

Part II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Air Control Group 18 continued to operate air control, anti-air war fare and air support facilities in support of the First Marine Aircraft Wing.

On 18 April 1971, Headquarters, Marine Air Control Group 18 arrived at MCAS Iwakuni, Japan from the Republic of Vietnam aboard the USS Washtenaw. County (LST 1166). On 19 April 1971, Marine Air Control Group 18 became a functional group at Iwakuni.

During the period 23 April 1971-3 May 1971 the Inspector General of the Marine Corps conducted the IG inspection of Marine Air Control Group 18 and subordinate units.

On 21 May 1971, upon receipt of MCO 5440.19 the Group commenced planning in preparation for the group reorganization which would be executed on 1 July 1971. Involved is some intermal organization adjustments plus the joining of the Marine Wing Communications Squadron.

On 24 May 1971, MACG-18 sent three officers to Misawa AFB to participate in ASWEX 3-71. They were tasked with establishing a tactical air control element in support of ASW forces in the Sea of Japan. On 2 June 1971 the three officers returned to this command after a satisfactory exercise with the Japanese Air Self Defense Forces. (Refer to Annex B, page 3).

On 15 June 1971 Marine Air Control Squadron 8 was redesignated as Marine Air Control Squadron 4. On this same date the MACS-8 colors were retired along with a change in Commanding Officer.

During the entire period covered extensive message traffic culminating in a visit to COMNAVFORJAPAN by members of the Group was conducted in an effort to obtain a site for relocating MACS-4. A physical survey of the sites available is being planned and will be conducted during July.

Additionally, during the period from April through 30 June 1971 extensive use has been made of training controllers from the Marine Air Control Squadron aboard CVA's in the Gulf of Tonkin.

Part III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. 18 April - Headquaters Marine Air Control Group 18 arrived at MCAS, Iwakuni aboard the U.S.S. Washtenaw County from the Republic of Vietnam. - Marine Air Control Group 18 became a fully functional 19 April group aboard the air station. - Marine Air Control Group 18 was inspected by repre-23 April sentatives of the Inspector General of the Marine Corps. 3 May - TACC activated at 1st MAW Headquarters by MACG-18. 18 May 28 May - Change of command ceremony as LtCol. DELANEY releaved Col C. T. WESTCOTT as Commanding Officer, MACG-18. (Annex F) - Representatives from MACG-18 met with representatives 16 June of COMNAVFORJAPAN to discuss the site search for relocation of MACS-4 from Okinawa to the Iwakuni local flying area (Annex E). - A cost reduction savings of \$441,190.93 was submitted 30 June by the group. This involved redistributing excess equipment held by H&HS-18.




