Shapely and abundant long buds on many upright stems turn gorgeous apricot-orange-vermillon or something most satisfactory of the two-tones. 7.4

MONTEZUMA (Paf. 1383) \$2.75
Salmon-red like blending scarlet and orange, double flowers pop out everywhere . . amazingly productive. Good cutting, some fade, but a great well dressed bush drawing envious eyes. 8.6

MY FAIR LADY (PPAF) $\$ 3.00$
Pastel tones in dazzling variations, large heavy flower.

Exhibition type, apricot and peach, strong stems, . . different. 7.2

WAR DANCE (Pat. 2017) \$2.75
Hot, dark orange-red color, full-blown deep red-velvet, 28 to 40 petals, well armored bush, heavy-flowered cluster. 7.1

WHITE KNIGHT (På. 1359) \$2.75 AARS 1958
Snow white, alone in All America award list for white hybrid tea, elegant 35 -petaled and erect 7.2

CIRCUS (Pat. 1382) $\$ 2 . S 0$ AARS $19 S 6$
Yellow, Salmon and Scarlet, a real circus of colors, still-novel
2-inch double flowers abundant in cuttable compact cluster. 7.8

FASHION (Pat. 789) \$2.00 AARS 1950
First peach floribunda called coral, shapely arrangeable. Fashion is Pinocchio-Crimson Glory cross, individually lovely lasting buds and clusters. 9

FIRE KING (Pat. 1758) \$2.00 AARS 1960
Dazzling red, lasting and shapely flower, wonderful in vigorous hedge, late spring to early winter. 7.8

GIRL SCOUT (Pat. 2090) \$2.50
Lively lemon-yellow slender buds and $2 \frac{1}{2}$-inch flowers on compact 2-feet bush. 7.

GOLD CUP (Pat. 1683) \$2.00 AARS 19S8
Three-inch golden yellow, fragrant cupped flowers, clusters and singles, bushy, fragrant and freely renewing from base. 7.1

GOLDEN SLIPPERS (Pat. 2244) \$2.SO AARS 1962 .
New bright gold marked red, a lovely orange-vermillion color FIRST in All America floribunda winners (1962). Frosty-white clear, nicely formed and fragrant, vigorous and bushy. 7.1

JIMINY CRICKET (Pat. 1346) \$2.00 AARS 1955
Tangerine-red opens coral-orange fitishing pink; a romping grower, glossy foliage, geranium fragrance. 7.6

LAFON.TAINE (Pat. 2040) $\$ 2.00$
Rich yellow clusters, abundant and continuous flower, low and compact. 7.2

LAVENDER GIRL (Pat. 1672) $\$ 3.00$
A $\$ 5$ venture with a feminine following for real lavender, now $\$ 3$ and the same fascinating and desirable color tones; up to 42 petals, bushy, good stems hold fragrant 3 -inch blooms. 7.
