To expedite the work of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

FACTS BEARING ON THE PROBLEM

The work of the Joint Chiefs of Staff is being retarded by the current practice of supporting committees of holding papers requiring action until the next fixed weekly meeting. Delays incident to this practice may occur several times during the processing of a single paper.

These delays are prolonged when a supporting committee refers a paper received from the Joint Chiefs of Staff to some other supporting committee.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the practice of supporting committees of the Joint Chiefs of Staff meeting only on a specified day each week be discontinued.

That the chairman of each supporting committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff call meetings of his committee as often as the number and nature of the papers awaiting action requires.

That when a committee considers that a paper should be more appropriately handled by another supporting committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff it should return the paper to the Secretary of the Joint Chiefs of Staff with a notation to that effect.

That when a committee desires information from another committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff it will obtain the specific information by informal request to the other committee and not by referring the entire paper to it.

GENERAL POLICIES GOVERNING
JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF ORGANIZATION

Following are policies of general nature which the Joint Chiefs of Staff wish their supporting agencies to follow:

1. Non-partisanship

Officers on duty with the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization are drawn from the several services to assist in integrating the capabilities, functions, and needs of their particular service to the problems presented this organization. Their effort should be to reach sound solutions to all problems presented by the most effective employment of the joint means at hand. As Staff Officers of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, it is their duty to reach decisions which will best prosecute the war after due consideration has been given to the views of the agencies of the War and Navy Departments interested in the matters under consideration.

2. Committee members not to be instructed

Committees are required to make solutions of the problems presented after full consideration of all pertinent factors. They should approach all problems with open minds and without firm preconceived decisions based on consideration of partial information only. Deliberations and not negotiations are required. Deliberations cannot ensue if committee members are hampered by instructions or the answers to problems from which they are not permitted to depart.

3. Speed and brevity

Every effort will be made to expedite the work of the Joint Chiefs of Staff organization. To this end subcommittees will be set up promptly to consider views without waiting for a formal meeting of the parent committee. If after a full consideration

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of all data pertinent to a particular problem the members of a committee cannot agree, they will submit an immediate report indicating their divergent views. Reports of committees will be limited to two typewritten pages, double space, with discussion and other supporting data attached as enclosures, appendices, and annexes.

4. Relations with British members of Combined Committees

Problems of combined interest must be approached and solved in accordance with the above policies. The governing consideration should be the successful prosecution of the war.

CHARTER

JOINT DEPUTY CHIEFS OF STAFF

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff (J.D.C.S.) are hereby established as an executive agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff will consist of:

a. The Deputy Chief of Staff, U. S. Army.

b. ~~The Vice Chief of Naval Operations.~~ *In Corrigendum*

FUNCTIONS

3. The Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff shall:

a. Interpret and implement the known policies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

b. Act on matters requiring decision that are referred to them by the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

PROCEDURE

4. The deliberations of the Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff may be accomplished formally at regular meetings, or members may communicate their respective decisions by informal notification to the Secretary of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

5. In taking final action on any matter referred to them, members of the ^{Staff Committee} (Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff) must be in unanimous agreement in their decision, both as to the decision which is made and also that further review of such decision by the ^{Board} Joint Chiefs of Staff is unnecessary. If either of these conditions does not obtain, the matter in question shall be referred to the ^{Board} Joint Chiefs of Staff, through their Secretariat, with appropriate recommendations.

RESTRICTEDENCLOSURECHARTERJOINT STRATEGIC SURVEY COMMITTEEORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Strategic Survey Committee (J.S.S.C.) is hereby established as the agency in the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization charged with advising the Joint Chiefs of Staff on matters of grand and Military strategy.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Strategic Survey Committee will consist of:

a. Two General officers of the Army, one of whom will be from the Army Air Forces.

b. Not more than two flag officers of the Navy.

3. The members of the Joint Strategic Survey Committee will not be regularly assigned to other duties.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Joint Strategic Survey Committee shall:

a. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff in regard to strategy, and the relation of Military strategy to national policy.

b. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff in regard to combined Military strategy in the light of the developing and predictable situation, and in the light of long-range possibilities.

c. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the strategic possibilities to be considered when current plans have either been executed or become impracticable.

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5. The Joint Strategic Survey Committee shall:
 - a. Establish its own method of procedure.
 - b. Present its conclusions to the Joint Chiefs of Staff as written memoranda, or orally if so requested.

6. The Joint Strategic Survey Committee is authorized to request all agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization and of the War and Navy Departments for such information, studies, or estimates as it may require in connection with its duties.

7. The members of the Joint Strategic Survey Committee are authorized to attend such meetings of the Joint and Combined Staff Planners and of the Joint and Combined Chiefs of Staff as they may desire.

RESTRICTEDE N C L O S U R ECHARTERJOINT STAFF PLANNERSORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Staff Planners (J.P.S.) are hereby established as the agency in the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization charged with the preparation of joint war plans.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Staff Planners will consist of:

a. Two general officers of the Army, one of whom will be from the Army Air Forces.

b. Not more than two officers of the Navy.

3. Whenever a member of the Joint Staff Planners is unable to attend a meeting of the Joint Staff Planners or the Combined Staff Planners, he will appoint a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Joint Staff Planners shall:

a. Be responsible for the preparation of studies relating to the combined employment of military forces of the United Nations in the prosecution of the war, and make recommendations to the Joint Chiefs of Staff in regard to such combined employment.

b. Be responsible for the timely preparation of war plans required for the joint employment of the Army and Navy in the prosecution of the war, and submit such war plans to the Joint Chiefs of Staff for their action.

c. Review all major projects and plans for psychological warfare, and for foreign propaganda in areas of actual or

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projected Military operations, and make recommendations to the Joint Chiefs of Staff in regard to final approval.

d. Review security measures submitted to the Joint Chiefs of Staff by Joint Security Control.

e. Review for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and advise them in regard to action to be taken on recommendations of other agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization when such recommendations concern joint war plans or joint operations.

f. Furnish strategic guidance and information concerning joint war plans to, and act in coordination with, the Joint Administrative Committee. Representatives of the Joint Administrative Committee may be invited to attend the meetings of the Joint Staff Planners.

g. Furnish strategic guidance and information concerning joint war plans to agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization and to agencies of the War and Navy Departments whose participation is required in the preparation of studies and war plans or the execution of war plans.

h. Represent the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the Combined Staff Planners for matters under their jurisdiction.

PROCEDURE

5. The Joint Staff Planners shall:

a. Establish their own method of procedure.

b. Issue directives to the planning teams of the Joint War Plans Committee prescribing the studies and war plans to be prepared, and setting forth the factors controlling the scope of each study or war plan.

c. Meet with the planning teams of the Joint War Plans Committee at frequent intervals for the purpose of discussing, giving advice, and rendering decisions relative to the studies or war plans under preparation.

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d. Review all studies and war plans prepared by the planning teams of the Joint War Plans Committee and, when appropriate, submit them to the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

e. Employ the services of the Joint Intelligence Committee in connection with the preparation of studies and war plans, and in estimating the capabilities of the enemy.

6. Since complete agreement on all matters can not be expected, the Joint Staff Planners, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

7. The Joint Staff Planners are authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with their duties.

CHARTER

JOINT LOGISTICS COMMITTEE

DUTIES

1. The Joint Logistics Committee (J.L.C.) is hereby established as the primary logistics advisory and planning agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, replacing the Joint Administrative Committee whose charter is hereby cancelled. In addition, it will consider matters under the jurisdiction of the Joint Chiefs of Staff not assigned to other agencies thereof.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Logistics Committee will consist of:
- a. Three general officers of the Army, of whom one will be from the Army Air Forces.
 - b. Three officers of the Navy.

NOTE: Officials from the Maritime Commission will be invited to attend the meetings of the Committee, when considering matters affecting that agency.

3. Whenever a member of the Joint Logistics Committee is unable to attend a meeting of the Joint Logistics Committee or the Combined Administrative Committee, he will be represented by a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Joint Logistics Committee shall:
- a. Study and make recommendations to the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the appropriate agencies thereof in accordance with its duties as set forth in paragraph 1.

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b. Advise the Joint Staff Planners in the consideration and preparation of joint war plans as to the logistic aspects of such plans in order that the Joint Staff Planners may insure the integration of logistics with strategy in the preparation of joint war plans.

c. Prepare logistic plans for implementing the war plans prepared by the Joint Staff Planners.

d. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff Planners concerning the logistics implications of proposed U.S. commitments relating to joint and combined operations.

e. Furnish logistics advice and information to other agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and to agencies of the War and Navy Departments and other governmental agencies whose participation is required in the preparation of studies and plans or the execution of plans.

f. Represent the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the Combined Administrative Committee.

PROCEDURE

5. The Joint Logistics Committee shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Form subcommittees from personnel of the Army and Navy, as required, to assist in the performance of its duties. Representatives of the Maritime Commission will be requested to join such Committees when appropriate.

c. Consult and inform the Joint Staff Planners, formally or informally, in order to insure that matters under its cognizance are handled in accordance with approved joint war plans and decisions as to joint operations. Representatives of the Joint Staff Planners may be invited to attend meetings of the Joint Logistics Committee.

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6. Since complete agreement on all matters cannot be expected, the Joint Logistics Committee, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

7. The Joint Logistics Committee is authorized to request all service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties and, reciprocally, will furnish information and assistance as appropriate to such agencies.

RESTRICTEDE N C L O S U R ECHARTERJOINT WAR PLANS COMMITTEEORGANIZATION

1. The Joint War Plans Committee (J.W.P.C.) is hereby established by the Joint Chiefs of Staff as a working committee of the Joint Staff Planners.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint War Plans Committee will consist of designated members of the planning sections of:

a. The Chief, Strategy and Policy Group, Operations Division, War Department General Staff.

b. The Assistant Chief of the Air Staff, Plans, U. S. Army Air Forces.

c. The Assistant Chief of Staff (Plans), Headquarters, Commander in Chief, U. S. Fleet.

d. Vice Chief of Naval Operations.

3. From the personnel of the Joint War Plans Committee there will be organized:

a. A planning team consisting of four officers of the Army, including two officers of the Army Air Forces, and four officers of the Navy, including an officer of the Marine Corps. This group will be permanently quartered together. The Joint Staff Planners may alter the number of members of this group if the requirements of war planning make such action desirable. Members of the group shall be assigned no other duty within their respective service, nor shall they be required to serve as members of other agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization, nor on subcommittees not appointed by the Joint Staff Planners.

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- b. Other joint planning teams, as required.

FUNCTIONS

4. The planning teams of the Joint War Plans Committee shall:

a. Prepare war plans, studies, and estimates as directed by the Joint Staff Planners.

b. Submit completed war plans, studies, and estimates to the Joint Staff Planners.

PROCEDURE

5. The planning teams of the Joint War Plans Committee shall:

a. Establish their own method of procedure.

b. Enter upon all deliberations with instructions from no source other than the Joint Staff Planners jointly. In their deliberations they will present their individual views regardless of rank or service, and will endeavor to reach composite solutions.

c. Meet with the Joint Staff Planners at frequent intervals for the purpose of presenting their views, seeking advice, and requesting decisions from the Joint Staff Planners relating to war plans or studies under preparation.

d. Employ the services of the Joint Intelligence Committee in connection with the preparation of war plans and studies, and in estimating the capabilities of the enemy.

6. The Joint War Plans Committee is authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties.

1. The Joint Intelligence Committee (J.I.C.) is hereby established as the intelligence agency in the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Intelligence Committee will consist of:

- a. The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff.
- b. The Director of Naval Intelligence.
- c. The Assistant Chief of the Air Staff, Intelligence, U.S. Army Air Forces.
- d. A representative of the Secretary of State.
- e. A representative of the Chairman, Board of Economic Warfare.
- f. A representative of the Director of Strategic Services.

3. The senior Army or Navy member will be the chairman of the Joint Intelligence Committee.

4. Whenever a member of the Joint Intelligence Committee is unable to attend a meeting, he will appoint a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

5. The Joint Intelligence Committee shall:

- a. Furnish intelligence for the use of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.
- b. Make written reports or oral presentations as requested.

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c. Publish intelligence summaries as directed by the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

6. The members of the Joint Intelligence Committee shall serve as United States members of the Combined Intelligence Committee.

PROCEDURE

7. The Joint Intelligence Committee shall:

a. Establish its own methods of procedure.

b. Maintain close liaison with the Joint Staff Planners and the Joint War Plans Committee in order to make readily available its services in connection with the preparation of studies and war plans.

8. The Joint Intelligence Committee will be assisted by a permanent joint intelligence staff consisting of members detailed from the respective organizations of the members of the Joint Intelligence Committee, functioning as a committee under the chairmanship of the senior Army or Navy member.

9. Since complete agreement on all matters can not be expected, the Joint Intelligence Committee, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

10. The Joint Intelligence Committee is authorized to establish, with the cooperation of interested departments of the government, subcommittees of experts on subjects of continuing special interest.

11. The Joint Intelligence Committee is authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties.

JOINT MILITARY TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Military Transportation Committee (J.M.T.C.) is hereby established as the agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff charged with performing for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and for appropriate agencies thereof duties relating to military overseas transportation.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Military Transportation Committee will consist of:

a. Two general officers of the Army.

b. Two officers of the Navy.

A representative of the War Shipping Administration will be invited to attend meetings of the Committee as an associate member.

3. Whenever a member of the Joint Military Transportation Committee is unable to attend a meeting, he will appoint a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Joint Military Transportation Committee shall:

a. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff with regard to administrative and operational matters concerning military overseas transportation.

b. Furnish information and advice concerning military overseas transportation, to the Joint Logistics Committee, as may be necessary to assist that Committee to perform its functions of overall logistic planning.

RESTRICTED

c. Coordinate the overseas transportation facilities of the Army and Navy with those of the War Shipping Administration and the United Nations for the movement overseas of personnel and war materials.

d. Keep the War Shipping Administration informed of the requirements for military overseas transportation, based on approved overall logistic plans.

e. Apportion the shipping allocated by the War Shipping Administration to meet requirements of the Army and Navy in accordance with existing priorities.

5. The members of the Joint Military Transportation Committee shall serve as the United States members of the Combined Military Transportation Committee.

PROCEDURE

6. The Joint Military Transportation Committee shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Implement its agreed decisions except on matters of major policy.

c. Form subcommittees from personnel of the Army and Navy, as required, to assist it in the performance of its duties.

d. Seek guidance on strategic plans from the Joint Staff Planners and on overall logistic plans from the Joint Logistics Committee.

7. The Joint Military Transportation Committee, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

8. The Joint Military Transportation Committee is authorized to request all Services and Governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties, and reciprocally will furnish information and assistance as appropriate to such agencies.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Committee on New Weapons and Equipment will consist of:

a. The Director, Office of Scientific Research and Development.

b. One general officer of the Army.

c. One flag officer of the Navy.

3. Whenever a member of the Joint Committee on New Weapons and Equipment is unable to attend a meeting, he will appoint a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Joint Committee on New Weapons and Equipment shall:

a. Coordinate the work of Service agencies with other governmental agencies concerned with research and development of new weapons and equipment.

b. Determine, through consideration of strategic plans, where emphasis in research should be placed.

c. Advise appropriate non-military research agencies of the requirements of the armed services for new weapons and equipment, and assist them in adapting new scientific projects to the requirements of the armed services.

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d. Advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff and appropriate agencies in the Army and Navy of progress being made in the development of new weapons and equipment, and recommend appropriate action in connection therewith.

e. Maintain liaison with agencies of other United Nations engaged in the development of new weapons and equipment.

PROCEDURE

5. The Joint Committee on New Weapons and Equipment shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Encourage direct dealing among the various research agencies and the heads of the divisions concerned with research or development of the Army Air Forces, the Ground Forces, and the Services of Supply, and the corresponding naval services.

ORGANIZATION

1. The U. S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, (U.S. M.B.W.) are hereby established as the agency in the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization charged with the performance for the Joint Chiefs of Staff of duties relating to the assignment of munitions and the balancing of resources against stated requirements.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The U. S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, will consist of:

- a. Not more than four general officers of the Army, one of whom will be from the Army Air Forces.
- b. Not more than four officers of the Navy.

3. Whenever a member is unable to attend a meeting of the U. S. Representatives, or of the Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, he will appoint a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

FUNCTIONS

4. The U. S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, shall:

- a. Maintain full information of the entire munition requirements and resources of the United States.
- b. Periodically inform the Joint Chiefs of Staff in regard to the relation of production achievements and prospects to the munitions requirements of the armed forces of the United States and of other Allied or friendly nations, as ascertained through effective liaison with the supply authorities.
- c. Recommend to the Joint Chiefs of Staff measures necessary to keep the planned requirements programs in line with

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strategic policy, the changing operational conditions in their effect on war materials, and the realities of production.

d. When directed by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, recommend assignments to the United States armed forces of finished munitions under the cognizance of the Army or the Navy.

e. Perform such other duties in relation to the assignment of munitions as the Joint Chiefs of Staff may direct.

f. Excepting one Army representative and one Navy representative, serve as United States members of the Munitions Assignments Board, Washington.

PROCEDURE

5. The U.S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, shall:

a. Establish their own method of procedure.

b. Seek strategic guidance from the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and operate in accordance therewith.

c. Implement their agreed decisions except upon matters of major policy.

d. Be assisted by the U.S. members of the Executive Staff of the Munitions Assignments Board.

e. Form subcommittees from personnel of the Army and Navy, as required, to assist them in the performance of their duties.

6. Since complete agreement on all matters cannot be expected, the U.S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

7. The U.S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, are authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with their duties.

CHARTER

ARMY-NAVY PETROLEUM BOARD

ORGANIZATION

1. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board (A.N.P.B.) is hereby established as the agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff charged with performing for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and for appropriate agencies thereof, duties relating to petroleum and petroleum products.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board shall consist of:

a. Two general officers of the Army, one of whom shall be from the Army Air Forces.

b. Not more than two officers of the Navy.

3. Each of the above members shall have a deputy who shall have plenary powers in the absence of his principal.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board shall:

a. Effect close cooperation between the War and Navy Departments on all matters pertaining to petroleum and petroleum products, maintaining close liaison with the Petroleum Administrator for War.

b. Be responsible for the preparation of full information on all matters pertaining to petroleum and petroleum products with which the War and Navy Departments are concerned.

c. Insure coordination, based on overall logistic plans, of procurement, overseas shipment, and storage of petroleum and petroleum products for the Army and Navy.

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d. In view of the short supply of certain petroleum products, the need to avoid competitive procurement, and the desire to vest procurement authority in the agency best equipped to exercise the authority:

(1) In accordance with overall logistic plans, determine the requirements of petroleum products for the Army and Navy and consolidate these requirements in accordance with appropriate specifications and points of delivery to whatever degree the Board may consider practicable.

(2) Determine, in collaboration with the Petroleum Administrator for War, the capacity of the petroleum industry to provide the established requirements.

(3) Determine upon and designate for each petroleum product the appropriate procuring agency or agencies for both services.

e. Assure the availability of petroleum products in the proper quantity and quality at designated points and at specified times as required by overall logistic plans. In the case of petroleum products originating in the United States, advise the Petroleum Administrator for War, as to the requirements of the Army and Navy of the United States and of the armed forces of its Allies.

f. Effect collaboration on petroleum matters with other United Nations as directed by the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

g. Furnish necessary information and advice to the Joint Logistics Committee to enable them to perform their functions of overall logistic planning.

5. The provisions of paragraphs d and e shall not be interpreted as displacing or affecting in any way the duties of the Aviation Petroleum Products Allocation Committee (A.P.P.A.C.), functioning under the Munitions Assignments Board.

RESTRICTED

6. Except as initiated by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Army-Navy Petroleum Board shall not supplant or interfere with the functions of any War or Navy Department agency as presently organized or of the U.S. Fleet, but the functioning of the Board should result in better coordination of the working of these several agencies and in more efficient services to the armed forces.

PROCEDURE

7. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board shall:

- a. Establish its own method of procedure.
- b. Implement its agreed decisions except upon matters of major policy.
- c. Establish an organization of officers detailed from the Army and Navy to carry out the functions prescribed. The Executive Officer will be an officer of the Navy.
- d. Seek guidance on strategical plans from the Joint Staff Planners and on overall logistic plans from the Joint Logistics Committee.

8. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board, if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

9. The Army-Navy Petroleum Board is authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties, and, reciprocally, will furnish information and assistance as appropriate, to such agencies.

- d. Additional secretaries to assist the Secretary and to serve supporting agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

3. Members of the Joint Secretariat will be officers of appropriate rank selected from the Army and the Navy. If more than one secretary is appointed to any one agency, each service should be represented.

FUNCTIONS

4. The Secretary shall:

- a. Make necessary preparations for and attend all meetings of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
- b. Record the minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Chiefs of Staff when meeting by themselves or with non-military agencies.
- c. Take such action as may be appropriate to implement decisions and policies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff or the Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff.
- d. Refer to appropriate agencies any matter which can be

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handled without reference to the Joint Chiefs of Staff or which requires study and recommendations prior to its consideration by the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

e. Follow up action taken in accordance with c. and d. above in order to assure that appropriate effectuating measures have been or are being taken, and maintain a record thereof.

f. Recommend to the Joint Chiefs of Staff any action, which, in his opinion, will improve the functioning of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.

g. Supervise the activities of the Joint Secretariat in order to coordinate the work of the agencies within the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.

h. Ensure that all papers presented for the consideration of the Joint Chiefs of Staff are as clear and concise as possible. If in his opinion any revision is necessary, the Secretary is authorized to change the form but not the substance of these papers. He will refer each revised report to the originating agency in order that it may be assured that there has been no change in substance.

i. Act in a liaison capacity between the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the various non-military governmental agencies.

j. Act in liaison capacity between the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Military Missions of other Nations.

k. Assign secretaries and provide such other officer, enlisted and clerical personnel as may be required for the proper functioning of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.

l. Provide for the reproduction and distribution of all official papers of the agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization, maintain a record thereof, and provide for their security.

m. Maintain the Combined Chiefs of Staff Building and provide for its security.

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n. Serve as the U. S. Secretary of the Combined Secretariat.

5. Members of the Joint Secretariat shall serve as members of the Combined Secretariat when the agencies to which they are assigned deal with combined matters.

PROCEDURE

6. The Secretary shall establish the procedure for the Joint Secretariat.

7. In the performance of his duties, the Secretary will be assisted, as he directs, by the Deputy Secretary, the Executive Secretary, the Supply Secretary, and such other officers as may be assigned.

8. The members of the Joint Secretariat will maintain close liaison with the Secretary and with each other in order to assist in the coordination of the work of the agencies within the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization.

DIRECTIVE

JOINT SECURITY CONTROL

Organization

1. The Joint Security Control (J.S.C.) is the agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization charged, in so far as is set forth hereafter, with:

a. Preventing information of military value from falling into the hands of the enemy.

b. Timing the implementation of those portions of cover and deception plans which must be performed by military and non-military agencies in the United States.

Membership

2. Joint Security Control will continue to be implemented by the Military Intelligence Service and A-2 of the War Department and the Office of Naval Intelligence of the Navy Department.

Functions

3. Joint Security Control shall:

a. With regard to the prevention of information of military value falling into the hands of the enemy:

(1) Recommend to appropriate officials the security measures to be carried out within the Joint Chiefs of Staff organization and the War and Navy Departments.

These will include measures to:

(a) Determine who shall be furnished information concerning specific places, dates, and plans for current and projected operations, and when information is to be given.

(b) Veto publicity which may jeopardize the success of current or projected operations or procedure incident thereto.

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(c) Control the reference to current or projected operations in correspondence by any available means of communication.

(d) Guard the secrecy of new weapons, inventions, projects and other military secrets directly or indirectly connected with military and naval materiel and operations.

b. With regard to timing the implementation of those portions of cover and deception plans which must be performed by military and non-military agencies in the United States:

(1) Inform military and non-military governmental agencies within the United States of missions assigned to them by the Joint Chiefs of Staff in carrying out portions of cover and deception plans prepared by the Joint Staff Planners or the commanders of the operation concerned.

(2) Follow up on the execution of the mission assigned in (1) above.

(3) Recommend to the Joint Staff Planners any action which it (Joint Security Control) believes would further the cover and deception desired for current or projected operations.

c. With regard to questions of security classification:

(1) Act for the Joint Chiefs of Staff in the settlement of such matters between the U.S. military services.

(2) Represent and act for the Joint Chiefs of Staff in settlement of such matters affecting other government agencies, utilizing the services of the Security Advisory Board as appropriate.

(3) Represent and act for the Joint Chiefs of Staff in the settlement of such matters between the United States military services and foreign government agencies.

S E C R E TProcedure

4. Joint Security Control shall:

a. With regard to the prevention of information of military value falling in the hands of the enemy:

(1) Make periodic incidental inspections to see that security measures which have been adopted by the Joint Chiefs of Staff organization and the War and Navy Departments are complied with.

(2) Report to appropriate officials violations of security regulations which have been adopted by the Joint Chiefs of Staff organization and the War and Navy Departments.

b. With regard to timing the implementation of those portions of cover and deception plans which must be performed by military and non-military agencies in the United States:

(1) Furnish such information to non-military war agencies such as the State Department, Office of War Information, Board of Economic Warfare, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Treasury Department, Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs, War Shipping Administration, as may be necessary for them to have in order to carry out missions assigned to them in the implementation of cover and deception plans.

(2) Carry out its functions by the issuance of directives to military agencies and by cooperation with non-military agencies.

(3) In utilizing any of the non-military agencies listed in (1) above, deal only with one or two persons on the highest level of the agency concerned. If assistance is to be sought from these agencies pertaining to cover and deception plans, these specially selected persons will be given only such information as is

necessary for them to have in order to carry out the mission assigned to them. They in turn will impart to subordinates only such information as may be necessary for them to carry out their instructions.

(4) Advise non-military agencies with regard to any project which they are contemplating which would interfere with current or projected military or naval operations.

(5) coordinate its activities, through the commanders in the field, with corresponding Security Control agencies of Allied nations involved in the military operations concerned.

(6) Obtain such strategic and tactical guidance from the Joint Staff Planners as is necessary to carry out its functions.

CHARTER

JOINT LOGISTICS PLANS COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Logistics Plans Committee (J.L.P.C.) is hereby established by the Joint Chiefs of Staff as a working committee of the Joint Logistics Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Logistics Plans Committee will consist of designated permanent and associate members of the logistics agencies of the War and Navy Departments.

3. There will be six permanent members, three from the Army and three from the Navy selected from:

- a. Operations Division, War Department General Staff.
- b. Army Service Forces.
- c. Army Air Forces.
- d. The Office of the Chief of Naval Operations.

4. The permanent members shall constitute a control group to direct, coordinate and supervise the work of the Committee. This will be their primary duty, and they will be provided with permanent office facilities.

5. Associate members will be designated by the Joint Logistics Committee from officers available in the War and Navy Departments. Their services shall be employed as required to assist the permanent members in the solution of problems on which they have special knowledge.

RESTRICTEDFUNCTIONS

6. The Joint Logistics Plans Committee shall:

a. Prepare plans, studies, and estimates as directed by the Joint Logistics Committee.

b. Prepare such additional plans, studies, and estimates, upon their own initiative, as they feel that the situation demands.

c. Submit completed plans, studies, and estimates to the Joint Logistics Committee.

d. Work in close liaison with the Joint War Plans Committee to the end that the resulting logistics plans will properly implement the war plans.

7. The Joint Logistics Plans Committee shall:

a. Establish its own procedure.

b. Enter upon all deliberations with instructions from no source other than the Joint Logistics Committee jointly, and be guided in its deliberations by the policies prescribed in J.C.S. 318/3, "General Policies for Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization."

c. Meet with the Joint Logistics Committee at frequent intervals, for the purpose of presenting their views, seeking advice, and requesting decisions from the Joint Logistics Committee, relating to plans or studies under preparation.

8. The Joint Logistics Plans Committee is authorized to request all service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties.

CHARTER

JOINT MUNITIONS ALLOCATION COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee is hereby established as the agency in the Joint Chiefs of Staff charged with performing for the Joint Chiefs of Staff duties relating to the allocation of finished munitions to the United States Forces in accordance with approved over-all logistic plans. This committee replaces the U.S. Representatives, Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, whose charter is hereby cancelled.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee will consist of:

a. Not more than four general officers of the Army, one of whom shall be from the Army Air Forces.

b. Not more than four officers of the Navy.

3. Three of the above officers from each service shall be members of the Munitions Assignments Board, Washington.

4. Whenever a member is unable to attend a meeting of the Committee, or of the Munitions Assignments Board, Washington, he will be represented by a deputy who shall have plenary powers.

5. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee shall:

a. Allocate finished munitions to United States forces in accordance with over-all logistic plans.

b. Maintain close liaison with the Joint Logistics Committee, in order that assignments and allocations of munitions to U.S. forces may be in harmony with approved logistic plans.

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c. When appropriate, inform the Joint Logistics Committee of proposed allocations.

d. Perform such other duties in relation to the allocation of munitions as the Joint Chiefs of Staff may direct.

e. Maintain information concerning munitions requirements and resources of the United States, as necessary for the effective functioning of the Committee.

6. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee, shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Confer, when desirable, upon matters of munitions assignments which may be presented to the Munitions Assignments Board, Washington.

c. Seek strategic guidance from the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and their appropriate agencies, and operate in accordance therewith.

d. Implement its agreed decisions except upon matters of major policy.

e. Be assisted by the U.S. members of the Executive Staff of the Munitions Assignments Board.

f. Form subcommittees from personnel of the Army and Navy, as required, to assist it in the performance of its duties.

7. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee if unable to reach agreement promptly, will submit to the Joint Chiefs of Staff a report indicating wherein the members disagree in order that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, thus informed, can take appropriate action.

8. The Joint Munitions Allocation Committee is authorized to request all Service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties and reciprocally will furnish information and assistance as appropriate, to such agencies.

CHARTER

JOINT PRODUCTION SURVEY COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Production Survey Committee (J.P.S.C.) is hereby established as the agency charged with advising the Joint Chiefs of Staff on matters pertaining to the balancing of production against requirements in accordance with the strategic situation.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Production Survey Committee will consist of not more than two officers of the Army, one of whom shall be from the Army Air Forces, and not more than two officers from the Navy. Representatives from the Office of War Mobilization may be requested to attend meetings of the Committee as associate members when matters of interest to the Office of War Mobilization are under consideration.

3. The members of the Joint Production Survey Committee will not be regularly assigned to other duties and shall be responsible both individually and collectively only to the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

4. The Joint Production Survey Committee shall:

a. Keep the production programs and reserve stocks of the military services, including International Aid, under constant survey and advise the Joint Chiefs of Staff:

(1) As to adjustments indicated in the light of the military situation.

(2) As to adjustments in requirements and stock levels indicated by the information contained in experience tables and other pertinent data.

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b. Maintain close liaison with the Office of War Mobilization in order to:

(1) Keep the Chiefs of Staff advised with regard to any problems pertaining to the military production programs which are raised by that Office.

(2) Cooperate with that office in the preparation of studies and the submission of recommendations which will result in economies in the over-all production program both as to the use of materiel and the utilization of manpower.

c. Use as a basis for their survey the approved troop bases and projected operations which have been approved by the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

5. The Joint Production Survey Committee shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Present its conclusions to the Joint Chiefs of Staff as written memoranda, or orally if so requested.

6. The Joint Production Survey Committee is authorized to request all agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and of the War and Navy Departments for such information, studies, or estimates as it may require in connection with its duties.

7. The members of the Joint Production Survey Committee are authorized to attend meetings of the Joint Chiefs of Staff or any of their supporting agencies.

CHARTER

JOINT POST-WAR COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Post-War Committee (J.P.W.C.) is hereby established as an agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff charged with consideration of certain post-war military problems of interest to the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

MEMBERSHIP

2. The Joint Post-War Committee will consist of:

a. Two officers of the Army, one of whom will be from the Army Air Forces.

b. Not more than two officers of the Navy.

c. In the absence of any member of the committee, he is authorized to designate a deputy to act for him, from the officers assigned to duty with the committee.

3. Officers for duty with the Joint Post-War Committee are authorized, in numbers to be determined from time to time by the Joint Chiefs of Staff. The Joint Post-War Committee may establish working teams as required from officers so assigned.

4. The members and officers assigned to duty with the Joint Post-War Committee will not be regularly assigned to other duties.

FUNCTIONS

5. a. The Joint Post-War Committee under general guidance of the Joint Strategic Survey Committee shall concern itself with post-war military matters of interest to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, except:

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(1) Problems of post-war internal organization of the military services which are assigned to the Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff.

(2) Problems pertaining to civil affairs which are assigned to the Joint Civil Affairs Committee.

b. For matters within its cognizance it shall:

(1) Be responsible for preparing studies and recommendations concerning post-war problems of national security, including disarmament, demobilization and demilitarization of enemy countries on its own initiative, or when these or any problems are referred to it by the Joint Chiefs of Staff or the Joint Strategic Survey Committee.

(2) Collaborate with representatives of the Department of State in matters pertaining to U.S. post-war military base requirements within the limits determined by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, these limits being subject, pursuant to Presidential directive, to the approval of the Secretary of War and the Secretary of the Navy in matters involving departmental policy.

(3) Recommend to the Joint Chiefs of Staff with respect to the military aspects of instructions to be issued to the United States representatives on inter-allied advisory commissions, control commissions or similar bodies.

PROCEDURE

6. The Joint Post-War Committee shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Present to the Joint Chiefs of Staff studies and recommendations which, when appropriate, will be first submitted to the Joint Strategic Survey Committee.

c. Maintain close liaison with other agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

RESTRICTED

7. If the Joint Post-War Committee is unable to reach prompt agreement within itself or with other agencies on matters of substance or of jurisdiction it will refer the matter to the Joint Strategic Survey Committee, for further reference, if necessary, to the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

8. The Joint Post-War Committee is authorized to request all service and governmental agencies and activities for information and assistance which may be required in connection with its duties, and reciprocally will furnish information and assistance as appropriate to such agencies.

2. The composition of the Special Subcommittee referred to in paragraph 2 a of the charter is indicated below:

a. one officer of the Army in the grade of colonel or higher,

b. two officers of the Navy in the grade of captain or higher, one to be a naval aviator, and

c. one officer of the Army Air Forces in the grade of colonel or higher.

CHARTER

JOINT POST-WAR COMMITTEE

ORGANIZATION

1. The Joint Post-War Committee (J.P.W.C.) is hereby established as an agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, superseding and including the functions of the Special Subcommittee of the Joint Staff Planners on sites for post-war military bases, which is hereby abolished.

MEMBERSHIP

2. a. The Joint Post-War Committee will be composed initially of the Special Subcommittee on sites for post-war military bases, plus two additional members, one each from the Army and the Navy.

b. The number of members will be changed as may be agreed upon from time to time by the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the basis of the work to be done and the availability of qualified officers.

c. The members of the Joint Post-War Committee will not be regularly assigned to other duties.

FUNCTIONS

3. In general the sphere of the Joint Post-War Committee will comprise post-war military problems of interest to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, except problems of post-war internal organization and civil affairs which are specifically assigned to the Joint Deputy Chiefs of Staff and the War Department Civil Affairs Division (and the Occupied Areas Section, Office of the Chief of Naval Operations), respectively. The Joint Post-War Committee will function under the over-all guidance of the Joint Strategic Survey Committee. Subject to these provisions, the Committee will:

RESTRICTED

a. Be responsible for preparing studies and recommendations concerning post-war military plans, problems and policies on their initiative or on reference to them by the Joint Chiefs of Staff or the Joint Strategic Survey Committee.

b. Assist and cooperate with agencies of the State and other Departments, as may be appropriate, in matters concerning post-war military problems of interest to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, including instructions to the United States representatives on European Advisory Commission on military matters pertaining to Axis surrender terms.

4. Matters on which the members of the Joint Post-War Committee do not agree shall be referred to the Joint Strategic Survey Committee, before being presented to the Joint Chiefs of Staff or to representatives of the State or other Departments or agencies.

PROCEDURE

5. The Joint Post-War Committee shall:

a. Establish its own method of procedure.

b. Work in close liaison with the Joint Strategic Survey Committee and with the Joint Staff Planners.

c. Where appropriate, present its reports to the Joint Chiefs of Staff through the Joint Strategic Survey Committee.

6. The Joint Post-War Committee is authorized to request all agencies of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Organization and of the War and Navy Departments for such information, studies, or estimates as it may require in connection with its duties.
