COURSE OF STUDY FOR THOSE HAVING THE MINISTRY IN VIEW

Reading, writing, arithmetic, United States history, general history, geography, and Scripture geography, theology, systematic theology (Mullins), The Church (Harvey), Deaconship (Howell), Church Discipline (Hiscox), Homiletics (Broadus), History of the

Baptist Denomination.

: -:

The course of study was adopted unanimously by the Association, and the churches are requested to license no person who cannot pass a creditable examination on reading, writing, the fundamental principles of arithmetic, grammar and geography, and to ordain no person who has not been before the Board of Examiners and recommended by them for ordination.

CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as the "Wake Baptist Association."

Article II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's kingdom among men, and the means accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

Article III. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen by the churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and the one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association ex officio, and ministers who are not in charge or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association, who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by payment of \$1.00 annually. Provided ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist denomination; also any layman in good standing in the Baptist church may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

Article IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment, giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

Article V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed by such officers. In addition, there shall be appointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board, which latter shall have charge of the

work of the Association during the interim of its annual session and three members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum, and the officers of the body shall be ex officio members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the Executive Board and the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the Executive Board of the Association.

Article VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote if a tie.

Article VII. It shall be the duty of the clerk to report the proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

Article VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the churches or collected during the session of this body, and distribute the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it is signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association, subject to the provisions of the By-Laws.

Article IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at an annual session of the Association through delegates appointed for that purpose, and if the Association shall consent to receive her the Moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship.

Article X. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any church that does not preserve Gospel order.

Article XI. This Association may invite visiting brethren to seats and extend to them all privileges of the body save that of voting. The Association shall meet on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August at such place as the Association may select.

Article XII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year in such places as the brethren shall designate.

Article XIII. We will receive no ministers into this Association but those who have a good moral character.

Article XIV. Any Baptist Sunday School or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member of this

Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

Article XV. We will withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the Gospel rule.

Article XVI. Each church connected with this Association can continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

Article XVII. By appointment of the Association there shall be preached during each session an introductory sermon.

Article XVIII. There shall be a Woman's Auxiliary to the Wake Baptist Association, both Junior and Senior Departments.

Article XIX. The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The officers of the Auxiliary shall be a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer for each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for same.

Section 4. All the reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

Article XX. This constitution may be amended at any annual session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

BY-LAWS

- Section 1. Schools, societies and individuals shall be acknowledged in the Minutes of the Association.
- Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.
- Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.
- Section 4. After the expenses of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Association funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.
- Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports to the Association.
- Section 6. The duties of the Boards provided for in the Constitution shall be such as arc usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

PROCEEDINGS

The Seventy-Second Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association convened with the Malaby's Cross Roads Baptist Church, near Knightdale, North Carolina, Wednesday and Thursday, August 17-18, 1938, with Rev. Geo. S. Stokes, acting Moderator, presiding.

Devotional exercises, conducted by Revs. T. B. Smith and W. H. Rogers, began at 10:00 A. M., with the singing of song "Lift Him Up," reading a scripture lesson found in the 9th chapter of Luke, and prayer offered by Rev. Rogers.

Rev. R. Crockett, the church pastor, in fitting words, gave a mes-

sage of welcome to the large delegation on behalf of the church.

Mr. B. A. Wall, presented by Brother J. H. Faison, welcomed the delegation to Knightdale in words interestingly, especially as he spoke of the agreeable relationship between the white and colored people of the community and declared his efforts to get a better school for the colored people in Wake County.

Prof. C. F. Pope, principal of the high school, Burgaw, North Carolina, responded to the messages of welcome in a tasteful way.

The Committees on Hours of Meeting and Finance were named subsequent the singing of song "Saviour More Than Life to Mc." (Sec Comm.)

Echoes from the Field were then heard. The reports showed progress in kingdom development by the churches of the Association.

The committee on Hours of Meeting then submitted its report and recommended that the programed hours be accepted—adopted.

Rev. H. Y. Cheek, associated by Revs. C. L. Faison and N. A. Cheek, on the rostrum, with Brother Faison reading a part of Matthew, Chapter 12, Brother N. A. Cheek offering prayer, and the congregation singing, "Come Thy Fount of Every Blessing," preached the annual sermon.

Among other things, the man of God averred: "The early church was placed under the spell of the Holy Spirit," as he based his theme on "The Holy Spirit and His Work."

(2) "One can do God's Work only as he is directed by the Holy Spirit." And (3) "The gospel is that message which falls from the lips of Jesus Christ." The message was profound.

Prayer was offered by Rev. W. L. Wilson, pastor of the Fuquay

Springs Baptist Church.

An offering taken by Deacons I. R. Burton and S. H. High amounted to \$7.03.

As visitors, Rev. Phillips of the National Baptist Convention, Nashville, Tennessee, and Miss M. A. Burwell, of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Convention of North Carolina, were presented and made some helpful remarks.

"Blest Bc The Tic" was sung and Rcv. N. A. Cheek pronounced

the benediction.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The devotionals were conducted by Rev. McKinley Hawkins and Brother Nero Wilkins. Echoes from the delegates were also heard.

Subsequent the singing of song "I Am Thine O Lord," Vice-Moderator Rev. H. D. Eaton presented Acting Moderator Stokes to

give a message.

High tribute was paid the Pioneers of the Association, an urge to hold strong faith in Jesus Christ, bring souls to Christ and give liberally to His Cause were the high points in the Moderator's message. Upon some recommendations:

1. That all Christians exercise more faith in Jesus Christ.

2. That every church member be urged to attend Sunday School more often, and bring into the Sunday School all the people of the community.

3. Give unstinted support to Shaw University.

4. That all pastors and churches of the Association encourage and help the Woman's Auxiliary.

Motion prevailed that the message go into the hands of a com-

mittee.

Rev. W. C. Somerville, General Secretary of the State Baptist Convention of North Carolina, came forth and gave a message on the Unified Program of North Carolina Baptists. He placed emphasis on Evangelism, Leadership Training, Benevolence, Home and Foreign Missions. The message was comprehensive and far-reaching, especially in the words "That the General Baptist Convention seeks to bring the pastors and churches closer together rather than to destroy any interests of the Associations."

Following the singing of song "I Am Thine O Lord," the Asso-

ciation went into an executive session.

THE EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Association went into an executive session at 4:00 o'clock to

consider some financial irregularities pertaining to the work.

The committee appointed at Mitchel's Chapel in the 1937 session of the Association reported it's findings. The report was received by motion, the question arrested by Rev. M. W. Williams, who made a statement thanking the brethren for their support during his term of office, and pledged his support to the work. The motion passed subsequent some discussion.

Furthermore, a motion prevailed that the matter be referred to

the Executive Board for settlement.

The Committee on Officers then made its report (see report). Adopted.

The benediction was then pronounced.

WEDNESDAY EVENING SESSION

The Woman's Auxiliary held a joint session, giving a program of interest to the public. Mrs. B. E. Barrett, President, presided.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The devotionals were conducted by the Rev. McKinley Hawkins and Rev. H. B. Cook, and echoes from the field were heard from the

many messengers.

The Ordinances of the Missionary Baptist Church were then discussed by Rev. H. D. Eaton, pastor of the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church, Wendell, N. C. "Baptism and the Lord's Supper are the two ordinances of the Baptist Church," declared the speaker. "Pastors should ever keep before the members and inform them of these so important ordinances," averred the minister.

The duty of church officers was discussed by Rev. C. C. Clark, pastor Mitchel's Chapel Church. Among other things, Rev. Clark said, "The pastor is to preach the gospel and care for the flock of

God's church, bring men and women to Jesus."

"The deacon should see that the pastor gets his salary on time, care for the table of the Lord and the poor among the church and community. They are, as well as the preacher, to be men of an honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom."

The duty of Baptist church members was discussed by Rev. V. T.

Williams.

Among other things, Rev. Williams declared that "Church members should co-operate in the fullest fashion with the program of the church and pastor, go to church, live pure lives, and keep the commandments of God."

Subsequent the singing of the song "I Need Thee Every Hour," Rev. Samuel Carter, Prof. of Philosophy at Shaw University, was presented by the Moderator to address the Association.

Prof. Carter chose for a subject, "What is a Christian?"

Some false conceptions of a Christian were mentioned by the speaker, as follows: "Feeling alone and doing something alone does not make one a Christian. A Christian is one who has the right belief, the right action and the right feeling," averred the professor.

The audience heard him gladly.

"My hope is built on nothing less" was harmoniously sung by the congregation and Brothers Horton and Diggs took an offering.

The committees on Education and New Churches made their re-

ports (see reports). Adopted.

Prof. Crockett, county agent of Wake, Mr. C. E. Lightner, funeral director, Raleigh, and Rev. Fred Davis, First Baptist Church

(colored) Wilson, were introduced and each made some helpful remarks.

The meeting closed.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session began its exercises, conducted by the Revs. K. P. Battle and A. G. Seawell, at 2 o'clock. An inspirational devotional hour was experienced.

The following named committees submitted their reports: Grievances, Obituary, Resolutions and Temperance (see reports).

Adopted.

Rev. D. P. Lewis, chairman of the Foreign Mission Board, and pastor of the South Main Street Baptist Church, Louisburg, North Carolina, gave some helpful remarks on missions and urged the messengers to give more money to missions.

The Finance Committee made its report (see report). Adopted. "God Be With You Till We Meet Again" was sung, while the congregation, imbued with the Master's Spirit to do more work on returning home, shook hands. They set out for home with apparent great gain.

THE EXTRA SESSION

The extra session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Wake Piney Grove Baptist Church, Garner, North Carolina, Thurs-

day, April 7, 1938.

An inspirational praise service was conducted by Revs. T. B. Smith and Wm. Smith, using song "All Hail the Pow'r of Jesus' Name", and the first general epistle of John as a Scripture lesson, followed with prayer by Brother Wm. Smith.

Subsequent some brief remarks by the acting Moderator and pastor, Rev. Geo. S. Stokes, the message of welcome was given by

Deacon Clyde Avery.

Mrs. B. E. Barrett, president of the Woman's Auxiliary, made some timely remarks on the work the women are doing and pledged her undying support to continue to work for the Association.

present.

Acting Moderator Stokes then gave an inspiring message to the delegates, setting in motion the machinery for the day and urging the brethren to carry on for God.

Subsequent the singing of song "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart," a motion passed that a vote of thanks be extended the Moderator for his helpful message and that the address be put on the

"The Functioning Baptist Church" was then discussed by Revs. V. T. Williams, Deacon A. I. Goodson and Rev. A. A. Morrissey. Each message was helpful to the many hearers.

dience in an able manner.

"Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross" was sung and an offering of \$1.05 was realized.

The Finance Committee made its report and the report was adopted.

Rev. J. W. Powell pronounced the benediction.

REPORT ON EDUCATION

It is obviously recognized and known that Education is a vital and indispensable need of all people. This is peculiarly true as relates to the American Negro. He suffers economic handicaps for the lack of employment opportunities and because of the low salary and wage scale; the injustices meted out to him by the law hampers his progress and dims his vision for fullest success; the inequalities of school facilities discourage and hinder his keeping pace with his Nordice contemporaries in many instances in scholarship attainments and preparation to meet the practical problems of life; the denial, in a widespread way, the exercise of the use of the ballot cripples his citizenship aspirations and rights. These things, along with the general needs of the age, make it extraordinarily imperative that we educate.

Therefore, we recommend:

1. That this Association encourage and urge our people to use to the fullest extent the advantages provided by the Public School System of the state in our several communities.

2. That along with our literary preparation we take advantage and prepare ourselves in manual training, agriculture, business, etc.

3. That the church be actively interested in securing the best

teachers, by training and fitness, for the schools.

4. That we recognize, endorse and support Shaw University as our standard institution of Christian education in higher learning.

5. That we give active support and co-operation to the Training Program of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, outlined for the training of church officers and Sunday Schools and B. Y. P. U. workers.
