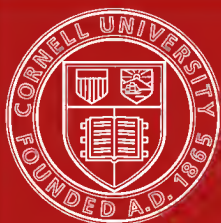

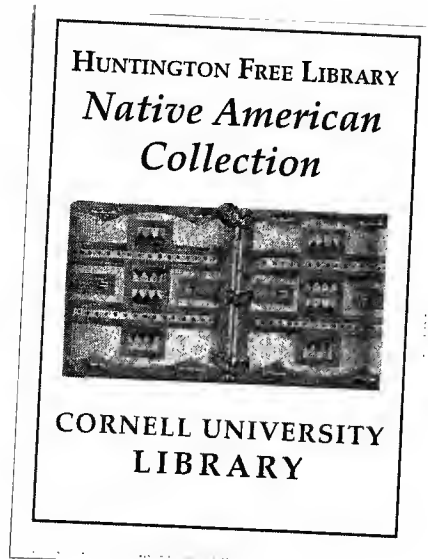

THE following pages contain a brief descriptive list, arranged alphabetically, of the most important bibliographies, and booksellers' and auctioneers' catalogues of old, scarce, and valuable books, pamphlets, manuscripts, maps and charts relating to the antiquities, history, and geography of North and South America, the West Indies, the Great South Sea, and voyages round the World. Of the general bibliographies not included in the present list, but which are of great value to Americanists, the reader should consult Brunet's Manual; Lowndes' Manual; Bibliotheca Grenvilliana; Harvard College Library Bulletins; Catalogues of the Boston Public Library, Library of Congress, Astor Library, Boston Athenaeum; and the works of DeBure, Antonio, Graesse, Boehmer, Panzer, and Meuselei.

ALCEDO (Antonio de).

"Antonio de Alcedo y Bexarano, the author of the well-known Geographical Dictionary, compiled a *Bibliotheca Americana*, which never was printed. This bulky compilation seems to be based entirely upon Pinelo-Barcia, with the addition of a few bibliographical notes, which are of interest only when referring to modern American authors. The titles are given in alphabetical order, abridged, and selected with very little discrimination."—HARRISSE, *Bib. Am. Vet.*, p. xxiv.

Manuscript copies are in the Sparks collection at Cornell, the John Carter-Brown library in Providence, and the library of H. H. Bancroft, of San Francisco.

Contains a list of pamphlets published in America on colonial taxation, 1770. Almon was an active pamphleteer and publisher during the War of the Revolution.

Extracted from No. 35 of Asher's Monthly list of Old Books. The collected voyages of Hulsius are printed in the German language, and are devoted chiefly to the voyages of the Dutch. The set described in the above memoir was collected by Mr. Adolph Asher, the Berlin bookseller, who afterwards sold them to Mr. Thomas Grenville. Six years later this brief catalogue was enlarged and 120 copies printed in 4to, as follows:

Contains facsimiles of the map of New Netherland by N. I. Vischer, and of the three existing views of New Amsterdam. These essays were written by Mr. Asher for Frederick Muller, the bookseller. The books described were in the Dutch public and private libraries of Amsterdam and in the collection of Mr. Muller. Indispensable to the collectors of books relating to New York. The titles are given at length in Dutch, with an English translation. The notes, which are chiefly historical, are numerous, and in some instances, extend to great length.

ASPINWALL (Thomas) Catalogue of Books relating to America, in the Collection of Colonel Aspinwall, Consul of the United States of America at London. 8vo, pp. (4), 66.

Comprised 771 lots, which formed one of the earliest collections of rare and valuable books on America. The collection, which was afterwards increased to about 4,000 volumes, was sold in 1863 to Mr. Samuel L. M. Barlow, of New York. Five hundred volumes of the rarest portion were sent in advance and placed in the private library of Mr. Barlow. The remaining 3,500 volumes were destroyed in the fire which consumed the establishment of Bangs Brothers, where the rest of the collection had been temporarily stored.

Vol. 1 was reprinted in 1875 with the addition of 298 titles, 1482-1601, and vol. 2, was similarly enlarged and reprinted with 482 more titles, 1600-1700, in 1882. A few copies of the 1875 edition of vol. 1 bear this title: *Bibliographical Notices of Rare and Curious Books relating to America, printed in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, in the library of the late John Carter Brown, by John Russell Bartlett.*

"Mr. Bartlett has performed his part in a most admirable manner. To a faithful description of the books themselves, he has added numerous and judicious notes of his own as to their character, besides presenting an analytical view of the contents of the more extensive publications. Besides, whenever he has found a valuable note by another hand relating to the books, its author or subject, he has not failed to avail himself of it. The maps he has chosen for illustration are few, but they are choice. The titles, portraits, printers' devices, vignettes, and woodcuts in facsimile are profuse, carrying the mind back to the past, to revel in the early times to which they relate. In adopting this auxiliary of description Mr. Bartlett has gone far beyond other bibliographers. As it is, the fortunate possessor of this volume [vol. 1, 1875] will have all the means which can be afforded for collation with the books it describes except the works themselves."—H. C. Mr. Brown was a large buyer of rare books from the collections formed by Obadiah Rich in London and Henri Ternaux in Paris.

This famous library of Americana of works published between the years 1482 and 1800 is well nigh perfect, and is quite unsurpassed.

The first (excepting the unfinished work of Eguiaza) bibliographical work on Mexico. Beristain lived to publish only 186 pages of the first volume—the rest of the work was edited by his nephew. The work is extremely scarce.

Following *Idea*, pp. 1-96, a catalogue of the Indian historical museum of pictures, manuscripts, maps, dictionaries, and grammars relating to the history and languages of the ancient empire of the Mexicans. This remarkable collection was made by Boturini during an eight years' residence in Mexico (1736-44). With these aids he hoped to resuscitate the forgotten history of the Indians, but owing to trouble with the authorities his plan was never fully carried out.

This noted French traveler was engaged in explorations and researches into the antiquities of North America, particularly in the United States, Mexico and Central America, from 1848 till 1863.

"It is very difficult to assign the place which this extraordinary man will occupy in the annals of science, for his works are to-day nearly as great mysteries as the hieroglyphs his labors have illustrated. His industry in his researches into the history of the Aztec races is something
