## Dean Named for College of Business

Dr. Edward A. Johnson, associate professor and research associate at the college of Business and Economics, West Virginia University, has been named dean of the College of Business at RIT effective Aug. 1, it has been announced by Dr. Todd H. Bullard, provost and vice president for academic affairs.

In announcing the appointment, Dr. Bullard said, "Dr. Johnson brings to the Institute an excellent background in several facets of special concern to the College of Business, including behavorial sciences, labor relations and contemporary trends in business. He will help RIT maintain distinctive programs in that college."

Dr. Johnson has been at West Virginia since 1966. In his present assignment he teaches personnel, industrial relations and other management courses at the graduate and undergraduate levels; serves as chairman of the WVU President's Personnel

Advisory Committee, and is a training consultant to numerous business and governmental agencies.

Prior to taking his present assignment in 1970, he was assistant professor and director of graduate programs in business administration and industrial relations in the College of Commerce, where he was responsible for the administration of graduate business programs. He also taught personnel and industrial relations courses at the graduate and undergraduate levels.

From 1962 to 1966, Dr. Johnson was assistant instructor and research assistant to Dr. Dalton E. McFarland, chairman, Department of Management, College of Business, Michigan State University.

Dr. Johnson holds the Ph.D. degree in management from Michigan State University; MILR (master of industrial and labor relations) in personnel administration from Cornell, and B.A. in psychology from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio.
