Resolved, That from and after this Grand Communication, the annual stipend to be paid by the subordinate Lodges to this Grand Lodge, be reduced from ten to six dollars.

On motion of Bro. Flint it was

Resolved, That three hundred copies of the Constitution of the Grand Lodge be printed for its benefit, and for the use of the subordinate Lodges under its jurisdiction; and that the Grand Secretary transmit one copy to each of the subordinate Lodges within the State.

A letter from the Most Worshipful Grand Master, L. H. Marsteller, received since the adjournment of the Grand Lodge on yesterday, was then read by the Grand Secretary, in which he returned his thanks to the Grand Lodge, and declined a re-election as Grand Master, not being able in his present situation to attend satisfactorily to himself to the duties of the office.

When, on motion, the Grand Lodge then proceeded to the election of its officers for the ensuing year, and the following officers were elected:

WHEREAS, various errors and informalities have crept into the ceremonies of many of the subordinate Lodges of this State, thereby creating material discrepancies in the mode of working in different Lodges, which ought not to exist—

Be it therefore Resolved, That the Grand Master appoint one or more Special Grand Lecturers, whose duty it shall be to visit the several subordinate Lodges of this State, and establish a more uniform mode of white in the same, according to the ancient customs and usages of Free Masons.

And be is further Resolved, That the said Special Grand Lecturers be req ired to call upon all such subordinate Lodges as are in arrears to the Grind Lodge, for a settlement of their accounts; and they are hereby authorized to settle and receipt for the same; and they shall account with the Grand Secretary for all moneys so received.

And be it further Resolved, That each of the said Special Grand Lecturers shall receive for his services, while employed in visiting the subordinate Lodges, a compensation of three dollars per day, over and above his necessary expenses.

On motion of Bro. John G. Marshall it was

Resolved, That the Grand Treasurer pay to Bro. William T. Bain thirty-five dollars for his services as Secretary to this Grand Lodge for the year 1837.

The Committee on Returns and Charters from subordinate Lodges made the following Report:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

The Committee on Charters and Communications from subordinate Lodges have given proper consideration to the subjects which it became their duty to investigate, and beg leave most respectfully to submit the following

REPORT:

1st. On the subject of Charters.

We have had under consideration a Communication from St. John's

Lodge, No. 96, Kinston, signed by the Master thereof, surrendering the Charter of the same, and assigning as a reason for so doing, incompetency and other causes deemed satisfactory to your committee. Accompanying this communication were sent the dues for the present year. It is therefore recommended that this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge receive this Charter, thus surrendered, in a kind and appropriate manner.

We have had before us a petition from the same place, signed by several Master Masons of high standing and character, praying for a Dispensation, authorizing them to work in the several degrees of Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft and Master Mason; which petition has been recommended to your favorable notice by Hiram Lodge, No. 40; and your committee therefore beg leave to report the following resolution:

Resolved, That the prayer of the petitioners for a Dispensation to hold a Lodge in the town of Kinston, to be called St. John's Lodge, No. 96, be granted by this Worshipful Grand Lodge.

Be it further Resolved, That said Lodge be allowed the use of the jewels and furniture belonging to the late Lodge.

We have also had before us a petition from Pittsborough, signed by several respectable Master Masons, and recommended by University Lodge, No. 80, praying for a Charter or Warrant to empower them to assemble as a legal Lodge to discharge the duties of Masonry in the several degrees of Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft and Master Masonthe new Lodge to be called Columbus, No. 102.

Be it therefore Resolved, That the prayer of the petitioners be granted by this Grand Lodge.

2nd. On Communications from subordinate Lodges.

It is with sorrow that your Committee are constrained to state that only fifteen subordinate Lodges have sent Representatives to this Grand Communication, viz:

Saint Johu's Lodge, No. 1, Wilmington; Royal White Hart, No. 2, Halifax; Davie, No. 39, Bertie; Hiram, No. 40, Raleigh; Hall, No. 53, Currituck: Perseverance, No. 59, Plymouth; Scotland Neck, No. 68, Halifax; Sharon, 78, Greenville; University, No. 80, Chapel Hill; Lafayette, No. 86, Louisburg; Enfield, No. 88, Enfield; Wake Forest, No. 97, Wake; Widow's Son, No. 75, Camden; Greensborough, No. 76, Guilford; Pittsborough, by dispensation.

The above named Lodges have also paid up their annual dues to the present time, with the exception of Hall and University Lodges. The other subordinate Lodges are still in arrears, notwithstanding the Grand Lodge has, from time to time, passed resolutions requiring all delinquent subordinate Lodges to adjust the claims standing against them within a given period, or appear by legal Representatives at the Annual Communications, to show cause why the charters, jewels and property of said Lodges should not be forfeited, the Grand Lodge at the same time informing them that if they failed to comply with the above requisitions, the charters, jewels and property thereof should be held and deemed to be forfeited; and, notwithstanding the Grand Lodge did, in the plenitudg of its mercy and brotherly love, suspend the en orcement of the abovementioned resolutions until the 25th day of December, 1837—

Therefore, be it Resolved by this Grand Lodge, That all subordinate Lodges which shall have been delinquent for two years, and which shall, on application, fail to settle with the Special Grand Lecturer, to be appointed, shall be required by him, in the uame of the Grand Lodge, to surrender their charters, jewels and property.

That they have examined returns from the Grand Lodges of New-York, New Hampshire, Connectcut, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Missouri, Maryland, Kentucky, Ohio, Georgia and Virginia; and respectfully beg leave to state that they have found nothing claiming the special attention of this Grand Lodge. They are gratified to state that in those States the Institution steadily maintains its character of firmness, truth, and bretherly love. The committee recommend a continuance of brotherly interchange of communications.

The Committee to whom was referred the examination of the Grand Treasurer's accounts, beg leave to remark, that from the papers exhibited to them, they are impressed with a belief that a Report could not be made satisfactory to the Grand Lodge, and therefore beg to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject; which Report having been submitted by Bro William Thos. Bain, the Grand Lodge accepted the same, and discharged said Committee from the further consideration of the subject, agreeably to their prayer — Wherupon, it was

Resolved, That Brothers John J Christophers, William T. Bain, and David W. Stone be appointed a Committee further to investigate the accounts of the late Grand Treasurer, and that they be authorised to adopt such measures for collecting the true balance that may be ascertained to be due from Bro. Green W. Ligon, deceased, the late Grand Treasurer of this Grand Lodge, as they may deem expedient and advisable, and said Committee have till the next Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge to report.

On motion, it was

Resolved further, That the Grand Secretary be entitled to retain, out of the monies received for each and every Dispensation or Charter hereafter granted by this Grand Lodge, or the Grand Master, one dollar, as his fee for filling up and making out the form; and that he pay the balance over to the Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge.

Be it further Resolved, That the price of Diploma granted by this Grand Lodge, or the Grand Officers thereof, shall be five dollars; and that the same shall accrue to, and be a part of the perquisites of the Grand Secretary.

Resolved further, That the Grand Secretary have dispensations, Charters, and Diplomas printed from time to time, as they may be needed, and that the cost of the same be paid out of the funds of the Grand Lodge.

On motion of Bro. John G. Marshall, it was

Resolved, That Columbus Lodge, No 102, Pittsborough, which has been working for but six months under a Dispensation, shall only pay five dollars due to the Grand Lodge for the present year.

The Petition and Memorial of sundry Master Masons of Washington, N. C. to the Grand Lodge, praying for a Dispensation to open a Lodge in said Town, were read and accepted, and a Dispensation granted them for that purpose.

The returns of Eagle Lodge, No. 71. Hillsborough, were not received until after the adjournment of the Grand Lodge, but it will be noticed under the head of "Returns of Subordinate Lodges," &c.

The following Resolution was then submitted by Bro. John G. Marshall:

WHEREAS, it has pleased the Supreme Architect of the Universe, in his inscrutable providence, to call from among us our Brother GREEN W. LIGON, late Grand Treasurer of this Gran | Lodge---
