

In 2016, I used the first three of the mentioned strategies with 40 Wikipedia language editions (the first 30 in number of articles and 10 to increase diversity).

#### CCC articles are about a quarter of each Wikipedia language edition.

In 2018, I calculated the percentages for Asian and Pacific languages: These are some of the latest (approximate) results for few languages:

Māori (13%), Fiji Hindi (15%), Vietnamese (16%), Thai (18%), Malayam (20%), Nepali (19%), Nepal Bhasa (19%), Tagalog (25%), Korean (32%), Japanese (40%).

60% of this content is not shared across languages. I am creating a cartography to see the shared content: the culture gap.

The project aims at proposing strategic content across languages to fill this gap.
