Unlike most Red Roses it does not wilt or dry, but will open perfectly. It does not become unsightly through the process of ageing. Its petals do not fall even after it is too old to be kept longer, and the bright color is retained for some time after it is full blown.

It is a large, well formed, full center Rose with 35 to 40 petals, with practically no deformed buds. It is, at least, equal to Talisman in production, with stronger and heavier stems. We consider it a much stronger grower than its parent.
