PREPARATION AND CARE OF LAWNS. The ground should be thoroughly drained and well enriched before sowing. Work the soil until well pulverized, and have the surface as smooth as possible, so that the grass may present an even appearance. After sowing, cover seed lightly and follow with roller. The best results are obtained by using plenty of seed, 4 bushels to the acre being about the right quantity. One quart is sufficient for 300 square feet. Let the grass obtain a good start before cutting, and then it should be trimmed with a lawn mower about every 10 days. Old lawns may be improved and renewed by the application of fertilizers and seeding about half the quantity of seed required for new lawns. This should be done whenever they show any thin places.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PLANTING

Sow seed indoors for early plants of Cabbage, Cauliflower, Egg Plant, Pepper, Lettuce and Tomato, February 20th to March 10th.

Set early plants outside, of Cabbage, Lettuce and Cauliflower, April 1st to April 30th.

Plant in the outside land, where they are to remain, Potatoes, Peas and Onion Sets, March 17th to May

Sow on the outside, where they are to remain, Asparagus Seed, Asparagus Roots, Beet, Onion Seed, Parsnip, Parsley, Lettuce, Kale, Turnip, Radish, Spinach, Carrot, Salsify, also Celery seed for plants, April 1st to May 15th.

Set outside plants of Tomato, Pepper, Egg Plant, May 20th to June 20th.

Plant outside, Sugar Corn, Muskmelon, Co Squash and Pumpkin, May 15th to July 1st.

Watermelon, May 20th to June 20th.

Plant outside all kinds of String Beans and Stringless Beans, May 15th to August 15th.

Lima Beans, May 15th to June 20th.

For late crops of Kale, Turnip and Spinach, sow August 10th to Sept. 10th.

For plants for late crops of Cabbage, Borecole and Brussels Sprouts, sow seed May 15th to May 25th.

FLOWER SEEDS FOR 1934

In submitting this list of flower seeds to our customers, we are offering the very best varieties that can be procured, and endeavor to give a short accurate description of each strain—its use, its color, height, blooming period, etc. We also offer, for the convenience of our customers, general directions for cultivation.

Hardy flower seeds should be sown in the open, after danger of frost is past, in well-worked and moist soil. Seeds of medium size, put at depth of one-quarter to one-half inch. Very fine seeds, press into the soil and cover slightly with a little sand or sphagnum moss. If seeds are not deep, water frequently. When up, tranplant from two to twelve inches apart, according to variety of plants. Do not leave too thick, as the plants will be weak and spindling. Keep weeds out of the flower beds.

A-Annuals, live and bloom only one season.

B-Biennials, live two seasons; sometimes blooming only the second season.

P—Perennials, tend to live from year to year. Seeds of perennials should be sown in late summer and cover well during winter.

HHP-Half Hardy Perennials. Fine seeds can be sown indoors or cold frame, and transplanted to open, latter part of April.

Early spring, about March or April, is the most logical time (for Maryland) to transplant strawberry plants. They will grow in light sandy soil and heavy clay soil, responding readily to fertile and well-drained soils. Give plenty of moisture when fruiting.

Stable or barnyard manure will help to give them best results. When plants arrive, if dry, dip in water, allowing to "plump up," before setting out. Plant in rows, 3½ to 4 feet apart with plants set 15 to 24 inches apart in the row. In winter cover with straw, and in early spring remove from plants and allow it to remain on ground as a mulch.

By planting every two weeks a family may have good corn throughout the whole season.



CUCUMBERS

For very early Cucumbers sow the first of April in a hotbed upon pieces of sod (grass side down), so that they can be readily transplanted to the open ground in rich soil when danger of frost is over, or protect by hand-glasses. The vines require a warm location for early Cucumbers. Plant after the ground has become warm in hills 4 feet apart for the smaller varieties, and 5 feet for the larger sort. For pickling sow from middle of June to last of July. Manure with wood ashes, fertilizer or some well-rotted compost, working the manure just under the surface. Sprinkle the vines with slug-shot plaster, or air-slaked lime to protect from bugs. The Cucumbers should be gathered when large enough for use, whether required or not; if left to ripen, it destroys their productiveness.

ONION SEED

CULTIVATION.—TO GROW LARGE ONIONS FROM SEED.—The seed should be sown as early as possible in the spring, as they grow much better during the cool weather, and should make most of their growth before the hot weather sets in. Sow 5 pounds of seed to the acre for large onions.

YELLOW GLOBE DANVERS.—A very handsome, round, yellow onion; a large yielder and splendid keeper; the preferred sort with market gardeners and large growers all over the country. We unhesitatingly recommend it for growing either sets or large onions.

Put this mixture on floor about 8 inches deep in beds the size desired and pack down with shovel. When the heat rises to 100 degrees, wait until it recedes about 70, then place the spawn. Keep same moist, make your bed in cellar, shed, pit or some building that can be darkened.

NASTURTIUM

Plant in May, the climbing varieties to cover arbor or fence, and the dwarf for beds or hanging baskets. The leaves are used for salad, and the seeds, when soft enough to be penetrated by the nail, for pickles.


RHUBARB OR PIE PLANT

CULTURE.—Good plants are easily grown in any good garden soil. Sow seed thinly in shallow drills a foot apart, thin to 4 or 5 inches. Keep soil loose and free from weeds. The plants are liable to vary considerably. Pick out the strongest and best. In fall or spring following transplant to the permanent bed, 4 feet apart each way, in deep, warm and very rich soil. soil.

PARSLEY

Select rich soil; sow the seed in drills one foot apart, covering half an inch deep. It would be well to firm the soil with the foot after sowing the seed. PEPPER OR CAPSICUM

Is cultivated mainly for pickles; used as a seasoning in many ways; sometimes medicinally. Sow seed early in hotbed, if possible; if not, select a warm place in the garden for seed bed; sow as soon as the soil is warm. Transplant when 3 or 4 inches high, in rows 18 inches apart.

The Dwarf Varieties should be liberally manured; the tall sorts will run too much to vine if heavily manured, it being better to depend on the richness of the land that was previously in good condition. 



TOMATOES-Extra Early Varieties

For early fruit sow the seed first of March in the hotbed or in pots in a sunny exposure in the house. When the plants are about three or four inches high they should be set out four or five inches apart in another hotbed or cold frame into small pots, allowing a single plant to a pot. Expose to the air as much as possible to harden, and about the middle of May set the plants in the open ground at a distance of four or five feet each way. Water freely at the time of transplanting and shelter from the sun for a few days until the plants are established.

Tomatoes will admit of training to stakes or trellis of various kinds. The usual method is to set one strong plant to a stake, using stakes five to seven feet in height, tying the plant up with strong, soft twine, pruning out quite freely as the vines advance in growth.





TURNIP

For early use, sow the small sorts as soon as the ground can be worked in the spring, in drills 14 inches apart, the Rutabagas 30 inches. As the seed is very fine, it should be covered but slightly, excepting in very dry weather. Select light, and if possible, new soil and manure with plaster and ashes or phosphates. Should the young plants be troubled with insects, a sprinkling of slug shot will be beneficial. For fall and winter use the early kinds should be sown, from the middle of July to the middle of August, and the Rutabagas from the middle of June to the first of July, using from one to one and a half pounds of seed to the acre.

Improved Purple or Red Top Globe Turnip




Fig. 639—Spray Pump is constructed entirely of brass. It is provided with a large air chamber and has brass ball valves and detachable hose.



Set plants 2 feet apart (narrow beds are best) and 2 inches deeper than the graft. Fill hole half full, then fill with water to settle dirt around roots to prevent air-pockets. Allow water to drain, then fill with dirt and cover with light mulch of peat moss or well-rotted manure. Top-dress with bonemeal in spring and autumn.
