clear of rats; measuring 12 feet square; the
front on Melponene street is built of brick.

7th. A building used as carriage house and
stable, measuring 74 feet long, by 22 wide.

The building has a brick front on Tepiscore
st.; 150 bales of hay may be stored in its gar-
ret.

8th and last. Four good wells, walled with
which water is as good as that of the river.

This property is surrounded with orange trees,
which are in production. The interior is plan-
