LIVESTOCK BILL BEFORE COMMONS

Ottawa, April 26.—A bill to amend and consolidate acts respecting livestock was considered in the House yesterday afternoon and will be taken up again later.

Among other things, the bill provides that a commission man selling livestock must deposit any money received for the same to a separate account and not disburse the money except in accordance with regulations made by the exchange and approved by the Minister.

Robert Forke, Progressive leader, thought this regulation very necessary. Recently, he said, a Winnipeg firm which had been regarded as reliable had failed and a number of farmers had lost the purchase price for some carloads of stock.

Hon. S. F. Timmie moved an amendment which he said was designed to appear as a clause at the end of the bill, providing that in "every case where, in the opinion of a veterinary inspector duly appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Animals Contagious Diseases Act, a contagious disease of animals exists or is expected to exist, the Animals Contagious Disease Act shall prevail as against this act or all or any other acts relating to livestock or livestock yards."

Hon. W. R. Motherwell, Minister of Agriculture, said he would leave the bill in committee and consider the amendment.

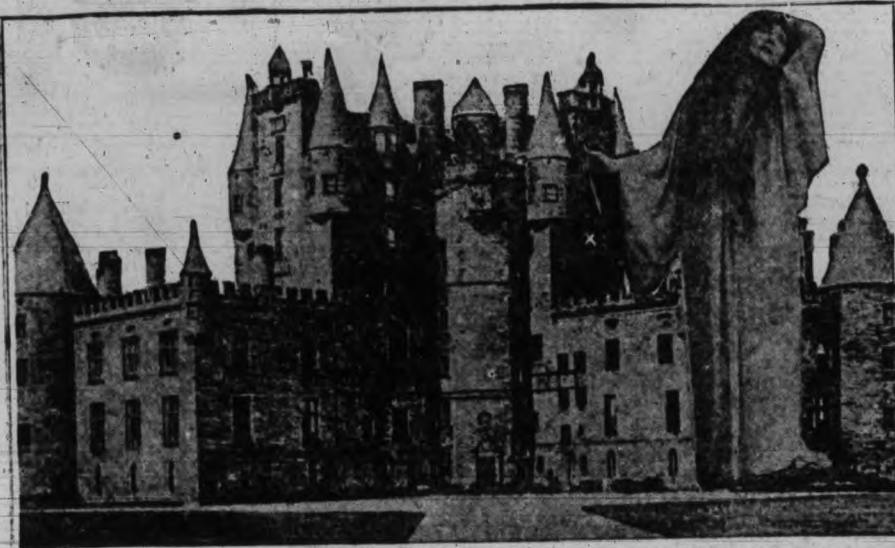

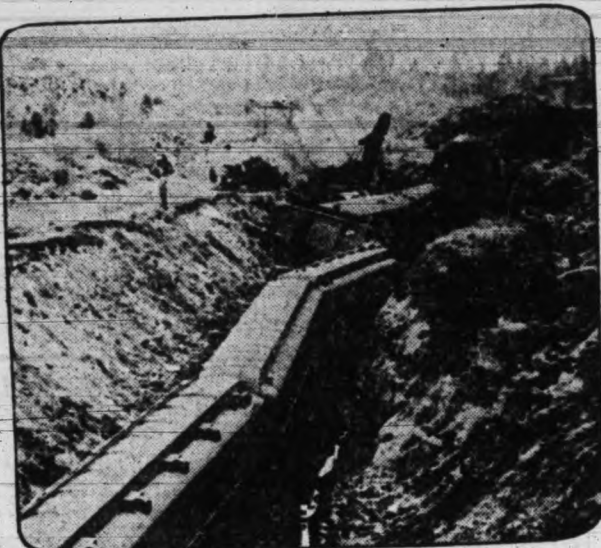
