Eight 500 lb bombs were dropped, in close support of Army troops, on a Jap concentration 300 yards W.W. of Tagbok, Mindanao. All bombs landed in the target area and caused the Japs to run out of their pill boxes which enabled the Army to pick them off easily. Moderate, accurate small arms fire was recleved from two 12.7 positions in the target area. These positions were believed knocked out by strafing
