2d of January, and ending on the 31st of March; and the *third* beginning on the 8th of April, and ending on the 3d of July (Commencement day). The vacations are eight days at the close of the first term, seven days at the close of the second term, and about nine weeks at the close of the third term.

The students pursue either the full course, for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, or that portion of the course for which the degree of Bachelor of Science is given, or any such portion of the course as the Faculty may sanction, for which a certificate of proficiency may be given at the close of each session.

The students of the full course are distributed into four classes, viz: the Senior, the Junior, the Sophomore, and the Freshman, Classes.

To be admitted into the Freshman Class, a student must be at least fourteen years of age, and qualified for examination on the following subjects and authors:—

Cæsar (First three Books of the Gallic War). Virgil (First six Books of the *Æneid*). Cicero (Four Orations against Catiline). Horace (First Book of the Odes). Xenophon (Four Books of the *Anabasis*). Homer (First three Books of the *Iliad*).

Quantity and scanning in each language.

Greek and Latin Exercises.

Ancient and Modern Geography.

English Grammar.

Arithmetic. Elementary Rules of Algebra, including Simple Equations. It is desirable that such students as design to pursue the scientific course, should also have studied the first four Books of Legendre's Geometry.

No student is admitted to advanced standing without being as fully instructed as the class, to which admission is asked, in all the studies which the class has pursued.

Course of Instruction for the Degree of Bachelor of Science.

THE degree of BACHELOR OF SCIENCE is given to such students as have attended all the courses in the Department of Mathematics, and in that of Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, and one course in Natural Theology and the Evidences of Christianity, with two courses in Modern Languages, or two courses in Moral and Natural Philosophy, or two courses in Physiology and Natural History.

The Professors in the Faculty of Arts, by arrangement among themselves, deliver to the students not less than three lectures, on separate days in each week, at such hours not devoted to the ordinary instruction and recitations of their several professorships, as they deem most fit, on subjects connected with their several professorships.

On each day of the week, except Saturday, there are three recitations of one hour each for every class. On Saturday, each class recites once.

The character of each recitation is recorded, and the results communicated to parents or guardians at the end of each term.

At the end of each term, public examinations (written and oral) of the classes are held by the Faculty, and the students who are distinguished are classed in order of merit.

The fees for instruction in the full course of the Department of Arts are \$30 per term, payable in advance. Scientific and other students, who recite with one or more classes, are charged for each branch one-third of the fee charged to regular undergraduates. In the Department of Modern Languages, the fee of each Professor is \$10.

Two Literary Societies, consisting of students and alumni of the Institution, are sanctioned by the Board of Trustees, and meet in the University, being under the general control and supervision of the Faculty.

Students not from the City of Philadelphia, will, if it be requested by their parents, have one of the Faculty appointed as a guardian, who will take charge of the disbursements, and attend to the comfort and well-doing of the individual.

The degree of Master of Arts may be conferred on the alumni of the University, bachelors in the arts of three years' standing, who apply for it. Such students as have received the degree of Bachelor of Science (of three years' standing) are entitled to the degree of Master of Science, on presenting to the Faculty a Thesis, which shall give satisfactory evidence that the author has continued to devote himself with success to science.

A public Commencement for conferring degrees, is held on the 3d of July, unless that day fall on Saturday or Sunday, when the Commencement is held on the Friday before.

A stated annual appropriation is made by the Board of Trustees, to enable the Faculty to offer *Prizes* for superiority in the performance of voluntary exercises, over and above the ordinary Course. The subjects are proposed by the several Professors early in the year; the award is made by the Faculty, and reported to the Board, before the month of June; and the names of those who have received Prizes are published at the annual Commencement.

In addition to the above, there is also a prize, called the "*Henry Reed Prize*," founded by the Alumni of the University in memory of the late Prof. Henry Reed, to be annually awarded for the best English composition by a member of the Senior Class, entitling the successful candidate to one year's interest on a certificate of loan issued by the City of Philadelphia, in the sum of \$600, and also to an accompanying Diploma of Merit.

The Committee on the Department of Arts may admit, for gratuitous instruction in this Department, such pupils, not exceeding ten at any one time, as shall, after application to the Provost, have been examined and approved by the Faculty, and reported by the Provost as worthy of admission.

Regulations

OF THE

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

THE Medical Department is under the immediate government of the Medical Professors, who constitute the Faculty of Medicine, subject to the Rules and Statutes of the Board of Trustees. The Faculty consists of

A Professor of the THEORY AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE AND CLINICAL MEDICINE,

A Professor of ANATOMY,

A Professor of MATERIA MEDICA AND PHARMACY,

A Professor of CHEMISTRY,

A Professor of SURGERY,

A Professor of OBSTETRICS, AND THE DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN, and

A Professor of the INSTITUTES OF MEDICINE.

The Medical Faculty hold meetings for the purpose of arranging and conducting the business of the department, and for the preservation of order and decorum among the medical students.

One of the members acts as Dean, whose duty it is to keep the Minutes of the Faculty, to arrange the examination of the candidates for graduation, to conduct the business of the Faculty at their meetings, and to attend to correspondence.

The Session for the Medical Lectures begins early in October, and ends early in March ensuing.

The Commencement for conferring the Degree of Doctor of Medicine, is held by a special mandamus of the Board of Trustees, during the month of March.

The following are the Rules in force in relation to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine:—

I. The candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one years, have applied himself to the study of Medicine for three years, and

been, during that time, the private pupil for two years, at least, of a respectable practitioner of Medicine.

II. The candidate must also have attended two complete courses of the following Lectures in this Institution:—

Theory and Practice of Medicine,
 Anatomy,
 Materia Medica and Pharmacy,
 Chemistry,
 Surgery,
 Obstetrics, and the Diseases of Women and Children,
 Institutes of Medicine.

III. Medical students who have attended one complete course in a respectable Medical School, where the attendance on two complete courses is necessary to a degree, where the same branches are taught as in this, and which is placed upon the *ad eundem* of this school, are permitted to become candidates by an attendance here for one full course; the rules of graduation being in other respects observed. They are also exempted from the payment of fees upon attending a second term.

IV. When a candidate applies to the Dean for admission, he must exhibit his tickets to prove that the above rules have been complied with.

V. The candidate, at the time of his application, must deliver to the Dean of the Medical Faculty, a Thesis, composed by himself, on some medical subject. This Thesis is referred to one of the Professors, who shall examine the candidate upon it, and make his report thereon to the Medical Faculty.

VI. When a candidate is rejected, his essay will be retained by the Medical Faculty.

VII. The essay must be in the candidate's own handwriting, and must be written uniformly on letter-paper of the same size, the alternate pages being left blank.*

VIII. Bad spelling in a Thesis, or evidences of a want of literary culture, will preclude a candidate from examination for a degree.

IX. A Thesis may be published by the candidate if he desire it,

* The essay should be written upon Thesis paper. This is for the purpose of convenient binding together into volumes. It is recommended to the candidate to prepare his thesis before the commencement of the second course of lectures.

the permission of the Professor by whom he was examined thereon being first obtained; but no alteration shall be made in such thesis without the consent of the said Professor.

X. The voting on the case of each candidate is by ballot. Candidates who have not been successful upon a first examination, will be permitted to have a second, when all the classes have been disposed of by the Faculty. The second examination will be conducted in full meeting of the Professors.

XI. The candidate shall pay the fees of graduation at the time of his examination, or before receiving notice of his success; his name may then be entered on the Register of passed candidates, for the purpose of being reported to the Board of Trustees and included in the mandamus for a Degree.

XII. Candidates who have passed their examination, and in other respects complied with the regulations, are to be reported by the Dean to the Provost, who will communicate such report to the Board of Trustees, in order that, if approved of by them, their mandamus be issued for conferring the Degree.

XIII. The Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate who absents himself from the Public Commencement, except by special permission of the Medical Faculty.

XIV. Graduates of Medical Schools, on the *ad eundem* list, by attending one complete course in this Institution, and complying with the above regulations, are put upon the same footing with students who have attended two complete courses here; that is, they may present themselves as candidates for graduation: also, if they attend a second time, the tickets will be free. Such graduates, if of five years' standing, are permitted to attend the course of Lectures, upon a general ticket of admission, free of expense, except the cost of the matriculating ticket. But this general ticket does not qualify for graduation.

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN THE UNIVERSITY.

As a means of illustrating and forcibly impressing the lessons of the Lecture-Room, CLINICAL INSTRUCTION IN MEDICINE AND SURGERY is conducted by the Professors in the University Hall, four times a week throughout the session; and no effort will be wanting to render this course interesting and of practical value to the students of the school.

For the accommodation of such patients as require it, the Faculty have provided two Surgical Wards, and proper attendance within the college building.

The Dispensary of the University, which is open throughout the year, affords an opportunity to the class of examining patients, and those who avail themselves of it, will find it a valuable addition to their means of clinical instruction.

Regulations, etc.

OF THE

LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

It is the design of this Department to aid in preparing gentlemen for admission to the Bar, and, also, to offer to those who have not the Bar in view an opportunity of acquiring knowledge in any one or all of the branches of legal learning. The Conveyancer and the Merchant may attend, with profit, the particular lectures appropriate to their respective pursuits.

By late Rules of the District Court and Court of Common Pleas of the County of Philadelphia, the time occupied in this Department is considered, with respect to admission to the Bar, as equivalent to a like term of regular clerkship in the office and under the direction of a practising Attorney. And persons admitted to practise in any Court of Common Pleas or District Court of the State, if they are graduates of this Department, are admitted, at once, to the Supreme Court. It is believed that admission to the Bar in Philadelphia will entitle to admission in any part of Pennsylvania, and in many other States of the Union.

Gentlemen can study in their own rooms, or in a room at the University provided for that purpose.

The Professors do not presume to embrace in their course the peculiar laws and rules of procedure of all parts of the Union. Their design is so to discipline and prepare the mind by instruction in the principles of jurisprudence and their application in Pennsylvania, that other local codes can be acquired with facility and advantage. The foundations of the laws of most of the States are the same.

Students may matriculate at any stage of their professional preparation.

Students are not examined for matriculation, nor is it possible to require, peremptorily, a college degree, or any previous line of

study. This must be left to circumstances, to the views of the student, and to the influences which control him.

Instruction is conveyed by lectures, and by books and portions of books upon the subjects of the lectures, which are recommended by the Professors. The students are frequently and carefully examined. Moot courts are held, at which questions are argued; And the Law Academy of Philadelphia, an institution of long standing, to which not only students, but many practising lawyers belong, gives opportunity for debate and argument which has been found of the greatest practical advantage. Exercises in writing legal essays and opinions form part of the course.

There are two terms each year. The first term begins on the first of October, the second on the first of February. Each term continues four months. From the first day of June to the first of October is vacation. The course is so arranged that a student entering at the commencement of any October term will complete his term of study in two academical years.

Students who have attended four consecutive terms with each Professor, may, upon the recommendation of the Faculty, proceed Bachelors of Law.

Students who have attended any one or two of the Professors only, may receive from each Professor certificates of proficiency.

The fee to each Professor is ten dollars for each term of four months. No matriculation fee is required.

In all cases where a student is a proper object for such indulgence, he will be allowed to attend the lectures without charge.

Those who have received the degree of Bachelor of Laws, may attend all future lectures free of charge.

Arrangement of the Course.

For the second term, beginning February 1, 1861, ending June 1, 1861, Sources of Municipal Law, Constitutional Law.

For the third term, beginning October 1, 1861, ending February 1, 1862, Law of Persons and Personal Property, Mercantile Law.

For the fourth term, beginning February 1, 1862, ending June 1, 1862, Mercantile Law, Law of Debtor and Creditor, Criminal Law, Conflict of Laws.

PROFESSOR MCCALL

The course for the four terms, beginning October 1, 1862, ending June 1, 1864, will be, unless some change is announced, a repetition of the above. It will be perceived, therefore, that a student entering on the 1st of October of any year, and continuing four terms, will have a complete course, though the studies will not be presented in the same order to him as to those who have entered in the previous October.

Regulations

OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF MINES, ARTS, AND MANUFACTURES.

THE design of the course of instruction in this Department, is to assist the student in those branches of applied science which are embraced in the plan of the Department, and to afford to those already in practice, an opportunity of acquiring theoretical information in connection with their occupations.

The course is adapted to the wants of the student of Civil Engineering, to young engineers in offices, to those desiring to become geologists, mineralogists, or mining engineers, and to those interested in manufactures, mining, or construction generally.

The method of instruction is by means of lectures, amply illustrated by drawings, models, and experiments, and by informal examinations and conversations on the subjects discussed, when desired by the student; parallel courses of reading and study are also pointed out, and assistance given in their prosecution by the Professors.

A separate course of Mathematics may be followed by those who desire to do so, under the direction of the Professor of Mathematics.

The well selected cabinet of minerals, belonging to the Department, is used to illustrate the lectures on Mineralogy.

No examination for admission is required; attendance upon the lectures is entirely voluntary, and they are not connected with the ordinary instruction.

The lectures commence in November, and are continued until the end of March.

Arrangement of the Course.

PROF. FRAZER.

Theory of Mechanics: and its application to the construction of machines.

Chemistry: its theories, and the properties of bodies and their compounds; its applications in the arts.

PROF. KENDALL.

Applied Mathematics: Trigonometry, Practical Astronomy, Surveying, Geodesy, Theory of instruments and observations. The course of Mathematics may be followed by those who desire to do so under the direction of the Professor of Mathematics.

PROF. ROGERS.

Civil Engineering: Construction: strength of materials, masonry, framing, and their special applications to railroads, canals, and waterworks.

PROF. TREGO.

Geology, as applied to the origin, order, and geographical distribution of rock formations, and its practical application to manufactures and agriculture.

Mineralogy, as applied to the constituent materials of rocks, the external and chemical character of ores and mineral substances, their connection with the various rock formations, and their uses in metallurgy and manufactures.

PROF. LESLEY.

Mining: Structural geology, metallurgy.

Library, Museum, and Cabinets.

THE apartment in the University occupied by the Board of Trustees, and the apartment adjoining it to the westward, are appropriated for the reception and arrangement of the Library, and as a Reading Room.

The Library is open for not less than two hours daily (Sundays excepted), for the use of the Students, Professors, Trustees, and Alumni of the University, and all persons connected with instruction in the several departments.

The Library is under the care and in charge of the Professor of Belles Lettres and the English Language and Literature, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Permission may be granted, from time to time, to take books for a limited period from the Library, and to admit to its use other persons than those connected with the University, subject to such rules and regulations as the Committee on the Library may adopt.

Connected with the Medical Department is the Wistar and Horner Museum. Tickets of matriculation in that Department entitle those holding them to admission to the Museum. The Museum is open on Wednesdays and Saturdays of each week, throughout the session.

The private Cabinets of the several Professors in the Medical Department are likewise open to the students, at convenient hours.
