Election Proclamation

AN ORDER PROVIDING FOR the organization, incorporation and incorporation and incorporation and incorporation and government of municipal corporations" approved March 13th, district of country, in the country of Monterey, State of California, as a which petition was accompanied by municipal corporation, under an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An act to provide for the organization, incorpora-tion and government of municipal corporations," approved March 13, 1888, and the amendments thereto; to provide for a name therefor, establish the boundaries thereof, and call an election within said territory to determine whether the same shall be so organized, and to provide for an election of the elective officers of said proposed corporation.

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting

of the Board of Supervisore of the County of Monterey, State of Cali-fornia, held on the 5th day of September, 1916, at its regular meeting room, in the Court House, in Salinas City, County of Monterey, State of California, there was presented to said Board a petition praying for the incorporation of the following described district of country in said County of Monterey, State of Cali-

fornia, to-wit:

We tried hard to improve our street but no one would help us.
