

**運** YÜN. To move; to agitate; to turn round; to go from place to place. To revolve in a circle; to circulate; to transport from one place to another. Yun chow 運舟 a transport boat.

**遇** GÖ. To meet; to light on; to occur; to come together; to encounter; to meet with, contrary to one's inclination; to see that which one has no desire to see; to be struck with alarm on seeing or meeting with; to rush or bounce against.

**遍** Same as 徧 Pëen.

**過** KO, or Kwo. To pass; to exceed; past, in reference to time or place. Exceeding a rule; error; fault; crime. Name of one of the diagrams; name of a state; name of a stream; a surname. Makes the perfect tense of verbs. Kwo keu chwang yen kö 過去莊嚴劫 the by-gone kulpa called *Chwang-yen*. Kwo sāng yu king man 過生於輕慢 errors (or faults) spring from levity and disrespect.

**遲** Same as 遲 Ping.

**遐** HEA. Distant; remote; far from.

**遑** HWANG. Unoccupied; at leisure. Pressed; urged. Pöh hwang 不遑 engaged, not having time to spare.

**逋** CHÄ. The appearance of walking or going.

**遏** GÖ, or Ö. To stop; to cause to desist; to cut off or terminate; to reach or extend to. Used to denote settling down with the hand.

**適** TSEW. Abrupt; sudden; to urge or press upon; to clash; to terminate; to end; to collect together; strong; to establish.

**邃** TSUNG. To walk; to go.

**道** TAÖU. 道 道 道

A way; a path; being at the head; the way that leads to; a thoroughfare on all sides. A principle. The principle from which heaven, earth, man, and all nature emanates. Seaou pëen taou 小便道 the urinary passage; the vagina. Ta pëen taou 大便道 the rectum intestinum. Ta taon 大道 or Küh taou 穀道 the passage by the anus. Seaou taou 水道 the passage by the urethra.

Taou-kwang yuen nëen 道光元年 the first of Taou-kwang, 'reason's glory,' title of the reigning emperor of China; (A. D. 1821.) Taou he 道喜 to congratulate, an expression used amongst equals. Taou tsëen shing che kwö 道千乘之國 to rule or govern a nation that can send forth a thousand war chariots.

The word *Taou* was formerly applied to divisions or departments of the empire as 河南道 Ho-nan taou, included the region of Ho-nan province.

2nd, Kwan se taou 關西道 the region of Shen-se province.

3rd, Ho tung taou 河東道 the region of Shan-tung.

4th, Ho pih tung taou 河北東道 contained places in Chih-le.

5th, Këen nan tung taou 劍南東道 contained places in Kwei-chow province.
