

All About Question Marks

Question Mark- a mark used in writing and printing at the conclusion of a sentence to indicate a direct question.

Correct examples:

- 1) How old were you when you learned to skate?
- 2) When are you ever going to grow up?
- 3) May I go to the bathroom?

Incorrect example:

- 1) Can I have a piece of that cake.

Correct example: Can I have a piece of that cake?

Indirect questions do not require a question mark.

Correct examples:

- 1) I can't imagine how she hit that ball.
- 2) I wonder if the quiz is going to be hard tomorrow.
- 3) James asked where we are hunting.

Incorrect example:

- 1) I was wondering where the bathroom was?

Correct example: I was wondering where the bathroom was.
