yesterday, and I communicated
to him the wish of the Ex-
Com. that he should speak
at our Tuesday morning meet-

impossible. His plans for the
future are not yet settled, and
he is apprehensive that he
may be under the necessity
of accompanying his invalid
son to a Water-cure, or some
other place, for treatment, at
the very time of our meeting.
I think you would do well to
write him at Perth Amboy,
entreating ^{him} if possible, to make

his arrangements in such a way
as not to interfere with our
meeting. It seems to me very
important that he should
speak for us.
