## Fruit Prospects.

The fruit buds of deciduous fruits both North and South endured the winter well, and reports from all parts of the country, $u p$ to date, indicate the most abundant crop for many years. The good condition is universal, except a partial damage to the Apricot crop, by frost, in Southern Califormia. The lateness of the season South retarded the swelling of the fruit buds much beyond the usual time, in consequence, the promises of a good crop there is unusally bright.

Mr. Samuel W. Hoover, president of the Hoover \& Gaines Co., of Dayton, Uhio died March 10th. We yielded to him our highest respect and we join with his friends and business associates in mutnal sympathy.

A summer school of forestry continuing from the 8th of July until the 10th of Augnst. is to be held under the auspices of the American Association for
the Advancement of Education. at Avalon, N. J.. fifteen miles north of Cape May, on the coast.

## Government Publications.

The fouth number of the current volume of the Experiment Station Record contains a review of the recent work in agricultural science throughout the world, with a report of the eighth annual convention of the association of American agricultural colleges and experiment stations, and timely editorials. The division of botany has issued Bulleton 16 on the commercial history, protection and cultivation of American ginseng. The weather bureau has compiled the rainfall and snow of the U S to 1891 ; and issued a storm bulletin on the blizzard of 1895 , together with the usual monthly weather crop bulletin, weekly snow charts, semi-daily weather maps, and wreck and casualty chart of the great lakes. Bulletin 13 is a report of the third annual meeting of the American association of state weather service co-operating with the national weather bureau. Farmers ${ }^{\circ}$ Bulletin 22 explains the scientific feeding of farm animals, while bulletin 25 describes the culture and uses of the peanut. Among the reprints of this useful series of bulletins is a revised edition of Directions for the preparation and use of importantinsecticides (B 19) ; Instructions for cultivating and curing tobacco ( $\mathrm{B}_{6}$ ) ; Some destructive potato diseases what they are and how to prevent them (B 15) ; Fertilizers for cotton (B 14); A compilation of analyses of American feeding stuffs (B11) ; and Sorghmm experiments (B37). Library Bulletin 5 has been issued to give notice of the accessions to the national agricultural library. The proceedings of the Virginia good roads convention are given in Bulletin 11 of the office of road inquiry. Statistical Report 123 contains a report on farm animals; the cotton crop; live stock in Great Britain and Ireland; cotton crop of India for 1894; a French congress on popular credit; the Australian wheat crop of Victoria; transportation rates and notes on foreign agriculture. For any of these valuable publications. address the secretary of agriculture at Washington.-American Agricalturalist.

## JAPANESE PLUMS.

## Deser:ption of Varietics in the Order of Ripening.

We give on this page descriptions of the most complete aseortment of Japan plums, in the order of their ripening-Some of our box lots contain a very full assortment, and this is a good opportunity to securc a desirable assortment. Our nomenclature can be depended upon.

Yusobe-Size of Wild Goose, round with a little point, dark purple, yellow flesh, quality good. Ripens with Early Richmond cherry. Later in blooming than other Japan sorts. Very hardy.

Berger-Fruit small, globular, bright uniform red, yellow tlesh, very small stone. Free. ''oo small for market, but desirable for the home garden.

Strawberry-Small, round - oblate, red-purple, with firm yellow flesh; cling; very early; moderately productive. Ripe with the last of the strawberries.

Willard-Medium size, round, not pointed; color dark clear red, with minute yellow dots; yellow fleshed, sweet and of fair quality. The earliest profitable market plum yet tested. The tree is very distinct and hardy, and matures its foliage earlier than any other Japanese variety, which is quite an important feature with this race of plums.

Red Nagate (Red June)-Medium size, pointed; color deep red-purple, flesh yellow, quality good; cling. A good market variety.

OGON-Medium size, round; color golden yellow; freestone. Moderately productive.

Kerr (Hattankin No. 2)-Large, usually pointed, color orange-yellow, with creany bloom; flesh yellow, juicy, subacid; quality good; cling. Very prolific and a profitable early market fruit.

Berckmans (True Sweet Botan, Sweet Botan, White-Fleshed Botan)-Medium to large, broadly and obtusely conical; deep blood red if ripened in the sun; flesh very sweet, excellent in quality; cling or semi-cling. Ripens with Abuudance, or just ahead of it. One of the best.

Abundance (Yellow-Fleshed Botan, Botan)-Large, ranging from nearly round to distinctly sharp pointed; color blush red with a darker cheek, on yellow ground; flesh yellow, juicy and sweet, quality good; cling. A strong-growing, upright, hardy tree, with numerous well distributed branches, very distinct. This is the most popular of all the Japanese plums. Very prolific and valuable as a market sort.

Maru-Medium size, round and somewhat flattened; color orange red; flesh yellow, of fair quality; free or nearly so. Hardy in bud. Showy.

NOMMAND-Large, obtusely conical; color clear golden yellow; flesh yellow, of high quality; free. Pit small. Very prolitic and one of the most desirable varieties.

Yellow Japan-Large, oblong-conical, pink red in color, with many yery fine gold dots; flesh yellow and juicy, good quality; cling. Very productive and one of the most valuable.

Снавот-Large, light and bright red on yellow ground, tlesh yellow and of good quality; cling. A tall growing tree with few branches at one year old.

Satsuma (Blood)-Large, broadly conical with a blunt sharp point; suture very deep; color very dark dull red all over; flesh blood red, rather coarse and acid, fair quality; cling. Pit small.

BURBANK-Large, roundish conical in form, the point generally blunt; color cherry red on mottled yellow ground, flesh yellow, rich and sugary; cling. Larger and better quality than Abundance, and rather handsomer in its varied markings, and three or four weeks later. Exceedingly productive. Next in popularity to Abundance.
Bailey-Large, nearly ronnd, color light and bright eherry-red on rich orange ground: flesh yellow, of excellent quality; cling. Rounder and larger than Burbank. A valuable sort.
Kelsey-Very large and long pointed, tapering gradually from a leart-shapep base, usually somewhat lopsided, with a deep furrow-like suture ; color reddish purple on yellow ground; flesh yellow, rich and pleasant in flavor; pit very small, free or only slightly clinging. The tree is tender if planted far north. It is more particular as to locality than any of the other Japanese varieties; but where it succeeds well it is the most magnificent plum in size and appearance in existence.

In different seasons and in some localities, the order of ripening given in this list may vary more or less. The first four varieties are all exceedingly early. and differ very little in their season of ripening.
